Mrs. Clinton, making her first extended comments on the crisis, reverted to the form she displayed in 1992, when her husband was accused of having an affair with ...

"Bill and I have been accused of everything, including murder, by some of the very same people who are behind these allegations," **Mrs. Clinton** said on NBC's "Today" show, referring to suggestions by some that she and her husband had something to do with the death of former White House ...

... Foster, which was ruled a suicide.

"So, from my perspective, this is part of a continuing political campaign against my husband," **Mrs. Clinton** said. Asked if the public should demand the resignation of a president who has an affair and lied about it, the first lady ...

... Ginsburg, said he was waiting to hear from Starr: "I'm waiting for Mr. Starr . . . for his staff to respond, and then we will talk."

Mrs. Clinton, in blaming the allegations on a right-wing conspiracy, charged that a loosely coordinated group of people who dislike her husband want to "undo" his two elections as president.

When Starr came up empty-handed in the Foster and Whitewater investigations, said **Mrs. Clinton**, the independent counsel began to dig for "dirt" in the Clintons' private life.

Lawyers involved in the case scoffed at **Mrs. Clinton's** allegation of a conspiracy against her husband.

"Show us the facts. Who conspired where? Who's conspiring to do what? Who are these people they are talking ...
