STATEMENT OF THE PRESIDENT

Today, the Federal Bureau of Investigation released its final crime statistics for 1996, and the results are good news for all Americans. Overall crime is down for the fifth year in a row, with the biggest reductions coming in violent crime (6%) -- and especially murders (9%). Reported rapes, robberies, assaults and all types of property crimes are down from the previous year. Even the arrest rate for violent juveniles, which had skyrocketed for seven years, has now gone down for two years in a row.

Since being elected President, my Administration has worked with police, prosecutors, school principals and community leaders on a tough, smart crime strategy to attack violent crime. Together, we have fought for more police in our communities, fewer guns on our streets, tougher punishment for violent offenders and better opportunities for our kids. Today's crime statistics show that, armed with these tools, we are moving in the right direction. Law abiding Americans are finally -- and decisively -- tipping the scales of justice in their favor.

**"Top Cops" Awards Event
Questions and Answers
October 9, 1997**

Q. What did the President announce today?

A. At an event to honor the 18 recipients of the National Association of Police Organizations (NAPO) "Top Cop" award, the President made two announcements strongly supported by law enforcement:

- Expanding Child Safety Locks. Following the President's lead on the use of child safety locks for handguns, eight major gun manufacturers announced that they would provide child safety devices with all of their handguns sold; and
- Scholarships for Children of Slain Officers. Building on legislation he signed a year ago, the President announced his support for a bill just proposed by the National Association of Police Organizations (NAPO) to make educational benefits available for the children of *state and local* law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

Q. What is the "Top Cop" award?

A. The "Top Cop" awards are given by NAPO and pay tribute to law enforcement officers from across the country for outstanding service to their communities during the preceding year. This year, 18 exceptional law enforcement officers will receive the award for their heroism and devotion to duty and service in their communities.

Child Safety Devices

Q. Who are the manufacturers announcing that they will begin providing child safety devices with their handguns?

A. Following the President's leadership on child safety locks, 8 major handgun manufacturers announced their support to provide them with their handguns: Glock, Beretta, Taurus, H&R, Heckler & Koch, Smith and Wesson, Mossberg & Sons, and SigArms. These manufacturers estimate that they represent about 80% of all of the handguns manufactured in the United States.

Also, it should be mentioned, that Smith and Wesson was the first of these companies to support child safety locks. In August, they announced a partnership with the Master Lock Company that would result in child safety locks being provided with all of their handguns sold for commercial use.

Q. What has the President done in the past to support the use of child safety locks?

- A. By including a provision to require the sale of child safety locks in his Anti-Gang and Youth Violence Act last February, President Clinton helped initiate a national debate on this issue. The President's legislation would require federally-licensed gun dealers to provide child safety locking devices with every gun sold. Moreover, in March, the President directed all federal agencies to provide safety locks with all handguns issued to federal law enforcement officers. By October 15th, all federal law enforcement officers will have been issued a child safety lock for their handgun.

Q. Will these safety devices actually prevent anything?

- A. A recent study by the Justice Department estimated that over one-third of all privately-owned handguns (22 million) are kept loaded and unlocked in our country. Other studies estimate that easy access to these weapons results in 1,500 child (ages 14 and under) being treated in hospital emergency rooms every year for unintentional firearms-related injuries. Child safety devices are an inexpensive and effective solution to this problem. In fact, a 1991 GAO study estimated that child safety locks could have prevented all accidental gun deaths involving children under the age of 6 that were included in the study.

College Scholarships for Children of Slain Officers

Q. Aren't these benefits already available to children of slain officers?

- A. One year ago, President Clinton signed into law the Federal Law Enforcement Dependents Assistance Act of 1996 -- commonly referred to as the "Degan Bill." This Act provides funds to assist in the college education of children of federal law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. Specifically, it provides for up to \$4,848 per year towards the cost of a full-time higher education.

Q. How many people have received educational benefits under the Degan program since it was created last year?

A. To date, 52 families have been determined to be eligible for the program, and several of these have applied for and/or received the first scholarships. The Justice Department will continue to conduct outreach to the families of slain officers and inform them of the availability of this educational assistance.

