MARY --

As you may know, the flowers to be used in the state dining room on the 29th are camellias.

Gretchen told me about them, and the story behind them is really very special. I don't know what, if anything, you will want to do with it but I pass along that Donnie has asked us for some interesting stories re preparation for the dinner.

Then-President Eisenhower planned to be in Moultrie, Georgia and the Mayor wanted to do something special. He gathered a group of women in the community together, and they began picking camellias and a portrait of the President was done. The group has expanded, and they've been working together ever since. In total they've done five portraits -- Eisenhower, Paul Harvey, Gov. Carter and Gov. Busbee.

On a spring-like day last March, Mayor Whithers (the same mayor, who is now 75 years old) called Tom Beard and asked Tom to see if RSC would like to have a portrait. The answer was no. The Mayor then asked if she would like to have some flowers, and the response was yes. So the women -- 75-100 of them -- got busy, and camellias were brought to Washington for a reception held on March 22.

This year he called the Social Office to see if they would like some more -- it's almost the peak of the season -- and he told them that in 2737 B.C. the first camellias were noted in China!

What follows is a wonderful communities story, I think.

Mayor Whithers, when I talked with him today, has already called about 75 women, who are very excited about gathering their camellias together for the White House. Six stores in the community are saving their paste-board boxes, and they are picked up every other day. Mayor Whithers says they now have plenty of them -- 75-100.

Early on Saturday morning, January 27, the women will bring their camellias to the Recreation Building where two florists will hand pick the ones that will come to Washington. They will then be packed in the boxes and put in a 23 ft. motor carrier. Mayor Whithers, the Chief of police and a member of the city council will drive to Washington, leaving Saturday afternoon. They plan to deliver the camellias to the White House at 2 p.m. on Sunday.

The women who helped the decorate the White House for the Inaugural receptions will be returning to work with the camellias. There will be sixteen of them, headed by Sue Duncan.

The Camellia — A Condensed History

HOW PLANTS OF ANY KIND get from their native habitat around the world is quite an interesting subject and the dissemination of camellias is particularly fascinating. One of the plaques in the camellia house at the Tennessee Botanical Gardens in Nashville states that in 2737 B.C. the tea plant (*Camellia sinensis*) was cultivated in China. Thus camellias may be the oldest flower known to modern man.

Another source says that the first written mention of the genus *Camellia* (though it was not designated as such) goes back many centuries before Christ. Korean legend has it that branches of "japonica", as it was called, used at a wedding feast symbolized longevity and faithfulness. It is believed that plants were grown in that country as far back as 1200 B.C. The Koreans called the camellia "enduring winter flower" and had a proverb "A man of character abides as the japonica in the snow". Another said "If you are rich, anoint your hair with japonica oil; if poor, use the oil of the castor bean".

What is really known is that all camellia species are native of eastern Asia and it is believed that Buddhist priests carried plants and seeds with them during their travels in Japan, China and Korea. The name japonica means of or pertaining to Japan.

The plaque above mentioned also reads that around 1000 B.C. the Japanese began growing tea and that was around the time of Abraham or perhaps Moses. The plaque then skips to the 16th century A.D. and says that the Japanese made tea drinking a religious rite. There are Japanese documents of the 7th century naming camellia as a source of oil. A Chinese botanist of the 11th century (the time of the Norman conquest of England) listed 72 cultivars of *C. reticulata* which puts the beginning of Chinese

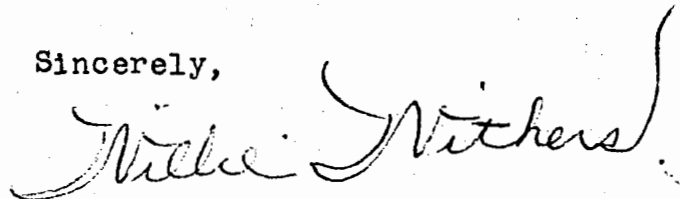

Approximately 140 dinner guests will be seated at round tables. Individual place settings will include the Truman china, the Morgantown crystal and the Monroe flatware on white tablecloths.

