I don't think we need to do anything in the budget for next year. It has full funding for COPS as agreed to in the BBA (1.4+ billion). What we need to do is some combination of the following:

- (1) get DOJ to back-off its "settle for 70,000" attitude and look for creative new ways to keep demand up (i.e., new targeted programs, waivers of the 75,000 cap for big cities, etc.);
- (2) get DOJ to back off its position that it can't use its statutory waiver authority w/out the appropriators signing off;
- (3) have OMB accept that COPS funding won't necessarily drop off in FY 2000 -- and get them to realize that keeping demand/interest up, through some flexibility, is as important as keeping the 100,000 count;
- (4) have WH and OMB leg. affairs make this a bigger priority with the Hill leadership types (will never win the DOJ/approps. relationship battle); and
- (5) get the President talking COPS again and doing cop events (I'll take handing out COPS funds and talking about crime rates going down any day before another directive.

Plus, I'm sure there's more we can be doing that hasn't immediately occurred to me. I'll keep thinking about it.

My guess is that the White House -- DPC, Intergovernmental, Leg. Affairs, OMB -- will have to step-in before the next budget cycle and do a bit of our own problem solving.

It does trouble me, however, that the Acting Associate AG seems so willing to concede the President's 100,000 goal...though I wouldn't say it surprises me...

- I want to thank the men and women of our federal agencies and military who patrol our skies, seas, and borders, and the law enforcement officers across the nation who keep our streets and communities safe and drug free;
- America's parents, teachers, coaches, health professionals who are the front lines of the fight against drugs;
- Let me also praise the millions of American children who each day make the decision against great pressures to stay drug-free -- we search a lot for role models and heroes among the adults of our society, these young people who make the right choice to avoid drugs are the best examples I know of.

The Administration's Strategy to fight Drugs:

- A balanced strategy designed to produce results: prevention to keep kids from ever turning to drugs; treatment to help break the cycle of addiction and crime; interdiction to reduce the flow of drugs; law enforcement to bring the dealers and traffickers to justice and break their organizations.
- Year-in and year-out, this Administration has provided the largest counter-drug budgets ever.
 - Between 1996 and 1998, resources increased by 19 percent
 - 23 percent increase in efforts to reduce demand -- the first demand reduction budget to break the 3 billion dollar milestone
 - a 22 percent increase in interdiction and 14 percent to domestic law enforcement

The Administration's Strategy is Producing results

- Overall drug use is diminishing -- From 1979 to 1996, the number of people regularly using drugs in America has plummeted from 14 percent to 6 percent. The number of cocaine users has dropped 70 percent in the last decade.
- We are reversing the trend in youth drug use -- After yearly growth since 1992, current

drug use by 12 to 17 year olds has declined between 1995 and 1996, and the use of marijuana, which had fueled the steady increases of the past, has stabilized.

- We are also seeing declines in both crack cocaine and methamphetamine usage.
- The amount Americans spend buying illegal drugs is down roughly 37 percent from 1988 to 1995; a total decline of \$34.1 billion reinvested in American society.
- Drug-related crime is in decline - In 1989, there were more than 1,400 narcotics-related murders. By 1996, that number hit a new low of 819.

But We Still Have Much to Do

- However, we cannot allow our progress to become an excuse for complacency or inattention. Combatting drugs in America is akin to fighting a cancer, we must commit ourselves to beating this disease through a long-term effort.
- Recognizing this I am calling upon the Office of National Drug Control Policy to develop "*Strategy 2007 -- a Ten-Year Blueprint for a Drug-Free America.*"
- This historic, first-ever long-term strategy will include a five year budget, which we will present to the American public and Congress each year, and be backed by a set of clearly defined benchmarks -- so that as we implement this strategy we are accountable to the American people for producing real results.

