1. (SBU) SUMMARY: DISCUSSING HIS VIEWS ON HIV/AIDS AT PARLIAMENTARY QUESTION TIME ON SEPTEMBER 20, PRESIDENT MBEKI CONFIRMED THAT THE GOVERNMENT'S POLICY ON HIV/AIDS IS PREDICATED ON THE VIEW THAT HIV CAUSES AIDS. ASKED TO CLARIFY WHETHER HE HIMSELF BELIEVES THIS IS THE CASE, HE EXPOUNDED AT LENGTH ON HIS BELIEF THAT A VIRUS CANNOT CAUSE A SYNDROME. THE PRESIDENT SAID THAT THE REPORT OF A GOVERNMENT PANEL WILL LEND CLARITY TO THE ISSUE OF WHETHER OTHER FACTORS THAN THE VIRUS CAN CONTRIBUTE TO AN HIV-POSITIVE STATUS. ASKED WHETHER PRESIDENT CLINTON HAD RESPONDED TO HIS LETTER EARLIER THIS YEAR ON HIV/AIDS, MBEKI RESPONDED THAT HE HAD, BUT DECLINED TO REVEAL THE CONTENTS OF THE REPLY; HE NOTED THAT THE USG HAD ASKED TO BE KEPT INFORMED OF THE SAG'S DELIBERATIONS ON HIV/AIDS. THIS IS THE CLEAREST STATEMENT THUS FAR OF MBEKI'S VIEWS ON HIV/AIDS. EMBASSY WILL PROVIDE FURTHER ANALYSIS OF MBEKI'S STATEMENT AND LOCAL REACTION IN SEPTTEL. END SUMMARY.

THE PRESIDENT ON HIV/AIDS

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2. (U) PRESIDENT MBEKI TALKED AT LENGTH ABOUT HIS VIEWS ON HIV/AIDS VIRUS DURING PARLIAMENTARY QUESTION TIME SEPTEMBER 20. (OTHER ISSUES DISCUSSED, INCLUDING RACISM AND ZIMBABWE, WILL BE REPORTED SEPTTEL.) FOLLOWING ARE EXCERPTS (NOT VERBATIM) FROM THE PRESIDENT'S REMARKS:

-- (ASKED BY LEADER OF THE OFFICIAL OPPOSITION TONY LEON WHETHER THE LACK OF CLARITY ON THE PRESIDENT'S POSITION ON HIV/AIDS IS CAUSING DELAYS IN PUTTING IN PLACE AN EFFECTIVE ANTI-AIDS PROGRAM) WE HAVE A COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM IN PLACE. THE PROGRAM IS BASED ON THE THESIS THAT HIV CAUSES AIDS, AND EVERYTHING IN THE PROGRAM SAYS THAT. THIS IS WHAT I SAID AT THE AIDS CONFERENCE IN DURBAN. THE GOVERNMENT HAS ALLOCATED FUNDS TO DEVELOP A VACCINE. AS THE GOVERNMENT, WE BELIEVE THAT, GIVEN THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE PROBLEM, IT IS IMPORTANT TO ACT EFFECTIVELY. TO DO THIS, WE NEED TO HAVE A COMPREHENSIVE UNDERSTANDING OF THE PROBLEM. WE NEED TO MAKE SURE OUR INTERVENTIONS CAUSE RESULTS. IT IS NECESSARY TO ANSWER THE QUESTION OF WHAT HIV TESTS MEASURE. THE CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL (CDC) AND DISSIDENT SCIENTISTS ARE LOOKING AT THIS ISSUE. IF SOMEONE IS HIV POSITIVE, THEY RECEIVE A PARTICULAR TREATMENT, SO IT IS IMPORTANT TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE TEST ALSO MEASURES OTHER THINGS.

