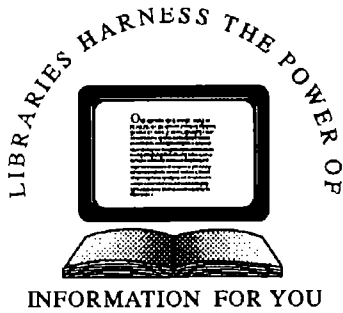

In a recent interview for her milestone birthday, **Mrs. Clinton** also says she feels young, happy, content and optimistic about her life.

"Over time, I have become more patient, humbler and ...

... exception. But when you strip it all away, Dr. Ramey's slogan has been a powerful influence on me."

So how does **Mrs. Clinton** feel about turning 50?

"I have to confess to you . . . being a half-century old is a little daunting. . . . But I hope to live to be a century old. . .

."

During the 50-minute interview in the Map Room of the White House, **Mrs. Clinton** reflects on her childhood, her parents, her husband and her legacy. And on what she might have done differently. She also reveals her birthday wishes, as well as how she ...

... saying, This is hopeless.

Stick to English.' "

In her book, *It Takes a Village*, the narration of which won her a Grammy Award, **Mrs. Clinton** writes that her parents dedicated their time, energy and money to their children.

Her mother and father had different approaches to character-building, but both ...

... wanted to be the "lead actor" in her life or a "minor player who simply reacts to what other think" she should say or do.

That question, **Mrs. Clinton** says, has enabled her to get through many



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difficult times.
In good stead

"Keeping that in mind has been very helpful to me over the ...

... shovel as a constant reminder that she is well equipped to deal with
"what life has sent my way and, when necessary, to shovel myself out."

Mrs. Clinton also remembers her mother saying, "Your father and I will always love you even when we do not approve of what you do."

We just hope you will ...

... I living up to my own expectations? Am I treating others the way I would want to be treated?"

How does **Mrs. Clinton** cope today with the problems swirling around her?

"I've been fortunate," she says. "I feel very loved and have a strong faith that has helped ...

... for me . . . looking at the brighter side of things and looking at the absurd parts of human nature have to keep you balanced and going."

Mrs. Clinton has this advice for women on coping with stress:

"Take stock of your life and value what you have.

"Where you can change something to make you ...

... most significant accomplishment in his 50 years.

"Convincing Hillary to marry me," he said. "That changed everything."

Reminded of her husband's answer, **Mrs. Clinton** says: "That's good, because the most significant decision in my 50 years was being convinced to marry Bill Clinton."

Mrs. Clinton says she hasn't taken stock of how living in the White House has changed her.

"But I'm sure I have changed," she ...

... towards others for their own personal, political, ideological or commercial reasons."

If she were granted three wishes for her 50th birthday, what would **Mrs. Clinton** wish for?

"The first would be world peace," she told me. "Seriously, I wish that between my birthday and say, the end of the year, we could ...
