SUBJECT: STATUS REPORT FOR FIRST LADY'S
CORRESPONDENCE

This report covers the period from March 14, 1994 through March 28, 1994. The report includes information about (i) the volume of mail received and produced by the Office of First Lady's Correspondence; and (ii) the Greetings Report.

Attached are the daily production reports for the time period and folders containing letters which are representative of those reviewed during the period.

During the period we received 5284 pieces of correspondence addressed to the First Lady. The average number of letters received daily has decreased from 460 to 440. Approximately 1500 letters received by this office were for the Health Care Reform Information Center. Another 1000 letters were forwarded to other offices or required no response. We responded to 2911 letters during the time period.

Approximately ~~5200~~ coded letters await a response and another 500 letters are in the data entry and proofing stages.

The Health Care Information Center is now operating at 1800 G Street. A liaison, Buddy Menn, has been assigned by Greg Lawler, who reports to Harrold Ickes, to coordinate the work of the agency representatives at this site. The Offices of First Lady's Correspondence, Presidential Correspondence, Domestic Policy, and the Health Care Delivery room are working with Buddy in a joint effort to oversee this operation. The goal for this week is to process the 7,210 letters which have been backlogged since 1993. The responses to these letters will be signed by Ira Magaziner. There will be a phone bank answering operation somewhat similar to the Presidential Correspondence Comment Line, which will be staffed by volunteers and supervised by the Agency Representatives. 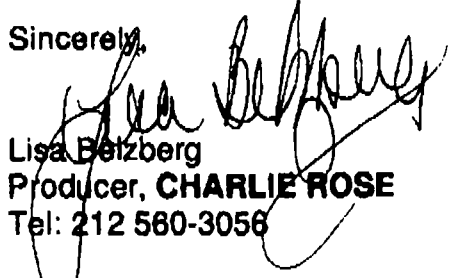

Dear President and Mrs. Clinton:

We are writing to inform you that the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports (PCPFS) has decided not to proceed with the Great American Workout (tentatively scheduled for May 2 on the South Lawn of the White House) -- an event we previously discussed with both of you personally on separate occasions. Although we embarked on the initial planning process, this decision was reached after critically evaluating our long-term objectives.

This is a new administration, with new leadership, and new messages. It is incumbent upon us to concentrate our efforts on those areas with greater substantive payoff for the White House, the Department of Health and Human Services, our constituents, and the American people -- health care reform, national service, crime and violence -- to name only a few. Our goals however, can only be met through careful allocation of staff, time, and resources. Clearly these are similar choices many government program offices are currently making. We would much prefer to use allocated funds or ask corporate sponsors to help with projects that get kids off the street, than to pay for a one-time event in Washington. We believe many would agree.

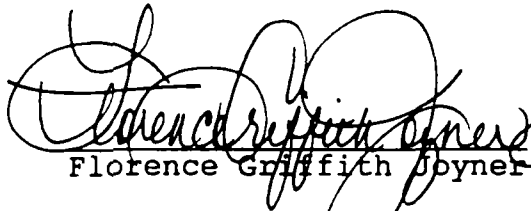
As you may know, May is National Physical Fitness and Sports Month. The President's Council has embarked on a rather aggressive and visible campaign that brings federal and organizational leaders together promoting physical activity and personal responsibility for improved health, performance and safety. It is our hope that the morning of May 2 would be reserved for the time you would agree to swear-in our newly appointed Council Members in the Rose Garden. Symbolically this ceremony would kick-off the May activities taking place throughout the country. We

would like to hold our first meeting of the Council that day, so we may begin our important work for the Administration.

We have asked our Executive Director, Sandra Perlmutter, to work closely with the PCPFS White House liaison, Mark Middleton and Director of Scheduling, Ricki Seidman. Scheduling this important ceremony on the morning of May 2 would be particularly helpful to our message and would afford the opportunity for our Council to learn just how important their mission is.

We look forward to seeing you on April 13 during the very exciting Olympic activities.