-- (ON WHETHER HIV CAUSES AIDS) THE ACRONYM, AS YOU KNOW, IS ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME. I DON'T BELIEVE IT'S A SENSIBLE THING TO ASK WHETHER HIV CAUSES AIDS. DOES A VIRUS CAUSE A SYNDROME? HOW CAN IT? A VIRUS CAN'T CAUSE A SYNDROME; IT CAUSES A DISEASE. THE CDC HAS PUT OUT A LIST OF 29 AIDS-RELATED DISEASES. WHAT IS THE RELATION OF THE VIRUS TO THE COLLAPSE OF THE SYSTEM? IT CONTRIBUTES, BUT THERE ARE OTHER THINGS THAT CONTRIBUTE. THE IMMUNE DEFICIENCY IS ACQUIRED FROM SOMETHING, BUT THERE ARE OTHER THINGS THAT LEAD TO A BREAKDOWN OF THE IMMUNE SYSTEM, AND WE RESPOND TO ALL OF THESE THINGS. (LOUD CHEERS FROM THE ANC CAUCUS.) THE BASIC PROBLEM IS THAT MANY PEOPLE DON'T WANT TO STUDY THIS; THEY ARE HAPPY TO REPEAT THE CONVENTIONAL WISDOM. SCIENTISTS, ORTHODOX AND NON-ORTHODOX, NEED TO FIND OUT, WHEN SOMETHING IS TESTED, WHAT IN FACT IS BEING MEASURED.

-- (ASKED BY FREEDOM FRONT MP PIETER MULDER WHETHER HE BELIEVES THAT THE GOVERNMENT'S STATEMENTS ON THE UNCERTAIN CONNECTION BETWEEN HIV AND AIDS HAVE CAUSED CONFUSION) I AGREE THAT PERHAPS THE WAY ALL OF US HAVE HANDLED THIS HAS RESULTED IN CONFUSION. THERE IS AN EXISTING PROGRAM TO DEAL WITH THIS QUESTION. WE MUST ANSWER OUTSTANDING QUESTIONS, AS THE PANEL IS DOING. ACCORDING TO LAST YEAR'S FIGURES, THE LEADING KILLER IN AFRICA IS HEART

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DISEASE. MALARIA IS SECOND, AND AIDS IS THIRD. AIDS CAUSES 12 PERCENT OF DEATHS; WE MUST NOT IGNORE THE OTHER 88 PERCENT.

-- (ASKED WHETHER PRESIDENT CLINTON AND OTHER LEADERS HAD ANSWERED THE LETTER THE PRESIDENT SENT EARLIER THIS YEAR ON HIV/AIDS) THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 CAPE TOWN 001580

SUBJECT: PRESIDENT MBEDI EXPANDS ON HIS VIEWS ON HIV/AIDS

UN SECRETARY GENERAL HAVE RESPONDED TO MY LETTER, BUT THEY HAVE NOT ISSUED THE LETTERS IN PUBLIC. WITH REGARD TO MY LETTER TO PRESIDENT CLINTON, I HEARD THAT IT LEAKED. THERE WAS NO AGREEMENT TO COMMUNICATE PUBLICLY. IF I WANTED TO RELEASE PRESIDENT CLINTON'S LETTER, IT WOULD BE DECENT TO GET THEIR PERMISSION. THEY'VE SAID THAT THEY ARE VERY INTERESTED IN OUR WORK ON THIS ISSUE, AND ASKED US TO KEEP THEM INFORMED.

-- (ASKED BY DEMOCRATIC HEALTH SPOKESMAN SAREL GOUS WHETHER HE HIMSELF BELIEVES HIV CAUSES AIDS, AND WHETHER HE WOULD BE WILLING TO BE INJECTED WITH THE AIDS VIRUS) THERE IS AN AIDS PROBLEM, WHICH WE HAVE GOT TO DEAL WITH AS COMPREHENSIVELY AS POSSIBLE. WE HAVE A COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM DRAWING ON ESTABLISHED PRACTICE. SCIENTISTS WILL CONTINUE TO DO THEIR WORK AND ALLOW US A BETTER UNDERSTANDING. OUR NATIONAL PANEL (ON THE CAUSES OF AIDS) WILL REPORT BY THE END OF THE YEAR. THE CDC, THE PASTEUR INSTITUTE IN FRANCE, AND MANY OTHERS RECOGNIZE THAT THERE ARE UNANSWERED QUESTIONS. SO I'LL WAIT FOR THE RESULTS, AND IN THE MEANTIME CONTINUE WITH THE EXISTING PROGRAM.

