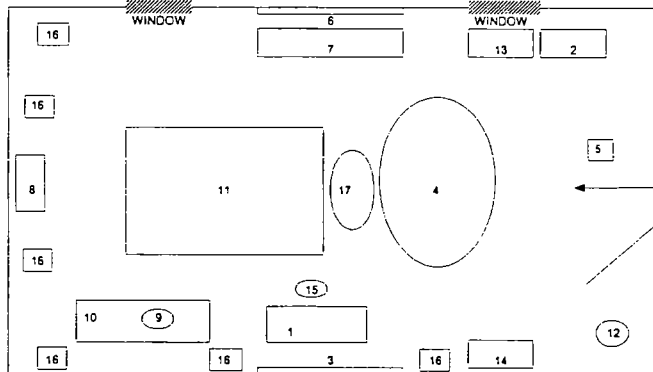

3. Drawing-Room

As you stand in the "voorkamer" facing the screen, the drawing-room is on your right. Here the family spent their evenings engaged in social conversation, cards, chess and draughts. The frieze pattern has changed to twining pink roses.

1. In front of you is a teak gateleg table (ca 1750), a wedding gift from Sir Herbert Baker (the British architect) to Sir Rowland and Lady Bourne in 1900.
2. The considerable size and depth of the teak Bible desk to your right, which dates back to 1750, afforded safe storage for the family Bible. The family Bible on the desk belonged to Pieter Hendrik de Villiers, after whom Villiersdorp is named. He was the great-grandson of Jacques de Villiers, Abraham's brother, who took transfer of Boschendal when Abraham died in 1719.
3. The oil painting of Miss Eileen Mary Buckle was painted in London by Henry John Hudson in 1891. Eileen was engaged to a young man at the time the portrait was painted; however, the engagement was broken off and she never married. She died at the age of 80.
4. Oval antique "Aubusson à la Marche" carpet.
5. The box-shaped footwarmer used to be filled with hot coals, the perforated top allowing the heated air to escape. In summer it was used as a footstool.
6. Oval gilded mirror (end of 18th century).
7. Dutch table decorated with floral marquetry of various woods and mother-of-pearl (ca 1700).
8. 18th-century armoire made of beefwood, with ebony bun feet.
9. An extremely rare blue and white Aritaware dish made between 1658 and 1683.

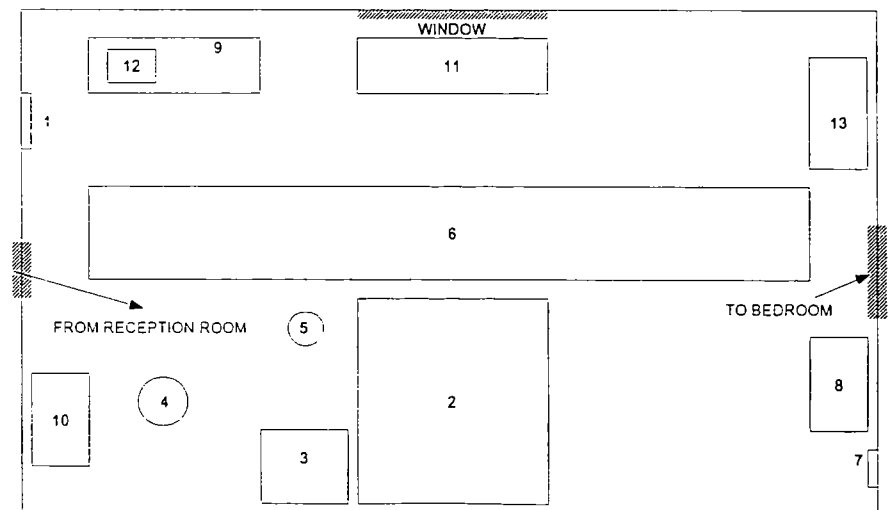


10. Stinkwood marquetry table.
11. Antique "Aubusson à la Marche" carpet.
12. Dutch elm side-chair with rush seat (ca 1800).
13. Cape stinkwood window seat (ca 1800).
14. Teak display cabinet (ca 1740).
15. Famille-rose porcelain garden seat (ca 1736).
16. Six stinkwood chairs with upholstered seats (ca 1825).
17. Oak tip-top table (ca 1750).

