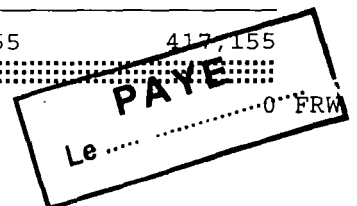

**THE GAINS OF THE 13TH INTERNATIONAL HIV/AIDS
CONFERENCE IN SOUTH AFRICA**

As the curtains drew down on the 13th International HIV/AIDS conference in Durban, South Africa last week, it became obvious that the AIDS landscape may never be the same for many reasons. We will highlight the ten major gains of this epoch Conference.

* The Conference may have broken the veil of silence about the disease in Africa. According to print and electronic media reports, HIV/AIDS became the major topic in many communities in South Africa, and across the continent. Citizens of South Africa reportedly spoke openly about the hitherto taboo subject of sex and its relationship to the spread of the virus. From now onwards, it is unlikely that rational governments in Africa can ignore the urgent need for national dialogue on HIV/AIDS.

* A popular African government tasted the raw anger of its citizens. The harsh criticism that reportedly

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heralded the keynote address of the host head of state, President Mbeki, during the conference and swift, widespread bitterness regarding the perceived lack of action by the South African government on HIV/AIDS, should serve as a wake up call to African governments.

* The medical and development side effects of AIDS dominated the mainstream media of Western capitals during the week-long Conference. During the South Africa conference, the Washington Post published an extensive and provocative three-part serial on HIV/AIDS in Africa. AIDS is now a legitimate, mainstream news item.

* Perhaps, one of the most significant outcomes of the Conference is the firm consensus reached on the hitherto forbidden "T" alphabet in HIV/AIDS advocacy: The "treatment" of HIV/AIDS no matter the continent, country or community of origin. For quite sometime, some experts considered it "irrational", "impractical," or "sheer fantasy" to talk about the need for the international community to provide life saving drugs to AIDS patients in the hardest-hit countries. Now, the argument is shifting to, "When, Where, and How," the international community can deliver lifesaving drugs to all AIDS patients, especially in Africa.

* The multinational pharmaceutical companies are now falling all over themselves in their eagerness to provide cheap and affordable drugs for AIDS patients in developing countries. Although this development is a culmination of a long term campaign, the graphic stories of the destructive effects of AIDS in Africa makes it prudent and palatable for global pharmaceutical companies to now do the right thing.

* The scourge of HIV/AIDS is now recognized in all Western capitals as a fundamental threat to globalization, and a tension-free world. The Clinton Administration had in April this year declared HIV/AIDS a national security threat, the first time in modern memory that a disease warranted such a declaration. Shortly before the conference, the President signed an executive order increasing the accessibility, affordability, and procurement of cheaper anti-AIDS drugs. The U.S. House of Representatives, in a major shift of emphasis, last week voted to ante up the funding for international HIV/AIDS programs,

increasing the White House 2001 budget request from \$244 million to \$286 million. Rep. Barbara Lee (D-CA), who last year introduced legislation in the House to establish a \$200 million per year program in Africa, has seen this legislation merged with that of the Chairman of the Committee on Banking and Financial Services, Rep. James A. Leach (R-IA), to establish a bi-partisan bill, "H.R. 3519, the World Bank AIDS Prevention Trust Fund Act", which is being warmly received in the Congress. Britain, France, and Germany are also pledging additional resources to AIDS programs in developing countries.

* The international donor and relief agencies are now united in the global fight against AIDS. For example, the UNICEF leadership chose the venue of the Conference to unveil its annual Progress of Nations report, devoted to the global effects of AIDS on children and youth. On the eve of the Conference, the World Bank made a pledge of \$500 million to fight epidemic in Africa. Juan Somavia, the Director-General of the International Labor Organization (ILO) wrote a scathing commentary on the plight of children in the UNICEF report and called for a "global moral imperative" to assist them in this era of AIDS. In addition, the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) released a ground-breaking study on AIDS and orphanhood during the conference.

