Press: The dominant questions at all three press conferences were, in approximate order of importance, the debates, Iran situation and the hostages, the First Lady's "influence," the polls. There seemed to be a renewed interest in hostages, obviously due to Iranian movements, though interest centered more on hostages themselves than the political situation or the President's reaction. The Moral Majority brought up again.

West Virginia: Senator Randolph flew with us and repeatedly brought up the debates and his support for the President's position. He also said he was helping on his own in Orange County, Calif. and in Boulder, Colo. Think he told this to Strauss last week.

The Huntington event, a parade, was well attended and very pleasing to Jay Rockefeller. He said that crowds were unusually warm and receptive, in contrast to previous visits he and his wife had made to highly Republican area.

Syracuse: This was a well-attended event and an attentive crowd. Although we had expected possible meeting and/or picket lines with local unions, no one appeared. This should be followed up with Landon Butler's office to thank them.

Mrs. Carter wanted it particularly noted that the Italian community here made a point to express their indignance about Reagan's "mafia" remark. She wants to be sure we are not overlooking potential impact of this. Again, here, she heard that the President should hold out against 3-way debate.

Hartford: Gov. Grasso and Toby Moffatt rode in the limo and discussed his support and involvement in campaign. He was forthcoming about helping and about loaning his AA to the campaign staff. Mrs. Carter also spoke with him privately about help and about the possibility of a meeting soon with the President. This needs to be followed up a.s.a.p. Also, Senator Ribicoff agreed with the President's position on debate. Local political writers were saying Connecticut is now "winnable for

