THE BUSINESS-ORIENTED NIHON KEIZAI SHIMBUW SAID (AUGUST
11), "AGREEMENT HAS NOT YET BEEN REACHED ON THIRTY
PERCENT OF THE DRAFT OF THE ACTION PROGRAM TO BE ADOPTED
AT THE U.N. WOMEN'S CONFERENCE IN BEIJING. HEATED
DEBATE IS EXPECTED ON POINTS AT ISSUE INCLUDING WOMEN'S
RIGHTS, HEALTH, VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, CONTRACEPTION,
UNIVERSALITY OF HUMAN RIGHTS, POVERTY AND DEVELOPMENT,
BQUALITY AND JUSTICE, BIOLOGICAL AND SOCIETAL
DIFFERENCES BY GENDER. THESE ISSUES ARE RELATED TO
CULTURE, TRADITION, RELIGIOUS BELIEFS AND THE DEGREE OF
DEVELOPMENT OF RACH COUNTRY.

"THE OFFICIAL DELEGATION FROM JAPAN HAS NOT BEEN CHOSEN
BECAUSE OF THE RECENT ELECTION AND CABINET RESHUFFLE,
BUT, MORE THAN 5,000 JAPANESE ARE SCHEDULED TO ATTEND
THE NGO FORUM. THE JAPANESE DELEGATION PLANS TO INVITE
500 PEOPLE TO AM EXCHANGE MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 3. THIS
TYPE OF EXCHANGE WILL BE THE MAJOR FACTOR AT THE BEIJING

COMPREHENSIVE TEST BAN TREATY

ONE OF MY ADMINISTRATION'S HIGHEST PRIORITIES IS TO NEGOTIATE A COMPREHENSIVE TEST BAN TREATY (CTBT) TO REDUCE THE DANGER POSED BY NUCLEAR WEAPONS PROLIFERATION. TO ADVANCE THAT GOAL AND SECURE THE STRONGEST POSSIBLE TREATY, I AM ANNOUNCING TODAY MY DECISION TO SEEK A "ZERO" YIELD CTBT. A ZERO YIELD CTBT WOULD BAN ANY NUCLEAR WEAPON TEST EXPLOSION OR ANY OTHER NUCLEAR EXPLOSION IMMEDIATELY UPON ENTRY INTO FORCE. I HOPE IT WILL LEAD TO AN EARLY CONSENSUS AMONG ALL STATES AT THE NEGOTIATING TABLE.

DEVELOPMENT. AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE NUCLEAR

REGARD, I CONSIDER THE MAINTENANCE OF A SAFE AND RELIABLE
NUCLEAR STOCKPILE TO BE A SUPREME NATIONAL INTEREST OF
THE UNITED STATES.

I AM ASSURED BY THE SECRETARY OF ENERGY AND THE DIRECTORS

1. "AL-FARAN" KILLS NORWEGIAN HOSTAGE; THREAT TO KILL OTHERS:

-- ALL MAJOR NATIONAL DAILIES GAVE PROMINENT LEAD ATTENTION THIS MORNING TO REPORTS FROM SRINAGAR STATING THAT THE "AL-FARAN" MILITANTS HAVE KILLED NORWEGIAN HANS CHRISTIAN OSTRO, WHO WAS ONE OF THE FIVE WESTERN TOURISTS ABDUCTED FROM PAHALGAM NEARLY FIVE WEEKS AGO. THE MILITANTS ALSO WARNED THAT THE FOUR REMAINING HOSTAGES WOULD MEET WITH THE SAME FATE IF AL-FARAN'S DEMANDS, WHICH INCLUDES THE RELEASE OF 15 IMPRISONED MILITANTS, WERE NOT MET WITHIN TWO DAYS. THE HEADLESS BODY OF OSTRO WAS FOUND ON SUNDAY ON THE HEIGHTS OF AISHMUQAM ON THE SRINAGAR-PAHALGAM ROAD WITH A NOTE TIED TO IT SAYING OSTRO HAS BEEN KILLED BECAUSE THE GOVERNMENT "HAS NOT ACCEPTED OUR DEMANDS. THEREFORE, THE ENTIRE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THIS KILLING LIES WITH THE GOVERNMENT."