AIDS ACTIVISTS CONFRONT HEALTH MINISTER

3. (U) THE DAY BEFORE THE PRESIDENT'S REMARKS TO PARLIAMENT, HEALTH MINISTER MANTO TSHABALALA-MSIMANG BRIEFED THE PARLIAMENTARY PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE ON HEALTH ON THE GOVERNMENT'S COOPERATION WITH OTHER COUNTRIES IN THE REGION ON HEALTH ISSUES. SHE DISCUSSED A NUMBER OF

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REGIONAL HIV/AIDS PREVENTION PROGRAMS. STANLEY MOGOBA, LEADER OF THE PAN-AFRICANIST CONGRESS, NOTED THAT THE GOVERNMENT WAS INVOLVED IN A NUMBER OF REGIONAL INITIATIVES THAT APPEARED TO BE PREDICATED ON THE PREMISE THAT HIV CAUSES AIDS. HE ASKED THE MINISTER WHETHER SHE BELIEVED THAT A CLEAR STATEMENT BY THE GOVERNMENT ON THE CAUSAL LINK BETWEEN HIV AND AIDS WOULD FACILITATE THE RAPID IMPLEMENTATION OF THESE PROGRAMS. THE MINISTER RESPONDED IN A SIMILAR VEIN TO HER REMARKS THE PREVIOUS DAY AT A PRESS CONFERENCE (REF A). SHE REPEATED HER STATEMENTS THAT NOBODY HAS EVER SAID THAT HIV DOES NOT CAUSE AIDS AND THAT AN EXCESSIVE FOCUS ON THE ROLE OF THE HIV VIRUS IN THE EPIDEMIC WOULD LEAD TO A PROGRAM THAT OVEREMPHASIZED THE USE OF ANTIRETROVIRALS AND IGNORED OTHER FACTORS SUCH AS POVERTY.

4. (SBU) ABOUT THIRTY PEOPLE FROM THE TREATMENT ACTION CAMPAIGN (TAC), REPRESENTING ALL RACES AND RANGING FROM GRANDMOTHERS WITH INFANTS TO TEENAGERS, ATTENDED THE HEARING, INTERJECTING "JUST SAY YES!" WHEN THE MINISTER DISCUSSED WHETHER HIV CAUSED AIDS. FOLLOWING THE MEETING, TAC SPOKESMAN ZACKIE ACHMAT, A YOUNG AIDS SUFFERER AND ANC MEMBER, PRESENTED A PETITION TO THE MINISTER ON THE STEPS OF PARLIAMENT AND EXPRESSED THE CAMPAIGN'S CONCERN ABOUT THE GOVERNMENT'S CONFUSING RHETORIC ON AIDS AND ITS FAILURE TO PROVIDE ANTIRETROVIRAL DRUGS.

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ACCORDINGLY.

SUMMARY

1. (SBU) THE SOUTH AFRICAN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH)
HAS TAKEN AN IMPORTANT STEP IN ITS BATTLE AGAINST THE
HIV/AIDS EPIDEMIC BY CONVENING A FIRST-EVER MEETING OF
DONORS TO COORDINATE ACTIVITIES. AS DECIDED IN THE
SEPTEMBER 14 MEETING, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH WILL
CHAIR THE MEETINGS AND UNAIDS WILL HELP MANAGE THE
COORDINATION OF THE HIV/AIDS PROGRAMS OF RESPECTIVE
DONOR AGENCIES. ALTHOUGH THE FIRST MEETING FOCUSED
PRIMARILY ON WORK TO BE DONE IN THE FUTURE, THE FACT
THAT IT TOOK PLACE AT ALL WAS AN IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENT.
END SUMMARY.