The centerpieces on each table will be large bowls from the Johnson service filled with profuse bouquets of red, pink and white camellias. The first camellias were noted in China in 2737 B.C.. The blossoms were picked by a group of women in Moultrie, Georgia and brought to the White House by some Moultrie citizens. The bouquets will be arranged by women from Moultrie and some members of the Garden Club of Georgia. Votive candles will also be on each table.

Both the menu cards and the place cards are in English and Chinese.

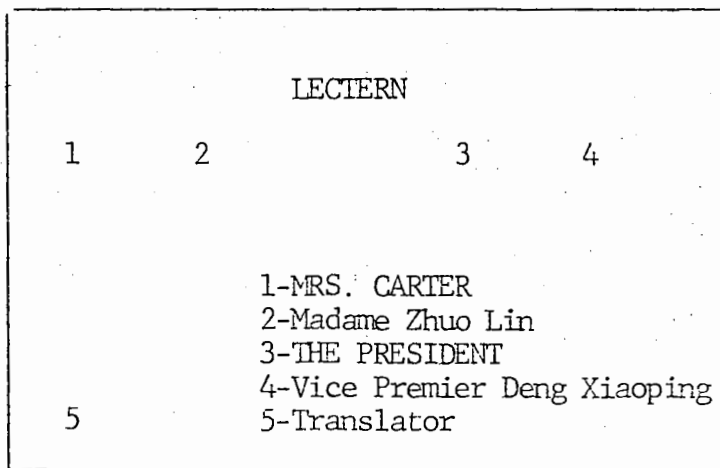

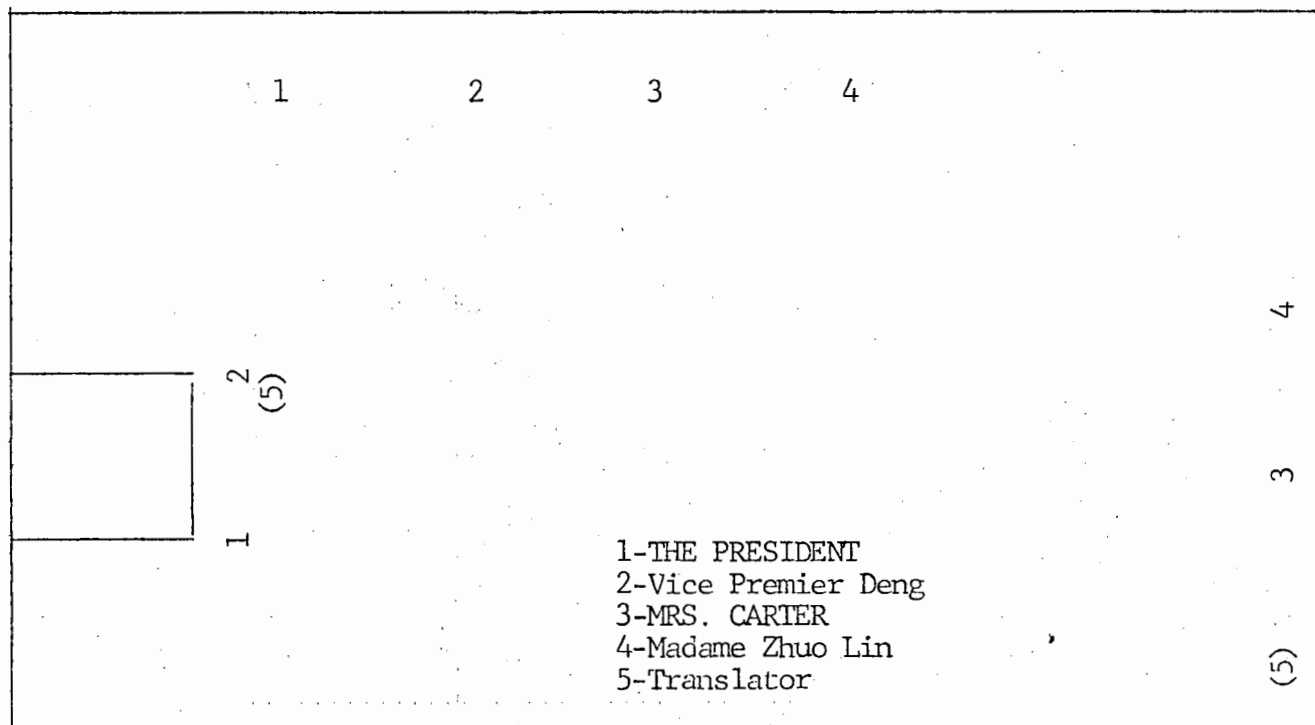

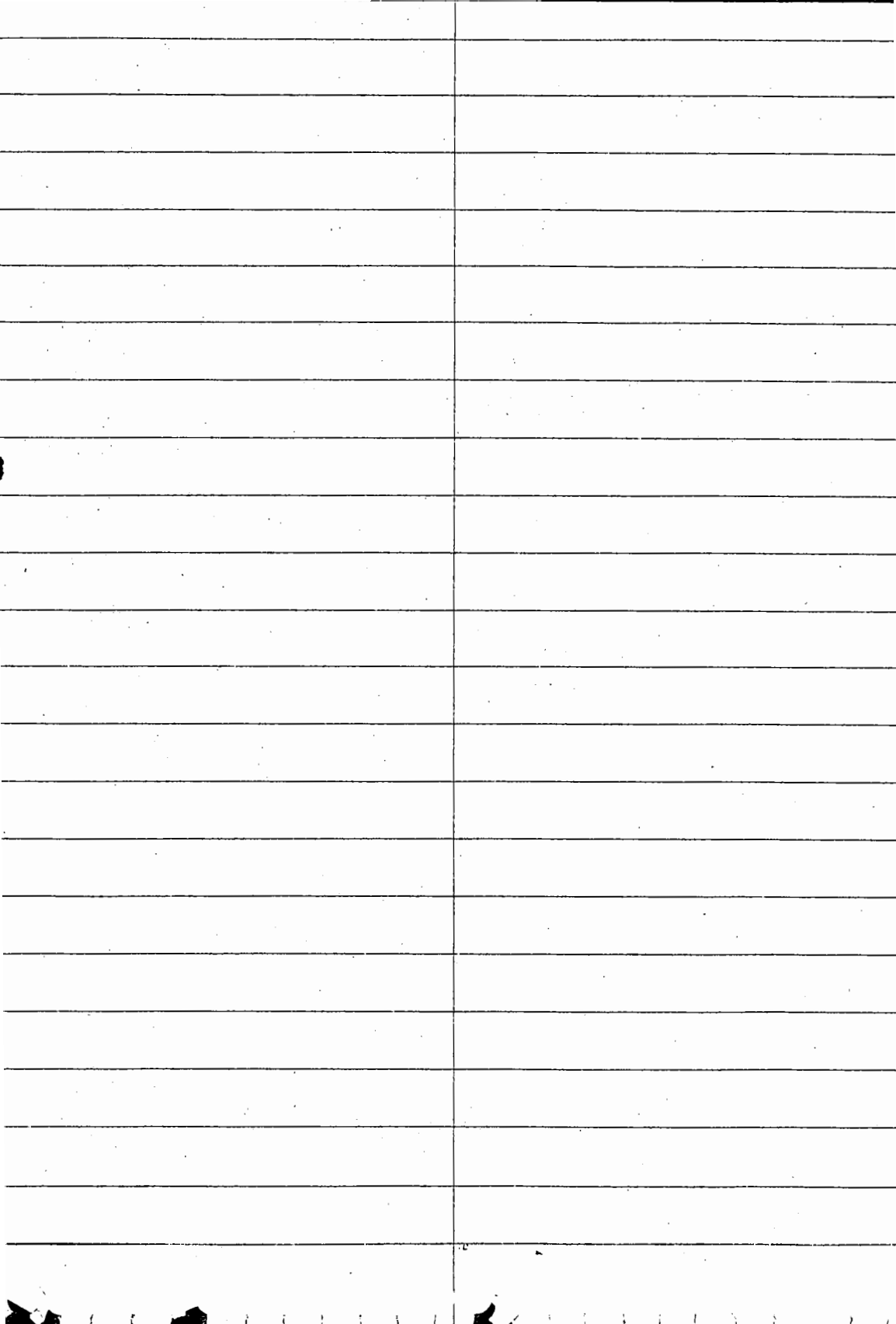

Our Camellia Portrait Cover—Paul Harvey, Nationally Known News Analyst

During his term as President of the United States, Dwight D. Eisenhower landed his Columbine at Spence Air Base near Moultrie several times on his way to and from the plantation of his Treasurer, George H. Humphrey, on hunting trips. He was due to land at Spence Field on February 4, 1959. Rolling and tumbling in bed some weeks in advance of his appearance, William B. Withers, Mayor of Moultrie, conceived the idea of reproducing the image of President Eisenhower in camellias. The next day he contacted Julian Bridges, a former school teacher and then florist, and confronted him with the idea. Julian Bridges said it could be done and he would be willing to do it. The Mayor got busy calling the ladies to bring their camellias to a central location on Tuesday, February 3, 1959, and had an eight-foot square plywood erected for the blooms. At 5:00 p.m., on the afternoon of February 3rd, Julian Bridges, a half dozen men and several dozen ladies went to work. Every camellia bloom was wired separately to insure stability of the bloom on the stem. At 3:50 a.m., the next morning about 150 'PROFESSOR SARGENTS' were