1. SUMMARY: THE 19TH SESSION OF THE EMPLOYMENT, LABOR AND SOCIAL AFFAIRS (ELSA) COMMITTEE'S WORKING PARTY ON THE ROLE OF WOMEN IN THE ECONOMY CONVENED IN PARIS, OCTOBER 6-7, 1994. A PRINCIPAL THEME OF THE MEETING WAS THE NEED FOR MAINSTREAMING WOMEN'S CONCERNS MORE DEEPLY INTO THE WORK OF THE OECD. EXAMPLES INCLUDED THE LACK OF GENDER ANALYSIS INITIALLY IN THE OECD JOBS STUDY, AND REPORTS FROM OTHER WORKING PARTIES THAT DEMONSTRATED THE VALUE OF SUCH ANALYSIS. THE ISSUANCE OF THE FIRST OECD COUNCIL RESOLUTION AND ACTION PLAN ON EQUAL OPPORTUNITY WAS ALSO A HIGHLIGHT OF THE MEETING. FULL AND SUBSTANTIVE DISCUSSION ALSO TOOK PLACE ON THE FOLLOWING AGENDA ITEMS: EMPLOYMENT/UNEMPLOYMENT STUDY; REPORT OF THE WORKING PARTY TO THE COUNCIL; PARENTAL LEAVE; THE PROGRAM OF WORK FOR 1995-96; THE FUTURE OF "TRADITIONAL" WOMEN'S PROFESSIONS; ACTIVITIES OF OTHER WORKING PARTIES; EQUAL OPPORTUNITY IN THE SECRETARIAT; AND THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN. END SUMMARY.

2. EMPLOYMENT/UNEMPLOYMENT STUDY: DISCUSSION REFLECTED GENERAL DISSATISFACTION WITH THE JOBS STUDY BECAUSE IT

DISPLAYED AN ALMOST COMPLETE LACK OF SENSITIVITY TO THE DIFFERENT EXPERIENCES OF WOMEN, FAILING FOR EXAMPLE TO PUBLISH GENDER-SPECIFIC STATISTICS AND ANALYSIS. THE SECRETARIAT ASSURED DELEGATES THAT FOLLOW-UP REPORTS AND ACTIVITIES WOULD BE REVIEWED TO ASSURE GREATER GENDER SENSITIVITY, AND THAT IT WOULD DRAW ON THE WORK OF THE WP WHERE APPROPRIATE. PART OF FUTURE WORK WILL ENTAIL DEFINING CONTINGENT WORK. THIS ITEM WAS OF GREAT INTEREST TO USDEL IN VIEW OF A RELEVANT DEPARTMENT OF LABOR STUDY. DELEGATES WERE MOST INTERESTED IN THE PORTION OF REPORT ADDRESSING "MAINSTREAMING". THIS TOPIC RESURFACED THROUGHOUT THE TWO-DAY MEETING.

3. REPORT TO THE COUNCIL: THE WP REVIEWED A DRAFT TEXT OF ITS PERIODIC REPORT TO THE OECD COUNCIL, AS REQUIRED BY ITS MANDATE. THE TEXT WAS GENERALLY ACCEPTABLE, BUT CHANGES WERE SUGGESTED IN A FEW AREAS, IN PARTICULAR THE SECTION DEALING WITH THE EMPLOYMENT OUTLOOK. THE REPORT TO THE COUNCIL WILL BE USED AS THE BASIS FOR FUTURE WORK AND WILL ADD TO THE HISTORICAL DOCUMENTATION OF WORKING PARTY ACTIVITIES. THE FINAL VERSION WILL BE CIRCULATED TO BUREAU MEMBERS FOR APPROVAL BEFORE IT IS SENT TO THE COUNCIL.

4. PARENTAL LEAVE: A SURVEY OF OECD COUNTRIES REVEALED THAT 18 HAVE SOME LEGISLATION PERTAINING TO PARENTAL LEAVE. RESULTS OF THE SURVEY, UPDATED TO JANUARY 1995, WILL APPEAR IN AN ARTICLE IN EMPLOYMENT OUTLOOK IN 1995. THIS STUDY PROVED USEFUL FOR MOST MEMBER COUNTRIES WHOSE LEGISLATION IS RELATIVELY NEW. IN ADDITION, THE WP ON EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS IS STUDYING STATISTICAL DATA ON PARENTAL LEAVE FOR FURTHER ANALYSIS.

5. "VO-TECH" ACTIVITY: THE WP'S WORK ON THE CHANGING ROLE OF VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING AMPLIFIES THE WORK OF THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE TO INCLUDE WOMEN'S CONCERNS. SEVENTEEN COUNTRIES INDICATED THEY DO (OR ARE CONSIDERING) GIVE CREDIT IN THE LABOR MARKET FOR LIFE SKILLS ACQUISITION. THE USDEL SHARED THE U.S. UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 PARIS 28576

VOLUNTARY SKILLS STANDARDS INFORMATION WITH THE WP. THE FINAL REPORT ON THE "VOTEC" WORK PLUS THE RESULTS OF THE JUNE MEETING OF EXPERTS ON CHALLENGES FOR WOMEN WILL BE SUBMITTED TO THE SPRING 1995 MEETINGS OF THE EDUCATION

COMMITTEE AND THE ELSA COMMITTEE.

6. PROGRAM OF WORK, 1995-96: A NEW ACTIVITY--THE FUTURE OF "TRADITIONAL" WOMEN'S PROFESSIONS--WAS ACCEPTED BY THE WP. THE SECRETARIAT'S WILL DRAW ON ITS EXISTING RESOURCES TO CARRY OUT PHASE I: DEVELOPING COMPARABLE STATISTICS AND DEFINITIONS. INTERESTED MEMBERS WILL BE CONTACTED DIRECTLY ABOUT CONTRIBUTING RESOURCES NEEDED FOR COMPLETING PHASES II-IV OF THE PROJECT. BECAUSE OF BUDGET RESTRICTIONS, THIS WILL BE THE ONLY NEW WP ACTIVITY FOR THIS PROGRAM YEAR.

7. REPORTS ON RELATED OECD ACTIVITIES: THE WP HEARD REPORTS ON THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES OF OTHER OECD BODIES: THE URBAN AFFAIRS GROUP'S CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN THE CITY, OCTOBER 4-6, 1994; THE SOCIAL POLICY WP'S STUDY AND HIGH-LEVEL SEMINAR (JULY 5-6, 1994) ON CARING FOR THE FRAIL ELDERLY (BECAUSE WOMEN ACCOUNT FOR THE LARGEST SHARE OF THE GROWING ELDERLY POPULATION, THE WP WAS INTERESTED IN RECOMMENDATIONS FOR RETIREMENT INCOME, HEALTH CARE AND SERVICES TO THE OLD); THE PUBLIC MANAGEMENT SERVICE'S 1993 STUDY OF PERFORMANCE-RELATED PAY IN THE PUBLIC SECTOR AND A PROPOSED NEW STUDY ON RECENT STRUCTURAL CHANGES AND STAFFING PRACTICES (THE PMS WAS ENCOURAGED TO INCLUDE THE UNITED STATES IN THE NEW STUDY IN VIEW OF THE CURRENT PROCESS OF "REINVENTING GOVERNMENT" NOW UNDERWAY).

8. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY IN THE SECRETARIAT: THE WP REVIEWED AND COMMENDED THE COUNCIL'S RESOLUTION AND ACTION PLAN ON EQUAL OPPORTUNITY AT OECD. DELEGATES NOTED, HOWEVER, THAT THERE WAS NO FORMAL STATEMENT ON SEXUAL HARASSMENT BY MANAGEMENT. FURTHERMORE, THE INFORMAL RECRUITMENT OF STAFF NEEDS TO BE FORMALIZED TO OBTAIN GREATER DIVERSITY. DELEGATES WERE ASKED TO ASSIST IN RECRUITMENT. USDEL PLANS TO SHARE VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENTS RECEIVED FROM OECD WITH OPM. OECD REQUESTED ASSISTANCE IN FINDING DIVERSITY CONSULTANTS. NO EEO COORDINATOR HAS BEEN APPOINTED AND FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS ARE SO FAR NOT YET AVAILABLE IN THE BUDGET.

9. FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN: DELEGATES WERE GENERALLY DISAPPOINTED THAT THE ONLY OECD CONTRIBUTION TO THE WORLD CONFERENCE WILL BE ON WOMEN IN DEVELOPMENT, AND THAT NONE OF THE WP'S OUTPUT WILL BE SHARED WITH CONFERENCE DELEGATES IN BEIJING. THE SECRETARIAT NOTED THAT THE OECD DOES NOT HAVE OBSERVER STATUS AT THE UN.

10. OTHER BUSINESS: EEVA-LISA TUOMINEN, MINISTRY OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND HEALTH, FINLAND, WAS ELECTED PRESIDENT OF THE WORKING PARTY, AND JANET WHITAKER, EMPLOYMENT DEPARTMENT, UNITED KINGDOM, WAS ELECTED TO THE BUREAU WHEN BOTH GERMANY AND AUSTRALIA RESIGNED. THE NEW BUREAU CONSISTS OF THE REPRESENTATIVES OF FINLAND, UNITED KINGDOM, UNITED STATES, SPAIN, NETHERLANDS AND BELGIUM. NO SEPARATE MEETING OF THE BUREAU WAS HELD. REPRESENTATIVES OF MOST OF THE MEMBER COUNTRIES ATTENDED THE WP MEETING, INCLUDING TWO

REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE USDOL'S WOMEN'S BUREAU: DEPUTY  
DIRECTOR DELORES CROCKETT, AND HARRIETT HARPER OF THE  
STAFF.

SUBJECT: ICFTU CONFERENCE ON WOMEN--THE HAGUE, OCTOBER 25-28

1. THE ICFTU CONFERENCE TOOK PLACE UNDER THE SPONSORSHIP OF THE LARGEST LABOR FEDERATION IN THE NETHERLANDS, THE FNV, AND WITH THE THEME "MAKING THE VISION A REALITY." DUTCH FOREIGN MINISTER VAN MIERLO OPENED THE CONFERENCE TELLING THE DELEGATES WOMEN'S RIGHTS NEED SPECIAL PROTECTION BECAUSE WOMEN'S POSITION IN THE LABOR MARKET IS STILL WEAK, ESPECIALLY IN TIMES OF RECESSION. HE APPLAUDED PROGRESS MADE ON EQUAL TREATMENT AND THE ATTENTION NOW BEING PAID TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND TO THE DOUBLE BURDEN OF FAMILY AND WORK OFTEN CARRIED BY WOMEN. ICFTU HEAD ENZO FRISO AND FNV CHAIRMAN STEKELENBURG ALSO ADDRESSED THE OPENING SESSION. IN HER OPENING SPEECH, CONFERENCE CHAIRMAN MAMOUNATA CISSE FROM BURKINA FASO, SAID THE CONFERENCE WAS INTENDED TO BUILD INTERNATIONAL SOLIDARITY AND URGED PARTICIPANTS TO WORK TO ACHIEVE THE VISION OF AN EGALITARIAN, NON-DISCRIMINATORY SOCIETY. ALL THE MEETINGS WERE CLOSED TO NON-INVITED GUESTS, INCLUDING EMBASSIES.

AMBASSADOR HOSTS LUNCH  
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2. AMBASSADOR DORNBUSH AND DCM KLOSSON JOINTLY HOSTED A LUNCH FOR THE SIX AFL-CIO DELEGATES AND ONE AMERICAN (DIRECTOR OF AFME'S WOMEN'S DEPARTMENT) WHO IS ALSO WOMEN'S CHAIR IN PUBLIC SERVICES INTERNATIONAL. FNV CHAIRMAN ATTENDED AS DID REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE THIRD UNION FEDERATION OF MID-LEVEL PROFESSIONAL/WHITE COLLAR MHP AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC AND INCOMES POLICY IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOR. CNV, THE SECOND LARGEST TRADE UNION FEDERATION, WAS UNABLE TO SEND A

REPRESENTATIVE. THE LUNCH PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR A RELAXED EXCHANGE OF VIEWS ON ISSUES SUCH AS THE DIFFICULTY IN ORGANIZING HOME WORKERS (INCLUDING TELEWORKERS) AND MODERN DAY SWEAT SHOPS, UNIONS AND POLITICS HERE AND IN THE U.S., EDUCATING UNION MEMBERS ON NATIONAL AND UNION ISSUES, AND AFL-CIO ACTIVITIES IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND NORTHERN IRELAND. STEKELENBURG TOLD SOME OF THE AMERICAN GUESTS ABOUT THE DUTCH UNIONS' SUPPORT OF THE GATT TREATY/WTO AND LABOR RIGHTS AS PART OF INTERNATIONAL TRADE AGREEMENTS.

#### LABOR STANDARDS IN TRADE AGREEMENTS

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3. WE UNDERSTAND FROM PRESS REPORTS THAT CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS WERE DIVIDED ON THE ISSUE OF LABOR RIGHTS IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE AGREEMENTS WITH WOMEN FROM COUNTRIES LIKE INDIA AND SINGAPORE ARGUING AGAINST WHAT THEY SEE AS A U.S.-LED WESTERN PROTECTIONIST MEASURE.

#### BEIJING CONFERENCE

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4. EMBASSY LABOFF WAS GIVEN A READOUT OF THE MEETING BY ONE OF THE AMERICAN PARTICIPANTS. THE 400 WOMEN FROM 106 COUNTRIES HAD EXTENSIVE DISCUSSION IN THE PLENARY SESSIONS ON THE BEIJING WOMEN'S CONFERENCE. SOME DELEGATIONS WERE INTENT ON HAVING REPRESENTATION ON THEIR COUNTRIES' OFFICIAL DELEGATIONS; THE CANADIAN WOMEN WERE ALREADY ASSURED OF REPRESENTATION. THE AFL-CIO, BECAUSE OF ITS POLICY OF BOYCOTTING ACTIVITIES IN PLACES WHERE WORKERS' RIGHTS ARE DENIED AND FREE TRADE UNIONS NOT ALLOWED TO FUNCTION, IS NOT SEEKING REPRESENTATION ON THE U.S. DELEGATION. AT THE END OF THE CONFERENCE A RESOLUTION WAS PASSED PLEDGING UTMOST SOLIDARITY TO ENSURE THAT CHINA WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO EXCLUDE ANY DELEGATION BECAUSE OF OBJECTIONS TO CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE DELEGATION OR PLACE RESTRICTIONS ON DELEGATES. THERE WAS STRONG SUPPORT FOR THE PARTICIPATION OF A CHINESE DISSIDENT UNION LEADER ON THE ICFTU DELEGATION. WE UNDERSTAND NO DECISION HAS YET BEEN MADE ABOUT AN ICFTU DELEGATION OR THE PARTICIPANTS ON MOST OTHER DELEGATIONS, BUT THE WOMEN AT THIS CONFERENCE CLEARLY WANTED CHINA'S WILLINGNESS TO OPEN UP THE CONFERENCE TO BE A KEY FACTOR IN DECISIONS BY THE ICFTU AND OTHERS ABOUT TAKING PART IN THE BEIJING CONFERENCE.