* The growing numbers of AIDS orphans are now recognized as a major long-term threat to the stability of hardest-hit nations. According to USAID, by 2010, one in seven children under 15 years of age in Sub-Saharan Africa will have lost a parent to AIDS. Other estimates project that during the same period, AIDS will account for 40 million orphans, 95% of them in Africa. The extended family system in Africa is under severe strain because of the unprecedented numbers of orphans. Taking care of orphans in institutional setting is out of the question in Africa because of the hefty price tag of \$2,000 a year for each child. These children are likely to miss out of school, become surrogate parents to their younger siblings or coerced into early sexual activities.

* The Conference reestablished the primacy of clinical, biomedical, public health, and qualitative research. Experts presented ground-breaking studies in areas such as accelerated vaccine development, modified dose therapy for developing countries, a relatively cheap, simple drug treatment (using nevirapine) that significantly reduces maternal transmission, and the economic implications of the disease. According to studies presented during the Conference, health experts in Africa and other developing regions face a major scientific dilemma on how

to solve the problem of breast feeding for HIV positive mothers. These mothers can transmit the virus to their infants even after receiving nevirapine at birth. However, bottle-feeding is impractical in poor countries, and infants can easily die of dirt-induced diarrhoea diseases.

* Finally, the greatest legacy of the Durban Conference is that the mobilization against HIV/AIDS will be equal part science and development. The science of AIDS will increasingly focus on the accelerated development of a vaccine. The development agenda will shift toward (a) ensuring access to lifesaving drugs, (b) strengthening the health care infrastructure of developing countries, (c) implementing comprehensive prevention programs, and (d) adopting multisectoral approaches to AIDS programs at community levels, where, anti poverty strategies, macroeconomic policies, democracy dividends, and social justice programs will become as important as pills. An energized army of activist will become as prominent as the star scientists and researchers. Political careers in developing countries may soar or fail depending on support for urgent remedial action on HIV/AIDS. In the final analysis, the global community will likely deploy formidable technical, financial, and human resources to stop the destructive effects of AIDS. That may be the ultimate legacy of the unprecedented gathering in Durban, South Africa.

AIDS HAS A DIRECT IMPACT ON A COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC STABILITY

Nearly two hundred American scientists and administrators in the American government have already begun to arrive in South Africa for AIDS 2000. Among these is America's "AIDS boss", Ms. Sandra Thurman. She is the influential director of the Office of White House Aids Policy. Pierre Steyn chatted with her in Washington.

For one who works everyday with subjects such as death, sex, money and drugs – subjects which make most government officials very uncomfortable – Thurman is a cheerful and surprisingly accessible person. Her headquarters are in an annex, a stone's throw away from the White House. It's clear that this 46 year old divorcee from Georgia spends many more hours here than in her house. On a coffee table in her office there are what seem at first glance colored candy, but a closer look reveals them to be multicolored condoms.

Three years ago President Bill Clinton appointed her Director of National Aids Policy when she was leading one of the largest American non-governmental organizations, which was specifically involved with AIDS prevention and care of people with AIDS. Since then she has visited Africa a number of times, including South Africa, to see first-hand the destruction AIDS has wrought. Thurman is referred to as one of the world's most knowledgeable persons on the subject of AIDS. She has assisted developed countries in shifting their focus from their own successes in the battle against the epidemic to the impending disaster in Africa and Asia.

"A hundred million people are still going to die, and there is yet no medical remedy in sight. AIDS makes the bubonic plague look like a joke. Within fifteen years the peak of the epidemic will be in India instead of Africa," she said. She is particularly pleased that AIDS 2000 will be held in South Africa. "It's the first time that the conference is being held in one of the areas where the epidemic is at its worst." Conference delegates from the First World will be able to see first-hand the extent of the disaster and the voice of those affected will be heard.

Ms. Thurman does not expect much good news from the conference. She also doubts that President Mbeki's advisory panel of scientists on AIDS, of which 50% believe that the HIV-virus causes AIDS while 50% do not, will have any notable announcement to deliver. "I don't think they will ever reach a consensus." Her point of view is that scientists can hold their discussions on AIDS, but that those in the forefront of the struggle against the epidemic should devote their time and energy to what they know works.