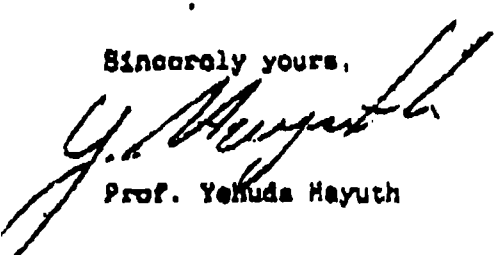

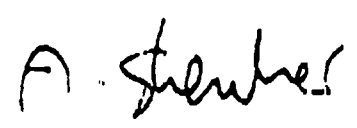

I'm telling
you... I love
California.
I'm leaving.'

Gardels, 41, is editor of *New Perspectives Quarterly*. He and his family—wife, Lilli, and sons Alex, 3, and Carlos, 6—lived in Woodland Hills, but they left town right after the quake. He was interviewed by phone from Milan, Italy.

At 4:31 in the morning, all lights were off, it's pitch-black. I immediately jump up, ask my wife to get the younger son to hide in a doorway. The TV set is the first thing that falls on my leg as I'm running out of the bedroom in pitch blackness. We have a linen closet that opens horizontally. I run into closets. I can't see. I have bruises all over my body.

The roar is deafening, like a jet taking off, like a train going by. We huddle until the first shock is over. It seems interminable. The doors have flown open. There's one flashlight downstairs; it's very weak.

I start fishing then, saying OK, there are batteries in some of the kids' toys. I discover everything has fallen out of their closets. The toys with the batteries I need are buried under 10,000 other toys that have fallen from the shelves. I make my way back to the table. Meanwhile, aftershock after aftershock is happening every time I stand up. I'm searching in the dark for my glasses, then I'm trying to go downstairs to get more flashlights.

Then I discover the ruins. The walls are cracked in 15 places, there are 2,000 books strewn across the floor. All the crystal is broken. There's wall-to-wall glass and debris on the floor. It is now 5:30. I can't see a thing.

I walk barefoot over glass and debris in a state of semi-shock. I go outside to turn off the gas. The wrench was hanging there already. I have a pool, 40 feet from my house. There has, in effect, been a tidal wave. It washed all the planted flowers, lifted them up by the roots and

washed them onto the patio, 40 feet away, knocked over huge pots with palm trees, broken. There are more aftershocks.

Finally, it's 6:30 and getting light enough to see. The fireplace is cracked to smithereens. I have 13 rooms in the house, each one with major cracks. Plaster is falling off the walls. Italian vases, everything shattered. All the spices are out of the cabinets. Honey mixed with coarse ground pepper and vinegar. It's a total mess.

Your first instinct is to start cleaning up. You don't know where to begin. Every book is out of the shelf. Every pot is broken. Every dish has fallen out. And every time you start to move, there's an aftershock. We cleaned up a bit, then sat outside and just stared into space.

We kept the kids away from the chimney. We talked to neighbors to assess the damage. I went to see the blind lady down the street—she's alone—to see if she needed help. Who knows where the day went? It's 3, 4, getting dark; gee, we'd better start getting ready for darkness.

We pitch a tent in the back yard, put out candles, a bottle of water. We get the kids dressed in two, three layers of clothes and prepare to sleep outside. That we did until 8 o'clock. We were singing campfire songs. It was incredible to see the stars. Usually, there are so many lights in L.A. you can't see the stars. Too much light refracting in the sky. It was pitch-black. We saw shooting stars.

It was cold. Then we got a call from my brother-in-law. He said the 101's finally open, you should come up here. Their house was not damaged at all. We didn't take two seconds. We drove with great trepidation along the 101, imagining at every turn that the freeway would break apart and we'd fall through a crevice.

had to go to Europe (on business). I was going to stay, but the schools were closed. We can't live in the house; the chimney is dangerous. A beam across the living room could be structurally unsound. We can't get ahold of a building inspector to check it.

We were terrified of going back in the house. I read the L.A. Times; I read the scientists' analysis, the pattern of the earthquake moving northwest to the San Andreas Fault. I didn't want my family in California when I was out of town. I would have no peace of mind. I couldn't do my work.

I frankly am so freaked out, but I'm not, generally speaking, a neurotic person. The pattern was so clear. The Big One could come tomorrow, in two days, two weeks, two years. If this one wasn't the Big One, I can be sure the house would not be standing in the Big One. So let's get out of there, look for another place to live, maybe the suburbs outside of Washington.

