### ***Program Objectives***

The purpose of this International Visitor Program is to expose the group of three Angolan military physicians, three Mozambican provincial battalion commanders, and a military journalist from each country to U.S. military and civilian HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment programs. The growing concern about the HIV/AIDS public health problem in Angola and Mozambique is compounded by misconceptions about the disease and a lack of knowledge of its symptoms and causes. Military and civilian leaders in these southern African nations are seeking ways to prevent new outbreaks of HIV infection and to help those afflicted with AIDS. The group would like to meet with professional counterparts to discuss strategies to reduce the threat of this deadly disease.

The visitors will be focusing on the following issues:

- ⇒ Public awareness and educational campaigns to combat HIV/AIDS
- ⇒ Military community response to HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment
- ⇒ HIV/AIDS medical research
- ⇒ Local government health and welfare agencies' response to HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment
- ⇒ Role of non-profit and advocacy groups, and grassroots community organizations in the fight against AIDS
- ⇒ HIV/AIDS awareness through social marketing in the media

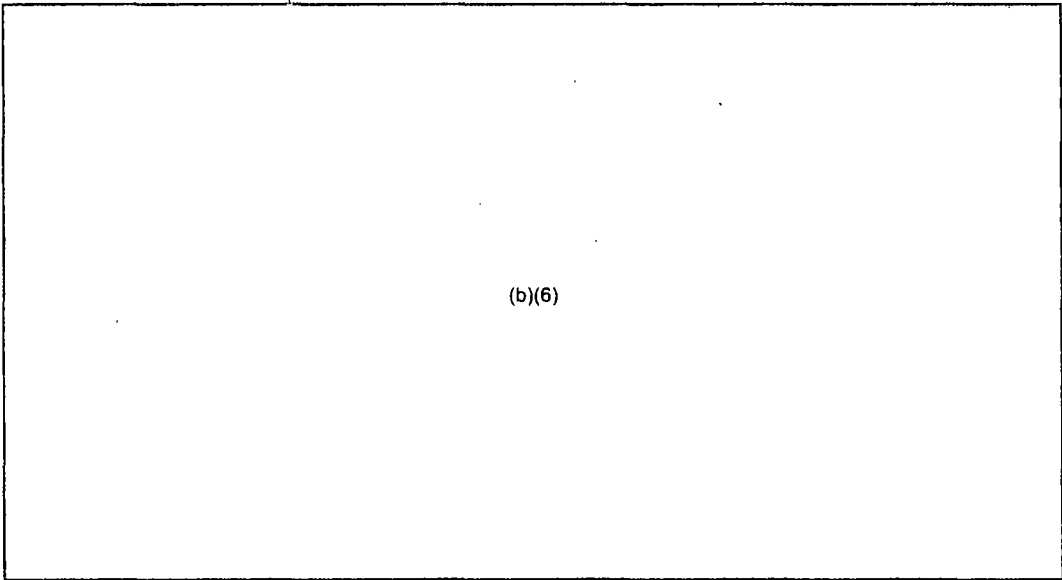