4. Master Bedroom

On the opposite side of the reception room is the master bedroom.

1. The oil painting on your left portrays Hendrik de Villiers of Paarl, whose ancestors lived in the Manor House. This painting is Africana.
2. The stinkwood four-poster bed (1810) is decorated with hand-crocheted lace hangings (1820) and an embroidered cotton bedspread (ca 1820).
3. The three-sided design of the moveable cot (made out of fruit-wood) was to allow for the open side to stand against the mother's side of the bed at night, or against a wall during the day.
4. The large blue-and-white Nankin tank (1790 - 1820), which was used as a wash basin, fits into a bidet with square tapered legs and a plain cover.
5. Besides the wash basin, there were no other ablution facilities except for the Chinese Imari porcelain chamber pot under the bed (1662 - 1723).
6. Anatolian Khelim runner.
7. Dutch 17th-century painting "Head of Young Girl".
8. Late 18th-century stinkwood commode with star inlay of yellow-wood and ebony.
9. The walnut chest of drawers to your left dates back to the 19th Century.
10. Camphorwood kist (ca 1810).
11. Rosewood table (ca 1800).
12. English mahogany standing mirror (ca 1800).
13. Armoire with ebony gable, beefwood door panels and satinwood and beefwood drawers (ca 1750).

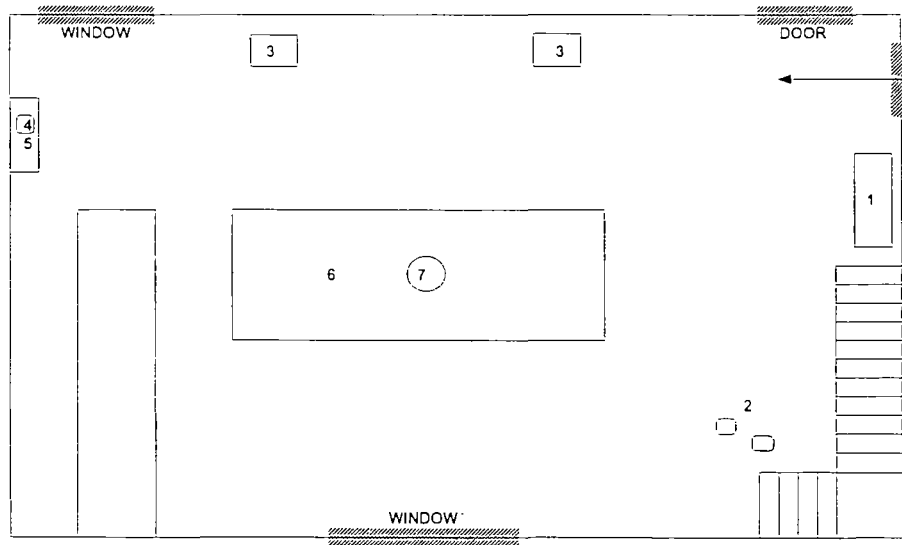


5. Kitchen

As you walk back to the dining room, facing the back entrance, the kitchen is to your right. The original floor was made of hardened clay which was washed with a mixture of water and cow dung to keep it cool and vermin-free. In front of you is the hearth and baking oven. The lower chamber, which is built into the chimney flue, was used for smoking meat.