Q. How much will expanding the educational benefits to all these new people cost?

A. The Justice Department estimates the first-year cost of this program to be about \$780,000.

Q. Has legislation been proposed to expand Degan? Who supports this?

A. NAPO supports and is proposing such legislation today. The proposed expansion would add state, county and local public safety officers to the list of those eligible for this educational assistance. This new definition would include fire and rescue personnel as well.

Q. How many law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty last year?

A. In 1996, 116 federal, state and local law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty, a dramatic 30% decline over 1995. This is the fewest number of police officer fatalities in over 35 years.

I am delighted to welcome you to the White House again to honor
those who risk their lives for our safety, and to announce an important
breakthrough in our effort to protect our children from guns.

Four and a half years ago, we made a commitment to take back our streets from crime and violence and to work to give our people back their peace of mind. We put in place a comprehensive plan, based on what law enforcement told us works in our communities. So we are working to put 100,000 community police officers on our streets, to put tough new penalties on the books, to steer young people away from crime and gangs and drugs, and to keep guns out of the hands of criminals.

We have made real progress. Just last week, we learned that the nation's murder rate has fallen to the lowest point in more than a generation and for the fifth year in a row violent crime and property crime have dropped nationwide. These are very encouraging trends -- and it's not hard to figure out what's going on. Just look behind me. One big reason we are turning back the tide of crime is because of the kind of outstanding police work we are honoring here today.

Every year I look forward to meeting the winners of NAPO's Top Cop awards, to shake the hands and look straight in the eyes of true American heroes. Nominated by fellow officers, the Top Cops assembled here today represent America's finest. Your courage and devotion have gone well beyond the call of duty. From rescuing wounded detention officers during a violent prison riot ... to saving thousands of plant workers pinned down by a sniper ... going deep undercover to arrest Hells Angel's gang members ... you have risked your lives to protect our lives. And on behalf of a grateful and admiring nation, I say thank you and congratulations to you and your families.

One of the ways we have worked with law enforcement is to protect our people -- especially our children -- from violence.

A recent study estimated that Americans keep almost 31 million firearms loaded and unlocked in their homes. Children are especially at risk of accidental shootings. Every year, about 1,500 children are treated in hospital emergency rooms for unintentional gun injuries. In 1993 alone, more than 200 children died.

Communities all across America have woken up to the horror of a child, playing with a parent's gun, accidentally taking the life of a brother, a sister, or a playmate. XXXXXXXX

In March, I directed that the guns issued to all federal safety officers -- including FBI, ATF, DEA, Customs and other officers -- be equipped with child safety locks. And by next week, every agency will have fully complied. When I announced this policy, I said, & if it's good enough for law enforcement, it's good enough for all our citizens.8

Today, because of the voluntary action of the firearms industry, millions of American parents will receive this protection. I am very pleased to announce that the nation's five largest gun manufacturers will provide child-safety devices with every new handgun they manufacture. This voluntary action will affect nine out of ten handguns made in America. And it will save many young lives.

The CEOs of Smith and Wesson, xx, xx, xx, and xx are here, and I

would like to ask them to stand. Thank you for being out front and making this commitment. I hope that every other handgun maker will follow your lead and make the same pledge.

As is well known, we have been on the different sides on many issues, such as the Brady Bill and the assault weapons ban, and there will be other disagreements in the future. But today we stand together with law enforcement officials to do what we all know is right for our children.

I want to thank those members of Congress -- especially Sens. Kohl, Boxer, Chafee, and Durbin and Reps. [who?] -- who worked with us to advance this issue.

And I want to take this opportunity to challenge all parents to do their part -- to take responsibility for the safety of their children. Tough laws, tenacious police, even the farsighted action of industry today, cannot keep our children safe if parents do not take responsibility. If you have a gun in your home, it is up to you to keep it locked and away from the reach of your child.