2. (SBU) WHILE TOP GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, INCLUDING

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PRESIDENT MBEKI AND HEALTH MINISTER TSHABALALA-MSIMANG, OFFER AMBIGUOUS VIEWS ON THE QUESTION OF WHETHER HIV CAUSES AIDS (SEE REFS), THE DOH HAS CONVENED A FIRST-EVER DONOR COORDINATION MEETING FOCUSED ON HIV/AIDS. IN THE SEPTEMBER 14 MEETING CHAIRED BY DOH, REPRESENTATIVES OF DONOR AGENCIES DISCUSSED ESTABLISHING AN HIV/AIDS "THEME GROUP FOR BILATERAL AND MULTILATERAL DONORS". ALL OF THE KEY DONOR AGENCIES WERE IN ATTENDANCE, INCLUDING USAID, THE WORLD BANK, THE EU, DFID AND HHS/CDC. IN ADDITION TO THE DOH, THE SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT WAS REPRESENTED BY OFFICIALS FROM THE DEPARTMENTS OF WELFARE, EDUCATION AND FINANCE.

3. (SBU) DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF THE DOH'S HIV/AIDS AND STD PROGRAM CELICIA SERENATA OPENED THE MEETING BY EXPLAINING THAT THE URGENCY OF THE HIV/AIDS PICTURE IN SOUTH AFRICA ARGUED FOR A MORE FORMAL ARRANGEMENT FOR COORDINATING THE PROGRAMS FUNDED BY VARIOUS DONOR AGENCIES. BUILDING ON THE COOPERATION THAT BEGAN WITH THE PARTNERSHIP AGAINST AIDS, THE DOH HOPED SUCH A FORUM WOULD BE ABLE TO ACCOMPLISH THE FOLLOWING GOALS:

- SHARE INFORMATION REGARDING THE EPIDEMIC;
- DEVELOP A COORDINATED AND NON-DUPLICATIVE RESPONSE;
- SCALE UP NATIONAL RESPONSES;
- IMPROVE COMMUNICATION TO ENSURE THE COUNTRY CAN BENEFIT FROM INTERNATIONAL PRACTICES AND INVESTMENTS;
- STRENGTHEN TECHNICAL SUPPORT IN TERMS OF ADVOCACY, TRAINING, POLICY ANALYSIS, RESEARCH, PROCESS MANAGEMENT AND PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT; AND
- ADDRESS CROSS-BORDER ISSUES.

4. (SBU) AS AGREED IN THE MEETING, THE DOH WILL CONTINUE TO CONVENE THE MEETINGS WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF UNAIDS. DR. NONO SIMELELA, CHIEF DIRECTOR OF THE DOH'S HIV/AIDS AND STD PROGRAM, WILL ACT AS THE DOH POINT OF CONTACT. UNAIDS NATIONAL PROGRAM OFFICER IVAN LLOYD SUGGESTED THAT AN IMPORTANT FIRST STEP WOULD BE TO SPELL OUT TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE DONOR FORUM'S SUPPORT OF THE PRIORITIES OUTLINED BY THE DOH. HE PROPOSED THAT THE GROUP MEET PERIODICALLY TO SHARE INFORMATION, DO ANALYSIS, IDENTIFY AREAS FOR INTERVENTION, AND DISCUSS STRATEGIES FOR TECHNICAL COOPERATION AND COLLABORATION WITH THE GOVERNMENT AND NGOS. AS THE COORDINATING AGENCY, LLOYD AGREED THAT UNAIDS WOULD COMPILE A LIST OF THE CURRENT ACTIVITIES OF DONOR AGENCIES. HE SUGGESTED

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ANOTHER MEETING WITHIN THE NEXT MONTH TO FINALIZE THE TERMS OF REFERENCE.

5. (SBU) ALTHOUGH SOUTH AFRICA HAS HAD A LONG RELATIONSHIP WITH DONOR AGENCIES, DR. SIMELELA OF THE DOH COMMENTED THAT DONOR SUPPORT HAS HERETOFORE BEEN ON UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 PRETORIA 007518

SUBJECT: DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CONVENES FIRST HIV/AIDS DONOR COORDINATION MEETING

AN AD HOC BASIS. SIMELELA SAID SHE INTENDED TO HOLD "SECTORAL SUMMITS" AT THE PROVINCIAL LEVEL AND CONCENTRATE ON A BOTTOM-UP APPROACH TO UNDERSTANDING WHERE DONOR ASSISTANCE CAN BE BEST UTILIZED. RESPONDING TO A QUESTION FROM THE EU REPRESENTATIVE ON WHAT SHE CONSIDERED HER MOST PRESSING FUNDING GAPS, SIMELELA ASKED FOR ASSISTANCE IN THREE AREAS: CONDOMS, TRAINING OF HEALTH CARE WORKERS AND VOLUNTARY COUNSELING AND TESTING.