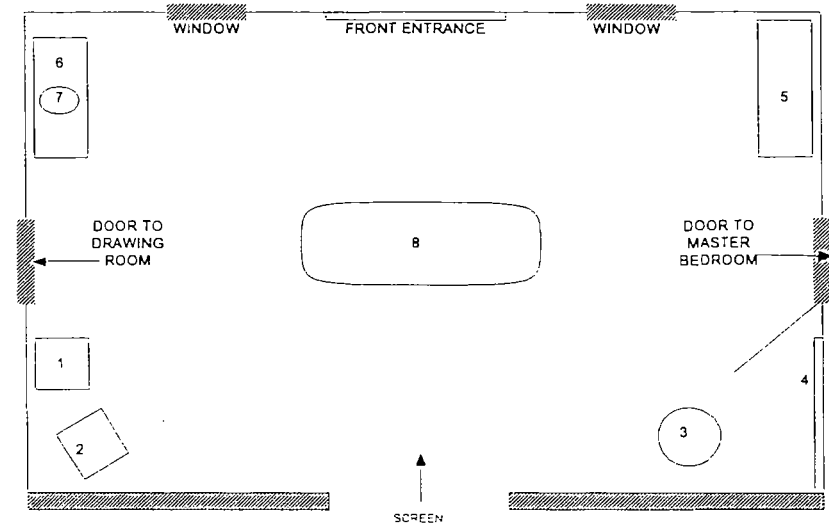
The enclosed wooden stairway on your left gives access to the loft, which was used for food storage. A coffin was also kept there in case of the unexpected.

1. On the stinkwood and yellow-wood food cupboard (ca 1810) on your left, is an oval brass-bound teak "teegoedbalie" (ca 1800) in which teacups were washed.
2. On the floor are two candle moulds. Making one's own candles was essential, as these were the only source of illumination in the house.
3. On your right are two 18th-century fruit-wood Queen Anne-style chairs, originally from the Simondium area.
- 4/5. At the back, in the pantry, two green handblown Constantia wine bottles⁽⁴⁾ (ca 1750) rest on an early 19th-century stinkwood plate-rack⁽⁵⁾.
- 6/7. On the stinkwood and yellow-wood gateleg table in the middle of the kitchen⁽⁶⁾ is a large copper coffee-pot with attached lid and brass-pierced "komfoor"⁽⁷⁾, which was made in Worcester by the coppersmith J W Maclachlan in 1848.



2. Reception Room "Voorkamer"

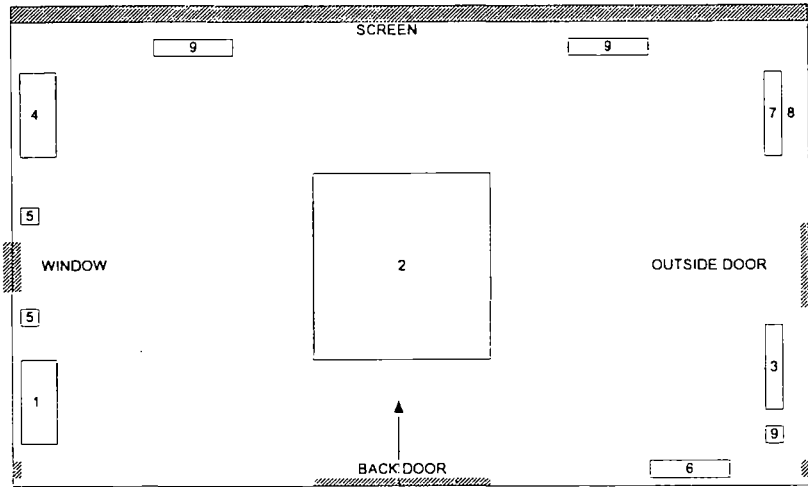
The dining-room is divided from the reception room ("voorkamer") by the original full-width teak and yellow-wood louvered screen with ebony appliqué work in a geometric design. Guests were welcomed here and, according to travelogues, wine and cake was served in this room at eleven o'clock in the morning.



