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===== HEALTH CARE WEEK =====

*1 THE SPEECH: WHAT TO LOOK FOR WEDNESDAY NIGHT

Pres. Clinton "will be asking all Americans to accept a new way of thinking about their health and the way they and their families obtain treatment for all illnesses" (Benson, NEWHOUSE, 9/19). "Try as he might to keep it simple, Clinton's plan introduces a new American vocabulary" (Borger, U.S. NEWS, 9/27 issue). "Expect an eloquent speech that some will declare bold and visionary" (Zaldivar, PHILA. INQUIRER, 9/19). It won't "kick off the widely advertised Battle of the Century. More like the Policy Seminar of the Century" (Church, TIME, 9/27 issue). Sen. Finance Chair Pat Moynihan: "Let's not get too excited" ("Meet the Press," NBC, 9/19). WH health adviser Ira Magaziner: "He will lay out his vision for health care reform and the principles upon which we're basing our reform" ("Newsmaker Sunday," CNN, 9/19). Clinton will ask the U.S. "to embrace an idea spurned for more than a century: comprehensive, government-regulated medical insurance for every man, woman and child in the land" (Fritz, L.A. TIMES, 9/19). NPR's Arnold: "This speech is going to set the tone, just as the president's call for shared sacrifice set the tone initially in the debate over his economic plan" ("Morning Edition," 9/20).

WHAT'S AT STAKE: Sen. Ted Kennedy (D-MA): "This is the defining issue for the administration" (BOSTON HERALD, 9/17). "In this defining, historic hour of his presidency, Clinton is risking all on an untested 'managed competition' structure" (Neikirk, CHICAGO TRIBUNE, 9/19). TIME's Church calls Clinton's speech "the most important of his young presidency" and his plan "the biggest upheaval in social policy in decades" (9/27 issue). "Implementation could prove so messy, even painful, that health reform could become a liability for Clinton if he runs for a second term" (Chen, L.A. TIMES, 9/18). "If he succeeds, Clinton will have created the biggest single domestic program since Social Security" (Rankin, PHILA. INQUIRER, 9/19). According to Hill aides, Hillary Rodham Clinton concluded a recent meeting with House Members "on a sharp political note. If the plan sinks, she said, Democrats who buck the president could go down with it." Reportedly she said: "It could be very costly to oppose the president on this" (Bayer, COPLELEY, 9/19).

DON'T LEAVE HOME WITHOUT IT: "The simplicity of a card worked for [FDR] and Social Security almost 60 years ago; it would have to work again" (Borger, U.S. NEWS, 9/27). NEWSWEEK's Fineman notes the FDR symbolism in the "health security card" Clinton will debut 9/22: "But it also looks like a credit card, raising the theory that Clinton wants to send another subliminal message: Charge it!" (9/27 issue). TX Health Commis. David Smith, noted a big problem in TX is its vast regions with little or no medical services: "If we get a plastic card for everyone in the state of Texas tomorrow, where are they going to use it? The Dairy Queen?" (DALLAS MORNING NEWS, 9/19).

*2 FINANCING: THAT STICKY PROBLEM OF HOW TO PAY FOR IT

The success of Pres. Clinton's plan "hinges on an ambitious program of cost-containment" (Krieger, S.F. EXAMINER, 9/18). The WH proposes \$238 billion in Medicaid/care savings over 5 years -- "a number that stunned lawmakers" at a 9/9 briefing. Admin. "insiders" say the WH "knew the Hill wouldn't buy such a big cut

but put it in the plan to make the numbers work." One adviser: "Clinton's saying to Congress, 'If you come up with a better way to pay for this, fine. You'll have to take the fall because I don't want to raise any new taxes'" (BUSINESS WEEK, 9/27 issue). USA TODAY's Welch writes Clinton "doesn't have a full answer" when it comes to financing (9/20).

WARNINGS: Sen. Finance Chair Pat Moynihan, on geometric growth of Medicaid costs: "To say you're going to reverse that rate down to zero growth in the same period is to have lost touch with reality." Moynihan, asked whether Clinton should tell the people his plan will cut \$238B from Medicare/Medicaid and reduce the deficit \$90B by the year 2000: "It would not be advised" ("Meet the Press," NBC, 9/19). Sen. Bob Kerrey's (D-NE) message to Clinton: "I have two questions that I'll be watching very closely: Do you have a plan whose parts make sense? And even more important, do you describe the plan as it's written, or do you describe something you think the American people want -- even if it's not in the bill" (Broder, W. POST, 9/19). Eleanor Clift: "The biggest flaw in the Clinton plan right now is that nobody believes the numbers" ("McLaughlin Group," 9/18). GOP analyst Kevin Phillips: "Clinton obviously has fudged his numbers on what health reform will cost in order to avoid another 1993 tax debate. As a result, he's creating a future tax issue for 1995 or 1996 which could become a major political problem" (NPR, 9/20).