6. 1. FOLLOWING PM ARTHUR'S ANNOUNCEMENT ON SEPT 16 THAT HE WOULD NAME AN "AIDS CZAR" (REF B), THE "ADVOCATE" FLOATED THE NAME OF BRANFORD TAITT, A FORMER MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FOREIGN MINISTER IN THE OPPOSITION DEMOCRATIC LABOUR PARTY GOVERNMENT, AS THE LIKELY CANDIDATE.

2. IN 1991, TAITT WAS THE GOB'S FIRST MINISTER OF HEALTH TO ADVOCATE THE DISTRIBUTION OF CONDOMS IN GLENDAIRY PRISON TO STEM THE SPREAD OF HIV/AIDS. ACCORDING TO LOCAL MEDIA, WHEN HE WAS ASKED ABOUT HIS LIKELY APPOINTMENT, HE DECLINED COMMENT AND REFERRED ALL QUERIES TO THE PM'S OFFICE. THE REPORT ABOUT TAITT CAME AS PM ARTHUR WAS ON HIS WAY TO THE HAGUE FOR A CONFERENCE, AND HE IS STILL OUT OF THE COUNTRY AS THE DEBATE ABOUT HIV/AIDS, CONDOMS AND PRISONERS IS ON-GOING.

3. ON SEPTEMBER 8, THE CURRENT MINISTER OF HEALTH RESTATED THE CALL FOR DISTRIBUTING CONDOMS AT GLENDAIRY. THIS SET OFF A FIRE-STORM OF CONTROVERSY BETWEEN CLERICS, POLITICIANS AND SOCIAL ACTIVISTS. DAVID THOMPSON, THE LEADER OF THE OPPOSITION, SAID THAT WHILE QUESTIONS OF MORALITY WERE IMPORTANT, THE SUGGESTION TO MAKE CONDOMS ACCESSIBLE TO PRISONERS WAS "A SENSIBLE ONE" AND SAID

THAT BARBADIANS "HAVE TO WAKE UP TO REALITY."

4. OPPOSING CLERGYMEN SAID THAT SUPPLYING CONDOMS TO PRISONERS WAS ENDORSING HOMOSEXUALITY, CALLING IT "A DEVIANT FORM OF SEXUAL BEHAVIOR THAT HAS TO BE WIPED OUT." ONE CLERGYMAN WHO AGREED WITH DISTRIBUTING CONDOMS TO PRISONERS, SUGGESTED THAT PERSONS BEING SENT TO PRISON SHOULD BE TESTED FOR HIV BEFORE THEY WERE INCARCERATED, AND ADDED, INFECTED PERSONS SHOULD BE QUARANTINED IN A SEPARATE SECTION.

5. TAITT SAID THAT UNLIKE THE CURRENT MINISTER OF HEALTH, HE DID NOT AGREE WITH DISPENSING CONDOMS IN GLENDAIRY, BUT FELT THAT RELATIVES AND FRIENDS SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO GIVE THEM TO THE PRISONERS. HE ADDED, "THE COMMUNITY HAS TO DEEPLY EXAMINE ITSELF TO SEE IF IT IS BEING BRUTALLY HONEST WITH ITSELF. GOD WOULD NOT WISH US TO BE DISHONEST ABOUT THE REALITY OF OUR SOCIETY."

6. COMMENT: THE PRESS REPORT FROM THE "ADVOCATE" SAID IT WAS "RELIABLY INFORMED." THE "ADVOCATE" AT TIMES HAS BEEN SEEN AS A GOB ORGAN. TAITT'S NAME CAME OUT AS PM ARTHUR WAS ON THE WAY TO THE HAGUE FOR A CONFERENCE. THE PM WAS OUT OF THE COUNTRY AS OF SEPT 28. GIVEN THE REACTION TO THE FLOATING OF TAITT AS THE PM'S PROPOSED HIV/AIDS' CZAR, THE ISSUE MAY BE REVISITED AFTER HIS RETURN. END COMMENT.