needed to complete the President's vest. During the night a tremendous rainstorm came up and torrential rains accompanied by electrical disturbances continued throughout the day on Wednesday. The wind was so bad President Eisenhower was not able to land his plane at Spence Air Base. The pilot, Colonel Bill Draper, continued to Moody Air Force Base at Valdosta, Georgia, where a successful landing was made. The next day President Eisenhower sent his pilot, Colonel Bill Draper, his co-pilot, Lt. Colonel W. W. Thomas, and his navigator, Major L. G. Strauch to Moultrie to see the camellia portrait which had been placed on the Court House Square. On February 12, 1959 President Eisenhower extended his sincere appreciation to the people of Moultrie for the gesture they had made in his behalf. This camellia portrait appeared in newspapers all over the United States and

many favorable comments poured in to Moultrie.

Later, on November 15, 1965, while he was convalescing at the Camp Gordon, Georgia Hospital, Mr. W. C. Vereen, Jr., sent a beautiful assortment of camellias from the gardens of Mr. and Mrs. Josh Wilkes to General Eisenhower by his pilot, Jim Dorrough.

Moultrie's Mayor talked with members of the staff of WSB-TV in Atlanta, Georgia on several occasions after this experience about putting on a TV program with camellias. In the fall of 1964 he learned that the American Camellia Society was holding a meeting in Tallahassee, Florida beginning on January 20, 1965. Members of WSB-TV staff were invited to come to Moultrie to film the tour of the American Camellia Society through the gardens in Moultrie on the following day. All arrangements were made with the television personnel and reservations had been made at the motel. Exactly one week prior to Friday, January 21, 1965, a hard freeze hit Moultrie killing