#### SOLIDARITY FOREVER

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5. THE ENHANCEMENT OF SOLIDARITY AMONG THE PARTICIPANTS WAS THE MAJOR GOAL OF THE CONFERENCE. ISSUES OF COMMON CONCERN WERE DISCUSSED IN WORKSHOPS, INCLUDING THE NEED FOR BASIC EDUCATION AND TRAINING FOR WOMEN, HUMAN RIGHTS/WORKERS' RIGHTS, EQUALITY OF PAY, SAFE WORKING CONDITIONS, CHILD CARE, FAMILY LEAVE, HEALTH CARE, UNION ORGANIZING, RACISM AND SOCIAL EXCLUSION. THE WORKSHOPS WERE A MEANS OF SEARING INFORMATION AND ENCOURAGING NETWORKING SO DELEGATES, ESPECIALLY FROM DEVELOPING COUNTRIES, COULD AVOID USING SCARCE RESOURCES TO "REINVENT THE WHEEL" AND LEARN INSTEAD FROM THE EXPERIENCE OF THEIR INTERNATIONAL COLLEAGUES. SOME OF THE DELEGATES WORKED IN COUNTRIES WHERE UNION ACTIVITIES ARE DANGEROUS, SO DELEGATES FROM DEMOCRATIC

COUNTRIES DEVELOPED RESPECT AND PERSONAL APPRECIATION OF WHAT THESE WOMEN FACED AS WELL AS A GREATER UNDERSTANDING OF THE HELP SOLIDARITY COULD BE TO WOMEN ORGANIZING WORKERS UNDER HARSH CONDITIONS.

UNION MEMBERSHIP CAN BRING BENEFITS BEYOND PROTECTION  
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6. DELEGATES WERE ESPECIALLY INTERESTED IN THE BENEFITS OFFERED BY AMERICAN UNIONS TO THEIR MEMBERS, E.G. SCHOLARSHIPS, HEALTH CARE, UNION CREDIT CARDS. THERE WERE ALSO QUESTIONS ABOUT WHAT AMERICAN UNIONS DO WHEN THEY LOSE THE VOTE AFTER ORGANIZING A CAMPAIGN TO BRING UNIONS TO A PLANT AND HOW THEY SUPPORT THE PEOPLE WHO HAD CAMPAIGNED UNSUCCESSFULLY FOR THE UNION. DELEGATES WERE TOLD ABOUT PROGRAMS GIVING A TYPE OF ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP WITH CERTAIN UNION PRIVILEGES TO PEOPLE WHO HAD CAMPAIGNED TO BRING THE UNION TO THEIR WORKPLACE.

7. WHO OWNS YOU?  
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DELEGATES FROM INDUSTRIALIZED COUNTRIES WERE INTERESTED IN DISCUSSIONS WITH THE AMERICANS ABOUT "KNOWING WHO OWNS YOU" IN THIS GLOBAL ECONOMY WITH MULTINATIONAL ACQUISITIONS. THE AMERICANS POINTED OUT HOW UNIONS CAN USE INTERNATIONAL NETWORKING TO PUT PRESSURE ON A MULTINATIONAL EMPLOYER BY ASKING FOR SUPPORT FROM UNIONS IN SEVERAL COUNTRIES WHOSE MEMBERS ALSO WORK FOR THAT MULTINATIONAL. DELEGATES WERE TOLD THAT NETWORKING CAN ALSO HELP UNIONS SHARE INFORMATION ABOUT WAGES AND CONDITIONS FOR EMPLOYEES IN THE VARIOUS COUNTRIES IN WHICH THE MULTINATIONAL CORPORATION OPERATES.

1. ACTION REQUEST FOR EMBASSY SANTIAGO -- SEE PARA 17.  
  
2. SUMMARY. THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN (ECLAC) CONVENED THE SIXTH SESSION OF THE REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE INTEGRATION OF WOMEN INTO THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN ON SEPTEMBER 25-29 IN MAR DEL PLATA, ARGENTINA. THIS CONFERENCE ALSO FUNCTIONED AS THE REGIONAL PREPARATORY MEETING FOR THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN TO BE HELD IN BEIJING, CHINA IN SEPTEMBER 1995, AN EVENT AND PROCESS TO WHICH THE ADMINISTRATION HAS ATTACHED A GREAT DEAL OF IMPORTANCE. DESPITE TENSIONS WITHIN THE REGION AND WITHIN THE HOST COUNTRY ON WOMEN'S ISSUES, THE CONFERENCE APPROVED A PROGRAM OF ACTION FOR THE WOMEN OF LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN 1995-2001, WITH SOME RESERVATIONS. ADDITIONAL

STRATEGIC ACTIONS TO BE ADDED TO THE PROGRAM OF ACTION WILL BE DECIDED BY THE CONFERENCE BUREAU AT AN OPEN SESSION IN SANTIAGO, CHILE NOVEMBER 16-18, 1994. THIS OPEN SESSION WILL APPROVE THE DOCUMENT TO BE FORWARDED TO THE SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN EARLY DECEMBER IN TIME FOR CONSIDERATION AT A TWO-DAY INTERSESSIONAL MEETING OF THE CSW LATER IN DECEMBER. END SUMMARY.

3. AMBASSADOR ARVONNE FRASER LED A 15-MEMBER US DELEGATION TO THE SIXTH SESSION OF THE REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE INTEGRATION OF WOMEN INTO THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN IN MAR DEL PLATA, ARGENTINA ON SEPTEMBER 25-29, 1994. THE US DELEGATION ADOPTED A LOW-KEY APPROACH, INTERVENING ONLY OCCASIONALLY. AMBASSADOR FRASER DELIVERED A WELL-RECEIVED SPEECH IN PLENARY SESSION CONCERNING THE CONVENTION ON THE ELIMINATION OF ALL FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN AND US CONFORMANCE WITH ITS PRINCIPLES. ALTERNATE HEAD OF DELEGATION AND PRINCIPAL US DELEGATE TO THE OAS INTER-AMERICAN COMMISSION OF WOMEN (CIM) MARIA BERRIOZABEL DELIVERED A SECOND SPEECH ON THE ROLE OF NGOS, AND RECEIVED SUSTAINED APPLAUSE AND COMMENDATIONS FROM THE CHAIR.

4. THE MEETING ELECTED HOST COUNTRY ARGENTINA AS CHAIR, MEXICO AS RAPPORTEUR, AND A CONSENSUS SLATE OF BARBADOS, BOLIVIA, CHILE, CUBA, ECUADOR, HONDURAS, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES AND URUGUAY AS VICE PRESIDENTS. THIS LAST CATEGORY WAS THE SUBJECT OF VIGOROUS DEBATE ON THE CONFERENCE'S FIRST DAY -- AND THE DIVISIONS THAT IT REPRESENTS FORETOLD THE TENSIONS THAT WOULD BE MANIFEST THROUGHOUT THE MEETING BETWEEN FIVE GROUPS: SOUTHERN CONE, ANDEAN, CENTRAL AMERICAN, CARIBBEAN STATES AND MEXICO. OTHER WESTERN EUROPEAN AND OTHER GROUP (WEOG) STATES REPRESENTED INCLUDED CANADA, THE UK, FRANCE AND SPAIN.

5. AFTER FIVE DAYS OF PLENARY AND DRAFTING COMMITTEE DISCUSSION, THE MEETING ADOPTED A PROGRAMME OF ACTION BY CONSENSUS. THE PROGRAM HAS FIVE SECTIONS: BACKGROUND, RATIONALE, CORE OBJECTIVES, STRATEGIC AREAS FOR ACTION, AND FOLLOWUP ACTIVITIES. THE BACKGROUND SECTION OUTLINES ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL CHANGES IN THE REGION SINCE 1985, FOCUSING ON POVERTY AMONG WOMEN, GLOBALIZATION, DEMOCRATIZATION, MIGRATION, GENDER EQUITY AND THE CONCEPT OF FULL CITIZENSHIP FOR WOMEN. THE RATIONALE DESCRIBES THE DUAL PURPOSES OF THE MEETING -- DEVELOPING A REGIONAL PLAN OF ACTION AND PROVIDING INPUT FOR THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN. THE CORE OBJECTIVE OF THE PROGRAM IS "TO EXPEDITE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF GENDER EQUITY AND COMPLETE INTEGRATION OF WOMEN INTO THE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS TOGETHER WITH THE FULL EXERCISE OF CITIZENSHIP IN THE FRAMEWORK OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT WITH SOCIAL JUSTICE AND DEMOCRACY."