DEFENSE: Counselor to the pres. David Gergen: "Individuals ... will have to take greater responsibility over their own lives and everybody will have to pay something. This is not a free ride" ("Meet the Press," NBC, 9/19). Sen. Jay Rockefeller (D-WV), on proposed Medicare cuts: "All of that money, every dime of it, goes to either prescription drugs or long-term care, which seniors desperately want and need." Sen. John Chafee (R-RI): "I don't like the word 'cuts' ... there can be savings under both [Medicare & Medicaid] through administrative reforms" ("Face the Nation," CBS, 9/19). WH health adviser Ira Magaziner: "We're still trying to finalize in the next few days what the composition of that all will be, but we will have some type of sin taxes and it's likely that some tobacco tax will be part of it." Magaziner said they were undecided on an alcohol tax ("Newsmaker Sunday," CNN, 9/19). Clinton adviser James Carville said he had been reassured by Hillary Rodham Clinton that the numbers were "credible": "And when Mrs. Clinton tells me its Easter, I start dying eggs" (N.Y. TIMES, 9/20). A "high-ranking" WH health adviser said "no elaboration on the financing scheme will be available until early October because 'there are people buried in the bowels of [OMB and Treasury] who need to get their licks in" (Priest, W. POST, 9/20).

*3 THE SALES JOB: KEEP IT SIMPLE, STUPID

MEDIA GENERAL's Hall: "I haven't seen anything as complicated since the SALT II treaty" (RICHMOND TIMES-DISPATCH, 9/19). N.Y. NEWSDAY's Page: "The issue combines the complexity of the 1986 overhaul of the tax code, the economic impact of this year's furious deficit-reduction fight and the emotional punch of a debate over issues of life-and-death" (9/19).

SPECIAL GUEST: Reagan/Bush Surgeon General C. Everett Koop will occupy the "Greenspan seat" next to Hillary Rodham Clinton during the 9/22 speech. On her other side, the WH "plans to seat a recognizable face representing the small-business community or the senior-citizens' lobby." One WH aide: "If Claude Pepper were alive, he'd be there" (NEWSWEEK, 9/27 issue). Koop will work

with the WH in an "advisory capacity" (PHILA. INQUIRER, 9/19).

STRATEGIES: N.Y. TIMES' Toner: "Solidify your base ... Defuse the most dangerous potential opponents [small business, doctors] ... Remember the middle class ... Remember your campaign promises" (9/19). NEWSWEEK's Fineman: "Shout 'Fire!' ... Use real numbers ... Keep it simple ... Keep the momentum ... Court the Republicans ... Claim the middle ... Find villains ... Grassroots count ... Let Congress do it." Fineman adds: "'Security' is the single most important word in the sales plan" (9/27 issue). W.S. JOURNAL's Wartzman: "As political villains go, the insurance industry is a dandy" (9/20).

BAD MEDIA RELATIONS? NBC White House correspondent Andrea Mitchell: "The main problem is that the White House has shot itself in the foot by singling out a couple of print people [for leaks] and excluding broadcast people. They've been force-feeding and hand-carrying information to the New York Times, Wall Street Journal and Washington Post. The result is that they've alienated a large number of reporters" (Kurtz, W. POST, 9/20).

*4 THE GOP: CHAFEE PLAN TURNS A CORNER

"By embracing an extensive government role and the principle of universal coverage, the Republicans moved closer to Clinton -- bowing to the political reality that the GOP lacks credibility on health care" (Borger, U.S. NEWS, 9/27). Sen. Ted Kennedy (D-MA): "If someone was to suggest to me a year ago the Republicans would come up with a program that was comprehensive ... I would say that wasn't possible" (BOSTON HERALD, 9/17). Germond & Witcover call Sen. Phil Gramm's (R-TX) remarks on putting medical decisions in the hands of federal bureaucrats "increasingly lonely" within the GOP (Balto. EVENING SUN, 9/17). Eleanor Clift: "The fact that the Republicans have come forward with a plan shows that they're ready to deal." Jack Germond called GOP recognition that reform is needed "the most significant" recent event ("McLaughlin Group," 9/18). ABC's Kast: "[Clinton] allies point to the Republicans unveiling their own health care reform plan last week as evidence the country is at a turning point" (9/19). GOP analyst Kevin Phillips: "Democratic fowlups, not Republican brains, are the principle building blocks of Republican credibility these days" (NPR, 9/20).