all the blooms and buds. The television trek from Atlanta had to be called off. However, Miss Ruth Kent, on whose program the film would have been shown over WSB-TV, offered encouragement and suggested an early start the next camellia season. WSB-TV began originating color just after the first of the year in 1966. Moultrie's Mayor was invited to come to Atlanta and present a camellia program emanating in color from the studio. He conceived the idea of reproducing the image of Georgia's Governor Carl E. Sanders, in camellias. A 16-year-old artist, John McCall, Jr., sketched the features of the Governor on a piece of plywood four feet by eight feet and produced an outstanding work of art. The portrait would just exactly fit in the back of the station wagon which carried it to WSB-TV in Atlanta on Sunday night. At 7:00 a.m., the next morning, January 3, 1966, Governor Sanders met at WSB-TV with John McCall, Jr., Miss Marilyn Smith, who made the formal presentation of the portrait to Governor Sanders, and Mayor William B. Withers, all of whom appeared on the *Today In Georgia* show with Miss Ruth Kent, MC.

PAUL HARVEY

When it became known last fall that news commentator, Paul Harvey, had accepted an invitation to be the speaker at the annual Chamber of Commerce Banquet on January 19, 1967, another idea germinated in the mind of Moultrie's Mayor. Two artists, Bob Jones, art teacher in the Moultrie Public Schools, and Bill Owens were invited to design the portrait. Again the good ladies of Moultrie were called on to bring their blooms. By 3:00 in the afternoon on January 19th, the last bloom was stapled to the board and the finished product was carried to the National Guard Armory where it was suspended by heavy cables from the ceiling against the wall behind the head table. Every bloom was wired with loving care.