Safeguarding our Children

- Our strategy against drugs must look to the future because it is our future -- America's children -- that we seek most to protect.
- Each day, on average, 6,488 kids try marijuana for the first time, 1,786 try cocaine and 386 try heroin.
- Youth drug use remains alarmingly high because young peoples' risk perceptions about drugs have diminished. In short, attitudes drive behaviors; to change attitudes, I have worked with Congress to create a 195 million dollar Anti-Drug Youth media campaign, which will focus the full power of the media -- from the Internet to television -- on getting the right message across to kids about drugs: drugs are wrong and they can kill you.
- The first phase of this campaign will begin in January with ads in *12 pilot cities: Atlanta, Baltimore, Boise, Denver, Hartford, Houston, Milwaukee, Portland (OR), San Diego, Sioux City, Tucson, and Washington, D.C.*
- Soon after, the campaign will go nationwide -- every American child will learn about the dangers of drugs when they tune in to primetime television, listen to the radio, and surf the Internet.
- Protecting our children requires educating them about the real risks of drug use. Parents bear the primary responsibility for teaching kids about drugs. However, all of us -- mentors, school teachers, ministers, health professionals, coaches, and local law enforcement -- must help.

Improving Law Enforcement

- We also protect our children from drugs by strengthening law enforcement to keep drugs off our streets and out of our communities.
- Today, I'm delighted to announce the formation of the *Central Florida High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area* -- the HIDTA program offers federal assistance to coordinate

counter-drug law enforcement efforts from the local level up to the federal level. By focusing these efforts we create a sum that is more effective at combating drugs than the individual parts.

- In 1996, Orlando was rocked by 30 deaths from heroin overdoses, many of them young people. The Orlando community came together. They banned the fly-by-late-night raves that glamorized and fueled the drug scene and the galvanized support for this new HIDTA.
- I want to recognize the efforts of the Florida Congressional delegation in helping bring this HIDTA to Central Florida. In particular, let me thank both Senator Graham and Representative McCollum for their longstanding support of America's counter-drug efforts.
- This new HIDTA will join the existing South Florida HIDTA, the Puerto Rico/US Virgin Islands HIDTA, the Southwest Border HIDTA, and the newly established Gulf Coast HIDTA in attacking drug trafficking at the most critical entry points into the United States.

Interdiction and USCG Numbers

- We protect our communities against drugs through law enforcement, we protect America -- our nation of communities -- by better policing our borders.
- I want to congratulate Admiral Kramek for the leadership he has shown as the United States Interdiction Coordinator and as Commandant of the Coast Guard.
- In FY97, the Coast Guard, in conjunction with other US law enforcement agencies, seized its highest ever total of cocaine: 103,617 pounds--triple their FY96 seizures and over 14,000 pounds more than their previous record in FY91.
- The men and women of the Coast Guard are proving that we can and will do better.
- *Today, I am committing an additional [X] million dollars to further strengthening our interdiction efforts nationally, including [X] specifically directed at the Caribbean region and Florida. I want to thank Secretary of Defense Cohen for his leadership in making this possible.*

Strengthening Our Borders

- Our progress stopping the flow of drugs at sea, will not go unnoticed. As we speak the cartels and traffickers are already reacting to our success.
- To counter this evolving threat we must now act to strengthen our land borders -- just as we maintain the curtain of control at sea.
- Five years ago the US-Mexico border existed primarily in geography text books and the minds of map makers.
- This Administration is changing that. We are building the infrastructure necessary to protect our borders from the flow of illegal drugs: We are deploying new technologies; We have increased the Customs budget by 72 percent; increased the number of DEA agents assigned to the region by 37 percent; doubled the number of border patrol agents guarding the Southwest border; and increased the rate of inspections by -- % (906,000up from 670,000) from 1994.
- Despite these advances, the Southwest Border remains the primary transit route for cocaine, marijuana, methamphetamine, and heroin entering the United States. It is our

responsibility to turn this deadly tap off.

