BACKGROUND

3. FROM SEPTEMBER 4-15, 1995, THE UNITED NATIONS WILL
CONVENE THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN (FWCW), IN
BEIJING. THE OVERALL THEMES OF THE CONFERENCE ARE
EQUALITY, DEVELOPMENT, AND PEACE. A PARALLEL FORUM FOR
NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS (NGOS) IS SCHEDULED TO
TAKE PLACE AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 8.

U.S. DELEGATION

4. THE UNITED STATES WILL SEND A STRONG DELEGATION TO
BEIJING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CONFERENCE:

-- FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON IS THE

DELEGATION'S HONORARY CHAIR, ALTHOUGH NO DECISION HAS BEEN MADE ABOUT HER ATTENDANCE AT THE CONFERENCE.

- AMBASSADOR MADELEINE K. ALBRIGHT, U.S. PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE TO THE UNITED NATIONS, WILL CHAIR THE DELEGATION.
- CABINET MEMBERS, INCLUDING SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DONNA SHALALA, WILL CO-CHAIR THE DELEGATION.
- UNDER SECRETARY OF STATE FOR GLOBAL AFFAIRS TIM WIRTH WILL SERVE AS AMBASSADOR ALBRIGHT'S ALTERNATE.
- THE HONORABLE MARJORIE MARGOLIES-MEZVINSKY, FORMER MEMBER OF CONGRESS, IS DEPUTY HEAD OF DELEGATION.

5. THE WHITE HOUSE IS EXPECTED TO NAME THE FULL DELEGATION EARLY THIS SUMMER.

U.S. PRIORITIES

6. THE UN FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IS IMPORTANT TO AMERICANS BECAUSE ALL OF US HAVE A STAKE IN HOW WOMEN AROUND THE WORLD LIVE AND THIS CONFERENCE MOVES THESE ISSUES TO THE TOP OF THE AGENDA. WOMEN EVERYWHERE WANT STRONG FAMILIES, ECONOMIC SECURITY, ACCESS TO BASIC AND BETTER EDUCATION AND HEALTH CARE, PARTICIPATION IN ALL LEVELS OF DECISION-MAKING, PERSONAL SAFETY, LEGAL RIGHTS, AND BASIC EQUALITY.

7. THE OVERALL U.S. PRIORITY FOR THE CONFERENCE IS TO PROMOTE THE ADVANCEMENT AND EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN AND TO REAFFIRM AND BUILD ON THE COMMITMENTS MADE AT OTHER IMPORTANT UN CONFERENCES: THE 1985 WOMEN'S CONFERENCE IN NAIROBI; THE 1992 CONFERENCE ON ENVIRONMENT AND DEVELOPMENT, IN RIO; THE 1993 CONFERENCE ON HUMAN RIGHTS, IN VIENNA; THE 1994 CONFERENCE ON POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENT, IN CAIRO; AND THE 1995 WORLD SUMMIT FOR SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT, IN COPENHAGEN. WOMEN WERE INTEGRAL TO EACH OF THESE CONFERENCES BOTH IN SUBSTANCE AND PARTICIPATION.

8. THE UNITED STATES STRONGLY SUPPORTS A SUCCESSFUL FWCW AND NGO FORUM, AND WE HAVE BEEN WORKING AT VARIOUS LEVELS OF THE UNITED NATIONS AND THE NGO ORGANIZING COMMITTEE TOWARDS THAT END.

9. THE UNITED STATES WILL PROVIDE LEADERSHIP ON:

- HUMAN RIGHTS OF WOMEN, INCLUDING ACTIONS TO ELIMINATE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN;
- A LIFESPAN APPROACH TO HEALTH AND EDUCATION;

- EFFORTS TO BALANCE WORK AND FAMILY RESPONSIBILITIES OF BOTH WOMEN AND MEN;
- ECONOMIC SECURITY;
- THE FULL PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN IN POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC DECISION-MAKING; AND
- THE IMPORTANCE OF NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS AS PARTNERS IN BUILDING COMMUNITIES--LOCALLY, NATIONALLY, AND INTERNATIONALLY.