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===== NATIONAL BRIEFING =====

*5 GOP '96: ALAN CRANSTON, GONZO JOURNALIST, PROFILES DOLE

In ROLLING STONE, under the header, "Freddy Krueger Does D.C.," ex-Sen. Alan Cranston (D-CA) profiles Bob Dole: "It's never been clear exactly why Dole wants to be president, except as an exercise in partisan warfare and personal advancement. Dole has never put forth a clear view of what he wants for the country in all the times he's previously run for president. ... What is clear is that Dole spells big trouble in the Senate for Clinton. The good news ... is that Dole isn't president. The bad news is that nobody's told him. ... He has swiftly become the Republican prince of legislative darkness. ... When Dole looks toward the White House, he faces still another dilemma. It's how to be partisan but seem bipartisan, how to act politically but sound statesmanlike, how to satisfy the far right but project a national image of responsibility at the same time. To this list must be added the absolute and imperative need keep his 'nonpresidential' temper under control" (9/30 issue).

NH HUSTINGS: Speaking to the NH Realtors Assn. 9/16, Jack Kemp again said "it is too early to point out potential" '96 candidates. Kemp: "I would suggest that '96 potential candidates

forget '96 until at least 1994. Particularly the Republican Party, which talks about electing more men and women to Congress. I think we have to try to take back the Senate" (Colqhoun, Manchester UNION-LEADER, 9/17). GANNETT's Raasch writes on the recent NH visits by Kemp and Gramm, during which Gramm "did not deny presidential ambitions" but said he will wait until after '94 to make a decision. Gramm: "Anyone who has ever served in the Senate, especially somebody from a big state who says 'I never thought about running for president,' I don't think is telling the truth. I have had an opportunity now to work with four presidents and on many occasions I have thought about what I would do if I were president." Kemp was asked if he has "wasted much of 1993 by allowing" Dole "to grab the party leadership." Kemp "became animated": "Look, 1993 is a legislative year. (Dole) is the legislative leader of the [GOP]. ... I have no way of matching his world-record Face the Nation interviews" (9/17).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: N.Y. TIMES' Kolbert on C-SPAN's "Road to the White House '96": "There are some obvious explanations for all the early activity ... starting with the fact that President Clinton was elected with just 43 percent of the popular vote. Add to this the rocky start of his Administration, the continuing presence of Ross Perot and the lack of a clear Republican favorite, and you get all the right conditions for a extra-long campaign." HOTLINE publisher Doug Bailey: "It's ridiculously early. But the fact of the matter is there are some fairly substantial efforts going on out there" (9/19).

*6 NAFTA: MOYNIHAN MAY MAKE GOING IN SENATE MUCH TOUGHER

Sen. Finance Cmte chair Pat Moynihan (D-NY), who began hearings on NAFTA last week, said it was doubtful the 12/31 deadline for passing NAFTA could be met: "There's y no need to do this by Christmas. Even if there was unanimity (in Congress) on this, there's no chance we could do it by then anyway." Although he said he was undecided, he called Mexico, "apart from Cuba ... the most authoritarian state in this hemisphere" (Turner, BUFFALO NEWS, 9/18). Moynihan, asked by NBC's Tim Russert if he is for NAFTA: "Don't assume that. I'm a free trader with free countries.

... Mexican government is an authoritarian government. They don't have an independent judiciary; they don't have free elections; they have lots of laws which they enforce very selectively." Moynihan asked how he'd vote if it were held today: "There won't be a vote today. We have to negotiate in the Congress." W. POST's Broder: "Are you thinking that you're going to send it back to the administration and say, 'Go back and negotiate again?'" Moynihan: "That could be done. Asked if organized labor can "trust" Clinton's promises that he will provide job retraining for those who lose jobs: "I'd like to see that legislation. When that legislation comes to us with the revenues to pay for it, then we ... have a different playing field" ("Meet the Press," 9/19).

WORKER TRAINING: The WH "hopes to lure some [Dems] with a promise to provide job training to those who do lose their jobs to increased competition to Mexico" (Carney/Zagorin, TIME, 9/27 issue). Counselor to Pres. David Gergen: "In the past, [admins.] have given lip service to the idea of retraining American workers. ... The bill we're envisioning is not just for NAFTA.... defense conversion ... is causing huge displacement. ... Don't tell me we can't find \$5 billion or \$6 billion or whatever the number's going to be over five years to help the workers of this country. We can do that" ("Meet the Press," NBC, 9/19).

