Tab C International AIDS Legislative Goals and Calendar

Part I: Appropriations Process

1) Secure full funding for the President's budget request on international AIDS (including HIPC&IDA money) in Appropriations process. Key Appropriations subcommittees are Agriculture, Foreign Operations, Defense, and Labor/HHS (to be reviewed by Martha Foley (WH Legislative Affairs), OMB, USAID first). Attached Appropriations calendar to follow.

2) Organize interagency briefings for above subcommittees. Also target and work with friends on the Committee (Pelosi, Leahy, Durbin, Jackson (Il), Feinstein, etc.).

Part II: Non-Appropriations Measures

1) Secure passage of Administration proposals. Seek legislative vehicle for our vaccine tax credit proposal (Ways & Means, Finance, Health Care revenue bills).

2) Devise strategy for managing congressional initiatives. Leach/Lee (H.R. 3519) passed in the House by voice vote on May 15. Need to fine-tune administration position and prepare for Senate strategy. Currently OMB, Treasury, and USAID are reviewing H.R. 3519's language and devising coordinated strategy for future negotiations with members.

Part III: General Education and Outreach to Members and Committee Education

1) Draft and clear interagency talking points on the AIDS crisis and highlight the Administration's proposals.

2) Design outreach (including specific talking points) for interested congressional groups (CBC, Women's, Asian, Military Committees, etc.).

3) Develop and utilize existing core groups of interested members (for dear colleagues, floor debates, one minutes, "whipping" -- internal lobbying, etc.).

SUMMARY

1. WHILE LESS THAN A YEAR HAS GONE BY SINCE REFTELS WERE ISSUED, MUCH HAS OCCURRED ON THE HIV/AIDS FRONT IN KENYA. MISSION OFFICES AND AGENCIES CONTINUE TO WORK ON EDUCATION ABOUT AND REDUCTION OF HIV/AIDS INFECTION. INCREASED FUNDING HAS COME THROUGH THE LIFE INITIATIVE AND SYNERGIES ARE BEING DEVELOPED WITH OUR EU PARTNERS AS WELL AS OTHER DONOR COUNTRIES. UNDER THE AMBASSADOR'S LEADERSHIP, THE MISSION HAS FORMED AN INTER-AGENCY WORKING GROUP TO EVEN FURTHER COORDINATE OUR HIV/AIDS PROGRAMS AND POLICY. A SURVEY OF MISSION EFFORTS WAS RECENTLY COMMISSIONED BY THAT GROUP. WE OFFER THIS UPDATE ON THIS AND OTHER MISSION EFFORTS AND ASSETS IN THE ONGOING BATTLE AGAINST HIV/AIDS. END SUMMARY.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE

2. THE MISSION NO LONGER DISQUALIFIES HIV-POSITIVE CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT. THIS BRINGS OUR EMPLOYMENT POLICY MORE IN LINE WITH THE PHILOSOPHY AND PRACTICE EMBODIED IN U.S. LAW. WE ARE CONTINUING OUR REGULARLY-SCHEDULED HIV/AIDS SEMINARS FOR ALL EMPLOYEES AND FAMILY MEMBERS. TOPICS OVER THE LAST YEAR HAVE INCLUDED PERSONAL RISK SELF-ASSESSMENT AND BEHAVIOR CHANGE: LINKING KNOWLEDGE TO ACTION. FUTURE SESSIONS WILL FEATURE PRESENTATIONS ON: FOCUS ON YOUTH, GENDER AND HIV/AIDS AND LIVING POSITIVELY WITH HIV.

3. ANOTHER PRIORITY GOAL IS TO CONVINCE THE MANAGERS OF AMERICAN BUSINESSES REPRESENTED IN KENYA TO ADOPT WORKPLACE POLICIES ON HIV/AIDS THAT FALL IN LINE WITH POLICIES IN PLACE IN THE U.S. THIS WOULD INCLUDE A NON-DISCRIMINATORY HIRING POLICY, DESTIGMATIZATION OF HIV-POSITIVE STATUS AND A SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR HIV-POSITIVE EMPLOYEES. WHILE A FIRST ATTEMPT, WITH ACTIVE MISSION ENCOURAGEMENT, HAS RESULTED ONLY IN THE ADOPTION OF NON-BINDING TERMS BY THE LOCAL AMERICAN BUSINESS ASSOCIATION, WE WILL CONTINUE TO PRESS FOR THEIR ACCEPTANCE OF U.S.-TYPE STANDARDS OF HIV/AIDS AND HIRING AND WORKPLACE POLICIES. DESPITE THE RELUCTANCE OF SOME COMPANIES, SEVERAL LARGE FIRMS HAVE DISPLAYED OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP IN THIS AREA. EVEREADY CORPORATION'S LOCAL BRANCH HAS ADOPTED A MODEL NON-DISCRIMINATING HIV/AIDS POLICY WHICH ALSO REACHES OUT TO ALREADY-INFECTED EMPLOYEES.