6. THE STRATEGIC AREAS TAKES UP ISSUES OUTLINED IN THE BACKGROUND SECTION, LISTS THE OBSTACLES TO DEALING WITH

THESE AREAS AND PROCEEDS TO STRATEGIC GUIDELINES, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIONS TO DEAL WITH EACH ISSUE. THE FOLLOWUP ACTIVITIES SECTION REQUESTS THE ECLAC SECRETARIAT TO CONTINUE TO CONVENE REGULAR SESSIONS OF THE REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN DEVELOPMENT, MONITOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM ADOPTED, AND TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THE RESULTS OF UN FORA WHICH BEAR ON THE SITUATION OF WOMEN AND ASSIST IN ENSURING THE BROADEST POSSIBLE COORDINATION WITH THE UN SYSTEM, INTERGOVERNMENTAL AND NONGOVERNMENTAL BODIES.

7. THE DRAFTING GROUP NEVER CONSIDERED THE STRATEGIC ACTIONS SECTION OF THE DOCUMENT, PARTLY BECAUSE THE CHAIR (MEXICO) PERMITTED LENGTHY AND REDUNDANT INTERVENTIONS. FOR THIS REASON, THE STRATEGIC ACTIONS SECTION OF THE DOCUMENT WAS ADOPTED ONLY PRELIMINARILY. THE CONFERENCE SECRETARIAT, CONCERNED ABOUT TIME, REQUESTED EACH DELEGATION PARTICIPATING IN THE DRAFTING GROUP TO SUBMIT THEIR ADDITIONAL SUGGESTED STRATEGIC ACTIONS IN WRITING. MORE THAN 200 PAGES OF SUGGESTED ADDITIONS WERE RECEIVED. THE SECRETARIAT ANNOUNCED IT COULD NOT SYNTHESIZE AND INCORPORATE THEM AND PRODUCE A DOCUMENT IN THE TIME ALLOTTED.

8. AS IT BECAME CLEAR ON THE FINAL DAY OF THE CONFERENCE THAT THERE MIGHT NOT BE A DOCUMENT ISSUED AT ALL, THE US DELEGATION AND OTHERS APPROACHED THE SECRETARIAT TO SUGGEST THAT SOME FORM OF DOCUMENT BE APPROVED, FOR FAILURE TO DO SO WOULD RISK THE ECLAC REGION HAVING NO INPUT INTO THE BEIJING PROCESS. AFTER CONSULTATION, THE SECRETARIAT COMPLIED, AND THE DRAFTING GROUP ADOPTED THE PROPOSAL FOR AN OPEN MEETING OF THE BUREAU TO BE CONVENED IN SANTIAGO, CHILE, NOVEMBER 16-18, TO DISCUSS THE ADDITIONAL STRATEGIC ACTIONS.

9. WITH TIME RUNNING OUT, THE US TOOK RESERVATIONS ON PARAGRAPHS 4 AND 70 OF THE DOCUMENT, WHICH CONTAINED REFERENCES TO THE HARMFUL EFFECTS OF STRUCTURAL ADJUSTMENT PROGRAMS, PARTICULARLY THAT THEY WERE THE CAUSE OF UNEMPLOYMENT, POVERTY AND VIOLENCE. THESE CHANGES HAD BEEN INTRODUCED IN THE MEETING BY THE CUBAN DELEGATION. THE US DELEGATION WAS UNSUCCESSFUL IN ATTEMPTING TO REACH A COMPROMISE ON THE TEXT, EITHER ALONE OR WITH THE USEFUL INTERVENTION OF CANADA, BRAZIL, AND THE UK DELEGATION.

10. SIMILARLY, THERE WAS A LACK OF CONSENSUS UPON WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS AND HEALTH LANGUAGE. DESPITE AN EFFORT BY MEXICO TO INCORPORATE INTO THE ECLAC PROGRAMME OF ACTION LANGUAGE ON WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH DERIVED FROM THE RECENTLY-CONCLUDED CONFERENCE ON POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENT, ARGENTINA, HONDURAS, ECUADOR AND GUATEMALA TOOK RESERVATIONS ON THOSE PARTS OF THE DOCUMENT.

11. THE CONFERENCE ALSO ADOPTED A RESOLUTION, BY CONSENSUS, CALLING FOR THE "UN COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN, AS THE RELEVANT PREPARATORY BODY OF THE FOURTH

WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN, TO AMEND THE DRAFT PROVISIONAL RULES OF PROCEDURE TO PROVIDE FOR THE PARTICIPATION OF ASSOCIATE MEMBERS OF REGIONAL ECONOMIC COMMISSIONS AS OBSERVERS." THERE ARE SIX ASSOCIATE MEMBERS OF ECLAC AT PRESENT, INCLUDING PUERTO RICO. THE PUERTO RICAN DELEGATION WORKED CONSTRUCTIVELY WITH THE US DELEGATION THROUGHOUT THE MEETING, AND SERVED A VALUABLE FUNCTION BY CAUCASSING FREQUENTLY WITH THE ACTIVE CARIBBEAN GROUP.

12. THE CONFERENCE WAS ADDRESSED BY SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN, GERTRUDE MONGELLA, AND BY PRESIDENT CARLOS SAUL MENEM OF ARGENTINA.

13. THE HOLY SEE, PRESENT AT THE MEETING AS AN OBSERVER, SPOKE ONLY ONCE IN PLENARY, OFFERING A 10-POINT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE MORE SOCIAL SERVICES TO WOMEN, HELP ELIMINATE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, AND FIND WAYS TO ELIMINATE THE CAUSES OF THE DESIRE FOR ABORTIONS.

14. THE MOST WARMLY RECEIVED SPEECH IN PLENARY WAS THAT DELIVERED BY THE HAITIAN DELEGATE. HER SHORT STATEMENT ABOUT HAITI'S RETURN TO DEMOCRACY FOLLOWING THE US-LED INCURSION PROMOTED A FOUR-MINUTE STANDING OVATION FROM ALL DELEGATES, INCLUDING CUBA.

15. THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION AND OTHERS WERE LOBBIED BY A GROUP OF LATIN AMERICAN INDIGENOUS WOMEN TO ASSIST THEM IN INCLUDING LANGUAGE ABOUT INDIGENOUS WOMEN'S ISSUES IN THE PROGRAMME OF ACTION. THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION LISTENED INTENTLY AND OFFERED SUPPORT WHEN POSSIBLE. THE DOCUMENT DOES CONTAIN REFERENCES IN MANY PLACES TO INDIGENOUS ISSUES, BUT AS NOTED ABOVE, THE RESULTS OF NEGOTIATIONS OVER THE STRATEGIC ACTION SECTION REMAIN TO BE SEEN.

16. A LIVELY AND PRODUCTIVE NGO FORUM WAS HELD IN MAR DEL PATA DURING SEPTEMBER 19-23 -- THE WEEK PRIOR TO THE ECLAC MEETING. APPROXIMATELY 1,500 NGOS REPORTEDLY ATTENDED THE FORUM, INCLUDING FROM THE UNITED STATES. THE FORUM, WHICH RAN INTO LOGISTICAL AND FINANCIAL PROBLEMS ON ITS LAST DAY, PRODUCED A DOCUMENT WITH RECOMMENDATIONS FOR GOVERNMENT DELEGATES. UNFORTUNATELY, THE DOCUMENT ONLY BECAME AVAILABLE IN ENGLISH ON THE FINAL DAY OF THE GOVERNMENTAL MEETING. NONETHELESS, THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION HELD SEVERAL MEETINGS WITH INTERESTED NGOS WHO REMAINED IN MAR DEL PLATA FOR THE GOVERNMENT MEETING AND WITH DELEGATIONS THAT WILL BE REPRESENTED AT THE MARCH MEETING ON THE PLATFORM FOR ACTION TO BE DISCUSSED AND ADOPTED IN BEIJING.