For far too many years, our people feared that crime would always continue to grow and grow -- that there was nothing we could do about lawlessness and violence. But working together -- police, parents, public officials, and responsible industry leaders -- we have begun to turn the tide. To the Top Cops here today, again I say thank you. Because of the uncommon bravery you show every day, America is moving forward to the new century with our streets safer and our lives more free than xxx.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY

Subject: Importation of Uzi and Galil Firearms

The historic Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 banned 19 specific assault weapons, duplicates of those 19 firearms and certain other semiautomatic weapons possessing various military style features. The Administration and Congress worked to ban these deadly firearms because -- as the weapon of choice for gangs and drug dealers -- they were being recovered at numerous crime scenes and resulting in criminals being better armed than the nation's law enforcement officers. Last year, in part as a result of the ban on assault weapons, fewer police officers were slain in the line duty than any year since ____, and no law enforcement officer was killed by an assault weapon.

In addition to the prohibitions contained in the 1994 ban on assault weapons ban, the 1968 Gun Control Act further restricts the importation of firearms unless they are determined to be particularly suitable for or readily adaptable for sporting purposes. To enforce this law, the Treasury Department has developed a factoring system to determine whether firearms meet this sporting purposes test and are thus importable. And on two occasions, the Department has amended this system to prevent the importation of non-sporting assault rifles and pistols.

I am now informed that 2 of the 19 assault weapons that were specifically banned from importation in 1994, the Galil and the Uzi, have been re-designed in order to circumvent the ban on assault weapons. Moreover, permits allowing the importation of thousands of these firearms have been approved. The Galil and Uzi, which are manufactured by Israeli Military Industries, were specifically banned because these weapons were manufactured and used for military purposes and had no legitimate sporting function. It is difficult to imagine that firearms derived from military weapons, with no legitimate sporting purposes in this country, are either consistent with the 1994 ban on assault-type weapons or appropriate for importation under the provisions of the 1968 Gun Control Act.

My Administration has aggressively enforced all applicable laws to keep non-sporting firearms and other munitions posing a threat to public safety from entering the country. Therefore, to protect the peace and safety of Americans, I direct you to:

- 1) Take the necessary steps to reexamine and determine whether the sporting purposes test should be modified with respect to the importation of the Galil, Uzi and any other military-style firearms that have been similarly adapted or reengineered to circumvent the 1994 ban on assault weapons;

- 2) Suspend action on pending applications [and existing permits] to import these weapons effectively immediately; and
- 3) Delay final action on any application until this review process is completed.

Nothing herein shall be construed to require actions contrary to applicable provisions of law.

Speech suggestions:

1. Intro, thank yous. Check w/Christa Robinson and Michelle Crisci. TOPCOPS, NAPO Board, other officials.
2. Talk about TOP COP honorees. Get anecdotes from Christa. Endorse NAPO's proposal to expand the Deegan bill to include state and local public safety officers who die in the line of duty. Last year, at this same TOP COPS event, the President signed legislation to provide college scholarships to the kids of federal law enforcement officers slain in the line of duty. This program is now in place, and NAPO would like us to endorse a state and local version of this. We should support it, saying it's the least we can do for the dedication and hard that cops -- like today's TOP COPS -- have given us.
3. Link TOP COPS work to Crime Accomps.

As a result of the work of these officers, we're driving down the crime rate. Last Saturday, the FBI released its crime statistics for 1996, and the numbers are good news for all Americans. Overall crime is down for the fifth year in a row, with the biggest reductions coming in violent crime (6%) -- and especially murders (9%). Reported rapes, robberies, assaults and all types of property crimes are down from the previous year. Even the arrest rate for violent juveniles, which had skyrocketed for seven years, has now gone down for two years in a row.

Since being elected President, I've worked with police, prosecutors, school principals and community leaders on a tough, smart crime strategy to attack violent crime. Together, we have fought for more police in our communities (more than 63,000 funded to date), fewer guns in the hands of criminals (assault weapons banned and more than 250,000 fugitives and felons denied handgun purchases, and more than 90% of police departments still doing background checks -- despite Supreme Court decision), tougher punishment for violent offenders ("three strikes") and better opportunities for our kids (after school programs). Last week's crime statistics show that, armed with these tools, we are moving in the right direction. Law abiding Americans are finally -- and decisively -- tipping the scales of justice in their favor.