According to Thurman, success in this struggle is determined by two factors: leadership, which permeates to the grassroots; and the continuous flow of resources to grassroots organizations, which ultimately lead the struggle against AIDS. She refers to Zambia, Senegal and Uganda as countries where decisive leadership at the managerial level and lower resulted in success in the fight against the infection. "There are some outstanding AIDS programs in South Africa and outstanding leaders of community organizations. In South Africa it's the community, and not the government, which takes the lead."

She would encourage the South African government to do all it can to decrease the HIV/AIDS transmission from mother to child – and that means they need to use AZT. "We in the U.S. successfully diminished the mother-to-child transmission by 70% by using AZT. Look, we are sensitive to the concern over a possible toxicity of the drug, but one needs to weigh the pros and cons."

The U.S. cannot pass judgment on South Africa's point of view on AZT, but it is prepared to co-operate with South Africa to do all it can in order to decrease mother-to-child transmission. Thurman says that in

the 18 years she has been involved with AIDS prevention she has never encountered a pregnant woman who refused the opportunity to help her unborn child.

The developed world needs to do more to help the Third World build infrastructures. "Even if we had all the AZT in the world free of charge, we would still need to get it to the people." She accepts the South African government argument that AIDS should be fought in a "holistic" way; in other words, that there needs to be improvement in living conditions, sanitation and education, which would lead to a decreased battle against AIDS. AIDS should not be fought on a different level – it needs to be part of each, single developmental program. "AIDS has a direct impact on the economic stability of a country. It's not only a question of health," Thurman emphasizes.

Although the U.S. and South Africa have reached an agreement on the manufacturing and import of generic AIDS drugs, to her knowledge, there are still no drugs manufactured in South Africa. Even if they are manufactured locally, and even with the international pharmaceutical companies' latest offer to drastically reduce the price of such drugs, these will still be beyond the reach of most people with AIDS. "We need to find ways to work together with pharmaceutical companies and governments. Without spending a fortune, we can improve many people's lives by purely concentrating on the basics."

SHE FIGHTS IN THE AIDS TRENCHES OF AMERICA AND NOW, THE WORLD

Among the over 11,000 people who attended the AIDS 2000 Conference in Durban this week, was the head of White House AIDS Policy in the U.S. [sic]: Ms. Sandra Thurman

You see it in her eyes: that sometimes hope is all that is left. Because in the trenches of the most desperate battle that mankind still fights, Sandra Thurman is still accessible, friendly and full of empathy. As a student 18 years ago, she became involved in caring for the very first dying AIDS patients. Today she is the Director of U.S. National Aids Policy. She has hope even for Africa: "People look at the AIDS figures for Africa, and the numbers are frightening. But the fact is there are unbelievable community programs right throughout the continent where outstanding work is being done. Therefore, despite all the tragedy that AIDS causes, there is also hope and triumph. Your country shows so much promise. There are certainly frightening challenges, but there is hope. And, yes, South Africa is behind in reacting to the epidemic. You are where America was ten years ago. You have reason for concern because the chance that you still have to make a dramatic change vis-a-vis the epidemic, is quickly fading. If South Africans do not mobilize, it will be too late."

Sandra Thurman is extremely practical. The greatest remedy against HIV/AIDS is time, because that "buys" in the short-term the chance for a successful fight. Therefore, she warns, this should not be wasted. "Look, there will always be time for academic discourse; that's what academics do. But in the meantime, there is work to be done. We know how to tackle this epidemic; we know what works. Now we must just do it!"

She came to South Africa for the first time two years ago. "It was significant that there was very little on AIDS in the newspapers. Now people see it all over the place. That's a great shift." She smiles. "One of the good things is the polemic that President Mbeki's pronouncements on HIV/AIDS has provoked. That was worldwide news. Some people refer to it as an embarrassment, but that was his gift to the world: that he turned on the volume of the debate worldwide, and that you, with your fine community organizations and programs, could lead; just as everywhere the community walks in front and the government follows. That happened in the U.S. as well."

