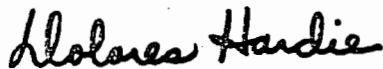

THANK YOU.

WONDERFUL TO BE HERE.

I HAVE ENJOYED CAMPAIGNING THIS YEAR, GOING BACK TO THOSE PLACES I WAS IN 4 YEARS AGO -- SEEING FRIENDS I MADE THEN -- MAKING NEW FRIENDS. IT'S BEEN FUN.

I WAS HERE OFTEN, AND AS THE 1976 PENNSYLVANIA PRIMARY APPROACHED, THE PRESIDENT LITERALLY LIVED IN PENNSYLVANIA, SPENDING THE NIGHTS IN YOUR HOMES, WALKING STREETS, VISITING PEOPLE WHERE THEY WORKED -- FARMS, FACTORIES, STEEL MILLS, GOING INTO YOUR DEEP MINES.

WHEN HE FIRST CAME TO PENNSYLVANIA, HE WAS A LONELY CANDIDATE. HE WENT FROM ONE COMMUNITY TO ANOTHER IN A CAR WITH ONE DRIVER. HE DIDN'T HAVE ANY SECURITY. HE GOT TO KNOW THIS STATE AND CARE FOR THE PEOPLE.

I WILL NEVER FORGET THAT 1976 PRIMARY ELECTION NIGHT AND HOW IMPORTANT IT WAS TO US -- AND WE WON!

AND MANY PEOPLE HAVE SAID IT WAS A TURNING POINT IN OUR CAMPAIGN.

YOU DID THAT FOR US -- AND YOU VOTED FOR THE PRESIDENT AGAIN IN THE GENERAL ELECTION -- AND WE WILL ALWAYS BE GRATEFUL TO YOU.

AS PRESIDENT, JIMMY HAS CONTINUED TO WORK CLOSELY WITH PENNSYLVANIANS. HUNDREDS OF YOUR CITIZENS HAVE BEEN TO THE WHITE HOUSE TO TALK TO HIM ABOUT JOBS, INFLATION, COAL, STEEL, SHIPBUILDING, ENERGY, EDUCATION, FARMING AND THE SPECIAL PROBLEMS OF THE POOR AND ELDERLY. NOT JUST EASY -- COURAGEOUS IN TACKLING THE DIFFICULT ISSUES. HE HAS NOT AVOIDED A ONE, NO MATTER HOW COMPLEX, HOW CONTROVERSIAL, OR HOW POLITICALLY UNPOPULAR -- OR WHICH PRIMARY HAPPENS TO BE NEXT TUESDAY.

WHEN THERE ARE "HARD CHOICES" TO BE MADE, HE MAKES THEM -- SOMETIMES WE PAY A PRICE POLITICALLY -- BUT IN THE LONG RUN I BELIEVE HIS ACTIONS ARE GOOD BECAUSE THE AMERICAN PEOPLE KNOW THEY CAN TRUST HIM. THEY KNOW HE IS HONEST WITH THEM, AND THEY KNOW THAT HE DOES NOT ACT OUT OF POLITICAL EXPEDIENCY, BUT IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF ALL THE PEOPLE OF OUR COUNTRY.

AND WE DO FACE DIFFICULT PROBLEMS TODAY -- AND WE ALL KNOW WHY. NOW PAYING FOR LONG YEARS OF NEGLECT IN FACING UP TO ENERGY -- AND FACING UP TO INFLATION.

THESE PROBLEMS HAVE BEEN WITH US FOR 10-12 YEARS. LONG-TERM PROBLEMS -- NO SIMPLE SOLUTIONS. AND JIMMY CARTER IS TAKING STEPS -- WORKING COURAGEOUSLY -- TO OVERCOME THEM.

VERY SOON -- FIRST COMPREHENSIVE ENERGY POLICY IN HISTORY.

IRANIAN CRISIS.

WE HAD A GREAT VICTORY WHEN THE U.S. OLYMPIC COMMITTEE VOTED
TO BOYCOTT THE OLYMPICS -- AND NOW OTHER COUNTRIES ARE BEGINNING
TO JOIN IN. WE MUST STAND UP TO THE SOVIET UNION AND BE MILITARILY
STRONG AND PREPARED.

YES, WE DO HAVE PROBLEMS -- AND THEY CANNOT BE QUICKLY SOLVED.
BUT THE ACTIONS THE PRESIDENT HAS BEEN TAKING OVER THE PAST FEW
MONTHS ARE BEGINNING TO PAY OFF. AND I AM CONFIDENT NO ONE COULD
DO A BETTER JOB. HE IS THE BEST PERSON IN THIS COUNTRY TO LEAD US

On Friday, April 18, Mrs. Carter will campaign in Philadelphia and return to the Pittsburgh area for an evening Democratic dinner.

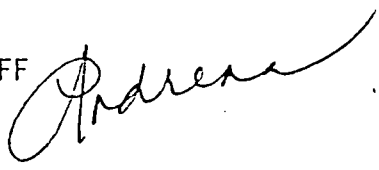