People who didn't go through this damage, like friends of mine in Redondo Beach or Orange County, it's like just another earthquake to them. For those who experience it, it is like you don't want to wait for the Big One.

It breaks my heart to leave. I worked in Gov. Jerry Brown's office; I work with institutes to think about the Pacific Basin. I'm a promoter of California. But it's not worth it.

[On Wednesday] I'm out there cleaning the house, the sun is glinting on the pool, the garden is blooming, the grass is green. It's beautiful. It's paradise. It's lovely. Nice Mediterranean style. It's perfect.

And you start thinking, Jesus, this is a shame. Is this real? And all you have to have is another 6.5 aftershock. That day we did. Five in a row. And I said, I'm out of here.

At any moment the Big One could strike. Talk about writing on the walls. There is writing all over the walls on my house. The writing is all over the sagging walls of my house.

The financial aftershocks—this quake shook every ounce of equity out of my house. In California, you save by buying a home. You get equity, you sell, move on, move up. This has wiped out the effective savings of a big chunk of the middle class.

It didn't wipe me out. I have to put 20 grand up front to fix my house; I'll get 40 or 50 from the insurance company. I'll be putting 80 grand into a house which is going to sell below what I bought it at. You should say I live in a beautiful two-story home with a large pool on one-third of an acre. It's available at a good price, a \$400,000 house.

I'm telling you two statements; I love California. I'm leaving.

Every time you get ready to go to sleep, you feel something, a truck going by. The adrenaline starts rushing. I'm a cliché. [After the quake] the kids were not out of my sight the whole time I was in California. I slept with them, ate with them. Everybody was in the car with me.

You've heard the voice of a rational man who's in terror.

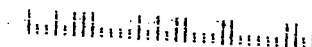

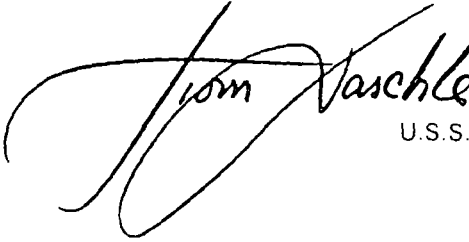

Sometimes when you are so close to a situation - especially in Washington - you lose focus of the issue. I'm a good politician - one of the best you have. I've had more negative publicity from the press in my day than you could possibly imagine. School busing, abortion, too Catholic, too Irish, whatever. But you know what, I've never let the hostile press affect election results that I've been in. Never let them turn you around on an issue. If they feel that they can reach you, they'll never let go. This Watergate - Whitewater - and the attack on Hillary is complete bullshit, making the public think that some big con or cover up is going on. It's irresponsible. The press has incredible power in the United States, it can mold public opinion. It is even more powerful than government or religion - the Pope or the President it doesn't matter. It attacks the Catholic Church because it can't change their conservative policies. It attacks and even tries to cripple the Presidency and Congress to keep them in low esteem with the public.

You've got two issues:

1. You and Hillary are taking on the powerful and well connected insurance and medical industries. You're right in doing it but understand how powerful they are and will do everything to protect the status quo (which is to their financial interest).
2. The media wants complete access to you and your government, records, files and now they even want what you and your attorney are talking about. They will push you and if they think they can force you to cave in, they'll keep at it. No stopping traffic or limousines parked all over the place. No governor's, mayors, senators, etc. - just regular people. No White House meetings to discuss new strategy (it will only get leaked). Run the White House like you lost it.

I have many other opinions and as always I'm prepared to help you any way I can.

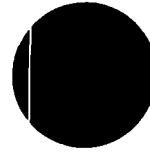

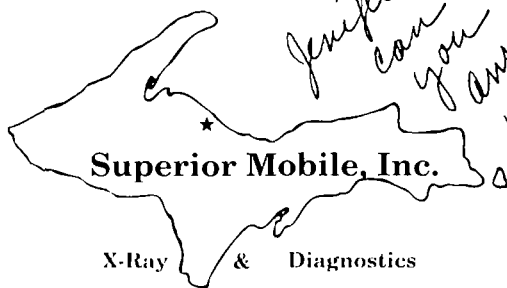

I would very much like the opportunity to ask Mrs. Clinton a couple of questions and she in turn could relay them to the head of H.C.F.A.

