Fact Sheet

The Dinner:

Approximately 140 dinner guests will be seated at round tables in the State Dining Room. Individual place settings will include service plates from the Franklin D. Roosevelt and Woodrow Wilson administrations (their first use in this administration) and the Theodore Roosevelt china for service of each course, with the Monroe gold flatware and the Morgantown crystal.

The blue and white of the china patterns will be complemented by Wedgwood blue iris and white iris arranged in lucite containers of varied heights. Containers will be centered on beveled mirrors and surrounded by votive candles.

SUBJECT: ENTERTAINMENT FOR TITO/YUGOSLAVIA STATE DINNER

Celedonio Romero and his three sons - Celin, Pepe, and Angel - are considered the "Royal Family of the Guitar " and perform as a quartet and solo.

They have played with the major orchestras in the United States and internationally under the baton of such distinguished maestros as Arthur Fiedler and Eugene Ormandy. They have many albums to their credit and Angel Romero is probably the most famous soloist of the group.

The Times has said of them, "As soloists and as a quartet, they offered music that was effective and varied. They players are flawless and have a perfect sense of thym...together they are wonderful...individually, the Romeros are no less exciting."

They are free on March 7 and would be a nice compliment for the evening honoring Tito.