-- REPORTS QUOTED SOURCES IN THE UNION HOME MINISTRY IN NEW DELHI SAYING THE GOI WOULD NOT RELEASE ANY OF THE MILITANTS WHOSE RELEASE IS BEING DEMANDED BY THE AL-FARAN. PM NARASIMHA RAO CONDEMNED THE KILLING AND DIRECTED THE UNION HOME SECRETARY AND THE STATE GOVERNMENT TO CONTINUE THEIR EFFORTS TO GET THE REMAINING HOSTAGES RELEASED. THE GOI ON SUNDAY NIGHT REVIEWED THE SITUATION FOLLOWING THE KILLING OF THE HOSTAGE. INTERNAL SECURITY MINISTER RAJESH PILOT CONDEMNED THE KILLING AS A DASTARDLY ACT AND SAID THAT IT CLEARLY INDICATED PAKISTAN'S INVOLVEMENT IN THE INCIDENT.

-- PAPERS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE ENVOYS OF THE FOUR COUNTRIES WHOSE NATIONALS ARE STILL IN CAPTIVITY CALLED ON THE AL-FARAN TO RELEASE THE REMAINING HOSTAGES "IMMEDIATELY AND UNCONDITIONALLY." THE APPEAL WAS MADE IN A JOINT STATEMENT ISSUED AFTER THE ENVOYS, INCLUDING AMBASSADOR FRANK WISNER, MET WITH UNION HOME SECRETARY K. PADMANABAIH WITHIN HOURS AFTER THE DISCOVERY OF THE KILLING. THE STATEMENT SAID THAT THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE "BARBARIC ACT OF VIOLENCE...RESTED WITH THE PERPETRATORS, AL-FARAN, AND NO ONE ELSE."

1. THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS, CORA RAIN COLEBROOKE, TOLD POLOFF THAT HER GOVERNMENT IS IN AGREEMENT WITH U.S. VIEWS ON MOST SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES IN THE UPCOMING CONFERENCE, PARTICULARLY THOSE DEALING WITH VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, AND WOMEN'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

2. ALTHOUGH WOMEN'S HEALTH ISSUES ARE A PRIMARY CONCERN TO THE BAHAMAS, MS. COLEBROOKE CAREFULLY AVOIDED A POSITION ON WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS. WHILE SUPPORTING UNIVERSALITY OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN GENERAL, SHE POINTED OUT THAT CULTURAL FACTORS CAN PLAY A PART IN THE PERCEPTION OF RIGHTS IN SOME COUNTRIES, AND THESE PERCEPTIONS WILL UNDOUBTEDLY BE DIFFICULT ISSUES AT THE CONFERENCE AS THEY ATTEMPT TO CREATE A GLOBAL DOCUMENT.

3. MS. COLEBROOKE STATED THAT THE BAHAMAS IS HOPEFUL

THAT MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS JANET BOSTWICK WILL BE APPOINTED ONE OF THE VICE-PRESIDENTS OF THE CONFERENCE, BUT, CONSIDERING THE NUMBER OF CANDIDATES, THEY FEEL THAT THIS WILL BE DETERMINED BY VOTE AT THE CONFERENCE ITSELF. (NOTE: AS AN ABLE, ARTICULATE ATTORNEY ELECTED AS THE BAHAMAS' FIRST FEMALE MEMBER OF PARLIMENT, MS. BOSTWICK WOULD BE AN OUTSTANDING CHOICE.)

4. IT APPEARS THAT THE BAHAMIAN DELEGATION WILL SUPPORT MOST OF THE ISSUES THAT THE U.S. SUPPORTS, AND WILL WORK TO REMOVE AS MUCH BRACKETED LANGUAGE AS POSSIBLE, BUT FEELS THAT CONTENTION ON MANY OF THE ISSUES WILL NOT LIKELY BE RESOLVED IN BEIJING. WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS IS A GOOD EXAMPLE, AND ONE WHICH IS ENORMOUSLY, BUT SUBTLY, SIGNIFICANT HERE. HOWEVER, MS. COLEBROOKE AGREED THAT SMALL GAINS WILL GROW INTO BIGGER ONES IN TIME. MEANWHILE, THE BAHAMIANS DEFINITELY PLAN TO PLAY AN ACTIVE AND AGGRESSIVE ROLE IN THE CONFERENCE. SHE ALSO ACKNOWLEDGED THAT NGO'S ARE AN IMPORTANT FACTOR IN IMPLEMENTING PROGRAMS FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF WOMEN.