FUNDING FOR TRAVEL OF OTHER DELEGATIONS

10. POSTS MAY RECEIVE REQUESTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN FUNDING OF HOST COUNTRY DELEGATIONS TO THE WORLD CONFERENCE. USAID HAS EXHAUSTED ITS MONIES ALLOCATED TO SUPPORT THE TRAVEL AND PER DIEM OF FOREIGN PARTICIPANTS. HOWEVER SUCH INQUIRIES MAY BE DIRECTED TO ANNABELLE GUEVARA AT THE UN SECRETARIAT FOR FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN NEW YORK (TELEPHONE 212-963-3868). THE SECRETARIAT HAS CIRCULATED A NOTE VERBALE AMONG MISSIONS IN NEW YORK OF THE 49 LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES, INVITING THEM TO SEND NAMES OF FOUR MEMBERS OF OFFICIAL DELEGATIONS TO RECEIVE TRAVEL AND PER DIEM FUNDING FOR THE CONFERENCE. THE NAMES ARE TO INCLUDE ONE INDIVIDUAL YOUNGER THAN 25, ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF AN NGO, AND TWO GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

ACTION REQUESTED

11. EMBASSIES ARE REQUESTED TO REPORT ON GOVERNMENTAL AND NON-GOVERNMENTAL PRIORITIES AND PREPARATIONS FOR THE

CONFERENCE; AND ON THE LEVEL, SIZE, AND COMPOSITION OF COUNTRY DELEGATIONS, INCLUDING WHETHER THE DELEGATIONS WILL INCLUDE CABINET MINISTERS, PARLIAMENTARIANS, YOUTH REPRESENTATIVES, AND REPRESENTATIVES OF NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS.

12. WE WOULD ALSO APPRECIATE RECEIVING REPORTS ON ISSUES THAT ARISE RELATING TO CHINA'S HOSTING OF THE CONFERENCE AND THE FORUM.

13. IN JULY, WE WILL SEND A DEMARCHE CABLE ASKING HOST COUNTRY SUPPORT FOR U.S. POSITIONS ON VARIOUS ISSUES IN THE PLATFORM.

14. EMBASSIES ARE REQUESTED TO USE THE KWMN TAG, TO SLUG THEIR REPORTS FOR G/CS (THE GLOBAL CONFERENCE SECRETARIAT), AND TO INCLUDE AS INFO ADDRESSEES USUN NEW YORK AND EMBASSY BEIJING.

1. ACCORDING TO BELGIAN MFA DIRECTOR FOR UN AFFAIRS VAN REUSEL, BELGIUM'S DELEGATION TO THE FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN BEIJING WILL PROBABLY BE LED BY BELGIAN MINISTER OF LABOR MIET SMET. VAN REUSEL EXPECTED THE BELGIAN DELEGATION WOULD BE LARGE AND WOULD INCLUDE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE BELGIAN REGIONS, NGO'S, AND OTHER GROUPS. HE SUGGESTED THAT HIS COLLEAGUE MS. VREVEN IN THE MFA, WHO WOULD RETURN FROM GENEVA JULY 10, COULD CONFIRM THIS TENTATIVE INFORMATION AND PROVIDE MORE DETAILS ON THE COMPOSITION OF THE BELGIAN DELEGATION AND ITS AIMS. POST WILL FOLLOW UP WITH MS. VREVEN NEXT WEEK.

2. IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE INFO ON THE BELGIAN DELEGATION, THE BELGIAN PRESS HAS ANNOUNCED THAT QUEEN FABIOLA, WIDOW OF FORMER KING BAUDOUIN OF BELGIUM AND SISTER-IN-LAW OF THE REIGNING BELGIAN KING, IS EXPECTED TO ATTEND THE CONFERENCE AS ONE OF A GROUP OF SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVES OF UNSYG BOUTROS-GHALI. QUEEN FABIOLA WILL ALSO ATTEND THE 'WOMEN'S FORUM' TO BE HELD ALMOST SIMULTANEOUSLY SOME 50 KILOMETERS FROM BEIJING, AUGUST 30-SEPTEMBER 8. FOR THE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE ITSELF, THE BELGIAN PRESS SAYS THAT QUEEN FABIOLA HAS BEEN ASKED BY BOUTROS-GHALI TO BE IN CHARGE OF RECEIVING WIVES OF CHIEFS OF STATE. QUEEN FABIOLA HAS BEEN ACTIVE IN A NUMBER OF COMMISSIONS AND PREPARATORY MEETINGS FOR THE WOMEN'S

CONFERENCE.

((FBIS Transcribed Text)) Women of the Caribbean region are preparing to have their voices heard at the World Conference for Women, in Beijing, China, later this year. Regional journalists are also dealing with gender issues which are sure to be raised at the conference. Gina Rogers was in St. Vincent last week to attend a gender analysis seminar:

((Begin recording)) ((Rogers)) Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Justice and Information in St. Vincent and the Grenadines the Honorable Parnell Campbell told the Caribbean journalists that over the years, he has become more gender-sensitive. He stated that when journalists examine the role of women in government, because women represent the minority they come to the illogical conclusion that women do not exercise a sufficient role in the legislative process and the development of Caribbean societies. He invited the media representatives to take note of the women behind the scenes, which, he said, is where it matters.

((Campbell)) It may be blase to refer to the phrase: Behind every successful man, there is a woman. Blase it may be, but in very many cases it is absolutely true. Women have always been (?the power) behind the force. I applaud, of course, the move to (?elevate) this unseen role to a position of greater visibility. I, for one, would love to see more women in parliament, more women as ministers, and more women as prime ministers. All I am saying is that we should not feel that because they have not been in visible positions that they have been insignificant.

((Rogers)) The deputy prime minister also applauded women for their unerring sense of judgment, which he called women's intuitions. The journalists in attendance took offense to both remarks.

((Unidentified speaker)) I take ((words indistinct)) seriously, which suggests that women should be in charge of the decisionmaking that affects their lives and that decisions should not be made for them, which means that women need to be in positions equivalent to men all over the political and decisionmaking, administrative, and managerial landscape. They need to be in charge of making decisions about their reproductive health, for instance. It seems to me a little crazy that it is men who are making decisions about women's bodies.

((Unidentified speaker)) My initial reaction to him was anger, but I think I have grown, I think, as the days have gone on, a lot less angry, and so I am more sympathetic, because he is simply uninformed. It highlights, I think, his comments highlight what we've been saying for a long time in this region. We can talk as ((word indistinct)) and as feminists, and it depends in whatever

capacity in women's organizations and in the (?NGO) sector. We can talk as much as a month about that, but we maintain that we have...((pauses)) When we get to government level, there is a problem. I think he encapsulates what that problem is.

((Rogers)) The purpose of the Fourth World Conference on Women, in September, is to eliminate gender discrimination. In an address by (UNIFEM) Director (Noelene Heyser), she stated that it is not possible to sustain a world where only half of humanity have their needs and perspectives addressed. ((end recording))

2. SPEAKING TO THE PRESS ON JUNE 30, KONRAD INDICATED THAT AUSTRIA WOULD NOT SIGN A CLOSING DOCUMENT IN BEIJING WHICH WOULD REPRESENT A BACKSLIDING FROM THE STEPS MADE IN EARLIER WOMEN'S CONFERENCES. SHE WAS CRITICAL OF ATTEMPTS BY SOME DELEGATIONS TO REPLACE THE CONCEPT OF EQUAL TREATMENT WITH WHAT SHE CHARACTERIZED AS A "BE NICE TO WOMEN" APPROACH. SHE NAMED SEVERAL ISSUES AS IMPORTANT ONES FOR AUSTRIA: VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, ACCEPTANCE OF WOMEN'S RIGHTS AS A PART OF HUMAN RIGHTS, AND THE RIGHT OF WOMEN TO CONTROL THEIR BODIES (E.G. NUMBER OF CHILDREN.)