17. ACTION REQUEST: DEPARTMENT REQUESTS THAT EMBASSY SANTIAGO REPRESENT THE UNITED STATES IN NEGOTIATIONS AT THE OPEN MEETING OF THE ECLAC BUREAU TO BE HELD IN SANTIAGO OVER NOVEMBER 16-18 (SEE PARA 8, ABOVE). DEPARTMENT WILL PROVIDE THE TEXT OF THE US SUBMISSIONS FOR THE STRATEGIC ACTIONS SECTION OF THE DOCUMENT TO EMBASSY AS WELL AS FURTHER BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON THE DOCUMENT. DEPARTMENT'S OFFICE OF THE CONFERENCE

SECRETARIAT WILL PROVIDE BACKUP VIA TELEGRAM AND  
TELEPHONE, IF NECESSARY, FOR THE EMBASSY OFFICER  
ATTENDING THE MEETING. EMBASSY IS REQUESTED TO CONTACT

THIS IS AN ACTION MESSAGE. PLEASE SEE PARAGRAPHS 7 AND 8.

1. IN SEPTEMBER 1995, THE UNITED NATIONS WILL HOST THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN BEIJING. THE PREVIOUS THREE CONFERENCES WERE HELD IN MEXICO CITY (1975), COPENHAGEN (1980), AND NAIROBI (1985). THIS WORLD CONFERENCE HAS A DUAL PURPOSE: TO REVIEW AND APPRAISE THE ADVANCEMENT OF WOMEN SINCE THE LAST WORLD CONFERENCE -- THE GOALS FOR WHICH EXTEND TO THE YEAR 2000 -- AND TO MOBILIZE WOMEN AND MEN AT BOTH THE POLICY-MAKING AND GRASS-ROOTS LEVELS TO ADVANCE THE STATUS OF WOMEN.

2. IN PREPARATION FOR THE WORLD CONFERENCE, EACH OF THE FIVE UN REGIONAL ECONOMIC COMMISSIONS IS HOSTING A PREPARATORY COMMITTEE MEETING (PREPCOM). THREE HAVE ALREADY BEEN HELD: THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COMMISSION FOR EAST ASIA AND THE PACIFIC (CONVENED IN JAKARTA, JUNE 1994); THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN (CONVENED IN MAR DEL PLATA, ARGENTINA, SEPTEMBER 1994); AND THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR EUROPE (VIENNA, OCTOBER 1994).

3. THE PURPOSE OF THE FIVE REGIONAL PREPCOMS IS TO DRAFT

A PLAN OF ACTION FOR ADVANCING THE STATUS OF WOMEN IN THE REGION AND TO PROVIDE REGIONAL INPUT INTO THE PLATFORM FOR ACTION, THE FINAL DOCUMENT THAT WILL EMERGE FROM THE BEIJING CONFERENCE.

4. THE SUCCESS OF THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN AND ITS PREPCOMS IS VERY IMPORTANT TO THE UNITED STATES. TO THIS END, WE HAVE PARTICIPATED ACTIVELY IN ALL THE REGIONAL PREPCOMS.

5. THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR AFRICA (ECA) WILL CONVENE ITS REGIONAL PREPCOM IN DAKAR, NOVEMBER 16-23. THE UNITED STATES WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE ECA PREPCOM AS AN OBSERVER. A CABLE REQUESTING ACCREDITATION OF THE U.S. DELEGATION WILL BE FORTHCOMING.

6. THE MEETING WILL TAKE PLACE AT THE CENTRE INTERNATIONAL DU COMMERCE EXTERIEUR IN DAKAR. ACCORDING TO AN ECA BROCHURE, SEVERAL HOTELS ARE OFFERING SPECIAL RATES FOR PARTICIPANTS.

7. ACTION REQUESTED: EMBASSY IS REQUESTED TO GRANT COUNTRY CLEARANCE FOR THE FOLLOWING EIGHT PERSONS. AS NOTED IN EMBASSY'S FAX, EMBASSY IS ALSO REQUESTED TO MAKE HOTEL RESERVATIONS FOR THEM AT THE MERIDIEN PRESIDENT HOTEL, FROM NOVEMBER 15 THROUGH NOVEMBER 23:

- PRUDENCE BUSHNELL, DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY, BUREAU OF AFRICAN AFFAIRS;
- VERONICA BIGGINS, DIRECTOR, WHITE HOUSE PERSONNEL;
- JAN PIERCY, U.S. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, WORLD BANK;
- ARTHENIA JOYNER, DESIGNATED BY THE WHITE HOUSE TO PARTICIPATE IN EVENTS LEADING UP TO THE BEIJING CONFERENCE;
- DOTTIE LAMM, ALSO DESIGNATED BY THE WHITE HOUSE TO PARTICIPATE IN EVENTS LEADING UP TO THE BEIJING CONFERENCE;
- KATHLEEN D. HENDRIX, IN G/CS, THE CONFERENCE SECRETARIAT ESTABLISHED TO PREPARE FOR THE BEIJING CONFERENCE;
- SHARON KOTOK, ALSO FROM G/CS;
- JOYCE HOLFELD, DIRECTOR OF THE FIELD AND PROGRAM SUPPORT OFFICE, CENTER FOR POPULATION, HEALTH AND NUTRITION, GLOBAL BUREAU, USAID.

8. IF EMBASSY BELIEVES IT WOULD BE USEFUL TO ACCREDIT AN EMBASSY OFFICER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MEETING, PLEASE ADVISE THE DEPARTMENT OF HIS/HER NAME AND TITLE.

9. EMBASSY IS ALSO REQUESTED TO DESIGNATE A CONTACT PERSON (PREFERABLY THE SAME PERSON WHO WILL BE

ACCREDITED) AND PHONE NUMBER FOR THE U.S. DELEGATION AND TO RESPOND TO THE DEPARTMENT ASAP, AS SOME DELEGATION MEMBERS WILL BE LEAVING WASHINGTON NOVEMBER 4 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ESCWA REGIONAL PREPARATORY MEETING IN AMMAN.

10. FYI, THE ECA HEADQUARTERS ARE IN ADDIS ABABA. HOWEVER BOTH THE SENEGALESE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS (BUREAU OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS) AND THE MINISTRY OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS SHOULD BE AWARE OF THE PREPARATIONS FOR THE REGIONAL MEETING. 1. SUMMARY: ECOSOC MET IN RESUMED SUBSTANTIVE SESSION NOVEMBER 3-4. THE REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEES ON NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY WERE NOTED. CONSIDERATION OF THE MERGER OF UNIFEM AND INSTRAW WAS POSTPONED UNTIL AFTER THE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE. NO DECISIONS WERE TAKEN ON EUROPEAN COMMISSION (EC) PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMISSION ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT OR ON THE COMMITTEE ON DEVELOPMENT PLANNING. END SUMMARY.

