FROM THE CASTLE TO BELÉM



BELÉM DISTRICT

BELÉM was once a peaceful suburb of Lisbon. Born from the Restelo — the strand from where numberless Portuguese vessels left heading for unknown lands in the 15th century — Belém grew richer and richer as numerous monuments were built there in close connection with the Discoveries of the Portuguese. But it was the Gentry who, fleeing from the bustle of the city, built in Belém their dwelling-houses thereby giving the place a special character.

In the late 18th century Belém was already one of the six districts of Lisbon and for fifty years (from 1835 to 1885) even attained the dignity of a separate municipality. However, ever since, Belém has held the category it now occupies: a parish.

At the present time Belém is one of the most charming places in Lisbon for sightseers. Indeed, besides the magnificent view of the Tagus the tourist will also find remarkable monuments, some interesting museums and multi-century buildings full of arresting picturesqueness.

2. WE HAVE DEVELOPED FIVE ADDITIONAL IDEAS FOR MRS. CARTER'S PROGRAM, WHICH HOPEFULLY YOU WILL HAVE TIME TO CONSIDER AT LEAST PRELIMINARILY BEFORE THE ADVANCE TEAM ARRIVES HERE ON FRIDAY. WE HAVE SELECTED THEM TAKING INTO ACCOUNT CONCERNS ABOUT TRAVEL TIME, DUPLICATION OF THE PRESIDENT'S PROGRAM, AND THE PRESS. WE HAVE ALSO RUN THESE IDEAS THROUGH PROTOCOL AND THEY ARE AMENABLE TO ALL OF THEM.

A. TRIP TO SERBIAN VILLAGE. A THIRTY-MINUTE DRIVE (WITH POLICE ESCORT) THROUGH THE ROLLING SERBIAN COUNTRYSIDE TO THE VILLAGE OF LESKOVAČ. IT IS CLEAN, TIDY, AND REPRESENTATIVE OF THE QUIET AND VISUALLY INTERESTING SERBIAN PEASANT ARCHITECTURE AND FARM-YARDS. THE FOCAL POINT OF THE TRIP COULD BE A VISIT TO THE WOOD SCULPTOR ZIVKOVIC, WHO HAS AN INTERNATIONAL REPUTATION AND WHOSE WORKS, USING PEASANT THEMES, ARE BOTH UNUSUAL AND ATTRACTIVE. ZIVKOVIC HAS TURNED HIS YARD IN HIS TYPICAL SMALL SERBIAN FARM INTO AN OUT-DOOR MUSEUM OF SCULPTURES AND ANTIQUES AND HAS CONSTRUCTED TWO SMALL BUILDINGS WHICH HOUSE HIS COLLECTION. BOTH HE AND HIS MUSEUM HAVE BEEN THE SUBJECT OF TELEVISION DOCUMENTARIES AND A LARGE FORMAT ART BOOK PUBLISHED BY A FRENCH FIRM. HIS YARD COULD ACCOMMODATE THE EXPECTED GROUP OF NEWSMEN, AS WELL AS PROVIDE GOOD VISUAL OPPORTUNITIES. IF AN OUTDOOR LUNCH IN A SCENIC SETTING IS DESIRABLE, THIS AREA WOULD ALSO BE

QUITE SUITABLE, PROVIDING THE WEATHER COOPERATES. THE LENGTH OF THE VISIT COULD BE LENGTHENED OR SHORTENED, DEPENDING ON THE REST OF THE SCHEDULE. AT A MINIMUM IT WOULD TAKE, INCLUDING TRANSPORTATION, TWO HOURS. B. BOAT TRIP ON THE DANUBE. A TRIP DOWNSTREAM WOULD TAKE ABOUT ONE HOUR AND END AT SHEDEREVO, WHERE THERE IS AN IMPRESSIVE AND PARTIALLY RESTORED MEDIEVAL FORTRESS ALONG THE WATERFRONT -- ONE OF

THE LARGEST IN EUROPE. THERE IS NOT MUCH ELSE TO SEE AT SHEDEREVO, AND THE TOWN ITSELF IS NOT PARTICULARLY SCENIC. THE SURROUNDING COUNTRYSIDE, HOWEVER, CONSISTS OF PLEASANT UNDULATING HILLS COVERED WITH VINEYARDS AND NEARBY ON THE TOP OF ONE HILL IS A POPULAR AND EXCELLENT RESTAURANT, THE VINOGRADI, WITH A TRULY SUPERB VIEW OVER THE DANUBE. THIS RESTAURANT, WHICH HAS A PLEASANT OUT-DOOR TERRACE FOR EATING, IS OFTEN USED FOR OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS, AND MRS. MONDALE VISITED THERE DURING HER VISIT LAST JUNE. UNDER THIS OPTION, MRS. CARTER COULD TRAVEL TO SHEDEREVO BY BOAT, DRIVE TO THE VINOGRADI FOR LUNCH HOSTED BY THE YUGOSLAVS, AND RETURN TO BELGRADE BY CAR (ABOUT 30 MINUTES).