3. KONRAD SAID SHE HAD SHARPLY PROTESTED AGAINST CHINA'S DECISION TO LOCATE THE NGO CONFERENCE AT SUCH A DISTANCE FROM THE GOVERNMENT CONFERENCE SITE. IN HER PRESS REMARKS, SHE SAID SHE HAD ALREADY INTERVENED WITH THE CHINESE AMBASSADOR, AND WOULD

CONTINUE TO PRESS THE CASE OF THE NGOS.

1. ON JULY 5, DCM AND PAO THORNHILL MET WITH UNDERSECRETARY SHERIDA AL-KA'ABI OF THE QATARI MINISTRY OF LABOR, SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND HOUSING. DURING THE MEETING EMBOFFS POINTED OUT THE IMPORTANCE THE USG IS ATTACHING TO THE CONFERENCE AS INDICATED BY THE LEVEL OF REPRESENTATION THE US INTENDED TO SEND. EMBOFFS ALSO NOTED THAT THE US DELEGATION WOULD INCLUDE A LARGE NUMBER OF WOMEN.

2. AL-KA'ABI SAID THE GOQ WAS ALREADY PLANNING FOR THE CONFERENCE, AND THAT THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS HAD IN FACT ALREADY CONSIDERED THE MAKE-UP OF THE DELEGATION. AFTER A PHONE CALL, AN AIDE CAME IN WITH A PAPER WHICH SAID THAT THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS HAD NOT YET MADE A FINAL DECISION ON THE MAKE UP OF THE DELEGATION, ONLY THAT IT WOULD BE LED BY THE GOQ'S (MALE) AMBASSADOR IN BEIJING.

3. EMBOFFS SUGGESTED THAT SENDING AN ALL-MALE DELEGATION TO THE CONFERENCE MAY SEND THE WRONG SIGNAL, AND URGED AL-KAABI TO KEEP THE USG POINT OF VIEW IN MIND IN FUTURE INTERNAL DISCUSSIONS ON THE MATTER. AL-KA'ABI SAID HE AGREED THAT AT LEAST ONE WOMAN SHOULD BE ON THE DELEGATION AND PROMISED TO CONVEY USG THOUGHTS TO THE MINISTER. IN RESPONSE TO PAO'S QUESTION, HE DID NOTE THAT SEVERAL QATARI WOMEN HAD BEEN TO SEE HIM IN THIS REGARD.

((FBIS Transcribed Text)) "They welcomed the establishment of a Technical Action Services Unit (TASU) with the assistance of the government of Canada through the Caribbean Regional Institutional Strengthening Programme (CRISP) to assist in the implementation of the Community's decisions, particularly in those areas where technical inputs not readily available in member states were required. Heads of government expressed their gratitude to the government of Canada for their assistance provided.

TRENDS IN THE REGIONAL ECONOMY:

Heads of government observed that most Caricom countries experienced improved economic performance in 1994 but that high levels of unemployment also continued to be a major problem in most countries. They reiterated their commitment to pursue policies which create a climate to stimulate investment and increased employment opportunities and, at the same time, provide a sustainable, social safety net for the protection of the most vulnerable sectors of their population.

DEBT:

Heads of government viewed with extreme concern the severe debt burden facing several member states, mindful of its detrimental effects upon the development of regional economies. They welcomed Guyana's call for concerned action to secure debt reduction including debt relief from the multilateral institutions.

Heads of government noted Guyana's willingness to assume the lead

responsibility for the debt issue within the context of follow-up to the Summit of the Americas.

REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT FUND:

Heads of government acknowledged the president of Guyana's expression of gratitude to member states and the Caricom Secretariat for refining the concept of the Regional Development Fund (RDF) as proposed by Guyana. They noted Guyana's expressed interest in participating in the working group on smaller economies, which ministers, meeting at the Denver trade ministerial meeting, agreed to establish.

Heads of government also endorsed the proposal developed by Guyana for the establishment of the RDF in the context of the proposed Free Trade Area of the Americas (FTAA). They also agreed to pursue the initiative within the context of the OAS.

Heads of government mandated their representatives to pursue the initiative at all levels within the multilateral organisations with which they are associated.

"JOINT CONSULTATIVE GROUP:

Heads of government agreed that the NGO community should be represented in the joint consultative group and in this regard requested the secretary general to conduct a study of regional NGOs with a view to their more effective incorporation into the decision-making process.

They recognised this step as an important element of the wider dialogue that was taking place among the governments, social partners and non-governmental organisations (NGOS) of the region but stressed, however, that this should be a partnership with all the partners undertaking their duties and responsibilities in the implementation of the Community's decisions.

Heads of government accordingly received representatives from the Caribbean Congress of Labour (CCL), the Caribbean Association of Industry and Commerce (CAIC) and for the first time representation of the NGO communities through the Caribbean Policy Development Centre (CPDC). They recognised the contribution which these three organisations were making to the further development of the Caribbean

HUMAN AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT ISSUES:

Heads of government devoted attention to issues related to human and social development. They reviewed the conclusions and follow-up activities relating to the International Conference on Population and Development (Cairo, 1994) and discussed the issues arising out of the World Summit on Social Development (Denmark, 1995). They were firmly of the view that in order to ensure the sustainable development of the region, member states needed to focus attention on promoting the quality of life of the citizens of the Community through the development of people-centred programmes. They acknowledged that the effectiveness of such programmes depended on the degree of consultation with, and involvement of, their social partners, including the non-governmental organisations (NGOS).

FOURTH WORLD CONFERENCE ON WOMEN (FWCW):

Heads of government also examined the status of the Community's preparations for the Fourth World Conference on Women (FWCW) (China, September 1995) and favouably considered the request from the seventh meeting of ministers with responsibility for the integration of women in development (Bahamas, May 1995) for the greater recognition of women's issues in the deliberations of the conference of the heads of government.

THE POPE THANKS THE UN FOR SPONSORING THE CONFERENCE AND AFFIRMS THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH'S COMMITMENT "TO CONTRIBUTE TO UPHOLDING THE DIGNITY, ROLE AND RIGHTS OF WOMEN." THE POPE THEN EXPRESSES THANKS TO WOMEN IN VARIOUS ROLES: WOMEN WHO ARE MOTHERS, WIVES, DAUGHTERS, AND SISTERS; WOMEN WHO WORK; AND WOMEN IN RELIGIOUS ORDERS.

3. THE POPE THEN CRITICIZES THE HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL CONDITIONING THAT HAS BEEN "AN OBSTACLE TO THE PROGRESS OF WOMEN" IN THE PAST AND THE PRESENT, SAYING THAT THIS OFTEN HAS RESULTED IN THEIR "RELEGATION TO THE MARGINS OF SOCIETY AND EVEN REDUCTION TO SERVITUDE". THE POPE ADMITS THAT MEMBERS OF HIS CHURCH HAVE IN THE PAST BORNE PART OF THE BLAME FOR THESE INJUSTICES, SAYING THAT FOR THIS SITUATION HE IS "TRULY SORRY." A COURAGEOUS AND ACCURATE EXAMINATION OF THE PAST WOULD REVEAL THAT "WOMEN HAVE CONTRIBUTED TO (THE LONG HISTORY OF HUMANITY) AS MUCH AS MEN, AND MORE OFTEN THAN NOT, THEY DID SO IN MUCH MORE DIFFICULT CONDITIONS," ACCORDING TO THE POPE.