GEPHARDT: TIME's "Informed Sources" reports Clinton asked Gephardt to refrain from giving a speech in Congress opposing NAFTA on the same day Clinton and the ex-presidents made their presentations. A Dem Party source: "Having Gephardt come out against us on the same day would have just been devastating." Still, Gephardt is "expected to issue a statement opposing NAFTA this week" (9/27 issue).

CUOMO: NY Gov. Mario Cuomo (D), up for re-election to a 4th term in '94, "is sending signals he may be ready to break with the president over the pact." Cuomo in an interview with AP: "Most people say it will cost you jobs right away. If that's true, why don't we wait until we can better afford the job losses?" (Turner, BUFFALO NEWS, 9/18).

VIRGINIA (11 HOUSE SEATS): FOR (2): Bliley (R-07), Moran (D-08). LEANING FOR (3): Bateman (R-01), Goodlatte (R-06), Wolf (R-10). AGAINST (1): Byrne (D-11). LEANING AGAINST (2): Scott (D-03), Sisisky (D-04). UNDECIDED (3): Pickett (D-02), Payne (D-05), Boucher (D-09) (RICHMOND TIMES-DISPATCH, 9/18).

HISPANIC CAUCUS: House chief dep. maj. whip Bill Richardson (D-NM) on Hill Hispanics: "It breaks down along lines that are hard to deal with. Basically, the Cubans and Puerto Ricans are against it, the Mexicans are for it -- except in California for some reason" (Balto. SUN, 9/18).

WEEKEND TV: George Will: "Mr. Clinton's problem is, there are too darned many Democrats in Congress" ("Brinkley," ABC, 9/19). Mark Shields: "He's making a good fight ... but it's a loosing fight." Rowland Evans: "One speech doesn't make a campaign." WH CoS Mack McLarty: "No, but two days in one week is a strong effort" ("Evans & Novak," CNN, 9/18). EXIT QUESTION: "Will Bill Clinton bring NAFTA back from the grave?" Barnes: "Yes." Clift: "Yes." Germond: "No." Kondracke: "Yes." McLaughlin: "Yes" ("McLaughlin Group," 9/18).

LABOR: AFL-CIO's Tom Donahue: "We've never been a single-issue organization; we're not a single-issue organization on this issue. This is a very important issue to us, but we don't support or choose candidates on that basis. If we did, we would not have supported Bill Clinton's election campaign" ("McLaughlin's One on One," 9/19). Robert Novak calls the AFL-CIO Clinton's "barnacle": "If President Clinton loses NAFTA, it won't be the doing of Ralph Nader, Jesse Jackson, Pat Buchanan, or even Ross Perot. He can blame the AFL-CIO" (W. POST, 9/20).

AFL-CIO AD: This ad appeared on all networks this a.m.: Video of Capitol; men in suits walk up the steps, converse in corridors. VO: "In Washington, big corporations and lobbyists are spending millions making false claims about the NAFTA trade deal." Scenes from USA-NAFTA ad as the word "FALSE" stamps the screen. VO: "But across America, people going to factories, to farms and offices know NAFTA means jobs going south. Economists who have studied job loss say we will lose up to 500,000 American jobs to NAFTA. Americans want to expand trade." Video of a rusty gate closing. VO: "But not by trading away their jobs. NAFTA. It's a bad deal for America, and Americans know it."

*7 LANSING RALLY: PEROT AND RIEGLE BLAST NAFTA, USE EACH OTHER
Ross Perot and Sen. Don Riegle (D-MI) 9/18 "launched an anti-NAFTA movement from the [Lansing] Capitol steps they hope will flatten the pact nationwide." The 3 and 1/2 hour rally "took on a patriotic, combative air as each of the eight speakers spelled out what they saw as the weaknesses" of NAFTA. Riegle "blamed Wall Street and the corporate leaders pushing the pact for being greedy." Rep. Marcy Kaptur (D-OH) "spoke of the