C. BELGRADE HOUSING AREA COMMUNITY CENTER. THIS WOULD BE A RAINY DAY OPTION, AND WE WILL LET YOU KNOW HOW IT SHAPES AFTER WE VISIT IT TOGETHER WITH PROTOCOL TOMORROW. PROTOCOL HAS SUGGESTED THIS TO US AS A POSSIBILITY DURING OTHER USG VISITS, AND WE UNDERSTAND THAT MANY FOREIGN OFFICIALS HAVE IN FACT VISITED THE COMMUNITY CENTER.

D. MOTHER AND CHILD CENTER. THIS WOULD BE ANOTHER RAINY DAY ALTERNATIVE IN BELGRADE. THIS CENTER WAS BUILT IN THE 1960S PARTLY WITH USG FUNDS. IT IS WELL-MAINTAINED AND EVEN IMPRESSIVE BY YUGOSLAV STANDARDS. IT WOULD INVOLVE A PROGRAM OF AN HOUR AT MOST. WE ALSO WILL SEE THIS TOMORROW.

E. VILLAGE CRAFTS PROGRAM. PROTOCOL SUGGESTS POSSIBILITY OF BRINGING IN CRAFTSMEN FROM SIRIBOJNO, A VILLAGE IN SERBIA, THREE HOURS DISTANT FROM BELGRADE, WHICH HAS BEEN DEVELOPED ALONG THE LINES OF STURBRIDGE AND WILLIAMSBURG, ALBEIT SERBIAN-STYLE. PROTOCOL HAS IN MIND A SPECIAL PROGRAM PUT ON BY THE CRAFTSMEN AT THE SAVA CENTER, TOGETHER WITH FOLK MUSIC AND DANCING.

1. WITH REGARD TO JUNE 11 WHITE HOUSE REQUEST BY TELEPHONE FOR NAMES OF YUGOSLAVS WHO PARTICIPATED IN MEETINGS WITH THE PRESIDENTIAL ADVANCE TEAM ON JUNE 6 IN BELGRADE, WE ARE PROVIDING THE FOLLOWING:

- RANKO VILUS, CHIEF OF PROTOCOL, FEDERAL SECRETARIAT FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS (FSFA). VILUS WAS THE HOST FOR THE ADVANCE TEAM.

SUBJECT: PRESIDENT CARTER'S VISIT; MRS. CARTER PROGRAM

1. C - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. ACCOMPANIED BY PROTOCOL, DCM AND EMBOFF VISITED BOTH THE BELGRADE COMMUNITY CENTER AND THE BELGRADE MOTHER AND CHILD CARE CENTER (OPTIONS C AND D REFTEL). THE COMMUNITY CENTER IS LOCATED ACROSS THE SAVA RIVER IN NEW BELGRADE AND CONSISTS OF A LARGE BUT ATTRACTIVE APARTMENT COMPLEX HOUSING 10,000 PEOPLE, A SHIPPING AREA, PLAYGROUNDS, MEETING HALL, AN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, AND A DAY-CARE CENTER. THE SCHOOL (GRADES 1 - 8), IN PARTICULAR, IS WELL DESIGNED AND ATTRACTIVE, SINGING, DANCING, WOOD, AND COLOR WITH GREAT EFFECT. A WALK THROUGH THE AREA, INCLUDING SOCIAL AMENITIES, WOULD TAKE ABOUT AN HOUR AND PROVIDE GOOD OPPORTUNITIES FOR MRS. CARTER TO MEET WITH LOCAL RESIDENTS. FOR THE PRESS, SPACE WOULD NOT BE A PROBLEM, EXCEPT THAT IN THE SCHOOL THE WALK-THROUGH WOULD HAVE TO BE PLANNED WITH AN EYE TO AVOIDING THE NEED TO DOUBLE BACK THROUGH CORRIDORS WHERE A THROG OF ACCOMPANYING NEWSMEN MIGHT CAUSE A TRAFFIC PROBLEM. VISUAL OPPORTUNITIES ARE OK, BUT NOT PARTICULARLY EXCITING OR UNIQUE TO YUGOSLAVIA.