4. USAID/KENYA IS FOCUSING ON SUPPORT FOR HIV/AIDS PREVENTION AND BEHAVIOR CHANGE, POLICY AND ADVOCACY, AND COMMUNITY-BASED CARE. PREVENTION AND BEHAVIORAL CHANGE ACTIVITIES INCLUDE WORKING WITH BUSINESS TO DEVELOP SUPPORTIVE POLICIES, AND PREVENTION AND CARE PROGRAMS FOR EMPLOYEES; SUPPORT FOR THE SOCIAL MARKETING OF CONDOMS AND VOLUNTARY COUNSELING AND TESTING (VCT). USAID/K HAS SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE JAPANESE INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AGENCY TO ESTABLISH A VCT CENTER OF EXCELLENCE AT KENYATTA NATIONAL HOSPITAL. WE WILL SUPPORT TRAINING FOR COUNSELORS, ESTABLISHMENT OF AN AIDS NETWORK (TO REFER HIV-POSITIVE CLIENTS FOR FURTHER SERVICES) AND COVER LIMITED OPERATIONAL EXPENSES. COMMUNITY OUTREACH IS CONDUCTED THROUGH PEER MOTIVATION, PARTICIPATORY MEETINGS AND COMMUNITY THEATER; AS WELL AS SCHOOL-BASED PREVENTION EDUCATION PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS. OTHER

PARLIAMENTARIANS, LEADERS OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES AND OTHER SENIOR GOK OFFICIALS TO HELP THEM BECOME ADVOCATES FOR PROGRAMS AND POLICIES TO COMBAT HIV/AIDS. WE ALSO AIM AT BUILDING A NATIONAL-LEVEL CAPACITY FOR ANALYSIS AND DISSEMINATION OF SURVEILLANCE DATA, AND TO DEVELOP LEADERSHIP AT THE DISTRICT (COUNTY) LEVEL AS WELL AS WITHIN THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

7. THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL (CDC) OFFICE HAS SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASED ITS PRESENCE IN KENYA AND HAS ADDED HIV/AIDS PREVENTIVE PROGRAMS TO ITS TRADITIONAL PORTFOLIO OF MALARIA AND HIV/AIDS RESEARCH. MOST OF THE \$3.5 MILLION IN LIFE INITIATIVE FUNDING FOR FY 00 WAS DISBURSED THROUGH EXISTING USAID/KENYA CONTRACTORS. NOW THAT CDC HAS RECEIVED THE NSDD 38 APPROVAL FOR THEIR EXPANDED PRESENCE OF U.S. DIRECT HIRES, THEY WILL WORK CLOSELY WITH THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH, THE KENYA MEDICAL RESEARCH INSTITUTE, UNICEF, UNAIDS, WHO AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS TO IMPROVE SURVEILLANCE, INCREASE VOLUNTARY TESTING AND COUNSELING, PREVENT MOTHER TO CHILD TRANSMISSION OF HIV AND PREVENT TUBERCULOSIS. CDC WILL ALSO FOCUS ON OTHER ASPECTS OF HIV/AIDS SUCH AS YOUTH, BLOOD SAFETY, THE MILITARY AND SPECIALIZED TRAINING. THE MISSION IS PLEASED TO WELCOME CDC'S TEAM OF WORLD-CLASS PHYSICIANS AND RESEARCHERS AND IS DETERMINED TO FULLY INTEGRATE THEIR EFFORTS INTO THE OVERALL MISSION HIV/AIDS OBJECTIVES.

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8. THE U.S. ARMY'S MEDICAL RESEARCH UNIT (MRU) CONTINUES TO PLAY AN ACTIVE ROLE AS THE DOD AGENT IN AFRICA FOR DEVELOPING AND TESTING A HIV VACCINE. MRU ANTICIPATES INCREASED FUNDING THAT WILL ALLOW THEM TO WORK IN AN AREA WHERE WE HAVE HAD LITTLE ENGAGEMENT BEFORE -- SURVEILLANCE, COUNSELING AND HIV PREVENTION IN THE KENYAN MILITARY. THE MAIN FOCUS OF MRU'S HIV PROGRAM IS TO CHARACTERIZE HIV VIRUS SUB-TYPES WITHIN KENYA IN PURSUIT OF A SUITABLE VACCINE. THIS PROGRAM WILL FOLLOW A COHORT OF 3,000 VOLUNTEERS FOR THREE YEARS TO ESTABLISH A BASELINE FOR FUTURE VACCINE EFFICACY TRIALS.