poverty she and other congresswomen found on a fact-finding trip to Mexico." As Perot "was spreading his anti-NAFTA gospel in Lansing," Gov. John Engler (R) and Sen. Phil Gramm (R-TX) "were praising the plan 300 miles to the north at the Republican Leadership Conference on Mackinac Island." Perot and Riegle "pledged to hold anti-NAFTA rallies nationwide to convince President Clinton and Congress to forget the plan" (Hoffman, LANSING STATE JOURNAL, 9/19). STATE JOURNAL's Borowski: "Perot's nasal voice, full of Texas twang and homespun humor, echoed off nearby buildings -- the human equivalent of an air-raid siren" (9/19). DETROIT NEWS' Cole notes Riegle had a "sore throat that kept him from talking much at the rally. He did say, however, that 'NAFTA is bad for the country, especially the Midwest and Michigan'" (9/19). One thing "spoiled the moment" for Riegle: "A plane buzzed over the Capitol trailing a banner that said: 'Remember the Keating 5. Dump Riegle'" (Berke, N.Y. TIMES, 9/19). W. POST's Walsh: "Less than a year ago, the rally could have been part of the Clinton campaign. ... Many in the audience wore the caps, T-shirts and jackets of labor union organizations that strongly backed Clinton last November" (9/19). N.Y. TIMES' Berke: "The first grand demonstration of the mischief [Perot] has in store as the 1994 elections approach" (9/19). NBC's Fratangelo: "During the presidential campaign, this was Clinton country. Union members backed his campaign of change. Now they think he's had a change of heart about their jobs" (9/18). Rep. Helen Delich Bentley (R-MD) also spoke. Despite the event, DNC Chair David Wilhelm said Clinton still planned to appear at a Riegle fund-raiser next month.

ROSS IN MD: "Armed with the requisite one-liners, Ross Perot met briefly with supporters in Annapolis" 9/17 to stump against NAFTA "and brush off charges that he is a demagogue." Perot also charged that Ford, Carter and Bush "sit on the boards of big businesses that would benefit from cheap labor costs in Mexico." Perot dismissed Carter's demagogue comment: "I've been called everything but a drive-by shooter" (Balto. SUN, 9/18).

ROSS TALK: USTR Mickey Kantor: "I agree with President Carter that Mr. Perot has given hyperbole a bad name. He has been misleading, and, in fact, he's been not factual in ... much of what he has said about NAFTA." AFL-CIO's Tom Donahue: "Perot is able to translate this agreement and some of its likely effects in language that the people understand" ("McLaughlin's One on One," 9/19). Counsellor to Pres. David Gergen: "I have never thought that Ross Perot was a demagogue. ... I've always thought he was a great patriot. ... he's very well intentioned on NAFTA. I think some people have fed him some very misleading information" ("Meet the Press," NBC, 9/19). Clinton, in a TIME interview, was asked if he "env[ied]" Carter for being able to call Perot a "demagogue": "From the comments around the breakfast table [before the ceremony last week], I wasn't sure he would be the one to make that comment. ... There were other candidates for the prize. But anyway, he won the award. Now, of course, if you're a former president, you have a different role and a different leeway. I don't think as President I should be trying to personalize this conflict. I think we've got a better chance with NAFTA if it doesn't degenerate into a shouting match but instead elevates into an honest discussion of the difficult choices facing the country" (9/27 issue). ABC's Donaldson: "God bless Jimmy Carter." George Will: "I think one of the immediate, great benefits of NAFTA is to sink Ross Perot" ("Brinkley," ABC, 9/19). NEWSWEEK's CW arrow is down: "Hey Ross, that giant

sucking sound is your poll numbers going south" (9/27 issue).

*8 WHITE HOUSE PHONE SYSTEM: \$26 MIL FOR BETTER VOICE MAIL?

COPLEY's Green recalls post-inauguration complaints from Clinton and the WH staff about the WH telephone system, calling it "the antithesis of the high technology they hoped to bring to Washington. ... Notwithstanding the president's talk about economizing in the White House, Clinton's subordinates have proceeded with plans for a new telephone system and have ordered the installation of one now estimated to cost \$26 million." But an investigation by the House Gov't Affairs Cmte "found the present system was far more effective than the administration has claimed. Indeed, investigators have determined it never has been used close to capacity. Meanwhile, the expensive new system -- contracted for without the competitive bidding normally required by law for such federal purchases -- offers only marginal improvements." Responding to a 6/16 letter from Cmte Chair John Conyers (D-MI) and ranking GOPer Bill Clinger (R-PA), WH aide Patsy Thomasson "wrote that competitive bidding was bypassed for reasons of national security and because there was an 'urgent and compelling' need to acquire a new telephone system." But the cmte's findings "reject both reasons cited by Thomasson." The report, on WH claims that 65,000 calls/day was "too much" for the old system: "In reality, the system problem which led to thousands of unanswered calls and busy signals was not inadequate equipment, but rather a lack of personnel to properly man the public comment lines and inadequate management procedures." Hill sources added that "urgent and compelling" reasons to bypass competitive bidding "generally has been confined to times of war." As to nat'l security concerns, the WH "now admits" the system "has never been classified." The report: "Clinton did not have [a private] line upon his arrival at the White House because neither Presidents Bush nor Reagan desired one." The new system has three added features: Voice mail for the entire EOP; six-party conference calls, up from 3-party; "Greater ease in rerouting telephone lines and numbers in interoffice personnel moves" (S.D. UNION-TRIBUNE, 9/19).