3. ALL IN ALL, OUR JUDGMENT (KEEPING IN MIND THAT BELGRADE IS NOT PARIS OR LONDON) IS THAT THE COMMUNITY CENTER IS WORTH YOUR CONSIDERATION, PARTICULARLY AS A RAINY WEATHER ALTERNATIVE TO THE SERVIAN VILLAGE OPTION. IF YOU CONCLUDE THAT AN IN-TOWN PROGRAM IS MOST APPROPRIATE, THE COM-

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MUNITY CENTER VISIT COULD ALSO BE MADE IN CONJUNCTION WITH A VISIT TO THE NEARBY SAVA CENTER WHERE THE YUGOSLAVS HAVE SAID THEY COULD ARRANGE A SPECIAL LIVE PEASANT HANDICRAFTS EXHIBIT (OPTION E).

4. EMBREFF ALSO VISITED MOTHER AND CHILD CARE CENTER. THE UPPER FLOORS WHERE THE WARDS ARE LOCATED ARE BRIGHT, CLEAN AND ATTRACTIVE. THE ENTRY AND LOWER PUBLIC FLOORS, HOWEVER, ARE DINGY, IN NEED OF PAINT AND CLEANING, AND FULL OF WAITING CHILDREN. THE ELEVATORS ARE ALSO SMALL AND COULD NOT ACCOMMODATE A LARGE GROUP. IN SHORT, IT IS NOT AT ALL APPROPRIATE FOR A VISIT.

5. EMBREFF ALSO REVISITED LESKOVAC JUNE 18 WHERE WOOD SCULPTOR BOGOSAV ZIVKOVIC RUNS HIS SCULPTURE GARDEN AND MUSEUM. ZIVKOVIC HAD ALREADY BEEN INFORMED BY YUGOSLAV AUTHORITIES THAT A GROUP MIGHT BE COMING FOR A VISIT JUNE 22. HIS GARDEN CONSISTS OF THREE QUANT ONE OR TWO-ROOM COTTAGES (TYPICAL OF THE TRADITIONAL SERBIAN EXTENDED FAMILY SYSTEM), HIS OWN HOME, AND TWO SMALL BUILDINGS WHICH HOUSE HIS INDOOR COLLECTION. THE COTTAGES ARE FRESHLY WHITEWASHED AND OLD WOODEN FARM IMPLEMENTS, CARVED DISTAFFS, AND SOME OF HIS FLAT WOOD SCULPTURES HANG ON THE OUTSIDE WALLS. ON THE LAWN AND AROUND IT ARE HIS MAIN CREATIONS -- PEASANT FACES, SCENES AND STORIES CARVED ON SEVEN-FOOT HIGH TREE STUMPS. NUMEROUS STONE SCULPTURES, WOODEN FARM TOOLS, AND ABUNDANT GREENERY AND GLEANERS ALSO INVITE THE EYE.

6. THE IMMEDIATE NEIGHBORHOOD -- CONSISTING OF ABOUT FIVE OTHER HOMESTEADS -- IS ALSO PLEASANT. THE HOUSES ARE WELL-KEPT AND THE YARDS ARE NEAT, GRASSY, DOTTED WITH FLOWERS, AND POPULATED BY A COLORFUL ASSORTMENT OF GESE, PIGLETS, AND CHICKENS. THE STREET IS PAVED, SO A BRIEF AND MUDLESS WALK WOULD BE POSSIBLE, IF DESIRED. HOWEVER, A FEW HUNDRED FEET PAST ZIVKOVIC'S HOME, THE ROAD IS UNPAVED, FILLED WITH Gaping POTHOLES, AND SUITABLE ONLY FOR TRACTORS OR VEHICLES WITH HIGH CARRIAGES.

1. C -- ENTIRE TEXT.

2. AS REQUESTED REFTEL, WE ARE PROVIDING BELOW DESCRIPTIVE TEXTS ON THE VARIOUS SITES WHICH MAY -- WE EMPHASIZE MAY--BE VISITED BY PRESIDENT AND MRS. CARTER DURING THEIR JUNE 24-25 VISIT TO BELGRADE. NEITHER SCHEDULE HAS BEEN AGREED UPON, BUT WE HAVE IDENTIFIED IN PARA 3 BELOW THE SITES PRESIDENT CARTER IS ALMOST CERTAIN TO VISIT. MRS. CARTER IS ALSO LIKELY TO ACCOMPANY HIM TO THESE SITES AND WILL ALSO HAVE A SEPARATE SCHEDULE WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE SITES LISTED IN PARA 4. THIS MESSAGE IS CLASSIFIED BECAUSE IT PERTAINS TO THE SCHEDULE.