- *I am directing members of my Drug Policy Council, led by Director McCaffrey to present to me within 6 months time a comprehensive federal plan for shielding the Southwest Border from the drug threat.*

US-Mexico

- However, in strengthening our borders we must be careful not to build divides.
- The United States and Mexico are linked by history, culture, geography and a growing, commonly built prosperity.
- Expanded cooperation with Mexico is producing far greater results, not only with respect to trade, but also in the fight against drugs than we could ever hope to achieve through a modern day strain of isolationism.
- Shortly, the United States and Mexico will release a bilateral Counter-drug Strategy. This historic first-ever agreement will unite our two nations behind common efforts and objectives in the fight against drugs, ranging from treatment to interdiction.
- We must move forward together, with absolute respect for the sovereignty of each of our great nations, but clear in our resolve that the United States will not sit idly by while the plague of drugs wastes away our people and their hopes and aspirations.

Hemispheric Efforts

- Our efforts with Mexico provide a framework upon which we are building a larger hemispheric commitment to fight drugs.
- This administration has worked closely with the nations of this hemisphere to form a common agenda to defeat drugs. We have formed tough agreements with the Caribbean nations to strengthen interdiction, crafted a hemispheric-wide Anti-Drug Strategy, and joined together to fight money laundering.
- *Next we must work cooperatively to form national plans to reduce drug use, trafficking and production, which include markers for evaluating each of our success, and the Organization of American States should be charged with establishing a multilateral group to monitor progress in implementing these national plans, and promoting opportunities for increased hemispheric cooperation.*
- These two goals will be the United States' primary counter-drug objectives at the second Summit of the Americas upcoming in Santiago this April. Achieving these two goals will not be easy, however, working with the nations of the hemisphere we will make progress in lifting the weight of drugs and drug-driven violence and corruption that has undermined democracy, tattered lives, and hamstrung still greater prosperity for all our nations.

Attached is a brief note from a Treasury source on DPC's crime priority funding areas for the 1999 budget as discussed by Jose Cerda at a Law Enforcement Steering Committee meeting today.

US to unveil five-year plan to end drug trade along Mexican border
MIAMI, Florida, Dec 11 (AFP) - The US government will unveil a detailed
plan next month to drastically curb drug-trafficking along its border
with Mexico within the next five years, officials said Thursday.
The initiative will be officially announced on January 27, during
President Bill Clinton's State of the Union speech to Congress.
Still, White House officials were willing to share a few early details
about the plan.

"We're going to try and stop drug smuggling into the United States
across the Mexican-US border in the next five years, substantially stop
it, while still allowing our second biggest trading partner to continue
economic cooperation," said US drug "czar", retired general Barry
McCaffrey.

Each year, millions of people cross the US border with Mexico, which
stretches some 3,000 kilometers (1,860 miles.)

But the US southern border also has become one of the country's main
points of entry for illegal drugs, McCaffrey said, pointing out that it
is "the biggest open border in the world."

"There's nothing like it anywhere on the face of the Earth," McCaffrey
observed.

McCaffrey said details about the anti-drug program would be made public
next month, but said one idea under consideration is to employ new
X-ray technology that can peer into the interior of metal, and even

concrete receptacles, which might conceal illicit drugs.

"We said, 'let's use them on trucks, let's use them on rail cars.' They work. They absolutely work," McCaffrey said.

