Six-Nation Meeting on Military AIDS Prevention

Delegations from six countries of South and South East Asia met in Cha-Am, Thailand, in September 1995 for a four-day Regional Seminar on "AIDS Prevention in Military Populations". The seminar was designed to examine a number of policy issues and technical aspects important for the development of effective AIDS prevention programs—within the military, and to discuss how these efforts within the armed forces could be better coordinated with their own national (civil) AIDS programs.

As was the case for the earlier Regional Training Seminar for Eastern and Southern Africa, the gathering was financially supported by the Economic Development Institute of the World Bank, with content and planning input by the Civil-Military Alliance to Combat HIV and AIDS, WHO's Global Programme on AIDS (GPA), the Joint UN Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) in consultation with the United Nations Department of Peace-Keeping Operations.

The delegations to this seminar represented the countries of Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Nepal and Thailand. Once again the high-level delegations included officials from the Ministries of Defense, the military medical and nursing services, and the civil national AIDS programs.

The participants felt the HIV/AIDS epidemic posed a challenge to all, even those countries presently reporting a low HIV prevalence. They felt this encounter offered them an exposure to and examination of policy issues in a new light as perceived and expressed in their neighboring countries. It was a chance to exchange and learn from policy views and program approaches that would benefit their own policy reflection in the future.

They further realized that, although they had begun with widely varying experience and policy approaches, they had quickly come to a consensus on many issues, and this would lead them to review their policies and practices on their return home. They affirmed they had learned much from each other, and that this kind of shared policy reflection should become a continuing element in their own national civil and military health program development. 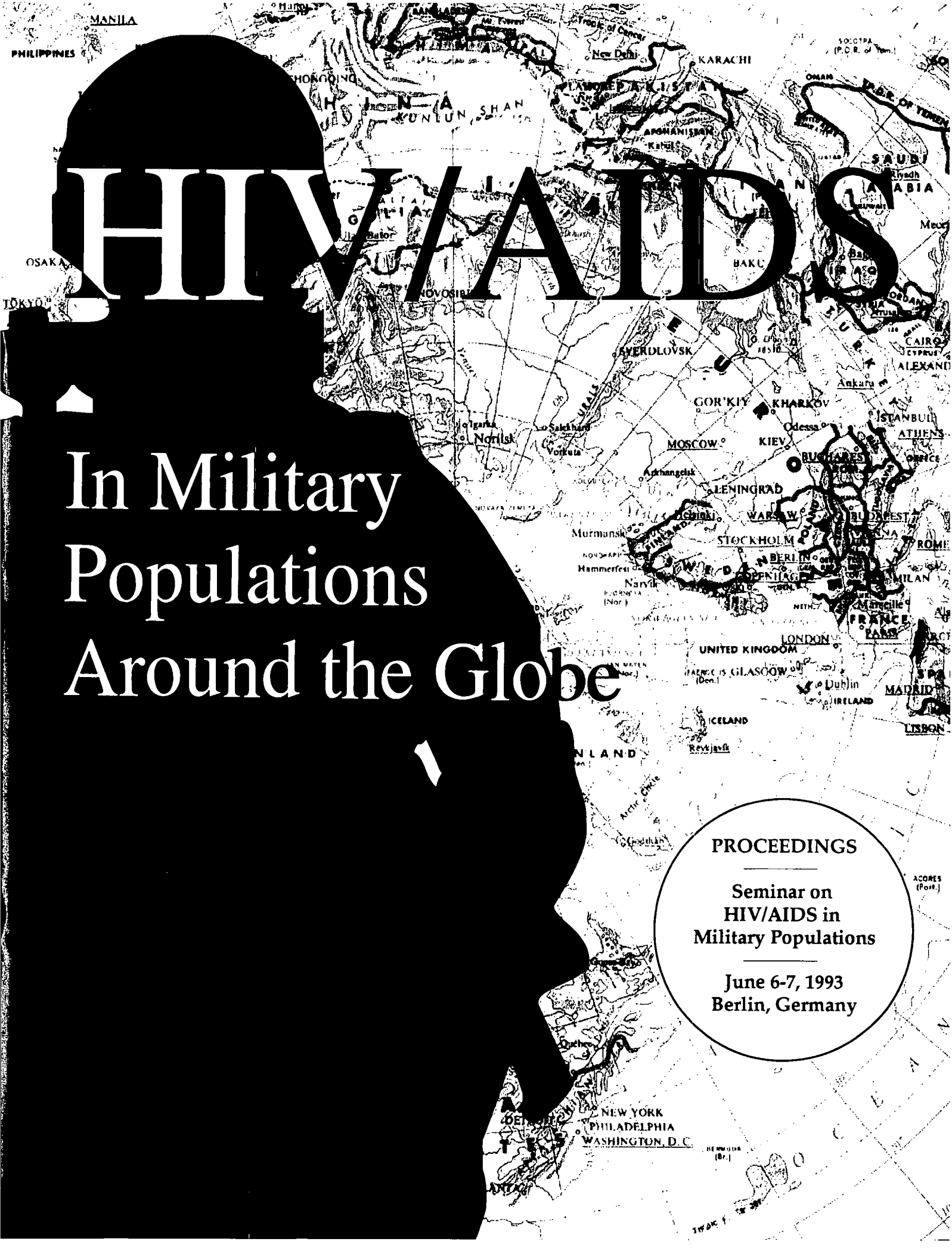