3. SITES THE PRESIDENT IS ALMOST CERTAIN TO VISIT:

A. KALEMEGDAN PARK (KA-LE-MEG-DAN):

(PARA) PRESIDENT AND MRS. CARTER MAY VISIT THE PARK ON THE AFTERNOON OF JULY 24.

(PARA) KALEMEGDAN PARK IS LOCATED ON A BLUFF AT THE JUNCTURE OF THE LONGEST RIVER IN EUROPE -- THE DANUBE, AND IN YUGOSLAVIA -- THE SAVA. THE OVERLOOK GIVES A SPECTACULAR VIEW OF THE FLAT PANNONIAN PLAIN WHICH STRETCHES TO THE NORTH BEYOND BUDAPEST, AND OF THE DANUBE AND SAVA VALLEYS.

(PARA) BECAUSE OF ITS STRATEGIC POSITION, THE JUNCTURE OF THE TWO RIVERS HAS SINCE RECORDED TIME BEEN AN IMPORTANT COMMERCIAL AND MILITARY SITE. TRACES OF PRE-HISTORIC SETTLEMENTS AS WELL, AS REMAINS OF CELTIC VILLAGES HAVE BEEN EXCAVATED ON THE SPOT. THE ROMANS

*****WHSR COMMENT*****

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BASED A LEGION AND THEIR DANUBE RIVER FLEET HERE, CALLING THE PLACE SINGIDUNUM, A FEW ROMAN WALLS AND A DEEP WELL, DESIGNED TO HELP DEFENDERS WITHSTAND LENGTHY SIEGES, STILL CAN BE SEEN. THE REST OF THE FORTIFICATIONS, ALSO WELL PRESERVED, ARE PREDOMINANTLY FROM THE PERIOD OF TURKISH OCCUPATION OF THE SITE (1521-1867). THE NAME "KALEMEGDAN" IS OF TURKISH ORIGIN.

(PARA) KALEMEGDAN IS NOW THE MAIN CITY PARK OF THE CITY OF BELGRADE, CONTAINING A SMALL ZOO, A MAGNIFICENT MUSEUM OF THE MILITARY HISTORY OF YUGOSLAVIA, A HUNTING AND FORESTRY MUSEUM, AND SPORTS FACILITIES UTILIZING BOATS. IN PLEASANT WEATHER, KALEMEGDAN IS A MAGNET FOR THE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY, FOREIGN VISITORS, AND YUGOSLAVS VISITING THE CAPITAL ON TOUR. PART OF THE FILLED-IN MOAT IS NOW A DISPLAY AREA FOR MILITARY HARDWARE CAPTURED IN THE FIRST AND SECOND WORLD WARS.

(PARA) ALONG THE SAVA (NORTH) SIDE OF THE PARK IS A BROAD, TWO-HUNDRED METER LONG, TREE AND FLOWER-LINED ASPHALT WALKWAY, WITH A FINE VIEW OF THE RIVER AT THE END. HERE DOZENS OF PENSIONERS GATHER TO PLAY CHESS AND REMINISCENCE, AND THE COLORED YUGOSLAV FOLK DANCE, THE "KOLLO" IS OFTEN SPONTANEOUSLY DANCED BY PASSERS BY.

B. TITO GRAVESITE (MRS. CARTER IS ALSO LIKELY TO VISIT):

(PARA) PRESIDENT AND MRS. CARTER WILL PROBABLY VISIT THE GRAVESITE, TO PAY RESPECTS AND TO LAY A SPRAY OF FLOWERS ON PRESIDENT TITO'S TOMB, DURING THE MORNING OF JUNE 24.

(PARA) PRESIDENT TITO WAS BURIED MAY 8, 1980 ON THE GROUNDS OF HIS BELGRADE RESIDENCE, AT HZICKA 15, IN THE RESIDENTIAL SUBURB OF DEDINJE (DE-DEEN-YE). THE TOMB LIES IN A PAVILION-GREENHOUSE WHERE HE OFTEN WORKED. THE SITE IS ABOUT THREE KILOMETERS FROM THE CENTER OF THE CITY, WHICH IT OVERLOOKS. THE PAVILION IS CALLED IN SERBO-CROATIAN "SVECARA" (TSVE-CHAR-AH), OR "HOUSE OF FLOWERS". THE TOMB RESTS IN THE CLIMATE-CONTROLLED CENTRAL HALL OF THE BUILDING, UNDER A GLASS-IN ROOF, SURROUNDED BY EXOTIC TROPICAL PLANTS. THE STONE IS SIMPLE WHITE MARBLE, INSCRIBED IN RAISED GOLD LETTERS "JOSIP BROZ TITO - 1892-1980."

