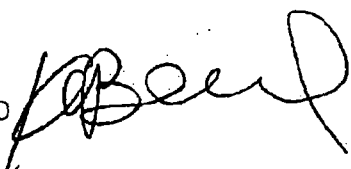

1. We have attached the final IWG document on expanding the U.S. role in controlling the international HIV/AIDS epidemic. It includes a summary list of "next steps," and is the result of two large interagency meetings in February and March, and five smaller issue-oriented subgroup sessions. The first draft of the document was circulated and we have tried to incorporate all

agency-suggested changes. However, some trade-offs and omissions were inevitable. Please note that designation of agency "leads" is not intended to be exclusive. Follow-up actions will be coordinated by lead agencies with the understanding that all interested parties should be included.

Please review the final document and provide your Department concurrence in writing by Friday, April 14.

2. The consensus document is not intended to be static. It is only a first step in ramping up USG activities to deal with the HIV/AIDS crisis. A number of issues and actions raised by the IWG will require further discussion at the departmental level as well as in the Deputies and Principals Committee process.

Next steps:

- The IWG will meet again in June, prior to the International AIDS Conference in Durban, to document progress on each of the action items outlined in the consensus document. The lead agencies are expected to coordinate input into this process.
- An issue-specific discussion/decision paper is being prepared and will be circulated within the next two weeks. It will expand on the following issues raised in the consensus document:
 - Coordination of USG international AIDS activities, with recommendations and options for staffing in Washington, coordination of programs in the field, and USG leadership initiatives such as the "Presidential Envoys for AIDS Cooperation" and U.S.-EU Summit preparation.
 - Security issues, including increasing DoD military-to-military training programs, involvement in UN Peacekeeper education and HIV/AIDS control, and specific taskings for the intelligence community.
 - Economic and trade issues, including improving access to medical care and pharmaceuticals in poor countries, evaluating expanded debt relief/debt swaps for AIDS control in the developing world, and focus on the macroeconomic impact of the epidemic.

Where agencies and departments have equities, they are encouraged to begin preparing options and discussion points on these issues within the next two weeks.

I want to express my sincere gratitude for your kind invitation to the IWG. I have learned a great deal about U.S. policymaking during the sessions. It was very helpful to be present during the discussions to hear how U.S. policy is being developed to help the international HIV/AIDS crisis and how the U.S. Military HIV Research Program can be involved.

Dr. Susan Bailey will be sending forward the formal DoD response. I just wanted to thank each of you personally. As a follow up to the discussions, the U.S. Military HIV Research Program has already given USAID information on military specific educational modules. These are our furthest advanced in development, although we do not have definitive efficacy as of yet. We will be in contact with USAID to see how these are adopted and hopefully we can apply the knowledge they are gaining to FY01 when DoD funding is available.

Two of our staff are attending the DoD fact finding mission in South Africa this week. Both are there as experts on the Program's education component. They will be involved in the discussions and both have supporting materials to distribute.

To the issue at hand, the background is excellent. You may want to note that the substantial decline in the average life expectancy of more than a decade in Africa is evidence of the mature nature of the two-decade epidemic and all the countries with rising pandemics are headed that same direction, if you do not intervene now. For some reason those life expectancy tables seem to bring home the message to lay individuals. It is important to emphasize the leadership of the U.S., as well as noting the on-ground U.S. government agencies working closely with NGOs and other large contributors like EU (but this needs to be implied with enhanced coordination to avoid duplication not only between donors but among the U.S. agencies). This lays the groundwork for the last page – page 10. I can't personally emphasize enough how critical page 10 is both for the leveraging of U.S. government dollars, but taking a leadership role in fostering interaction between other countries.

It always amazes me how little people talk and coordinate unless brought together by a respected leadership group. This is also so true at the country level. It seems to me every visit to Africa the in country principals haven't really spoken to each other between my visits.

The document is well prepared and articulate, but the long-term success will require the leadership proposed on page 10 to continue to encourage and coordinate critical activities around the world.