2. COMMITTEES ON NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY: THE FIRST DRAFT DECISION IN THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON NEW AND RENEWABLE SOURCES OF ENERGY AND ENERGY FOR DEVELOPMENT (E/1994/25) WAS ADOPTED WITH THE AMENDMENT IN THE SECOND LINE "WITHIN EXISTING RESOURCES". THE SECOND DRAFT DECISION IN THE DOCUMENT WAS ADOPTED UNCHANGED. THE DRAFT DECISION IN THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES (E/1994/26) PARAGRAPH E WAS ADOPTED UNCHANGED AS A SINGLE DECISION ALLOWING FOR THE THIRD SESSION. THE COUNCIL THEN ADOPTED A DECISION NOTING THE TWO REPORTS, REQUESTING THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO PROVIDE NECESSARY SUPPORT TO THE COMMITTEES AND INVITING MEMBERS TO PRESENT THEIR VIEWS ON "THE FORMAT IN WHICH THE COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE COMMITTEE ON NEW AND RENEWABLE SOURCES OF ENERGY AND ENERGY FOR DEVELOPMENT SHOULD PRESENT THEIR WORK" AND

REQUESTING THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO PREPARE A REPORT ON THE BASIS OF THESE VIEWS FOR THE NEXT SUBSTANTIVE SESSION OF ECOSOC.

3. THE MERGER OF UNIFEM AND INSTRAW: THE G-77 INTRODUCED A RESOLUTION POSTPONING THE DECISION UNTIL AFTER THE BEIJING WOMEN'S CONFERENCE (E/1994/L.50). THAT TEXT WAS SUBSTANTIALLY MODIFIED IN NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE EU IN A WAY WHICH WOULD HAVE THE SECRETARY-GENERAL (SYG) PROVIDE ECOSOC, THROUGH THE ACABQ, WITH AN ANNOTATED REPORT ON THE MERGER. (THE SECRETARIAT HAD PROVIDED THE INFORMATION AS A CONFERENCE ROOM PAPER, WHICH IS BEING POUCHED TO IO/ESA). THE SYG IS ALSO TO PROVIDE THE INFORMATION THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN. THE ECOSOC THEN RECOMMENDS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THE ECOSOC REEXAMINE THE ISSUE AT ITS RESUMED SESSION AFTER THE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE AND THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAKE A FINAL DECISION AT ITS FIFTIETH SESSION. THIS VERSION (E/1994/L.50/REV.L) WAS THEN ADOPTED BY CONSENSUS. THE TEXT OF THE OPERATIVE PARAS IS AS FOLLOWS:

BEGIN TEXT

1. TAKES NOTE OF THE REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL PURSUANT TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 48/111;
2. ALSO TAKES NOTE OF THE QUESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE REPORT OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE AND BUDGETARY QUESTIONS AND ITS CONCLUSION THAT FURTHER STUDIES WERE NECESSARY BEFORE A DEFINITE DECISION COULD BE MADE ON THE QUESTION OF THE PROPOSED MERGER;
3. REQUESTS THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO SUBMIT TO THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL, THROUGH THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE AND BUDGETARY QUESTIONS, AN UPDATED REPORT WHICH WOULD CONTAIN, INTER ALIA, THE INFORMATION REQUESTED IN COUNCIL DECISION 1993/235 AND PARAGRAPHS 2 AND 3 OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 48/111, AS WELL AS THE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUESTED BY THE ADVISORY COUNCIL;
4. ALSO REQUESTS THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO MAKE THIS REPORT AVAILABLE TO THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN AT ITS THIRTY-NINTH SESSION;
5. RECOMMENDS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT IT REQUEST THE COUNCIL TO RE-EXAMINE THE ISSUE, AT A RESUMED SESSION TO TAKE PLACE AFTER THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN AND BEFORE THE THIRD COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TAKES UP THE AGENDA ITEM ON THE ADVANCEMENT OF WOMEN, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE DELIBERATIONS AT THE THIRTY-NINTH SESSION OF THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN, THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN AND THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONCERNING INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS IN THE UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF WOMEN;

6. RECOMMENDS THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TAKE A FINAL DECISION ON THE PROPOSED MERGER OF THE INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH AND TRAINING INSTITUTE FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF WOMEN AND THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT FUND FOR WOMEN AT ITS FIFTIETH SESSION, IN VIEW OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL AND THE DELIBERATIONS UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 USUN NEW YORK 004833

1. SUMMARY: THE ECLAC PREPCON FOR THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN AGREED ON A LIST OF STRATEGIC ACTIONS AFTER THREE DAYS OF TENACIOUS DEBATE. TWENTY-NINE COUNTRIES AND TWO ASSOCIATE MEMBERS WERE REPRESENTED AT THE MEETING. IN A DEPARTURE FROM OTHER CSW PREPCONS (AND IN THE INTEREST OF MEETING A TIGHT SCHEDULE) MANY ISSUES WERE DECIDED BY VOTING. THE SECRETARIAT FOUND THE FORMAT OF AN EXPANDED DIRECTORS MEETING USEFUL AND SAID THEY MIGHT REPEAT IT. END SUMMARY.

2. THE OPEN MEETING OF THE ECLAC WOMEN'S CONFERENCE WAS ABLE TO REACH A CONSENSUS THANKS TO THE PATIENCE OF THE ECLAC SECRETARIAT AND A FORCEFUL ARGENTINE CHAIRPERSON, ZELMIRA REGOZZOLI. THE FRENCH IO REPRESENTATIVE TOLD US THAT IN TEN YEARS WORKING INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES, THE MAR DEL PLATA PREPCON WAS THE FIRST ONE HE HAD SEEN END WITHOUT A FINAL DOCUMENT. THIS MEETING INITIALLY SEEMED DESTINED FOR THE SAME OUTCOME. IT WAS TWO HOURS BEHIND SCHEDULE AFTER APPROVING THE FIRST ACTION ITEM. HOWEVER, AMB. REGOZZOLI SET THE TENOR AT THE NOVEMBER 16 OPENING CEREMONY, SAYING THAT A LIST OF STRATEGIC ACTIONS HAD TO EMERGE FROM THE

SESSION. IF NOT, THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY WOULD PREPARE THE AGENDA ON DECEMBER 1 FOR THE BEIJING CONFERENCE WITHOUT INPUT FROM THE REGION WHICH HAD MADE THE MOST PROGRESS ON ADVANCING THE STATUS OF WOMEN.

3. WHO CAME? TWENTY-FIVE ECLAC COUNTRIES AND TWO ASSOCIATE MEMBERS (PUERTO RICA AND THE NETHERLANDS ANTILLES) WERE REPRESENTED BY DELEGATIONS FROM THEIR CAPITALS, NORMALLY FROM THE GOVERNMENT WOMEN'S ORGANIZATIONS. ARGENTINA, BRAZIL AND CHILE HAD LARGE, ACTIVE DELEGATIONS. URUGUAY AND MEXICO HAD SMALLER DELEGATIONS (BUT THEY WERE TENACIOUS). IN ADDITION TO THE U.S., SPAIN, ECUADOR AND THE NETHERLANDS WERE REPRESENTED BY EMBASSY PERSONNEL. CANADA, COLOMBIA, AND GUAYANA WERE NOT REPRESENTED. SIX NGO DELEGATES ATTENDED AS OBSERVERS BUT DID NOT ENGAGE IN OPEN LOBBYING.

4. THE CUBAN DELEGATE, MARGARITA FLOREZ MADAM FROM THE NATIONAL SECRETARIAT OF THE CUBAN WOMEN'S FEDERATION, SOUGHT TO PROMOTE CONSENSUS. SHE WAS SEATED BETWEEN CHILE AND COSTA RICA, TWO OF THE MORE ACTIVIST DELEGATIONS, AND THEY OBVIOUSLY RESPECTED HER OPINIONS. SHE MADE NO ATTEMPT TO AGAIN RAISE STRUCTURAL READJUSTMENT PROGRAMS AS A CONFERENCE ISSUE OR TO ENGAGE IN POLEMICS WITH THE U.S. A DELEGATE OBSERVED WRYLY THAT THIS IS A RARE CONFERENCE WHERE THE CUBANS AGREE WITH THE U.S. AND THE ARGENTINES OPPOSE US.