(PARA) VISITORS REACH THE GRAVESITE VIA A WINDING GARDEN PATH, SINCE THE SITE WAS OPENED TO THE PUBLIC. MORE THAN 15,000 PERSONS A DAY HAVE FILED REVERENTLY PAST. AS VISITORS ENTER THE PAVILION, THEY ENCOUNTER TWO ARMED HONOR SENTRIES OF THE TITO GUARD REGIMENT FLANKING THE DOORWAY AT RIGID ATTENTION. VISITORS CIRCLE THE FLOWER BEDS IN THE CENTER OF WHICH IS THE TOMB. THEY MAY ALSO GLIMPSE THROUGH THE GLASS WALLS TWO OF THE COMFORTABLY-FURNISHED ROOMS WHERE PRESIDENT TITO OFTEN WORKED.

U. PALACE OF THE FEDERATION (MRS. CARTER WILL ATTEND THE STATE DINNER):

(PAPA) THIS IS THE LARGEST GOVERNMENT EXECUTIVE OFFICE BUILDING IN YUGOSLAVIA; IT IS THE SITE WHERE THE OFFICIAL TALKS BETWEEN PRESIDENT CARTER AND HIS YUGOSLAV HOSTS WILL TAKE PLACE ON THE MORNING OF JUNE 24, AS WELL AS THE SITE OF THE STATE DINNER THAT EVENING.

(PAPA) THE PALACE OF THE FEDERATION IS IN NEW BELGRADE, THE SPRAWLING HOUSING AND ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLEX WHICH HAS ARISEN SINCE THE WAR ACROSS THE SAVE RIVER FROM OLD BELGRADE COMPLETED IN 1958, IT IS A LARGE, "H"-SHAPED BUILDING HOUSING THE OFFICES AND STAFF OF THE PRINCIPAL FEDERAL BT

 GOVERNMENT BUILDING -- THE PRESIDENCY OF THE SOCIALIST
 FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA (CHIEF OF STATE AND
 COLLECTIVE PRESIDENCY); THE PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERAL
 EXECUTIVE COUNCIL (PRIME MINISTER) AND MEMBERS OF THE
 COUNCIL (THE CABINET); AND THE OFFICES AND STAFF OF
 THE PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERAL ASSEMBLY AND ITS MAJOR
 COMMITTEES. THE BUILDING CONTAINS ABOUT 1,500 OFFICES
 UNDER A TOTAL ROOF AREA OF ABOUT 628,000 SQ. FT.
 (PARA) THE PALACE OF THE FEDERATION IS SO NAMED NOT
 ONLY BECAUSE IT HOUSES THE OFFICES OF THE PRINCIPAL
 FEDERAL ADMINISTRATIVE BODIES BUT ALSO BECAUSE ITS
 REPRESENTATION HALLS AND SALONS ALSO REFLECT THE FEDERAL
 NATURE OF YUGOSLAVIA: THERE ARE EIGHT BEAUTIFULLY
 DECORATED AND FURNISHED HALLS, EACH NAMED AFTER ONE
 OF THE SIX REPUBLICS (SLOVENIA, CROATIA, BOSNIA-
 HERZEGOVINA, SERBIA, MONTENEGRO AND MACEDONIA) AND TWO
 AUTONOMOUS PROVINCES (VOJVODINA AND KOSOVO). THE
 FURNISHINGS IN EACH HALL ARE THE PRODUCT OF THE LOCAL
 AREA, AND THE EFFECT IS LUXURIOUS AND IMPRESSIVE. THERE
 IS ALSO A GRAND HALL OF THE FEDERATION, WHERE THE STATE
 DINNER IS LIKELY TO BE HELD. THERE IS A LARGE, STAR-SHAPED
 CHANDELIER 56 FEET ACROSS MADE FROM SMALL GLASS CRYSTALS.
 THE BUILDING IS FACED WITH MARBLE AND WHITE STONE FROM
 THE FAMOUS QUARRIES ON THE DALMATIAN ISLAND OF BRAC.
 D. THE OLD PALACE (STARI DVOR) (STA-RI DU-VOR):
 (PARA) THE OLD PALACE, WHERE THE PRESIDENT AND HIS
 FAMILY WILL OVERNIGHT, IS LOCATED WITHIN A WALLED AREA
 CONTAINING SEVERAL OTHER BUILDINGS BELONGING TO THE
 COURT OF THE SERBIAN (LATER YUGOSLAV) ROYAL FAMILY. THE
 PARK IS A BOTANICAL GARDEN AND PRESERVE FOR PHEASANTS,
 QUAIL AND OTHER SMALL GAME. IT IS SITUATED ON THE HIGHEST
 GROUND NEAR THE CAPITAL, IN THE RESIDENTIAL AREA OF
 BEOGRAD, AND OFFERS AN UNOBSCURED VIEW OVER A VALLEY TO

THE KOSUTNJAK HILLS TO THE SOUTH.