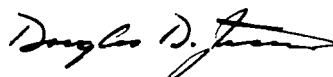
1. If health care services for the elderly are being cut in 1994, what is going to happen in five years when there will be three times as many seniors needing these same types of services?!

Dear Mrs. Clinton:

I am writing to offer a perspective of our health-care system from my view as a practicing doctor. As you will see from reading the two letters I have attached hereto, I have been attempting to obtain payment for professional services I provided to a Tennessee Medicaid insured some fifteen months ago. Attempts to reach the offices of Provider Relations at the Bureau of Medicaid have been futile, resulting in my office having submitted this claim on four separate occasions.

That the efficiency of Tennessee Medicaid is poor is not the important issue in this matter. That I have written to Governor Ned McWherter, Senator Jim Sasser, and Congressman Harold Ford and have yet to receive a response from any of these gentlemen is not even significant. What is of greater relevance is the sentiment that this matter generates in my mind and in the minds of other physicians who I have discussed this with and who report similar difficulties in treating impoverished patients. How will we be able to provide quality health-care to our citizens if those who must provide the care are not treated reasonably.

I must, in the strongest manner, convey my support for your and the President's effort to improve our nation's health-care system. While certainly not a popular topic among many doctors, let me assure you that there are those who share your vision for a system that will provide medical care for all of our citizens. As I noted to Governor McWherter though, we must not lose sight of an issue of equal importance—that is making certain those who will provide the care for such patients be not just minimally qualified, but men and women of professional stature who will be enthusiastic about treating these patients. I recalled to him the thoughts of a patient I had treated recently, who in discussing this very issue put it very succinctly when she asked what good it would do to feed the hungry with food that did not taste good. In weighing the decision to become a provider in the new TennCare system, it was a sense of moral obligation and professional duty that caused me to enlist. As the incoming President of the Tennessee Podiatric Medical Association, it was my hope that by enlisting, I might induce others to enlist as well. It now seems that this decision might have been a poor one if this experience with Tennessee Medicaid is any example of how our new program will function. I welcome treating those patients who need my services, but it is not unreasonable to expect to be paid for such services.

While I had asked that Governor McWherter, Senator Sasser and Congressman Ford use their authority to facilitate this matter, I shall not ask the same of you. I would ask though, that as you assist the President in connection with the overwhelming task of health-care reform that you keep in mind the issue of quality of care. A system that will utilize professionals of lesser stature or those of only minimal qualification, because all of the other doctors do not want to see "these patients" is very much like feeding the hungry with food that does not taste good.

I wish you and the President my very best in all your efforts. May you be guided by wisdom and fairness as you lead our country.

It is absolutely astounding to me that even after six hours of repeated dialing, your office can not be reached. Though my experiences with Medicaid are admittedly limited, I can see why there are those who view the efficiency of Medicaid with such disdain.

My reason for writing you concerns failure to receive payment in connection with services I provided to one of your insured captioned above. Mrs. Foster was operated by me on October 8, 1992. Yes, that is correct, **OCTOBER 8, 1992.** Can you imagine if the State of Tennessee somehow incorrectly processed your paycheck for this length of time. Again I must say, I certainly can imagine why there are those who refuse to have anything to do with Medicaid.

You will recall that my office manager, Mrs. Janice Jackson attended the TMA sponsored insurance workshop on November 4, 1993 and spoke with you regarding this case. My office has filed this same claim on 2/4/93, 3/14/93, 7/22/93 and then sent it directly to you on 12/22/93. Now what is the excuse for this sort of inefficiency. Please let me know what is holding up the process, and after doing so please provide payment for my services. I know the readers of the Commercial Appeal would just love to hear this tale in a letter to the editor. While I thought it my professional responsibility to enlist as a TennCare provider, I would hope that payment for services would be managed in a more effective manner.

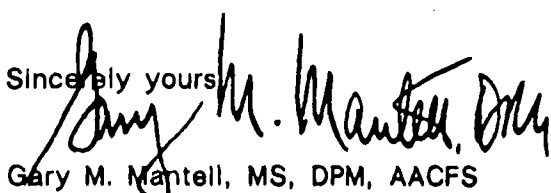
Attached you will find a copy of a letter I sent to the office of Professional Relations at the Bureau of Medicaid regarding failure to process payment for professional services I provided to a Medicaid insured dating back till October of 1992. As you will see, this claim has been submitted to Medicaid on four separate occasions.