4. THE POPE THEN LISTS SEVERAL MAJOR "OBSTACLES" TO THE PROGRESS OF WOMEN SOCIALLY, POLITICALLY AND ECONOMICALLY. HE REGRETS THAT "THE GIFT OF MOTHERHOOD IS OFTEN PENALIZED RATHER THAN REWARDED." HE CALLS FOR "REAL EQUALITY FOR WOMEN IN EVERY AREA: EQUAL PAY FOR EQUAL WORK, PROTECTION FOR WORKING MOTHERS, FAIRNESS IN CAREER ADVANCEMENT, EQUALITY OF SPOUSES WITH REGARD FOR FAMILY RIGHTS, AND THE RECOGNITION OF EVERY THING THAT IS PART OF THE RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF CITIZENS IN A DEMOCRATIC STATE." THE POPE ALSO CALLS FOR "A GREATER PRESENCE OF WOMEN IN SOCIETY AND CONDEMNS ALL FORMS OF "VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN IN THE AREA OF SEXUALITY," WHICH ARE THE RESULT OF "AGGRESSIVE MALE BEHAVIOR".

5. THE POPE APPEALS TO "STATES AND INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTIONS" TO UNDERTAKE "AN EFFECTIVE AND INTELLIGENT CAMPAIGN FOR THE PROMOTION OF WOMEN IN ALL AREAS OF WOMEN'S LIFE AND BEGINNING WITH A UNIVERSAL RECOGNITION OF THE DIGNITY OF WOMEN." THE POPE DEFENDS THE PROPOSITION THAT IN THE CREATION OF CULTURE AND SOCIETY "WOMEN AND MEN ALIKE SHARE EQUAL RESPONSIBILITY FROM THE START," PLAYING COMPLEMENTARY ROLES FROM THE PHYSICAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL AND ONTOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVES: "WOMANHOOD EXPRESSES THE 'HUMAN' AS MUCH AS MANHOOD DOES, BUT IN A DIFFERENT AND COMPLEMENTARY WAY." THE POPE AFFIRMS THAT

"A CERTAIN DIVERSITY OF ROLES IS IN NO WAY PREJUDICIAL TO WOMEN", PROVIDED THAT THIS DIVERSITY IS NOT ARTIFICALLY IMPOSED AND REFLECTS "WHAT IS SPECIFIC TO BEING MALE AND FEMALE."

6. THE POPE CONCLUDES BY CLAIMING THAT "THE CHURCH HAS MANY REASONS FOR HOPING THAT THE FORTHCOMING UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE IN BEIJING WILL BRING OUT THE TRUTH ABOUT WOMEN" AND PRAYING FOR "THE SUCCESS OF THE IMPORTANT UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 ROME 009711

A SPOKESMAN FOR THESE LEADERS CLAIMED THAT "WE HAD SUCCEEDED IN ESTABLISHING CONTACTS WITH THE ABDUCTORS AND IN PERSUADING THEM TO FREE THE HOSTAGES WITHOUT ANY HARM TO THEM." AL FARAN ON SUNDAY THREATENED TO TAKE THE "EXTREME STEP," AND HAS SET JULY 15 AS THE DEADLINE FOR THE GOVERNMENT TO "STOP ALL ANTI-INSURGENCY OPERATIONS IN THE VALLEY AND RELEASE 23 DETAINEES INCLUDING THE CHIEFS OF AL-OMAR MUJAHIDEEN, HIZBULLAH, MUSLIM MUJAHIDEEN AND HARKAT-UL-ANSAR OUTFITS" IN EXCHANGE FOR THE REMAINING FOUR HOSTAGES. MEANWHILE, REPORTS SAID MILITANTS KILLED THREE LOCAL PEOPLE THEY HAD KIDNAPPED EARLIER.

2. "U.S. TO SUPPLY MILITARY WARES TO PAK":

-- THE HINDU FRONT-PAGED STORY, UNDER THE ABOVE HEADLINE, BY DEPUTY EDITOR K.K.