(PARA) THE OLD PALACE ITSELF WAS COMPLETED IN 1927 BY KING ALEXANDER. IT IS BUILT IN A STYLE COMBINING ASPECTS OF SERBIAN AND ROMANIAN COUNTRY VILLAS OF THE TIME, PROBABLY TO PLEASE QUEEN MARIA, WHO WAS FROM ROMANIA. THE FIRST TWO FLOORS HAVE EXTENSIVE OPEN WINDOWS ALLOWING MAXIMUM LIGHT INTO THE SPACIOUS HIGH-CEILINGED ROOMS AND FURNITURE IS UNOBTRUSIVELY PLACED TO MAINTAIN THIS IMPRESSION OF SPACE AND LIGHT.

(PARA) AN UNDERGROUND TUNNEL CONNECTS THE OLD PALACE TO THE NEARBY BARRACKS OF THE MILITARY GUARD.

(PARA) ADJOINED TO THE PALACE IS A SERBIAN ORTHODOX CHAPEL USED BY THE ROYAL FAMILY. THE EMPEROR OF ETHIOPIA, HAILE SELASSIE, ALSO WORSHIPPED THERE DURING A POSTWAR STATE VISIT TO YUGOSLAVIA.

(PARA) SINCE 1945, THE OLD PALACE HAS ONLY BEEN USED BY VISITING CHIEFS OF STATE. PRESIDENT TITO NEVER RESIDED IN THE OLD PALACE. PRESIDENTS NIXON (1970) AND FORD (1976) STAYED THERE DURING STATE VISITS.

E. FRIENDSHIP PARK (PARK PRIJATESJSIVA) (PARK PRIJATELSIVA):

(PARA) PRESIDENT CARTER WILL PROBABLY PLANT A "TREE OF FRIENDSHIP" AT THE PARK OF FRIENDSHIP DURING THE AFTERNOON OF JUNE 24. MRS. CARTER WILL PROBABLY BE PRESENT.

(PARA) FRIENDSHIP PARK ORIGINATES FROM 1961 WHEN IT WAS DECIDED TO CREATE A GROVE OF TREES DEDICATED TO LASTING FRIENDSHIP AMONG NATIONS. THE FIRST USE WAS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FIRST CONFERENCE OF THE NONALIGNED NATIONS, DURING WHICH LEADS OF STATE PLANTED YOUNG TREES IN A SYMBOLIC COMMITMENT TO THEIR COUNTRIES' DEDICATION TO PEACE AND FRIENDSHIP. AT THAT TIME, NEARLY ALL VISITING HEADS OF STATE, INCLUDING PRESIDENTS NIXON (1970) AND FORD (1976), HAD PLANTED TREES IN THE GROVE.

(PARA) THE PARK, OF COURSE, IS LOCATED ON THE PLAIN OF NEW BELGRADE BESIDE THE SOUTHERN BANK OF THE SAVA RIVER AND THE SOUTHERN SHORE OF THE DANUBE RIVER. WITHIN A SHORT WALKING DISTANCE IS LOCATED BELGRADE'S MODERN ART MUSEUM AND A RESTAURANT NAMED "BOSCH" AFTER THE NEARBY CONFLUENCE ("MOUTH") OF THE SARAJEVO AND SAVA RIVERS.

4. SITES WHICH MRS. CARTER MAY VISIT WITHOUT THE PRESIDENT:

A. LESKOVAC VILLAGE (LRS-KO-VATCH):

(PARA) MRS. CARTER MAY VISIT THE VILLAGE AREA FOR LUNCH JUNE 24.

(PARA) LESKOVAC IS A SMALL VILLAGE IN THE ROLLING HILLS OF THE SUMADIJA REGION OF SERBIA, THIRTY KILOMETERS SOUTH OF BELGRADE. THE AGRICULTURAL ECONOMY OF THE AREA

CENTERS ON FEED CROPS, VEGETABLES, FRUIT AND PIG RAISING. MOST FAMILIES AS WELL SUPPLEMENT THEIR INCOME OR PROVIDE FOR THEIR OWN NEEDS BY KEEPING ONE OR TWO COWS, A FEW CHICKENS, AND PERHAPS SOME GEESE. THE PROPERTIES -- BY LAW NO MORE THAN TEN HECTARES PER FAMILY -- ARE PRIVATELY OWNED, AS IS ABOUT 85 PERCENT OF AGRICULTURAL LAND IN YUGOSLAVIA. THE VILLAGE ITSELF IS A CLUSTER OF SEVERAL HOMESTEADS AND IS REPRESENTATIVE OF RURAL LIFE IN SERBIA.