LAUNCHING THE PRESIDENT'S ANTI-DRUG MEDIA CAMPAIGN OCTOBER 11, 1997

- **The President's First Priority.** The number one priority in the President's 1997 National Drug Control Strategy is to motivate our kids to reject the use of illegal drugs. That's why his Drug Strategy and Balanced Budget included substantial funds for an unprecedented paid media campaign to teach our kids about the dangers of drug use.
- **Media Campaign Now Law.** Yesterday, by signing the Treasury and Postal Appropriations bill into law, the President officially launched his \$195 million media campaign. Working with Congress, the private sector and others, the Office of National Drug Control Policy will now begin to shape specific drug-related messages to virtually all of the nation's youth (ages 9-17).
- **Why a Paid Media Campaign?** There are several important reasons why President Clinton has proposed a paid media campaign:
 - (1) **More kids using drugs.** While overall drug use is down 50 percent over the last 15 years, adolescent drug use has been rising -- and the perceived risks of drug use falling -- since 1990;
 - (2) **Fewer anti-drug messages.** Increased media competition in recent years has led to a 30 percent drop in free public service announcements, with almost none aired during prime time viewing hours; and
 - (3) **Need for a targeted, updated strategy.** The media campaign will allow us to target specific programs or time slots that attract the young viewers we need to reach. And it will allow us to use the full power of the electronic media -- such as the Internet -- to make sure our message is getting out to everyone.
- **Reaching Kids Early.** Statistical evidence shows that if a child can reach the age of 21 without using drugs, he or she will probably never use them. And studies also show that children who use one drug are more likely to use other and more serious drugs. In fact, a recent study by Columbia University's Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse (CASA) showed that kids who smoke marijuana are 85 times more likely to use cocaine than kids who do not.
- **Having the Right Tools.** The President's media campaign is designed to give government the same resources and tools to help kids reject illegal drugs that advertising agencies use everyday to market consumer products and foods.

**Question/Answer on Washington Post Article on Fairfax Teenagers and Drugs
December 15, 1997**

I. Background:

On Sunday and Monday of this week, the Washington Post featured a two-part special report on teenage drug use in Fairfax County. The report -- which is largely based on interviews with 100 county youngsters, as well as with law enforcement, school and other local officials -- makes several points:

- (1) Teenage drug use in "affluent" Fairfax County seems to have increased considerably since the start of the decade. Over the last few years thousands of area youth were directed to the county's growing drug-treatment program. And last year hundreds of students were suspended, expelled and arrested because of drugs.
- (2) Kids of all types -- athletes, runaways, honor students, gang members, cheerleaders -- admitted to selling and using drugs. And it is kids that are selling drugs to kids.
- (3) As a result, much of the suburban teenage drug culture can be invisible to parents, school officials and law enforcement. Traditional drug law enforcement focuses on adults, and the juvenile justice and treatment provider system keep juvenile offenders' names confidential.
- (4) The problem in Fairfax, while no worse than other area neighborhoods, is indicative of the challenge we face in curbing teenage drug use in suburbs -- not just in our cities.

II. Suggested Talking Points

- **Overall Drug Use is Down.** From 1979 to 1996, the number of people (12 and older) regularly using drugs in America dropped nearly 50 percent, from 25.4 million to 13 million people. Similarly, the number of cocaine users has dropped 70 percent in the last decade (from 5.7 million in 1985 to 1.7 million in 1996).
- **Crack, Meth Use is also Declining.** And the most recent data from the Drug Use Forecasting Program show a decline in crack and methamphetamine use in cities that had been previously ravaged by these two drugs. Not surprisingly, drug-related murders also dropped to their lowest level in years (819 in 1996 as opposed to 1,302 in 1992).
- **Youth Drug Use Up...Now Reversing.** But illicit drug use among 12 to 17 year olds has risen since 1992. Fortunately, it's now starting to decline again. Between 1995 and 1996, teen drug use fell from 10.9 percent to 9 percent. That's only a start, but it's good news.

- **Fighting for Safe and Drug-Free Schools.** In response to increased adolescent drug use, President Clinton fought to save -- and increase resources for -- the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities program. This program provides support for violence and drug prevention programs in 97% of the nation's school districts, and must be part of any effort to keep violence, drugs and alcohol away from students and out of schools.
- **Making Sure We Reach All Our Kids.** But as the Washington Post's special feature on Fairfax County makes clear, more needs to be done to get the message to all of our kids that drugs are dangerous. That's why the President -- with bipartisan congressional support -- is preparing to launch an unprecedented national media campaign to motivate America's youth to reject illegal drugs and substance abuse. This \$195-million media campaign will rely on high-impact, anti-drug television and radio advertisements aired during prime-time.
- **Race Not An Issue.** The Washington Post story also makes clear that protecting our kids from drugs is not a black or a white issue. It's something that affects all of our kids, and it's something we should all be concerned about. It's a key example of why we all have to find ways to work together as One America.