Moultrie has swelled with the pride of accomplishment and the reward far outweighed the labor when this portrait was unveiled at the annual Chamber of Commerce Banquet just before Paul Harvey was due to deliver his address.

Paul Harvey insisted that it took him until the following Monday to completely recover his equilibrium to the point that he was able to comment on the experience. Included in his news cast on Monday, January 23, 1967, Paul Harvey made the following comments on this subject:

"... And in Moultrie, Georgia, my first return there in eleven years, I had one of the most moving experiences of my life and I relate this with some risk of being misunderstood for there is personal vanity involved. Moultrie unveiled behind the speaker's platform in the Armory last Thursday night, a huge tapestry made of flowers. It was a flattering likeness of Paul Harvey, a full-color portrait eight feet by eight feet created by the artistic placement of 5,000 camellias. With two local artists guiding them, dozens of local women had meticulously wired in place a camellia from every backyard in the county, including one named for Angel. For three months they worked to bring all the right colors into bloom at the precise time and then for three days and nights they worked at assembling this floral portrait. I have never been so

No Sweepstakes?

Several California shows tried "no sweepstakes" shows this past season. The Los Angeles Camellia Council (Descanso), Temple City and Pomona Valley shows tried this and were pleased with the results. ACS rules do not specify that sweepstakes must be awarded.

The Los Angeles Council feels that too much emphasis is being placed on quantity of blue ribbons with the result that the most sought after prize has been Sweepstakes and Runner-Up Awards. They feel that the elimination of Sweepstakes will serve as an equalizer between the large collectors and what some of the smaller growers call themselves—the "amateur" amateurs.

At the same time four "Best Japonica" awards were set up based on four size classifications—large and very large, medium, small and miniature. They point out that normally smaller varieties will receive equal recognition with the huge varieties which too often have won on sheer size alone.

ACS takes no stand on this—it's entirely a local decision as it should be. This may encourage more competition by concentrating upon quality rather than quantity.

PROGRAM NOTES

"EUBIE"

One of this season's most popular Broadway shows, "Eubie" is a lively, spirited revue celebrating the hit songs of the black American composer Eubie Blake. An excerpt from "Eubie" is performed tonight.

In 1921, Blake and his partners made theatrical history when their show "Shuffle Along" opened on Broadway. It was the first American musical written, performed, produced and directed by American blacks, and brought attention to talented performers such as Josephine Baker and Paul Robeson. Several of the numbers in "Eubie" are taken from "Shuffle Along", including "I'm Just Wild About Harry," which became widely known as Democrat Harry S. Truman's theme song during the 1948 presidential campaign.

Born of slave parents in Baltimore in 1883, Eubie Blake celebrates his 96th birthday on February 7.

RUDOLF SERKIN

It was in Washington, D. C., that pianist Rudolf Serkin first performed for an American audience, when he played at the Coolidge Festival in the Library of Congress in 1933. Born in Bohemia, now part of Czechoslovakia, in 1903, Serkin studied piano with Professor Richard Robert, and composition with Joseph Marx and Arnold Schoenberg. At age twelve he made his debut with the Vienna Symphony Orchestra, with which he frequently performed in his early career. Now an American citizen. Serkin lives with his wife in Vermont. He is a recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

JOHN DENVER

John Denver is one of the most popular American recording stars to have emerged from the 1970s. He has won a wide audience with his optimistic songs that express an appreciation for the beauties of nature and a love for his family and fellow man.

Denver was born in New Mexico and planned to become an architect, but was bitten by the folksinging bug. In the mid-1960s, he moved to Los Angeles where he supported himself as a draftsman by day and honed his singing skills in coffee houses at night. For three years he sang with the Chad Mitchell Trio, then left to become a solo performer. "Leaving on a Jet Plane," a song he wrote for his first album, was later recorded by Peter, Paul, and Mary and became a major hit for them.

Denver's own first successful single, recorded in 1972, was "Take Me Home, Country Road" which he will be singing tonight. During the last seven years, he has had several other hit singles and albums. A frequent performer on television, his special "An Evening with John Denver" won an Emmy award as the best musical variety special of the 1974-75 season. In 1977, Denver

made his acting debut in the film "Oh God!"