*9 COVER TO COVER

*13 ARIZONA: DECONCINI OPENS RACE TO MAHONEY AND OTHERS

While AZ Dems began "jockeying" for position 9/17 following Sen. Dennis DeConcini's (D) announcement that he would not seek another term, DeConcini "enjoyed an emotional homecoming" and was welcomed by a "boisterous crowd of party loyalists" in Tucson. DeConcini: "Tucson has always been my home. I used to have to hedge my bets when I was running statewide. Now I can say that I always considered it the best part of the whole state."

KICKOFF '94: Instead of getting a "quick jump" on the nomination, Sec/State Dick Mahoney (D) said 9/17 that he would "take a deeper look at the prospect of running." Mahoney visited 9/16 with supporters, including his father, ex-Ghana Amb. Wm Mahoney. Mahoney on their conversation: "My dad told me that I should really do a good, major statewide poll before I make any final decisions." Mahoney said the poll will be conducted "over the next month or so." He said that for now, he'll be making calls, mostly to Dems "who previously supported DeConcini." Mahoney: "I've got a lot of people I've contacted previously. Now I'll be going back to sign them up." Other Dems mentioned: Phoenix mayor Paul Johnson and AZ Dem chair/ex-Gore staffer Steve Owens (Meissner, ARIZONA DAILY STAR, 9/18).

"SENSE OF RELIEF?" ARIZONA REPUBLIC's Willey writes DeConcini's exit "frees his party from its obligation to defend the senator's past and allows it to blaze new trails with fresh faces and untarnished standard-bearers." Owens said he "thought all along" that DeConcini was "re-electable," but added, "it is time to let new people step up to the plate ... and the senator's decision allows this to happen." The announcement has changed the "field into a sea of bobbing little Mr. and Mrs. Smiths, all wanting to go to Washington." In addition to Meissner's list, Willey notes state Rep. Cathy Eden (D), Rep. Sam Coppersmith (D-01), ex-Phoenix Mayor/'90 gov. nominee Terry Goddard (D) and grocery store magnate Eddie Basha (D) (9/17). Other possible Dems: Rep. Ed Pastor (02) and S. AZ Planned Parenthood exec. dir. Virginia Yrun. Possible GOP candidates: Rep. Jon Kyl (R-04) and Businessman Al Banks. Possible Independent: Gary Drumheller.

LOOKING BACK: ARIZONA DAILY STAR's Beal writes about DeConcini's involvement in the S&L scandal: "It tarnished his reputation to the point that ... he regarded fund-raising practices that had been normal and accepted ... to be extremely distasteful. And so he quit" (9/19). ARIZONA DAILY STAR editorial: "DeConcini made the right choice.. His soft voice and hard work will be missed, but it is the right time to leave" (9/18). PHOENIX GAZETTE editorial: "The power that DeConcini

brought to the table, his attention to detail, his fund-raising, his extraordinary instinct for what the voters seemed to care about the most, was insufficient to stay the tide. ... But the irony is that it was DeConcini's own actions that called forth the turbulence that ultimately overwhelmed him" (9/17). ARIZONA REPUBLIC editorial: "DeConcini can find comfort in knowing that, all things considered, it was probably the right decision at the right time" (9/17).

*14 MASSACHUSETTS: POLL ILLUSTRATES GOP'S TROUBLES

KRC's Gerry Chervinsky "attributed the rise to Kennedy's campaigning and the favorable national press he has gotten as an important ally" of Clinton (Lehigh, BOSTON GLOBE, 9/19).

*15 MINNESOTA: McVOTE SHOWS MCFARLAND OVER MCKASY

In the MN IR convention, a straw ballot for the seat being vacated by Sen. Dave Durenberger (R), Hamline Univ. law prof. Doug McFarland had a 40-29% lead over ex-Commerce Commis. Bert McKasy. McFarland, who "just a few months ago" was "unknown," expects the nonbinding victory "to give his campaign a boost." But McKasy "dismissed the vote as insignificant." McKasy manager Leon Oistad: "It's just a beauty contest well in advance of the endorsement." Of the 1,200 IR delegates, "nearly one-third" were "undecided or voted for no endorsement" signalling that "they may be looking for other candidates to enter the race" (ST. PAUL PIONEER PRESS, 9/19).