I know you are deeply committed to participating in the current wave of healthcare reform. The notion of providing medical insurance to all citizens is indeed noble, and I commend your dedication to this effort. We must not allow ourselves to become so focused on the issue of universal coverage, that we lose sight of something which is just as important—that is quality of care. If we are to enlist dedicated healthcare professionals of stature, we must make certain that they receive equitable compensation. I heard it put more succinctly when the other day, a patient in discussing this very issue asked what good it would do to feed the hungry with food that did not taste good. Having to wait 15 months for payment is clearly unreasonable.

As I mention in my letter, I elected to become a provider in TennCare out of a sense of professional duty. I shall be serving as President of the Tennessee Podiatric Medical Association beginning this May, with the hope that my enlisting might motivate others to participate. I hope that I will not regret this decision. If this experience with Medicaid is any example of how our new program will operate, I can not see remaining an enthusiastic participant. I would deeply appreciate your using your authority to facilitate this matter.

REQUEST: For the President to meet with the nation's 500
Tribal Leaders

PURPOSE: Over 500 Tribal Leaders will accommodate the
President's schedule between now and April 15, to have
him join with them to establish and develop a good and
effective working relationship with the entire Clinton
Administration.

BACKGROUND: The President has expressed a strong interest in
holding this meeting, including a statement that was
taped in San Diego, (that Donsia Strong has seen), that
he planned to meet with tribal leaders. There have
also been a significant number of press inquiries about
the possibilities of this meeting.

The tribal leaders feel that a meeting with the
President was promised to them during the campaign.
Many of the tribal governments have sent letters
requesting and supporting the President move forth with
this meeting.

I have submitted approximately nine requests since May
11, 1993, before many of their issues of concern became
controversial. Now another big political problem can,
and should, be avoided by having this meeting prior to
the Attorney General's proposed "Listening Conference"
planned for Albuquerque in early May.*

I have been meeting regularly with a representative
planning group of the tribal leadership to make sure
they understand that this White House meeting will not
have a question and answer period. We have also
explained to them that we would like to have our Indian
policy closer to completion.

I have been in discussion with Ann Stock about this meeting since April of 1993. She has always been in favor of hosting such a meeting, and has only needed a date from Scheduling to begin planning. She has advised the members of the planning group of the cost of a tent rental if the event is to be held on the White House lawn, and they have the funds. The event could be also held in the residence, (similar to the New Hampshire function last week.)

We need to give the tribal leaders a minimum of two weeks to allow them the opportunity to get the best air fares and hotel reservations, and this would allow us the opportunity to get White House invitations out. We can expect between 90 and 95 percent of the tribal leaders to attend.

Request: Schedule Proposal for School-to-Work Bill Signing

Purpose: The purpose of the event is to draw public attention to the President's fulfillment of his campaign promises on youth apprenticeship and to highlight what the President is doing to help kids get good jobs.

Background: The School-to-Work Opportunities Act Conference Agreement is expected to pass the House and Senate in the next few weeks. This bill promotes the formation of a nationwide school-to-work system to assist students in making the transition from school to a good first job on a higher wage, higher skill career track. By combining learning at the work-site with classroom learning, these programs establish a partnership between schools and employers and prepare students for high quality jobs requiring technical skills and further education and training.

Previous Participation: In late August 1993 the President and Secretaries Reich and Riley announced the transmittal of the School-to-Work Opportunities Act to Congress.

Date and Time: Late March/Early April

Duration: One hour

Location: The White House: East Room or South Lawn. Or, if we have a bigger event, we could go to another larger site in Washington, D.C.

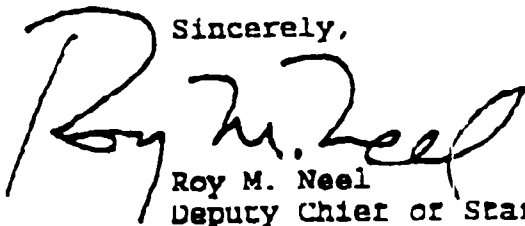