4. Need to do more with respect to kids and guns.

But we need to do more, especially when it comes the deadly mix of kids and guns that is at the heart of our nation's youth violence epidemic. Guns -- and handguns in particular -- have fueled the surge in juvenile murders. Since 1984, the number of kids killing with a gun has

quadrupled. And teenage boys today are more likely to die of a gun shot wounds than all natural causes combined. We must address this issue.

That's why in addition to cracking down on gangs by calling for more prosecutors, my juvenile crime legislation called for tougher gun penalties for illegally transferring guns to juvenile. And that's why my juvenile crime bill would require federal firearms dealers to include a child safety lock with every gun sold. The safety devices, which usually sell for less than \$10 and have the strong support of law enforcement, help prevent unintentional shootings and help keep guns out of the hands of unauthorized users. A recent study (Police Foundation) estimated that, in 1994, Americans kept almost 31 million firearms loaded and unlocked in their homes. Children are especially at risk of accidental shootings. In fact, over the past decade (from 1985 to 1994), an average of nearly 100 children per year (actually 85) have died as a result of such shootings.

So I was very pleased last August when I heard that Smith and Wesson had agreed to provide child safety locks with every hand gun. And that's why I'm even more pleased to announce today, that the CEOs of ___ other leading gun manufactures have chosen to do the same.

LAUNCHING THE PRESIDENT'S ANT-DRUG MEDIA CAMPAIGN OCTOBER 11, 1997

- **The President's First Priority.** The number one priority in the President's 1997 National Drug Control Strategy is to motivate our kids to reject the use of illegal drugs. That's why his Drug Strategy and Balanced Budget included substantial funds for an unprecedented, paid media campaign to teach our kids about the dangers of drug use.
- **Media Campaign Now Law.** Yesterday, by signing the Treasury and Postal Appropriations bill into law, the President officially launched his media campaign. Working with Congress, the private sector and others, the Office of National Drug Control Policy will now begin to shape specific drug-related messages to virtually all of the nations youth (ages 9-17).
- **Why a Paid Media Campaign?** There are several important reasons why President Clinton has proposed a paid media campaign:

In fact, a recent study by Columbia University's Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse (CASA) showed that kids who smoke marijuana are 85 times more likely to use cocaine than kids who did not.

The historic Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 banned 19 specific assault weapons, duplicates of those 19 firearms and certain other semiautomatic weapons possessing various military style features. It is now appropriate to determine whether the redesigned weapons would have legitimate sporting purposes in this country and are suitable for continued importation under the provisions of the Gun Control Act of 1968.

My Administration has aggressively enforced all applicable laws to keep non-sporting firearms and other munitions posing a threat to public safety from entering the country. Therefore, I direct you to:

- 1) Take the necessary steps to reexamine and determine whether the sporting purposes test should be modified with respect to the importation of the Galil, Uzi and any other firearms that have been similarly adapted or re-engineered since the 1989 ban on the importation of semiautomatic assault rifles or the 1994 ban on semiautomatic assault weapons;

Otherwise the spectrum is from the 2 years in the Hastert bill to the 12 years in the Adm bill.

Here are my thoughts on the ONDCP reauthorization language:

1. Change your first bullet to something more along the lines of ...
"Establishes numerical statutory targets for reducing drug use by the year 2001 whose budget implications have not been determined and which may violate the Balance Budget Agreement." Maybe something shorter, but we definitely don't want to be seen as saying that we don't want to cut drug use in half. Also, I'm not sure I'd put this first, maybe second.

2. Bullet #2 would be my first objection. Also, I'd be a bit stronger about HR 2610 only authorizing ONDCP for 2-years and how that fundamentally undermines ONDCP's ability to effectively coordinate administration-wide drug policy. For all the criticism we've taken for cutting staff at ONDCP and not giving it the tools/support it needs to do the job, we should certainly make the same point back to Congress when they're not supporting the office.

3. Can we drop the second and third sentence in the fourth bullet on page three? Why don't we just say --after the opening sentence that is underlined -- ..."This provision...might have prohibited previous research on marinol, which has been found to stimulate the appetite of AIDS patients, and on ibogaine, which is currently being studied for use in interrupting the addiction of cocaine and heroin-dependent users.