Sandra Thurman's walk in the world of the needy began in 1982, when she learned to care for her father, who lay dying of cancer at home. Shortly afterwards a dear friend contracted AIDS, and she taught the partner how to care for him in the same way. "After his death I took care of other patients, and later I began to train people to care for the dying. The next thing I knew I was spending nearly all my free time with people suffering from AIDS. My father was in the fashion industry, and my mother was involved in the arts, thus many of our friends were gay men. At the time AIDS in the U.S. was an epidemic affecting homosexuals. That's how I got involved. I also began raising funds for AIDS patients. Her academic background is social work, and later she specialized in health care. Since 1988 she has been involved in AIDS full-time as managing director of the largest AIDS organization in the southeastern U.S. Five years later she went to work for former President Jimmy Carter in Atlanta, in the field of child care, and four years later President Bill Clinton called her to the White House.

As a social worker there is something wonderful that strikes her in South Africa: "I see people here who have nothing, but who help other people who have even less. It's stunning for me to see how the community is mobilized. Our challenge as government officials and people in power, is to help community organizations grow and to empower them. The battle against AIDS will be won or lost at grassroots level. You are now stuck with the controversy over the political will to fight AIDS. It was just the same in the U.S. Only seven years after the epidemic surfaced did an American president mention it by name. In the meantime you have so many social problems in South Africa that you have only now entered the political debate. Unfortunately, the AIDS epidemic waits for no one: it drives on at full-steam, regardless of politics. Fortunately, your communities have already progressed and the politicians can now follow."

And President Mbeki?

“Well, the activists expected more vigor in his opening speech. But much of what he said is true. Of the 34 million people who have the virus, 95% live in the poorest countries. We also know that traditionally there is a connection between sickness and poverty. People who have no access to health care and good nutrition are naturally more predisposed to all types of infections, such as AIDS. But that is self-explanatory. He also said that we should stop seeing AIDS as merely a health problem, because then we will never beat it. It is a fundamentally a developmental question, an economic question, a security and a stability risk.” What we in South Africa should be doing first of all is to “do anything possible in order to avoid mother-to-child transmission.”

But it does not end there. “It is also important that we treat mothers, even if we use the cheaper therapy. The longer the baby can remain with its mother, the better it is for the child, even if the mother will later die. With AIDS you cannot wear blinders. There are the long-term implications from the child’s perspective.” Concerning the disparity in the cost of AIDS drugs she says: “That surely must be the biggest quandary. It’s actually a myth that all Americans can afford anti-retroviral medicines: 50% cannot.”

But we don’t as yet have any co-ordinated AIDS strategy.

“Fine, but the U.S. also doesn’t have one. We also began at the community-level and built the whole like a jigsaw puzzle. It would have been easier if we had had good political leadership from the beginning, because now co-ordination of community initiatives is nearly impossible. Fortunately, both sides are there: the public and the private sector. The key is communication – between the Health Department and other government initiatives and the community organizations.”

Tell me, is there a real concern in the developed countries about AIDS in the Third World? Real concern?

“Oh, absolutely! People often ask: Why should we in America hold our breath for tragedies in Africa? Decision-makers realize more and more that we are part of a global community. They always talk of globalization. We send e-mails from the U.S. to KwaZulu-Natal in three seconds. People understand that. Now they begin to realize that sickness is the same, that it also knows no boundaries. The security and stability challenges in the 21st century are going to be health, poverty and communication – and 20th century’s answers will not work from now on.”

Her involvement with AIDS has required many personal sacrifices. “Many of my friends thought I was not all there: why would I want to take care of people infected by AIDS? And gays on top of that – why do I care when I am not gay. Some of my colleagues did not want to bring their children to my house because an AIDS patient had been there! There was so much ignorance and prejudice and discrimination in the early days; also against me.” She says she persevered because “we all have the moral responsibility to do what we can for other people. I was lucky that I could combine my experience about this and so really make a difference – first in my hometown, then nationally and now everywhere.” Then she adds: “It’s true that I have not much more in my life. During a recent interview my former husband said that I am married to my work, and that my work is a jealous lover. I think that sums it up!” She blushes and quickly changes the subject. AIDS is an interesting sickness, she says -- it affects society precisely the same way it affects the body. “It attacks the weak spots in your body, and it focuses on the fault lines in our society: the inequality of women, insufficient health care, inadequate nutrition. And there, in the weak spots, we lose the fight. It’s precisely the same in a body with AIDS...”