DAVE WE HARDLY KNEW YE: Delegates were also given the chance "to cast symbolic votes" for Durenberger. Although IR "activists are relieved that he decided to retire," more than half the delegates "voted for him in what most likely was their last chance to pay tribute" to him (Salisbury, ST. PAUL PIONEER PRESS, 9/19).

OTHERS: Ex-Rep. Vin Weber was "being mentioned last week" as a possible contender, but Weber told ROLL CALL he "is definitely not running." A spokesperson for Rep. Rod Grams (R-06) said Grams "would not be running" (9/20). Ex-state Rep. Pat McGowan (R) announced 9/16 but was too late to get on the straw ballot (PIONEER PRESS, 9/19). Also mentioned: Dep. IR Chair. Sharon Clark, atty Clark Griffith, "party-switching" ex-Hennepin Co. Commis. Tad Jude, LG Joannell Dyrstad, and Jann Olsten, aide to ex-Sen. Rudy Boschwitz Jann Olsten. Ex-Sen. Rudy Boschwitz "issued a statement" saying he will not run and "expressing support for Olsten." Boschwitz is instead "chafing for a rematch" with Sen. Paul Wellstone (D) in '96 (ROLL CALL, 9/20).

PRESERVING THEIR "INDEPENDENCE": In a separate piece,

PIIONEER PRESS' Salisbury writes that IR delegates voted "to keep 'independent' in their name, rejecting a proposal to rename themselves the Republican Party" of MI. "Party leaders had recommended the name change, saying they are proud to be Republicans and want to be more closely identified with the national GOP." The party added "independent" to its name in 1975 "to distance" itself from national Republicans "who were being blamed for the Watergate scandal" (9/19).

*16 MISSOURI: MURPHY IN VIOLATION OF CAMPAIGN ETHICS?

Jackson Co. exec. Marsha Murphy's (D) use of stationery with the Jackson Co. logo for a 9/8 letter "requesting campaign contributions" has "raised questions" about whether she violated campaign ethics laws. Critics contend that the use of the county's logo, address and phone number is illegal and makes her taxpayer-funded office a "campaign resource." An MO Ethics Commis. official said that the letter "does not appear to violate the law." Murphy said that "she paid for the stationery, the printing and the postage" and enclosed an envelope with the campaign's P.O. Box. Murphy: "There is no taxpayer money being used to pay for any of this. ... I've always had two sets of stationery, one for county business and one for my campaign committee." MO Ethics Commis. Admin. Sec. Marion Sinnett said that "a complaint" from a MO resident "would have to be made before the commission could decide if there was a criminal violation" (Jeffers, KANSAS CITY STAR, 9/17).

NO DOLE ENDORSEMENT: Following an AP report that Sen. Bob Dole (R) is supporting ex-Gov. John Ashcroft (R) in the race (see HOTLINE 9/16), Dole sent Rep. Bill Emerson (R-08) a letter from his Campaign America PAC saying he did not "endorse" Ashcroft. From the letter: "I want you to know that, while John would make an excellent candidate, I have and will refrain from making an official endorsement until a determination can be made as to whether there will be a contested primary race for our Party's nomination" (Emerson release, 9/16).

RAISING ASHCROFT: Ashcroft held a campaign fundraiser 9/14 at the home of Cicardi Bruce with "more than 150" contributors. (Berger, ST. LOUIS POST-DISPATCH, 9/17) Possible GOPers: State Reps. Mark Richardson and David Steelman. Announced Dem: St. Louis Co. Councilwoman Geri Rothman-Serot. Possible Dems: Rep. Alan Wheat (D-05) and state Rep. Steve Carroll.

*17 TEXAS: HUTCHISON CALLED GOP "CELEBRITY" DESPITE ALLEGATIONS

Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison (R) had breakfast 9/17 with "more than 120" GOPers in VA to help raise money for the VA GOP. Later that day, Hutchison presented a speech to the Republican National Lawyers' Assn during a lunch. Hutchison is "in great demand around the country," despite questions about her tenure as TX Treas. being investigated by the Travis County grand jury. VA GOP Exec. Dir. Dave Johnson said that "the inquiry has gotten little attention" in DC: "She's a Republican celebrity. ... She's the newest member of the Senate. She represents part of the growing disenchantment with the Democratic administration in Washington." Hutchison said she has "'really made an effort' to not let the inquiry affect her work." Hutchison also said that "she is considering using political campaign funds to pay her mounting legal bills": "It certainly adds up. ... Some of it is probably going to be coming from privately raised funds, but I haven't done that yet. ... I may pay some from the funds I have now." An unidentified TX Dem Rep. said Hutchison has "gotten a real lucky break for two reasons: the national press tends to pay attention to senators who've been around for a long time. ... And