GETTING THE WORD OUT

9. OUR PUBLIC DIPLOMACY EFFORTS HAVE BEEN CHALLENGED BY THE SPORADIC RESURGENCE OF DISINFORMATION -- STORIES THAT ACCUSE THE U.S. OF UNLEASHING HIV. PAS HAS RESPONDED TO THE POTENTIALLY -DAMAGING STORIES WITH LETTERS TO THE EDITOR AND BY PROVIDING EDUCATIONAL BRIEFINGS TO MEDIA CONTACTS. OTHER PAS WORK IN THE HIV/AIDS REALM INCLUDE INTERNATIONAL VISITOR PARTICIPANTS, "CYBER TRAINING" FOR WOMEN JOURNALISTS, AS WELL AS GRANTS TO DEVELOP MATERIAL FOR HIV/AIDS AWARENESS SEMINARS. A SERIES OF MEETINGS WITH EDITORIAL BOARDS AND MEDIA EXECUTIVES HAS RESULTED IN BETTER REPORTING OF HIV/AIDS ISSUES, THE INTRODUCTION OF REGULAR FEATURES EMPHASIZING HIV/AIDS PREVENTION AND EDUCATION (FREQUENTLY ON THE FRONT PAGE) AND LESS SENSATIONALISM IN STORIES DEALING WITH THE VIRUS. AFTER A LONG PERIOD OF VACILLATION ON EVEN PERMITTING CONDOM ADVERTISEMENTS ON LOCAL TELEVISION, THE AMBASSADOR WAS ABLE TO EXTRACT AN AGREEMENT FROM THE STATE BROADCASTING CORPORATION TO RUN GENERIC CONDOM ADS FOR FREE, AND ADS FOR SOCIALLY-MARKETED CONDOMS AT A REDUCED PRICE AND TO RUN DAILY HIV/AIDS PREVENTION SPOTS ON RADIO AND TELEVISION. THE MULTIPLIER EFFECT OF FREE AND REDUCED-COST ADVERTISEMENTS HAS ALLOWED USAID'S PARTNERS TO APPLY THOSE RESOURCES IN OTHER EFFORTS IN THE HIV/AIDS BATTLE.

10. WE HAVE BEGUN A DIALOGUE WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND OTHER WASHINGTON-BASED AGENCIES TO EXPLORE OPTIONS THAT WILL BRING UNCLAS SECTION 03 OF 03 NAIROBI 008604

MISSION POLICIES INTO ALIGNMENT WITH OUR PUBLIC PRONOUNCEMENTS ON HIV/AIDS AND NON-DISCRIMINATION. THROUGH THIS DIALOGUE, WE HOPE TO OFFER SUGGESTIONS THAT CAN BE ADOPTED WORLD-WIDE AND THAT WILL PROVOKE THOUGHTS ON INNOVATIVE WAYS TO FUND AND SUSTAIN NEW PROGRAMS AND POLICIES IN SUPPORT OF OUR EFFORTS TO CONTAIN THE SPREAD OF HIV/AIDS AND TO IMPROVE SOME CURRENT STATE/USAID POLICIES ON DEALING WITH HIV-INFECTED INDIVIDUALS.

COMMENT

11. ALTHOUGH THE GOK HAS FINALLY RECOGNIZED THE HIV/AIDS PANDEMIC FOR THE THREAT IT IS, THERE IS STILL MUCH WORK TO BE DONE. MANY KENYANS REMAIN UNAWARE OF THE RISKS OF HIV INFECTION AND ITS IMPACT AND THERE IS LITTLE EVIDENCE OF CHANGE IN SEXUAL BEHAVIOR, THE MOST COMMON FORM OF TRANSMISSION IN KENYA. INFRASTRUCTURE FOR THE PREVENTION OF TRANSFUSION-TRANSMITTED HIV IS WEAK -- MAKING THE WORK BEING CONDUCTED BY USAID AND CDC IN THAT AREA EVEN MORE IMPORTANT -- AND THERE IS LIMITED KNOWLEDGE OF INTERVENTIONS TO PREVENT MOTHER-TO-CHILD TRANSMISSION. DESPITE INCREASING EMPHASIS ON VOLUNTARY TESTING AND COUNSELING, FEW KENYANS ARE AWARE OF THEIR HIV SEROSTATUS. THOSE WHO BECOME INFECTED STAND LITTLE CHANCE OF RECEIVING TREATMENT WHEN THEY BECOME SYMPTOMATIC. THE EVER-INCREASING NUMBERS OF VULNERABLE CHILDREN AND AIDS ORPHANS COULD OVERWHELM KENYA'S ABILITY TO CARE FOR THEM UNLESS INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS ARE PUT IN PLACE TO HELP COMMUNITIES AND FAMILIES COPE WITH THE ISSUE. THESE ARE ALL PROBLEMS THAT WILL CHALLENGE BOTH MISSION EFFORTS AS WELL AS KENYA'S FUTURE DEVELOPMENT AND STABILITY.

12. WE ARE PROUD OF THE WORK ACCOMPLISHED THUS FAR BUT WE HAVE FAR TO GO. MISSION NAIROBI WILL CONTINUE TO SEEK INNOVATIVE MEASURES AND ALLIANCES TO SLOW DOWN AND EVENTUALLY, REDUCE THE RATE OF INFECTION AND ITS CONCOMITANT DESTRUCTIVE RESULTS. OUR NEW INTERAGENCY TEAM HAS REVITALIZED EFFORTS TO BUILD COMPLEMENTARY STRATEGIES AS NEW RESOURCES IN THE GLOBAL AND AFRICAN FIGHT AGAINST HIV/AIDS BECOME AVAILABLE. WORKING WITH GOVERNMENT AND OUR NGO PARTNERS, WE ARE CONVINCED THAT KENYA CAN BECOME A MODEL OF BOTH FIELD RESEARCH EXCELLENCE AND PROGRAM EFFECTIVENESS IN THIS STRUGGLE.