2. SUMMARY: MISSION HAS RECEIVED AN INVITATION FOR THIRD AD HOC THEMATIC MEETING OF THE UNAIDS PROGRAM COORDINATING BOARD (PCB) TO BE HELD IN RIO DE JANIERO, BRAZIL, DECEMBER 14-15, 2000. THE U.S. IS A MEMBER OF THE PCB. THE MAIN AGENDA ITEM WILL BE DISCUSSION OF THE GLOBAL STRATEGY FRAMEWORK. COUNTRIES ARE BEING REQUESTED TO ADVISE UNAIDS OF THE NAMES OF THEIR REPRESENTATIVE AND ANY ADDITIONAL MEMBERS OF THEIR DELEGATIONS NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER 6. END SUMMARY.
3. THE UNAIDS SECRETARIAT HAS SENT AN INVITATION TO THE THIRD AD HOC THEMATIC MEETING OF THE UNAIDS PROGRAM COORDINATING BOARD (PCB), WHICH WILL BE HELD FROM DECEMBER 14-15, 2000 IN RIO DE JANIERO, BRAZIL. REGISTRATION FOR THE MEETING WILL BEGIN ON-SITE ON DECEMBER 13. THE MEETING WILL BE HELD IN THE RIO OTHON PALACE HOTEL, 3264 AVE. ATLANTICA, COPACABANA. A BLOCK OF ROOMS FOR ALL THE PARTICIPANTS HAS BEEN RESERVED BY UNAIDS AT THE RIO OTHON PALACE HOTEL AT A SPECIAL RATE OF USD 110 PER NIGHT. RESERVATION FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO UNAIDS, GENEVA, ASAP.

4. THE PRINCIPAL AGENDA ITEM FOR THE DECEMBER 14-15 MEETING WILL BE THE "GLOBAL STRATEGY FOR HIV/AIDS." THIS IS A NEW STRATEGY DOCUMENT, WHICH WILL BE ISSUED EARLY NEXT WEEK.

5. ADDITIONAL ITEMS INCLUDE PROGRESS REPORTS ON: THE FIVE-YEAR EVALUATION OF UNAIDS, THE UN SYSTEM STRATEGIC PLAN ON HIV/AIDS 2001-2005, AND THE SPECIAL SESSION OF THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON HIV/AIDS.

OPTIONAL FIELD VISIT

6. THE GOVERNMENT OF BRAZIL IS ARRANGING OPTIONAL FIELD VISITS ON DECEMBER 13 FOR INTERESTED PCB PARTICIPANTS. SIMULTANEOUS VISITS WILL BE ORGANIZED IN SAO PAULO AND RIO DE JANEIRO TO A VARIETY OF CENTERS AND PROJECTS. THESE INCLUDE A PROJECT ON PREVENTION WORK WITH YOUTH (BOTH IN SCHOOL AND OUT OF SCHOOL) AND POOR WOMEN; OUTREACH WORK WITH SEX WORKERS; MODEL CARE HOME FOR CHILDREN LIVING WITH AIDS; COMMUNITY AFFRO REGGAE PROJECT FOR LOW-INCOME YOUTH; PREVENTION OUTREACH AND SUPPORT OF GROUP ACTIVITIES FOR TRANSVESTITES AND SEX WORKERS; PREVENTION FOR LOW INCOME YOUTH, CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENT SEX WORKERS AND PROMOTION OF WOMENS' RIGHTS; PREVENTION FOR MEN WHO HAVE SEX WITH MEN; ADVOCACY AND TRAINING FOR RIO DE JANIERO POLICE FORCE; AMBULATORY SERVICES, DRUG DISTRIBUTION, AND SPECIALIZED AIDS CARE.

SUBJECT: The PEACs Initiative

In the hope that we can begin the international consultations that will be necessary to make PEACs a global success, let's approve the PEAC concept - immediately.

In the interest of making the U.S. PEAC as effective as possible, I recommend the PEAC report to the Secretary of State and through the Director of ONAP to the President, and that every effort be made to de-conflict the roles of the PEAC and the proposed ONAP international deputy.

If the USG can approve the PEACs concept quickly we will be able to mount the global consultations necessary to recruit broad multilateral sponsorship of PEACs for a large roll-out at the Durban AIDS summit this July. There is still time.

Part I: Appropriations Process

1) Secure full funding for the President's budget request on international AIDS (including HIPC&IDA money) in Appropriations process. Key Appropriations subcommittees are Agriculture, Foreign Operations, Defense and Labor/HHS (to be reviewed by Martha Foley (WH Legislative Affairs), OMB, USAID first). Attached Appropriations calendar to follow.

2) Organize interagency briefings for above subcommittees. Also target and work with friends on the Committee (Pelosi, Leahy, Durbin, Jackson (Il), Feinstein etc).

Part II: Non-Appropriations Measures

1) Secure passage of Administration proposals. Seek legislative vehicle for our vaccine tax credit proposal (Ways & Means, Finance, Health Care revenue bills).

2) Devise strategy for managing congressional initiatives. Leach/Lee (H.R. 3519) passed in the House by voice vote on May 15th. Need to fine-tune administration position and prepare for Senate strategy. Currently OMB, Treasury and USAID are reviewing H.R. 3519's language and devising coordinated strategy for future negotiations with members.

Part III: General Education and Outreach to Members and Committee Education

1) Draft and clear interagency talking points on the AIDS crisis and highlight the Administration's proposals.

2) Design outreach (including specific talking points) for interested congressional groups (CBC, Women's, Asian, Military Committees etc).

3) Develop and utilize existing core groups of interested members (for dear colleagues, floor debates, one minutes, "whipping"- internal lobbying, etc).
