LOGISTICS:

Airlines

- SAA is an American Airlines Codeshare, which means that US government agencies can use it.
- There are direct, nonstop flights to both Capetown and JoBerg from either Miami or NY. The attached pages from the Official Airlines Guide will indicate examples of these flights--these examples are a bit dated (Sept 97) but they give you a general idea.

Flights arrive in Capetown from Miami only at about 12:40 in the afternoon. This would mean that you need to leave Miami at 5:00 pm the day prior to your arrival in South Africa and, thus, that you would need to leave the Washington area earlier in the afternoon. The Miami-Capetown flight does not appear to fly on Mondays or Wed.

There also is a direct NYC-Johannesburg flight which arrives at about 3:00 pm or 4:30 pm depending on the day. There is a Miami-JoBerg flight that arrives at 3:40 pm (continuation from Capetown flight).

- There are numerous flights from Capetown to JoBerg (see attached). It is an approximately 2 hour flight.
- On the return you can fly from JoBerg to either Miami or NYC depending on the day. The flights depart in the evening from JoBerg. It is a 17.5 hour flight to NYC with one refueling stop in Cape Verde (you can stay on the plane).
- Keep in mind that the airport for Pretoria is the Johannesburg Int'l Airport. Pretoria is about 40 minutes driving time from JoBerg.
- You should be met by either a USIA or a USAID driver at the places you intend to visit and at the airport. This needs to be arranged.