5. CALL FOR VOTING: ON THE SECOND ACTION ITEM, THE MEXICAN REPRESENTATIVE ASKED THE CHAIR TO CALL A VOTE ONCE POSITIONS WERE CLEAR. THE CHAIR DID, AND THE MINORITY GOT ONLY THREE VOTES. THE CHAIR CONTINUED TO CALL VOTES WHENEVER THE DISCUSSIONS SHOWED CLEAR CUT DIFFERENCES OF OPINION, BUT EVEN THIS PROCEDURE PROVED TOO SLOW AND AT THE END OF THE SECOND DAY THE CHAIR ASKED THE PARTICIPANTS TO COMMENT ON AND COMBINE TWENTY-THREE ACTIONS FOR A SINGLE STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE, AND APPROVED THEM ALL AT ONCE. THURSDAY NIGHT, THE SESSION LASTED PAST THE DINNER HOUR (AND WE RAN OUT OF COFFEE), BUT GOOD HUMOR BEGAN TO PREVAIL AND THE MEETING GOT BACK ON SCHEDULE.

6. DISCUSSIONS POLARIZED IN TWO CIRCUMSTANCES. 1) SEVERAL OF THE MORE ACTIVIST DELEGATIONS MADE SUBSTANTIAL MODIFICATIONS TO RESOLUTIONS IN SPANISH, AND THE ENGLISH SPEAKING CARIBBEAN REPRESENTATIVES INSISTED ON A FULL EXPLANATION BEFORE PROCEEDING. 2) WHEN AN ACTION ITEM REFERRED TO REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS, THE ECUADORIAN AMBASSADOR, THE ARGENTINE DELEGATION, AND THE REPRESENTATIVE OF EL SALVADOR CLAIMED THAT THE CONFERENCE WAS ADVOCATING ABORTION. THIS INITIALLY LED TO RECRIMINATIONS.

7. THE HONDURAN REPRESENTATIVE (AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC) GUADALUPE JEREZANO TOLD US PRIVATELY THAT THE PAPAL NUNCIO HAD CALLED A NUMBER OF EMBASSIES TO REMIND THEM THAT THEIR GOVERNMENT HAD MADE COMMITMENTS TO HOLY SEE TO OPPOSE ABORTION, AND HAD ASKED IF THE DELEGATIONS HAD BEEN PROPERLY INSTRUCTED. IN ADDITION, SOMEONE LEAKED TO THE MEDIA THAT SPECIFIC DELEGATES HAD ADVOCATED ABORTION OR HOMOSEXUALITY IN CONTRAVENTION OF THEIR COUNTRIES' POLICIES. MS. JEREZANO ASKED THE CHAIR PUBLICLY TO INFORM THE MEDIA THAT THE DISCUSSIONS HAD FOLLOWED THE ANNOUNCED AGENDA AND NO NEW THEMES HAD BEEN INTRODUCED. AT THAT POINT, THOSE DELEGATIONS OPPOSING ACTIONS DEALING WITH REPRODUCTIVE

RIGHTS BEGAN TO ASK THAT THEIR RESERVATIONS BE NOTED FOR THE RECORD, BUT THEY ALLOWED THE ADOPTION OF CONSENSUS RESOLUTIONS.

8. U.S. INTERESTS: THE SECRETARIAT PREPARED A REVISED LIST OF STRATEGIC ACTIONS (DDR/2) DISTRIBUTED AT THE OPENING SESSION. ABOUT 80 PERCENT OF THE U.S. OBSERVATIONS ON STRATEGIC ACTIONS UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 SANTIAGO 006990

SUBJECT: ECLAC PREPCOM FOR CONFERENCE ON STATUS OF WOMEN AGREES TO LIST OF STRATEGIC ACTIONS

(DDR/1) WERE INCLUDED IN THE COMBINED TEXTS, AND ABOUT 20 PERCENT WERE INCLUDED AS NEW ACTION ITEMS. THE FORMER WERE USUALLY ACCEPTED AND THE LATTER WERE NORMALLY COMBINED WITH OTHER SUGGESTIONS FOR A NEW CONSENSUS TEXT. AN EARLY TEST CAME ON A U.S. SUGGESTION FOR STRATEGIC ACTION I.I THAT MORE WOMEN PURSUE MANAGEMENT TRAINING. THE MEETING WAS READY TO DISCARD THE SUGGESTION, BUT THE MEXICAN DELEGATE SUGGESTED THE ACTION WOULD BE MORE APPROPRIATE UNDER AREA II, SO WE WITHDREW IT. IT WAS LATER ACCEPTED AS STRATEGIC ACTION II.3.P. THE ONLY OTHER TIME THE U.S. PLAYED AN ACTIVE ROLE WAS FOR ACTION V.1.D. THE U.S. HAD SUGGESTED THE ITEM INCLUDE A REFERENCE TO THE "PROGRAMME OF ACTION ADOPTED BY THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENT," AND THE SECRETARIAT USED THE AMORPHOUS TERM "INTERNATIONAL INSTRUMENTS." THE MEETING ACCEPTED OUR SUGGESTION TO BE MORE SPECIFIC, BUT ALSO LISTED SEVERAL HUMAN RIGHTS CONVENTIONS.

9. A NEW ACTION ITEM CALLED FOR "DESIGNING COMPULSORY SEX EDUCATION PROGRAMS FROM THE FIRST YEAR OF SCHOOL." WE POINTED OUT THAT IN THE U.S., THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DOES NOT DETERMINE THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR LOCAL SCHOOLS, BUT THE ITEM WAS ACCEPTED AS ACTION II.5.I SO WE NOTED OUR RESERVATION. HOWEVER, THE FINAL TEXT INCLUDES THE PHRASE, "AT THE LEVEL OF SCHOOL BOARDS."

10. FOR THE MOST PART, THE U.S. LET OTHER DELEGATIONS TAKE THE LEAD, AND WE JOINED IN CONSENSUS WHENEVER POSSIBLE, AS WE HAD IN MAR DEL PLATA (REFTEL). THIS APPEARED TO BENEFIT THE DELEGATIONS THAT SHARED OUR INTERESTS, AND WE FEEL WE ACCOMPLISHED ALL OF OUR OBJECTIVES. WE FAXED THE APPROVED ANNEX TO G/CS, AND WE WILL POUCH THE DOCUMENTS DISTRIBUTED AT THE MEETING.

11. WRAP UP: THE CONFERENCE ENDED WITH THE DELEGATIONS EXPRESSING DELIGHT THAT THEY HAD BEEN ABLE TO REACH A CONSENSUS AND PREPARE A PLAN OF ACTION. THE SECRETARIAT NOTED THAT REGIONAL DIFFERENCES HAD PRACTICALLY DISAPPEARED DURING THE MEETING, AND SUGGESTED THAT THE FORMAT OF AN EXPANDED MEETING OF DIRECTORS HAD PROVED TO BE SO USEFUL IT MIGHT BE REPEATED. THE CHAIR THANKED THE NGO'S THAT WERE OBSERVERS FOR THEIR SUGGESTIONS AND FOR ASSISTING IN THE PROCESS OF REACHING CONSENSUS. GUERRA

1. SUMMARY: VISITING IO/OIC OFFICER VILLEGOREIX-RITAUD CLARIFIED ADMINISTRATIVE QUESTIONS BELATED TO OFFICIAL U.S. PARTICIPATION IN THE FOURTH CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN RECENT MEETINGS WITH THE CHINA ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (COC) FOR THE CONFERENCE AND SITE VISITS. CHINESE PREPARATIONS ARE ADVANCING ON ALL FRONTS. IO/OIC IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ONLY THE LOGISTICAL ARRANGEMENTS OF THE U.S. "VOTING DELEGATION," AND WASHINGTON NEEDS TO QUICKLY DETERMINE HOTEL REQUIREMENTS FOR USG ELEMENTS WHO WISH TO BE IN BEIJING FOR THESE EVENTS IN ORDER TO LOCK IN RESERVATIONS. END SUMMARY.