(PARA) REFLECTING THE EXTENDED FAMILY (ZADRUGA) SYSTEM WHICH WOULD SWAY UNTIL THE END OF THE 19 TH CENTURY, EACH PLOT HAS SEVERAL ONE OR TWO-ROOM COTTAGES BUILT AROUND A CENTRAL HOUSE WHERE THE FAMILY HEAD RESIDES. THE HOUSES ARE SIMPLE RECTANGULAR TYPES OF PASTER-COVERED BRICK, WITH ROOFS, AND DOORS, IT COME WITH PLEASING EFFECT.

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SEPTEMBER 11 OF 1964

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(PAPA) LERKOVAC IS ALSO THE HOME OF AN INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN WOOD SCULPTOR, GOLUSAY ZIVKOVIC (GO-GO-SAY ZHIV-KO-VEETCH), REPRESENTATIVE OF THAT BREED OF YUGOSLAV PEASANT-FARMER-ARTISTS WHO HAVE GIVEN RISE TO YUGOSLAVIA'S DISTINCTIVE SCHOOL OF LAKE ART. ZIVKOVIC BEGAN AS A SIMPLE FARMER-SCULPTOR ONLY IN HIS SPARE TIME. NOW IN HIS EARLY FIFTIES, HE DEVOTES ALMOST ALL HIS TIME TO SCULPTING. USING PEASANT THEMES, DREAMS, AND VILLAGE LIFE AS HIS SUBJECTS, ZIVKOVIC EVOKES THE PATHOS AS WELL AS THE SIMPLE JOYS OF VILLAGE LIFE IN A STYLE WHICH IS AT ONCE SIMPLE, BOLD, AND SOPHISTICATED.

(PARA) ZIVKOVIC'S MAIN WORKS ARE CARVED ON SEVEN-FOOT TREE STUMPS, WHICH ARE THEN STAINED AND OILED, BUT HE ALSO DOES SMALLER WORKS WHICH HE SELLS AT ANYWHERE FROM 40 DOLLARS TO SEVERAL THOUSAND DOLLARS. ZIVKOVIC HAS TURNED HIS FLEET AND GREENERY-FILLED YARD INTO A SCULPTURE GARDEN FEATURING BOTH HIS WORKS AS WELL AS ANTIQUE FARM IMPLEMENTS, ICONS, AND INTERESTING NATURAL OBJECTS WHICH HAVE CAUGHT HIS ARTISTIC EYE.

(PADA) IN VILLAGE OF LESKOVAC AND ZIVKOVIC'S FARM-
STUDIO ARE ONLY A 20-MINUTE DRIVE FROM BELGRADE, FOUR KILO-
METERS OFF THE MAIN ROAD TO CACAK.

B. NOVI BEGRUPO MUNICIPAL COMMUNITY:

(PARA) THIS IS A PAINY-SAY ALTERNATIVE TO LEGKOVAC
FOR HRS. CARTER TO VISIT JUNE 24.

(PAPA) THIS NOVI BEGRAD COMMUNE IS AN ATTRACTIVE BUILDING COMPLEX IN NEW BELGRADE -- LOCATED JUST ACROSS THE SAVA RIVER -- WHICH CREATES A SELF-CONTAINED, MODEL COMMUNITY WITHIN THE LARGER CITY, DESIGNED ENTIRELY BY YUGOSLAV ARCHITECTS AND CONSTRUCTED IN THE EARLY 1970S. THE COMPLEX HOUSES SOME 18,000 RESIDENTS AND CONSISTS OF SEVERAL APARTMENT HIGH-RISES, A SMALL SHOPPING CENTER, PLAYGROUNDS, PUBLIC MEETING HALL,

OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES, AN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL (GRADES 1 - 4), AND A GYMNASIUM FOR THE OF WORKING PARENTS. THE 1000-STUDENT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IS ESPECIALLY INTERESTING AS AN EXAMPLE OF FUNCTIONAL MODERN ARCHITECTURE USING BRICK, GLASS, AND COLOR WITH GREAT EFFECT. IT COMPARES WELL WITH THE BEST SCHOOLS IN THE WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN AREA. THE NURSERY WHICH ACCOMMODATES APPROXIMATELY 100 CHILDREN, IS ALSO WELL-APPOINTED AND WELL-RUN AND WORTHY FOR ITS LOW COST TO THE PARENTS -- LESS THAN 14 DOLLARS PER WORKING DAY.