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to the draft HIV/AIDS paper. I want to applaud the work you have been doing with minimal staff resources and pledge to you that the Africa Bureau will continue to support you as you undertake the difficult challenge of bringing this effort together. To further this effort, however, I think the IWG paper must identify more succinctly the specific issues that require higher-level attention. A number of the items enumerated in this draft are either already being implemented, or could be implemented at the Assistant Secretary level without requiring action by the DC/PC process. The initial draft reflects an interagency process that is only just getting organized.

I understand that you may have received similar comments from others and that a revised draft is in preparation. At this time, let me highlight three issues of special concern to the Africa Bureau. Over the past several months, we have seen the level and intensity of focus on HIV/AIDS increase dramatically. A strategic triad is emerging with the United States, African leaders, and our donor partners each more aware and more active in this area than was the case even a year ago. HIV/AIDS is now recognized as a security issue and as posing a threat to many of our other policy objectives in Africa and beyond. It is clear that the need for intense international consultations with both donors and our African partners has increased. Ambassador Holbrooke's proposal to establish a diplomatic framework to systematize these discussions has merit. His suggestion to designate Presidential Envoys, or PEACs, for international HIV/AIDS coordination has merit and could, if properly set forth, help catalyze the international response. To avoid creating a new institution, it seems reasonable that our ONAP Director be designated the U.S. PEAC. This should occur within the context of expanding ONAP to manage these additional responsibilities. I support the recommendations outlined in this paper to augment ONAP staff.

Second, the idea of debt-swaps for HIV/AIDS relief has not been adequately developed. This notion has been kicked about for some time but I am not satisfied that it has been addressed systematically. At a time when we are working intensively with African countries to increase their expenditures on social programs and poverty reduction, I am convinced that this debt-related idea

has a place in our program. Our commitment at the highest levels to work more closely with the new government of Nigeria, for example, provides an excellent opportunity for us to engage in creative and constructive thinking in this regard.

Finally, on the important question of pharmaceuticals and access to appropriate drug therapies, it is not clear from this draft exactly what additional high-level action is required or contemplated. The existing IWG is the appropriate venue for putting together specific recommendations and analysis for consideration by Principals and, ultimately, POTUS.

I look forward to reading the revised draft and want to thank you again for your leadership.

SUBJECT: Interagency Working Group on the Global AIDS Crisis

1. Attached please find the final IWG document on expanding the U.S. role in controlling the international HIV/AIDS epidemic. It includes a summary list of "next steps," and is the result of two large interagency meetings in February and March, and five smaller issue-oriented subgroup sessions. The first draft of the document was circulated and attempts have been made to incorporate all suggested changes. Please note that designation of agency "leads" is not intended to be exclusive. Follow-up actions will be coordinated by lead agencies with the understanding that all interested parties should be included.

Please review the final document and provide your Department concurrence by Monday, April 17. We will assume concurrence if we do not hear from you by that date.

2. The consensus document is not intended to be static, but rather an ongoing attempt to ramp up the USG response to the HIV/AIDS crisis. A number of issues and actions raised by the IWG will require further discussion at the departmental level as well as in the Deputies and Principals Committee process.

Next steps:

- The IWG will meet again in June, prior to the International AIDS Conference in Durban, to document progress on each of the action items outlined in the consensus document. The lead agencies will coordinate input into this process.
- An issue-specific discussion/decision paper is being prepared. It will expand on the following issues raised in the consensus document:
 - Coordination of USG international AIDS activities, with recommendations and options for staffing in Washington, coordination of programs in the field, and USG leadership initiatives such as the "Presidential Envoys for AIDS Cooperation" and U.S.-EU Summit preparation.
 - Security issues, including increasing DoD military-to-military training programs, involvement in UN Peacekeeper education and HIV/AIDS control, and specific taskings for the intelligence community.
 - Economic and trade issues, including access to medical care and pharmaceuticals in poor countries, evaluating expanded debt relief/debt swaps for AIDS control in the

evaluating expanded debt relief/debt swaps for AIDS control in the developing world, and focus on the macroeconomic impact of the epidemic.

Where agencies and departments have equities, they are encouraged to begin preparing options and discussion points on these issues as soon as possible.
