Holiday greetings and best wishes! I hope you and your family are well and enjoyed the season.

I am writing to invite you to a vitally important meeting later this month with other African-American leaders to discuss a strategy to combat the HIV/AIDS pandemic in Africa. This leadership summit will take place on Wednesday, January 26 from 3 to 6 p.m. in the headquarters of WorldSpace, which is located at 2400 N Street, N.W. in Washington, D.C. For your information, parking in the immediate area is limited so I would recommend that you plan to arrive by taxi, or take Metro to Foggy Bottom and walk over to the meeting.

As you may have heard, since leaving Congress last year, I have called for an AIDS Marshall Plan for Africa. I came up with this idea after learning of the absolute horror that this disease is now wreaking on the continent. More than 11 million Africans have already died from the disease; and more than 23 million others are currently infected by HIV and AIDS. There are now more than 13 million children who have been orphaned and are either being cared for by already overburdened relatives and family friends, or are trying to make a living on the mean streets in urban centers.

Just imagine this fact: 6,000 people a day are now dying from HIV/AIDS in Africa!

With the AIDS Marshall Plan, I am proposing an unprecedented commitment by governments, United Nations agencies, corporations, and from every day people like you and me to form an effective public-private partnership that can marshal the massive resources needed to address what is widely being called "the worst infectious disease catastrophe in the history of modern medicine."

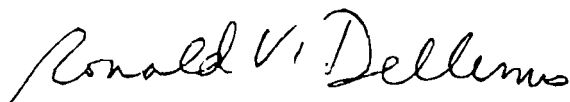

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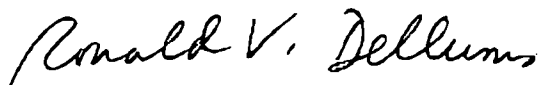

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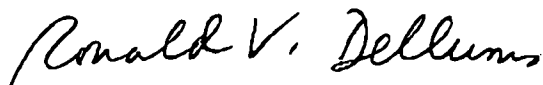

CFA PLANS MEETING ON HIV/AIDS PANDEMIC IN AFRICA

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The Constituency for Africa (CFA) will convene a meeting to discuss the "Aids Marshall Plan for Africa" at 3:00 p.m., on Wednesday (January 26, 2000) at the WorldSpace Building, 2400 N Street, NW, Washington, D.C. The meeting will be attended by leaders of African-American organizations and institutions, Members of the African Diplomatic corps, Members of the Congressional Black Caucus, and many of the foremost experts on the HIV and AIDS pandemic in Africa.

The AIDS Marshall Plan for Africa, which was conceived by former U.S. Congressman and current CFA Board Chairman, Ron Dellums, seeks to marshall unprecedented public and private resources and to establish a partnership among governments, U.N. agencies, private corporations and individual citizens, to overwhelm this disease which is decimating the African continent. AIDS kills approximately 6,000 people per day in Africa, and has made orphans of more than 10 million children. Today more than 20 million people are infected with the disease.

Last year, the "AIDS Marshall Plan for Africa Act" (H.R. 2765) was introduced before Congress by Congresswomen Barbara Lee (D-CA) to "create a program to provide assistance for HIV/AIDS research, prevention and treatment activities in Africa." The legislation has received active support from more than 70 Members of Congress, non-governmental organizations, the Government of South Africa, pharmaceutical giant, Bristol-Myers Squibb and the Reverend Jesse Jackson.

CFA is a key advocacy group in shaping U.S. policy towards Africa. It boasts a team of well-respected

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leaders including: Hon. Jack Kemp, CFA Vice-Chairman; Hon. David N. Dinkins, Chairman Emeritus; and Ambassador Andrew Young, also Chairman Emeritus. The daily operations of the organization are run by Melvin P. Foote, President and Chief Executive Officer.

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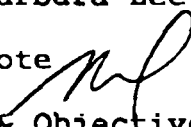

I'm writing to share with you the goals and objectives and plans for the CFA Leadership Meeting on the HIV/AIDS pandemic in Africa. The venue for this meeting will be here at the WorldSpace Building, and we are anticipating that 75 to 100 mostly African-American leaders will attend. We would like to hold this meeting during the last week of January 2000, and will be in touch with your offices, to coordinate an actual time and date, to ensure your participation.

GOALS

I. TO EDUCATE AND INFORM AFRICAN-AMERICAN LEADERS ABOUT THE HIV/AIDS PANDEMIC IN AFRICA.

II. TO EDUCATE AND INFORM AFRICAN-AMERICAN LEADERS ABOUT H.R. 2765, "THE AIDS MARSHALL PLAN FOR AFRICA".

III. TO BRAINSTORM WITH AFRICAN-AMERICANS LEADERS, STRATEGIES FOR MOBILIZING PUBLIC AND PRIVATE RESOURCES AND SUPPORT FOR H.R. 2765.

IV. TO SOLICIT AFRICAN-AMERICAN LEADERS AND THEIR ORGANIZATIONS TO JOIN WITH CFA TO FORM AN EFFECTIVE NATIONWIDE COALITION TO COMBAT HIV/AIDS IN AFRICA.

During the past several weeks, CFA has sent out background materials, including copies of the legislation to leaders of African-American organizations. In addition materials have been shared at a number of meetings including the CFA Town Hall Meeting in Columbia, MD (October 9); the West Coast Black Publishers Conference in Las Vegas, NV (October 20 - 22); the Black Professionals in International Affairs Conference in Washington, D.C. (October 30); the U.S. AIDS Conference in Denver, (November 6); the Pan-Africa Conference in Nashville, TN (Nov. 12 - 13); the Blacks in Government, Executive Committee Meeting in Washington, (November 20); and with the Commission on Pan-African Affairs Think Tank Meeting in Barbados, (Nov. 26 - 29). I'm pleased to report that in all cases, the message has been well received, and all organizations contacted, are eager to know how they can help.

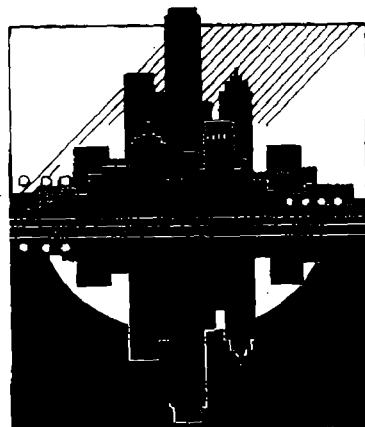