(PARA) TYPICAL OF YUGOSLAVIA'S UNIQUE BRAND OF SOCIALISM, WHICH EMPHASIZED THE SOCIAL AS OPPOSED TO THE STATE SECTOR, THE APARTMENT COMPLEX WAS FINANCED BY CONTRIBUTIONS FROM VARIOUS ENTERPRISES AS WELL AS GOVERNMENT AND SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS. SOME OF THE APARTMENTS ARE INDIVIDUALLY OWNED, BUT MOST ARE OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY THE ENTERPRISES OR INSTITUTIONS IN PROPORTION TO THE AMOUNT OF FINANCING THEY PROVIDED. THESE ORGANIZATIONS, IN TURN, ON THE BASIS OF GUIDELINES ESTABLISHED BY THEIR WORKERS' COUNCILS, LEASE OUT INDIVIDUAL APARTMENTS TO THEIR EMPLOYEES AT LOW, SUBSIDIZED RENTS. MILITARY FAMILIES COMPRISE AN IMPORTANT ELEMENT OF THE NOVI BEGRAD COMMUNE.

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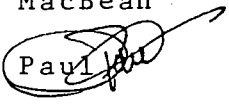

RE: Proposed schedule for Italy

Attached is the proposed schedule for the First Lady and Amy in Italy.

Because of her past visits to Rome and the fact that she will be with the President during his extensive ^{public} activities there, we are only proposing one separate event in Rome: a luncheon hosted by Mrs. Gardner at Villa Taverna. The guests would include 50-60 prominent Italians from the government, the arts, business, and the media.

The proposed Venice schedule has taken into consideration the activities of the participants at the Summit, ie. when we would be able to maximize press coverage. We have proposed that the "media event" take place on Sunday which will be a rather slow day at the summit consisting of only photo sessions.

The tour of the canals could be done with a small boat for RSC and Amy (around 10-15 seats), a VIP boat if needed, a press barge for stills and TV cameras and a small boat for writers. Since the canals that we have proposed are small, a large boat could not maneuver in these canals.

Along the tour we propose three stops: 1) gondola factory on a small canal; 2) murano glass showroom and 3) Guggenheim Museum.

The press arrangements could work as follows: at the gondola factory, RSC and Amy would disembark and proceed to a outside ramp on the canal and view a display of the craft, press would stay on their boats with the barge serving as a press platform. The display could be positioned so that the press would only be around 25' away. The Guggenheim and the glass show room would be limited to a small pool.

We also propose that RSC and Amy ride a gondola from the Guggenheim to the glass showroom. This is approx. 100 yards but is on the Grand Canal and would be easy for press pictures.

The tour would conclude at St. Mark's Plaza, hopefully arriving or departing on the hour so they could view the striking of the clock bell tower by the two Moor statues. A brief tour of the Ducal Palace at the Plaza is recommended.

Both of us thought that the Holocaust Memorial in the Jewish ghetto was quite moving in its simplicity. We recommend that RSC visit the memorial on Monday morning. Within the ghetto and close to the memorial are a senior citizens home, a day-care center and a community center. A visit to the Jewish ghetto could include an event at one of the above.

We discovered that ABC-TV is going to do a piece on the memorial irregardless of any visit by a principal. Even a brief visit by RSC to the memorial would mean that they would use her visit there in a Jewish ghetto story.

As the schedule notes, Amb. Gardner recommends that RSC visit the Biennale Exhibit of "Art of the 70's." We recommend that this be done on Monday afternoon when press will be busy with the summit. There is not much there for a picture so we would like to schedule it at a time when there would be little press interest away from the actual summit.

Located on an end of a large square in the "new" ghetto, this memorial, which was dedicated in late April, commemorates the 200 Venetian Jews who were carried off to concentration camps in 1944 and 1945. The extremely simple, very moving memorial consists of bronze bas reliefs on a stark wall topped by barbed wire. Adjacent to the memorial is a Jewish home for the aged; nearby are the Scuola Levantina, an old synagogue now a museum; a Jewish community center; a working synagogue; and a day-care center. ABC is planning to do a spot on the memorial during the Venice Summit, regardless of any visit by a principal. A short stop by Mrs. Carter on Monday morning would guarantee tape footage in the ABC piece.

Afternoon Possible unscheduled stop at Biennale Exhibit.

Ambassador Gardner strongly recommends at least a brief visit to the Italian and American pavilions of this international art exposition, which is located in a park near the Public Gardens. This year's theme is "Art of the '70's." The U.S. exhibit, housed in a small replica of Monticello, will highlight American pop art. Since the exhibit would be difficult for press to cover, we recommend that the tour, if scheduled, be done in the afternoon at which time press will be tied up at the Summit for the principal statements.