Per Rahm's earlier request: while Monrovia didn't get a COPS Anti-Gang grant the day the juvie strategy was announced (15 other cities did), they have received other COPS grants. Specifically, they are:

1. \$75,000 for 1 full-time officer -- 3/1/95 to 6/31/98 (COPS FAST).
2. \$300,000 for 4 full-time officers -- 12/19/96 to 11/30/99 (COPS UHP).
3. \$45,731 for civilians to redeploy officers -- 12/1/95 (COPS MORE).
4. \$45,731 to renew redeployment grant -- 11/30/97 (COPS MORE).

Total: \$466,462 for 5 officers plus funds to redeploy officers.

Also, I understand that an additional COPS MORE grant was rejected in 1996, and that they have requested additional time (not money) to spend their current COPS MORE renewal.

Finally, while it seems that this applicant's grants are in good standing with DOJ/COPS, we may want to double-check or do some additional vetting if we intend to use the Monrovia Police Department as a high-profile example of our success.

Great work! You should list pulling together this document as an accomplishment in and of itself. There are some numbers/details here we've asked for and never received.

Here are my quickie comments/suggestions:

Page 1, school uniforms. While this is out of my team's jurisdiction, it was not my experience -- and you Chicagoans may know better than me -- that 4 out 5 public schools in Chicago require school uniforms.

Page 7, child safety locks. All agencies have now complied with the President's safety lock directive. Leanne may have a bullet on this from a previous weekly.

Page 10, domestic violence. Your bullet talks about crime bill/VAWA funding, not any executive action.

Page 12, YCGII. Updated number of gun traces is not necessarily newsworthy -- what we learn from gun traces is (i.e., types of guns most likely to be found at crimes scenes, age of gun offenders, etc. However, overall this Administration has dramatically increased the number of gun traces we perform for state and local law enforcement (about 200% I think).

Page 12, Gun Dealers. I think the LA Times or WSJ had a recent article on the decrease in gun dealer, so I'm not sure if this information hasn't been released in some form. Regardless, this merits much more touting. Also, I take exception to Brady and Crime Bill "largely superseding" our gun dealers directive. As with the sex offender registry, our directive help pushed broader legislative changes. I'd say something like, "The Brady law and Crime Act codified our directive and further reformed the gun dealer licensing system..."

Page 12, 311. You should check w/Leanne and Christa on this. We also

helped get 311 efforts underway in Dallas, TX and San Jose, CA. COPS office may have provided some funds as well.

Also, you may want to include some of these things I didn't see on the list:

1. Cell Phones for Neighborhood Watch Groups. I think you guys have a file on this already. I think I have a copy of a report the Cell Phone folks sent to the President.

2. Other gun directives/actions.

- The President signed a gun directive in August of '93 that banned assault pistols from importation. This was superseded by the Assault Weapons Ban in the crime bill.

- In April/May of '94, the President -- in extending MFN to China -- banned the importation of certain Chinese munitions. This resulted in the denial of permits for millions of assault-type weapons (mostly SKS rifles) and rounds of ammunition.

- In 1996, the Administration negotiated a VRA (Voluntary Restraint Agreement) with Russia, to limit the number of Russian-made firearms and ammunition coming into the U.S.

3. I recall that in the summer of '94 the President signed a directive ordering the Secretary of Education to aggressively enforce the Gun-Free Schools Act. Since then, an estimated 6,000 kids have been expelled/suspended for bringing a weapon to school. While Ed is uncomfortable with this #, the VP used this number in an announcement this past June.

