I. PURPOSE

You will unveil a \$35 million investment in your FY 2001 budget to prevent unintended pregnancy and to ensure access to safe, high quality family planning services for American women.

You will also highlight a \$141 million investment in your FY 2001 budget to assist overseas family planning efforts.

II. BACKGROUND

The \$35 million investment, which represents a 15 percent increase over FY 2000 funding levels, is the largest funding increase since 1973.

The new funds will be used to prevent over a million unintended pregnancies per year. The investments will be used to increase accessibility of contraceptive counseling and services to women nationwide; to provide affordable contraceptive services to women of low income households; and to develop partnerships with community-based providers that conduct outreach to adolescents and high-risk populations.

Funds will also be used to improve the delivery of comprehensive reproductive health services, including sexually transmitted disease, HIV, and cancer screening and prevention.

You will also highlight a new investment of \$141 million, a 35 percent increase over last year's funding level, to assist family planning efforts overseas in the FY 2001 budget.