1. On your left is a Dutch 18th-century long-case clock made by Henricus van Vlymen. The face of the clock shows the date, day of the week, month, signs of the zodiac, phases of the moon and the tides in Amsterdam. The cabinet is covered with a burr walnut veneer and the gable shows a strong rococo influence.
2. Next to the grandfather clock is a 17th-century walnut armchair.
3. On your right is an iron- and moulded brass birdcage that dates back to the beginning of the 1700's. The cage was made in Holland, even though the brasswork indicates a strong oriental influence.
4. The original 1812 wall frieze of black acorns and small green leaves underneath the birdcage and the original wall colours were discovered during the 1975 restoration process. All the friezes have been restored to their former beauty.
5. The Cape stinkwood display cabinet (1718) houses a collection of rare VOC glassware.
6. Stinkwood and beefwood table (ca 1830).
7. Brass kettle and brass-pierced "komfoor" made by J W Maclachlan in 1848.
8. Stinkwood and teak gateleg table (ca 1800).

1. Dining-Room "Agterkamer"

You came in through the back entrance, and are now standing in the dining-room, or "agterkamer" (gaandery). This is where the family gathered for their meals, during which, according to early 19th-century travellers, servants gently waved a green branch or a whisk of peacock feathers to keep the flies away. Either before or after supper, family worship, an integral part of the daily routine, was conducted here, joined in by the domestic servants.

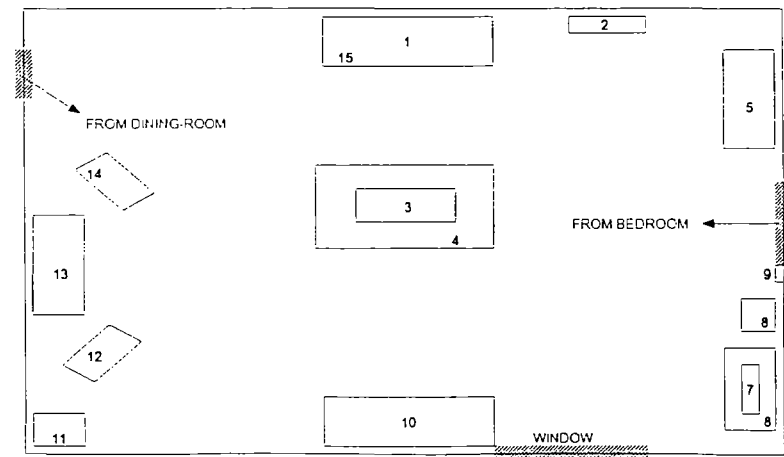


1. The gabled armoire with glazed frames is made of oak with a walnut veneer and is of Dutch origin. It houses a collection of fine "Kraak" porcelain, which was developed for the expanding Chinese export market during the Ming Dynasty (1573 - 1620).
2. The extension dining-room table is made of Burmese teak (ca 1840).
3. Beefwood and stinkwood Cape cabinet with tapered octagonal legs and silver escutcheons (ca 1800).
4. On display in the stinkwood display cabinet are Chinese famille-rose and Japanese porcelain dishes (early 18th century).
5. Pair of Charles II walnut chairs (17th century).
6. A pewter tobacco pot (ca 1740), a handblown Constantia wine bottle (ca 1750), and a pewter jug, rest on a stinkwood table with cabriole legs (ca 1750).
7. Tamboti "rusbank" (late 18th century).
8. Oil painting of Mouillé Point by W. Bowler.
9. Stinkwood tub chairs (18th century).

6. De Villiers Room/Study

The study was originally used as a bedroom.