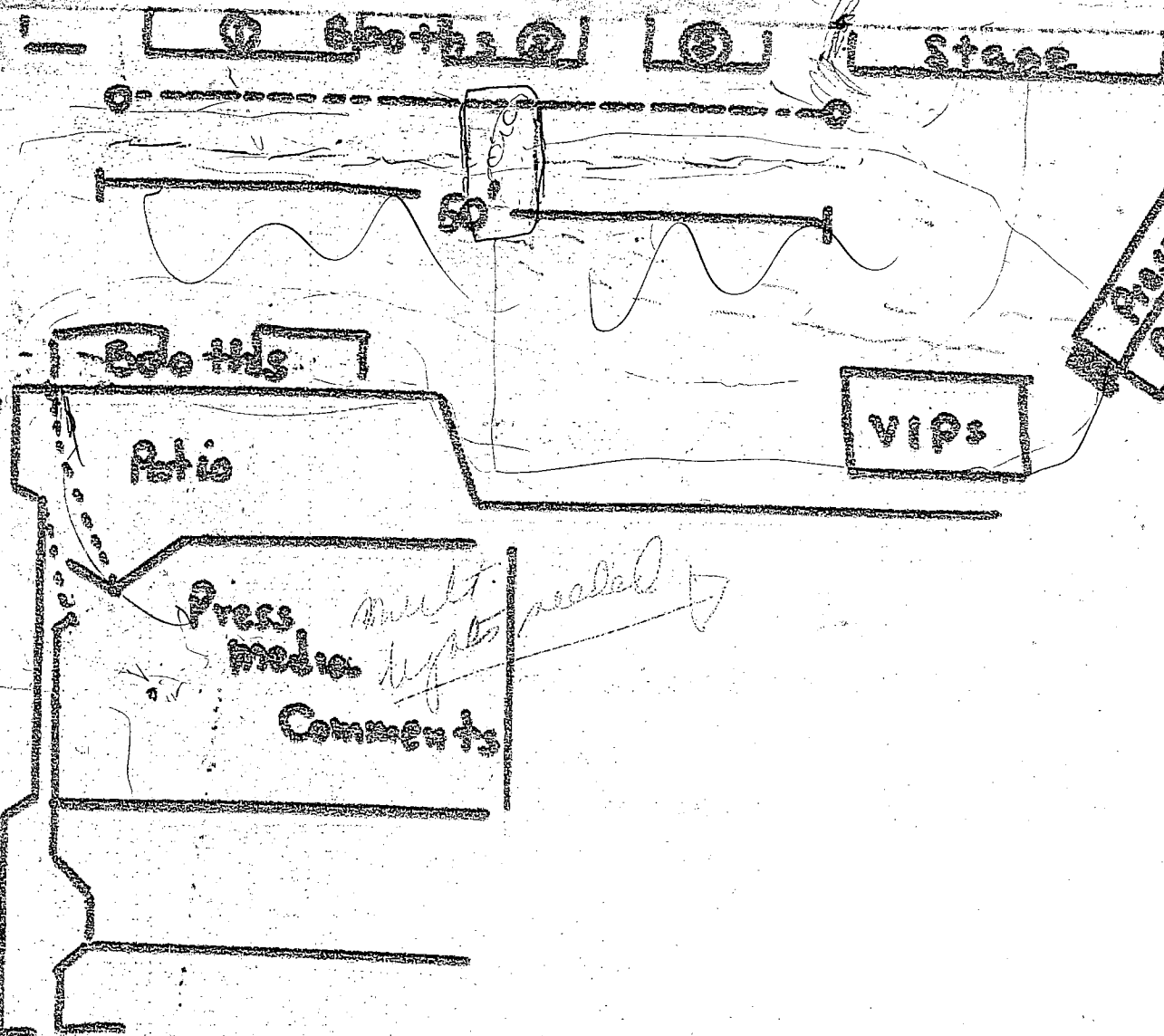

CRITERIA FOR AWARD

The Medal of Honor, established by Joint Resolution of Congress 12 July 1862 (amended by Act of March 3, 1918, and June 25 July 1953) is awarded in the name of Congress to a person who, while a member of the Armed Forces, distinguishes himself conspicuously by gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while engaged in action against an enemy of the United States, while engaged in military operations involving conflict with an opposing foreign force; or while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in an armed conflict against an opposing armed force in which the United States is not a belligerent party. The deed performed must have been one of personal bravery or self-sacrifice so conspicuous as to clearly distinguish the individual above his comrades and must have involved risk of life. Satisfactory proof of exceptional service is exacted and each recommendation for award of this decoration is considered on the standard of extraordinary merit. The award is limited to members of the Armed Forces of the United States in active Federal military service.

The President of the United States in the name of the Congress takes pleasure in presenting the MEDAL OF HONOR to

CORPORAL ANTHONY CASAMENTO
United States Marine Corps

for service as set forth in the following:

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his own life above and beyond the call of duty while serving with Company "D", First Battalion, Fifth Marines, First Marine Division on Guadalcanal, British Solomon Islands in action against the enemy Japanese forces on 1 November 1942. Serving as a leader of a machine gun squad, Corporal Casamento directed his unit to advance along a ridge near the Mantanikau River where they engaged the enemy. He positioned his squad to provide covering fire for two flanking units and to provide direct support for the main force of his company which was behind him. During the course of this engagement, all members of his squad were either killed or severely wounded and he himself suffered multiple, grievous wounds. Nonetheless, Corporal Casamento continued to provide critical supporting fire for the attack and in defense of his position. Following the loss of all effective squad personnel, he set up, loaded, and manned his unit's machine gun, tenaciously holding the enemy forces at bay. Corporal Casamento single-handedly engaged and destroyed one machine gun emplacement to his front and took under fire the other emplacement on the flank. Despite the heat and ferocity of the engagement, he continued to man his weapon and repeatedly repulsed multiple assaults by the enemy forces, thereby protecting the flanks of the adjoining companies and holding his position until the arrival of his main attacking force. Corporal Casamento's courageous fighting spirit, heroic conduct, and unwavering dedication to duty reflected great credit upon himself and were in keeping with the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the United States Naval Service.