TALKING POINTS ON PROPOSED DIRECTIVE

- **Two-part directive to be signed.** This week the President will sign a directive ordering the Treasury Department to: (1) temporarily suspend any pending and future applications to import modified assault weapons, and (2) reexamine -- and, if necessary, modify -- the criteria used to keep non-sporting weapons out of the country.
- **Taking action before assault-type weapons flood our streets.** Over the past few years, firearms manufacturers have adapted -- or "sporterized" -- certain assault weapons to circumvent the ban on their importation. There are about 30 models of these firearms -- including the new Uzi American and Galil Sporter, which have already been mentioned in the press. To date, only limited numbers of these weapons -- about 10,000 in 1995 and 25,000 in 1996 (and no Uzis) -- have actually been imported. By acting now, the Administration can avert the type of crisis faced by the Bush Administration in 1989. At that time, permits for more than a million assault rifles had been approved, and an increasing number of assault rifles were being recovered at crime scenes.
- **Directive to be broader than Senator Feinstein's request.** While Senator Feinstein has essentially asked the Administration to revoke the existing permit to import several thousand Uzis and Galils, the long-term impact of the President's directive could be much broader. By conducting a thorough review and amending the sporting purposes test as appropriate -- the directive covers many more weapons and is likely to have a broader long-term impact. Instead of just focusing on a single permit, the President's directive is intended to permanently ban the next generation of assault-type weapons.
- **Unprecedented record on firearms imports.** This Administration has done more than any other in using every tool and legal authority available to keep non-sporting, military surplus and other firearms out of the country. Under the President's leadership, literally, millions of firearms -- of all sorts -- have been blocked from importation. For instance:
 - In 1993, the President issued a directive to close the loophole that allowed certain assault pistols to be imported (despite the Bush Administration's 1989 ban on the importation of assault rifles).
 - In 1994, the President fought for and signed the Assault Weapons Ban into law as part of comprehensive crime legislation. When efforts to kill the ban were succeeding (August '94 vote on crime bill

rule), the President fought with the nation's law enforcement officers to make sure the Assault Weapons Ban was not dropped from the final bill. As a result, 19 specific assault weapons, duplicates of those 19 firearms and certain other semiautomatic weapons possessing various military style features were banned from importation.

- In 1994, the President (when granting MFN status to China) used his authority under the Arms Export Control Act to ban the importation of Chinese munitions. By taking this action, he stopped the potential importation of millions of assault-type rifles (SKS) and high-capacity magazines.

- And in 1996, The Administration took the unprecedented step of entering into a voluntary restraint agreement with the Russians to limit the number of firearms, clips and ammunition coming into the country as a result of increased trade with Russia. At the time, permits for millions of firearms and billions of rounds of ammunition were pending.

- And, both in 1996 and 1997, the Administration worked to defeat congressional amendments to force the importation of military surplus firearms. These military weapons, which were provided to foreign governments for free or at low costs -- and by the millions, included concealable handguns (.45 caliber semiautomatic pistols) and rifles that could be easily converted into fully automatic weapons (M1 carbines).