1. The beautiful teak and yellow-wood wall cupboard dates back to 1746. Jan de Villiers (Jacques' son) built a house on this site in 1746, and his son Paul had the soft brickwork of his own house built on its stone foundations.
2. When the map of Southern Africa hanging next to the cupboard was issued by Nicolas Visscher in Amsterdam in 1792, it was already 100 years out of date.
- 3/4. The oyster, walnut, and rosewood-veneered captain's box⁽³⁾ on the 18th-century stinkwood Cape gateleg table⁽⁴⁾ was made in Holland ca 1700. It opens at the front, and there are two drawers inside, with a secret compartment above.
5. The Dutch satinwood rolltop desk dates back to the 19th century.
- 6/7. Close to the window, on top of the satinwood drop-leaf table⁽⁶⁾, is an 18th-century stinkwood and beefwood sloping desk⁽⁷⁾.
8. James II walnut chair with exceptionally high and narrow back (17th century).
9. An 18th-century glass barometer hangs on the wall above the chair.
10. The 18th-century armoire is made out of ebony, satinwood and stinkwood. The carved panel in the gable comes from Sri-Lanka (former Ceylon) and shows a strong Eastern influence. This armoire was originally owned by the first Prime Minister of the Cape, Sir John Charles Molteno, during the 18th century.
11. Cape stinkwood Canterbury sheet music stand (early 19th century).
12. Charles II walnut armchair with needlepoint back and seat.
13. Dutch long-case clock made by Dakker, Groningen (ca 1750).
14. William and Mary beechwood winged armchair with high rounded back, and the back, seat and arms entirely covered in needlework.



15. Set of three famille-rose vases (ca 1800).
16. Two pewter candlesticks (ca 1760).

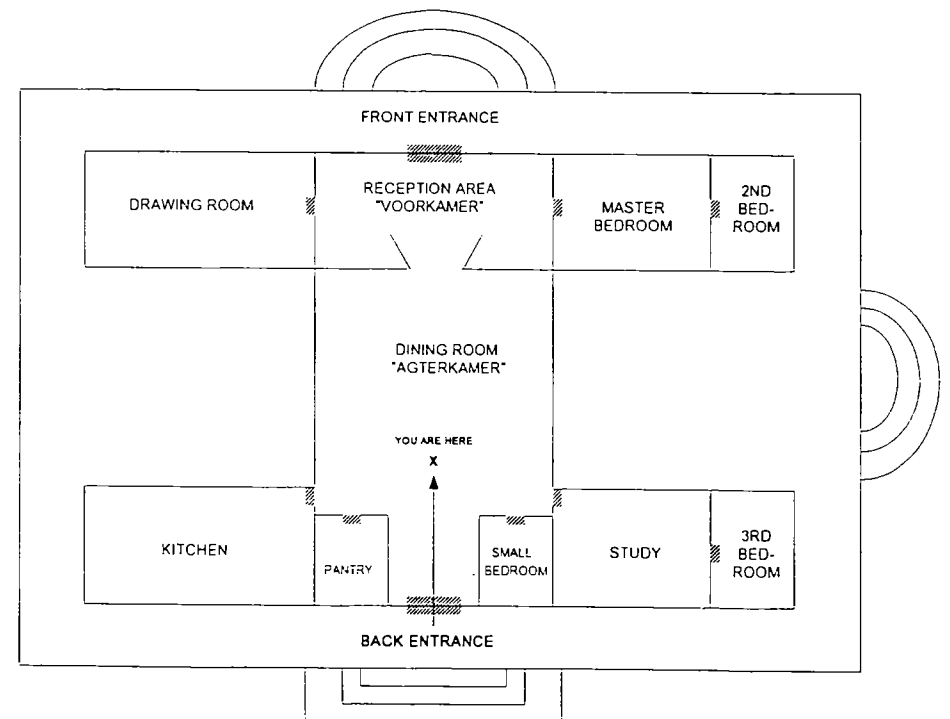
Introduction

Welcome to the Boschendal Manor House.

Governor Simon van der Stel granted the farm, originally named "Bossendaal", to the French Huguenot Jean Le Long in 1685.

Abraham de Villiers (also a French Huguenot) took transfer of Le Long's grant in 1715, together with adjacent unnamed farmland originally granted to the Frenchman Nicolas de Lanoy in 1690.

The Boschendal Manor House, as you see it today, was built in 1812 by Paul de Villiers and his wife Anna Susanna Louw, whose initials appear on the front gable in appliqué work.