2. IO/OIC OFFICER PATRICK VILLEGOREIX-RITAUD AND

EMBOFFS MET NOVEMBER 21 WITH MS. ZHANG QI, DIRECTOR OF THE GENERAL OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE CHINA ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (COC) FOR THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN/NGO FORUM. THIS MESSAGE ADDRESSES ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES RAISED BY VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD DURING HIS MEETINGS WITH THE CHINESE AND WITH EMBASSY ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL, ALONG WITH OTHER CONFERENCE/FORUM ISSUES. COC ADDRESS, TELEPHONE AND FAX NUMBERS ARE PROVIDED PARA 16.

3. VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD EXPLAINED TO ZHANG THAT HE HAS RESPONSIBLE ONLY FOR THE U.S. "VOTING DELEGATION" TO THE CONFERENCE ON WOMEN, NOT OTHER USG GROUPS THAT MAY ATTEND THE OFFICIAL CONFERENCE. HE SPECIFICALLY NOTED THAT HE HAS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ARRANGEMENTS FOR POSSIBLE WHITE HOUSE OR STATE DEPARTMENT/RAP PARTICIPANTS. THE CHINESE WERE CONFUSED BY THIS DIVISION OF LABOR WITHIN THE "LARGER U.S. DELEGATION" AND EXPLAINED THAT UNDER THOSE CIRCUMSTANCES, EACH U.S. GOVERNMENT ELEMENT SHOULD SUBMIT SEPARATE REGISTRATION FORMS AND APPLICATIONS FOR ROOMS AND OFFICES TO THE COG AS SOON AS POSSIBLE (SEE COMMENT PARA 15).

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HOTELS AND CONFERENCE ROOMS -- FIRST COME FIRST SERVE  
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4. VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD, WHO HAD SPENT THE BETTER PART OF TWO DAYS SURVEYING BEIJING HOTELS, NOTED THAT HE HAD ALREADY RECEIVED A WRITTEN ROOM-RATE QUOTE AND ASSURANCES OF SPACE AVAILABILITY FOR HOTEL ROOMS AND OFFICE SPACE AT THE CONTINENTAL GRAND HOTEL, WHICH IS ADJACENT TO THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE CENTER. MS. ZHANG QUESTIONED THE AUTHORITY OF THE HOTEL STAFF FROM WHOM VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD HAD RECEIVED THIS COMMITMENT. SHE SAID THAT THE INTERNATIONAL GRAND HOTEL HAD SET 800 ROOMS ASIDE FOR CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS, BUT UNDERSTOOD THAT MOST HAD ALREADY BEEN RESERVED FOR THE UN SECRETARIAT AND BELATED AGENCIES.

5. WHEN VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD PRESSED FOR A DECISION WHETHER OR NOT THE U.S. DELEGATION COULD STAY AT THE INTERCONTINENTAL GRAND, ZHANG SAID THAT THE U.S. GOVERNMENT MUST FIRST SUBMIT ITS FORMAL ROOM REQUEST TO THE COG, AND THEN THE COG WOULD "CONSULT" WITH THE HOTEL. ZHANG ALSO EXPLAINED THAT HOTEL REQUESTS GOING THROUGH THE COG BEFORE MARCH 31, 1995, WOULD RECEIVE 20 PERCENT DISCOUNT. (NOTE: VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD CARRIED COPIES OF THE ROOM RESERVATION REQUEST FORM BACK THE DEPARTMENT. EMBASSY WILL POUCH ADDITIONAL FORMS. THEY APPARENTLY ARE THE SAME FORMS GIVEN TO THE USUN MISSION CITED REF A. END NOTE.)

6. THE COC STRESSED THAT RESERVATIONS FOR OFFICIAL DELEGATIONS SHOULD BE MADE IN BLOC  
KS BY PARTICIPATING  
GOVERNMENTS. FORUM PARTICIPANTS WILL RECEIVE HOTEL REQUEST FORMS WITH THEIR REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION.

HOTEL REQUEST FORMS SHOULD BE SENT DIRECTLY TO THE COC.

7. COMMENT: THE CHINESE CONFIRMED THAT IT WAS POSSIBLE TO MAKE RESERVATIONS DIRECTLY WITH HOTELS AND SOME FOREIGN TRAVEL AGENTS MAY INDEED BE ABLE TO DELIVER ON PROMISES OF HOTEL ROOMS DURING BEIJING'S HIGH TOURIST UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 03 BEIJING 051755

ZHANG TOD VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD THAT CREDENTIALS WILL BE ISSUED AT THE CONFERENCE SITE BY THE UN SECRETARIAT ACCORDING TO THE OFFICIAL DELEGATION LISTS SUBMITTED BY GOVERNMENTS TO THE UNITED NATIONS. THE CHINESE SIDE TOOK CAREFUL NOTES WHEN VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD EXPLAINED HIS PAST EXPERIENCES WITH THE UN CREDENTIALLING PROCESS, WHICH HAVE INCLUDED DISCREPANCIES IN LISTS PROVIDED BY THE UNITED NATIONS. THEY SAID THAT THEY WOULD STRIVE TO AVOID MISHAPS, BUT WOULD HAVE TO ACCEPT THE UN LISTS AS ACCURATE.

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CREDENTIALS - NGO FORUM  
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9. EMBOFFS TOOK THE OPPORTUNITY OF MEETINGS WITH CONFERENCE ORGANIZERS AND UN OFFICIALS IN BEIJING TO REVIEW VARIOUS OTHER BELATED MATTERS. ALL CREDENTIALLING FOR NON-CHINESE GROUPS AND INDIVIDUALS WHO WISH TO ATTEND THE FORUM IS BEING HANDLED BY THE FORUM'S FACILITATING COMMITTEE IN NEW YORK. ACCORDING TO AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UN AND THE COC, ALL NGOS WHICH APPLY WILL BE ACCEPTED. UN PERSONNEL IN BEIJING HAVE HEARD OF NO INSTANCES IN WHICH THE FACILITATING COMMITTEE HAS REFUSED NGO APPLICATIONS.

10. THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UN AND THE COC GIVES THE COG FULL AUTHORITY FOR CREDENTIALLING ALL CHINESE NGOS AND INDIVIDUALS WHO WILL ATTEND THE FORUM. THE CHINESE HAVE APPORTIONED THEIR FORUM SEATS BY PROVINCE, WITH PROVINCIAL-LEVEL ALL-CHINA WOMEN'S FEDERATION (ACWF)

ORGANIZATIONS RESPONSIBLE FOR SELECTING PARTICIPANTS. KNOWLEDGEABLE CHINESE CONTACTS EXPECT NON-ACWF CHINESE NGO GROUPS TO INCLUDE A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF UNIVERSITY-AFFILIATED WOMEN'S STUDIES GROUPS, AND ORGANIZATIONS DEALING WITH HEALTH MATTERS, RURAL ISSUES, ETC. THE PROCESS OF REGISTERING CHINESE NGOS IS NOW BEGINNING. OUR CONTACTS HAVE HEARD OF NO PROBLEMS TO DATE.

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TRANSPORTATION  
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11. THE CHINESE TOLD VILLEGOUREIX-RITAUD THAT FREE SHUTTLE TRANSPORTATION WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM THE "MAIN HOTELS" TO THE CONFERENCE/FORUM SITES. WHILE NO FINAL LIST HAD YET BEEN COMPILED, COC'S ZHANG SAID THAT MORE THAN HALF OF ALL HOTELS WOULD BE SERVED BY SHUTTLES. AT PRESENT, THE CHINESE PLAN TO PROVIDE ONLY EARLY MORNING AND LATE AFTERNOON SHUTTLE SERVICE. IN ADDITION TO TAXIS, MONTH-LONG PASSES FOR PUBLIC BUS AND SUBWAY USE WILL ALSO BE AVAILABLE AT NOMINAL COST.