"RODEO"

"Rodeo" was first performed in 1942 at New York's Metropolitan Opera House. Composed by Aaron Copland and choreographed by Agnes deMille, "Rodeo" tells a love story set on a ranch in the American West.

At a Saturday-night square dance, a defiantly unfeminine cowgirl runs away after seeing the Head Wrangler, on whom she has a crush, dancing closely with another girl. The cowgirl returns, but in place of customary jeans and shirt, she has donned a dress for the first time, and in her hair, wears a pretty bow. The tomboy's blossoming into a beautiful woman astonishes everyone - now there is competition to dance with the former wallflower.

The Joffrey Ballet specializes in innovative forms of dance, especially those of the post-Diaghilev period (after 1928). A repertory company, the Joffrey tours major American cities for about sixteen weeks each year and spends several weeks performing in its home base of New York City.

Giant Pandas

Giant pandas are found only in a very small area of the mountains of central China. They live in dense bamboo and coniferous forests at altitudes of 5,000 to 12,000 feet. The mountains are shrouded in heavy clouds; and the temperature is cold with snow on the ground until June.

When full-grown, wild pandas weigh less than 240 pounds and measure six feet from the tip of the nose to the end of the little stump-like tail. They are about the same size as an American black bear. Pandas do not hibernate in winter. They move to higher or lower altitudes with seasonal changes in the weather. Their diet is leaves and shoots of various types of bamboo, but they also eat flowers, vines, and tufted grasses. Honey, when they can find it, is a great treat.

Giant pandas have inhabited China for at least 600,000 years, but were unknown to the rest of the world until 1869. The first giant panda taken out of China alive was purchased by the Brookfield Zoo in Chicago in 1937. The number of pandas living in the wild is not known; but while they are considered rare, they are not thought to be in danger of extinction. There are 25 or 26 giant pandas in zoos in China today; 3 in North Korea; one pair each in London, Washington, Mexico City, Tokyo, and Madrid; and a single female in Paris.

Ling-Ling and Hsing-Hsing

Washington's giant pandas are a gift from the people of the People's Republic of China. They were presented as a gesture of goodwill during President Nixon's trip to China in 1972. Ling-Ling is the female and Hsing-Hsing (pronounced "shing-shing") the male. Ling-Ling is a pet name for Chinese girls and refers to the sound made by the bells they wear on their wrists. Hsing-Hsing refers to the twinkling of a star. Both Ling-Ling and Hsing-Hsing were born in the wild between 1969-1971.

The two pandas are allowed to stay outdoors only as long as the temperature remains below 72 degrees Fahrenheit. The pandas have separate indoor cages of 2,500 square feet with an off-exhibit sleeping den in each cage. Their outdoor areas cover half an acre and are moated to keep the pandas inside.

This occasion reminds me of what Lu Hsien, the great Chinese thinker, once said. He said, "It would be best if mankind could avoid lack of mutual understanding and show concern for one another."

Art and literature will provide the best means toward that goal.

The art and literature of each nation is unique. International exchanges in this area will contribute to mutual understanding between peoples, to the flourishing of art and literature of each country and to world peace and human progress.

No doubt there should be active cultural exchanges between China and the United States following normalization. Here I am happy to inform you that the Boston Symphony Orchestra, as the first cultural exchange item since the establishment of diplomatic relations between the United States and China, will visit China in March. (Applause)

We hope that more American musicians, dancers, actors and other artists will come to China on performing tours. We, on our part, will send more Chinese artists here to perform for the American people.

This event will be attended by prominent Washingtonians and representatives from volunteer organizations, who will be asked to offer hospitality to our foreign guests -- in Washington and in other parts of the United States. Wednesday, January 31

3:00 p.m. Mrs. Carter and Amy will take Madame Zhuo Lin to the National Zoo to see the panda bears, after which they will return to the White House for a signing ceremony, if appropriate. (Press Coverage)

As per briefing with Mike Oksenberg, Mrs. Carter will informally discuss a possible international exchange program (The Friendship Force) with Madame Zhuo Lin as well as her interest in the services for the aged and mentally afflicted in China.
