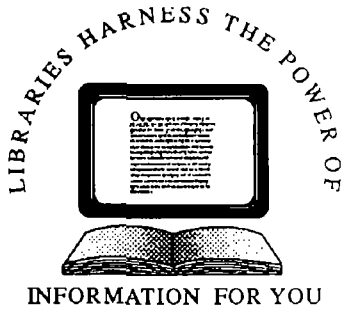

EDGARTOWN, Mass. - The White House elaborated Wednesday on its decision to send first lady Hillary Rodham Clinton and not the president to Princess Diana's funeral in London on Saturday.

Spokesman Joe Lockhart corrected his statement of Tuesday to say that Mrs. Clinton, along with the U.S. ambassador to Britain, retired Adm. William Crowe, will officially represent the United States at the ceremony.

Mrs. Clinton's visit will not be purely personal, as he had said. But Mr. Lockhart stressed that the first lady's attendance is because of her personal ties to the princess. The two have met a handful of times.

The spokesman repeated that Buckingham Palace and the Spencer family had decided to invite Mrs. Clinton, not the president. But he emphasized that the invitation was issued "in consultation" with U.S. officials and that President Clinton had spoken with British Prime ...