Outline for Radio Address: Kids and Drugs

- I. We are making progress on drugs/drug use/crime across America
 - A. Overall drug has declined. Drug use down has been cut in half from its peak.
 - B. Crime is down to its lowest level in years. Law enforcement and community residents working together to solve crime and drug problems in their communities. Closing down crack houses and open-air drug markets. Keeping schools open to make sure kids stay off drugs and out of trouble.
 - C. We have gotten ahead of dangerous emerging drugs -- like methamphetamine. We have a special strategy for meth and are working to stamp its use before it becomes a national problem.
 - D. Holding the line on interdiction, re-instating rule of law at our borders, working more closely than ever with our neighbors to keep drugs from reaching our shores in the first place.
- II. Our biggest challenge is kids and drugs.
 - A. Youth drug use rates had been going up. For 6 years now, some of our youngest kids (8th graders), have seen drugs as less dangerous and made the costly mistake of experimenting with them. (Anything about Fairfax county example in Post -- 6,000 kids in the growing county treatment center).
 - B. Some good news today. That's why I pleased today that the Monitoring the Future study being released today confirms that we have a solid glimmer of hope. For the second time this year (September release of Household Survey), national surveys are showing that kids -- and 8th graders especially -- are starting to get the message again and turning away from drugs. Today's study shows that, for the first time in years, 8th graders are more likely to disapprove of marijuana and less likely to experiment with it.
 - C. Now is the time to redouble our efforts. Now, more than ever, as we're beginning to reach kids and shift kids attitudes, we need to do more than ever. We need to make sure these changes take hold.
- III. What we are/will do
 - A. Importance of Media Campaign. That's why we called for an unprecedented paid media campaign to teach reach kids during prime time and teach them about the dangers of drugs. Over the coming months, we will be working with members of Congress and local leaders -- on a bipartisan basis -- to launch our media campaign in twelve cities.

Brady Bill -- Next week, the Department of Justice expects to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the Attorney General, the Ohio Attorney General and the Franklin County Sheriff (OH) to ensure that background checks are conducted for all prospective handgun purchasers in Ohio. As you know, since the Supreme Court's Prinze decision, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation (BCI&I) has only been conducting background checks on a voluntary basis. Under the proposed MOU, the Franklin County Sheriff will initiate all background checks of purchasers who do not consent to a background check. Arkansas is now the only state not conducting background checks on a voluntary basis.

Crime Statistics -- Next Sunday, the Department of Justice is tentatively scheduled to release both the 1996 Bureau of Justice Statistics Crime Victimization Survey and the FBI's Uniform Crime Report for the first half of 1997. While we won't be able to review the findings of these reports until next week, we expect them to show a continued drop in the crime rates.

COPS -- On Thursday, November 6th, the COPS office announced that it would fund 96 innovative state and local law enforcement projects and 21 Community Policing Demonstration Centers to provide the latest community policing information and model strategies for police and sheriffs throughout the country.

INS Reorganization -- On Friday, November 7th, the House Judiciary

Subcommittee on Immigration held a hearing on the Commission on Immigration Reform's proposal to break-up INS. Although no witnesses from the Administration were invited, Bruce sent a letter to inform Subcommittee Chair Lamar Smith of DPC's intent to review the Commission's recommendations and work with the Subcommittee to improve the management and administration of the nation's immigration system.

- **Progress On Drug-Related Crime.** Earlier this year, the Justice Department released studies showing that methamphetamine use declined between 7% and 52% in 8 key cities, and that the crack use was down substantially -- by at least 10% -- in 10 major cities. Drug-related murders also dropped to their lowest point in a decade.
- **Much More Still Needs to be Done.** Unfortunately, despite these signs of progress, drug use remains unacceptably high. Too many kids are still using drugs, and too many kids still do not understand the risks associated with them. Motivating kids to reject the use of illegal drugs must be our number one priority.
- **Time to Redouble Our Efforts.** MTF is the second national survey this year to show that we have an opportunity to begin reversing recent increases in adolescent drug use. Rahm & Jose (CC > Kent, Ian, Michelle) --- This is a quick heads up for whatever planning is occurring for the President's possible event in McAllen, Texas on January 9. You should be aware that this is in the same media market as the local prosecutor who has declined to prosecute drug cases brought to him by Border Patrol as the result of a lack of local resources (both prosecutive and jail space). I understand that we may be inclined to highlight new technology, but you should be aware that such an emphasis may feed state and local concerns that we should be funding personnel, jail space and basic office needs, before we spend on large technology projects.

This concern was made known to Gen. McCaffrey during the SW Border tour this summer and has also been made known to the AG directly and indirectly through NDAA.

Call me if you need details, but we should watch our message down there

very carefully to avoid having lots of negative local reaction to the President from prosecutors and law enforcement in the media.