2. HT CLAIMS THAT AL-FARAN EXTENDS DEADLINE BY A DAY:

-- THE HINDUSTAN TIMES WAS THE ONLY PAPER TO CLAIM THAT AL-FARAN MILITANTS, HOLDING FOUR WESTERN HOSTAGES IN KASHMIR, HAD EXTENDED THEIR AUGUST 15 DEADLINE BY ANOTHER DAY. GHANA'S FIRST LADY, NANA KONADU AGYEMAN RAWLINGS, HAS BEEN AN ACTIVE PARTICIPANT IN THE MAJORITY OF THE PREPARATORY MEETINGS TO FORGE A UNITED AFRICAN ONSENSUS ON THE ISSUES OF MOST CONCERN TO THE CONTINENT. GHANA'S NATIONAL COUNCIL ON WOMEN AND DEVELOPMENT (NCWD) HAS HOSTED NUMEROUS MEETINGS AND SESSIONS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY TO ENSURE THAT THE CONCERNS AND ISSUES OF GHANAIAI WOMEN ARE ADDRESSED BY THE PLATFORM FOR ACTION. A LARGE GHANAIAI DELEGATION ATTENDED THE DAKAR REGIONAL PREPARATORY MEETING AND THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL REGIONAL MEETINGS HELD IN ACCRA OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS WHICH HAVE INCLUDED THE PARTICIPATION OF FIRST LADIES FROM OTHER WEST AFRICAN COUNTRIES.
3. ON AUGUST 11, MRS. GERTRUDE MONGELLA, THE UN UNDER SECRETARY FOR THE CONFERENCE, AND NANA RAWLINGS PRESIDED OVER A CONTINENT-WIDE MEDIA-NGO ENCOUNTER WHICH PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR AFRICAN MEDIA AND NGO REPRESENTATIVES TO DISCUSS ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE CONFERENCE AND ISSUES TO

BE ADDRESSED. MEDIA FROM UGANDA, ZAIA, ZIMBABWE, NIGERIA, CAMEROON AND GAMBIA, AS WELL AS NGO REPRESENTATIVES, ATTENDED THE EVENT.

4. AT THE MEDIA-NGO EVENT, QUESTIONS CONCERNING CONFERENCE ARRANGEMENTS, NOTABLY THE DISTANCE BETWEEN THE CONFERENCE AND THE FORUM, WERE PREEMPTED BY MRS. MONGELLA IN HER OPENING ADDRESS. SHE INDICATED THAT THE CHINESE ARE PROVIDING FREE TRANSPORTATION BETWEEN THE TWO SITES AND THAT SHE WAS PLEASED WITH THE ACCOMMODATIONS. SHE ALSO CHALLENGED THE AUDIENCE TO KEEP FOCUSSED ON THE REAL ISSUES FOR AFRICA -- NOT CHINESE POLITICS AND THE HOTEL, BUT RATHER THE PLATFORM FOR ACTION AND AFRICA'S AGENDA. THIS SET THE TONE FOR DISCUSSIONS ON AFRICA'S AGENDA WHICH INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING PRIORITY AREAS: (1) POVERTY ALLEVIATION; (2) EDUCATION; (3) HEALTH; (4) PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION; AND (5) THE GIRL CHILD.

5. GHANA'S OFFICIAL DELEGATION, HEADED BY THE FIRST LADY, IS COMPRISED OF FIFTY ONE (51) PEOPLE. TWENTY FIVE DELEGATES (49 PERCENT) ARE FROM GOVERNMENT AGENCIES (THIS INCLUDES FOUR CABINET MINISTERS WHO ARE ALSO MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT), FOUR FROM GOVERNMENT MEDIA HOUSES, AND THE REMAINDER (43 PERCENT) FROM NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS (NGOS). (OF THE NGOS, FOUR YOUTH ARE INCLUDED.) USAID/GHANA IS SPONSORING THE PARTICIPATION OF FIVE NGO REPRESENTATIVES, INCLUDING ONE OF THE YOUTH.