there have been other things happening from the Mideast to NAFTA to health care reforms." Rep. Dick Armey (R-TX): "The response I got was that everybody is writing this off as partisan Texas politics. ... I'm surprised at how little impact it has made on attitudes toward the senator and her ability to work and function" (Kilday, DALLAS MORNING NEWS, 9/18). MORNING NEWS' Barta writes Hutchison "seems to be winning the PR battle. Many Texans feel the charges against her are trivial (an employee's use of a state phone and computer for political work and destruction of phone records), and-or they're political. That's part of her defense, and it's good politics. Texans like to see pluck" (9/20).

*18 VIRGINIA: PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR SUES ROBB

Private investigator Billy Franklin "filed a \$3.5 million suit" against Sen. Chuck Robb's (D) campaign committee and "several of his former associates" 9/17. In '91, Franklin researched the book, "Tough Enough," that accused Robb of "misconduct in his social life." Franklin "asserts" that Robb "associates" tried to "incriminate" him during his '91 research (see HOTLINE 8/4). The suit "accuses" six men of "illegally taping his phone calls and using them against him, and of illegally obtaining his phone records and using them against him." Franklin is seeking "\$1 million in compensatory damages and \$3.5 million in punitive damages." Robb campaign dir. Susan Platt: "This is a farce. It is nothing more than a weak attempt publicity." Ex-Robb campaign treas. Alson Smith, Jr. will "be served with the suit," but is "not one of the accused." The 6 plaintiffs include former Robb aides, David McCloud and Robert Watson and restaurateur Bob Dunnington (Allen, RICHMOND TIMES-DISPATCH, 9/19).

WILDER SPOTLIGHT: As "chief architect" of the "historic" 3-day meeting between the So. Gov. Assn and African heads of state, Gov. Doug Wilder (D) will be the "center of media attention." TIMES-DISPATCH's Hardy notes that the meeting will "focus on increasing trade and cultural contacts, but it might also help promote ... Wilder's political fortunes." If a Dem primary is held, Wilder will need "overwhelming" black support (9/19). Other possible Dem: Atty Sylvia Clute. Possible GOP candidates: Ret. Marine Lt. Col. Oliver North, Reagan OMB dir. James Miller and ex-U.S. Atty Jay Stephens.

CHALLENGE FROM THE RIGHT: "For once," when the GOP gathers for its fall convention this week, they "are not scheduled to battle over gay rights and abortion." This time "the flash point is taxes," particularly over Wilson's support of prop. 172 to implement a half-cent sales tax. "Conservatives have introduced resolutions" opposing 172, and Wilson supporters "have pledged to fight" for it but "his aides are downplaying the conflict." Wilson spokesperson Dan Schnur: "It isn't in anybody's best interest to highlight an issue of potential divisiveness at the convention when there are so many key issues on which all Republicans agree." The tax issue "may become a vehicle" for "conservatives who have never been happy with Wilson." Some conservative GOP leaders "have spent the last several weeks trying to recruit a candidate" to challenge Wilson in the primary. GOPers mentioned are Ex-Assemblyman Tom McClintock (R), L.A. Co. Supervisor Mike Antonovich and Frosh. Rep. Howard McKeon (25). McKeon "confirmed" that he had been contacted about mounting a challenge but said he "is supporting Wilson and has no interest." Ex-Assemblyman Tom McClintock (R): "I think it is imperative that Wilson be challenged. At this juncture, I am listening to the phone calls I've been receiving and assessing whether another such candidate will step forward and, if not, assessing whether the financial support is available to make a credible run" (Leshner, L.A. TIMES, 9/17).

THE REAL HEALTH CZAR? L.A. TIMES' Chen profiles the role Garamendi played in '92 and '93 on the formation of the Clinton health plan. Garamendi: "I'm the one to blame" (9/20).

*21 MINNESOTA: CARLSON SQUEAKS PAST QUIST IN STRAW POLL

In a straw poll taken at the state IR convention, Gov. Arne Carlson (IR) "squeaked out a narrow victory" over ex-state Rep. Allen Quist (IR). In the nonbinding contest that "won't count when the party endorses candidates next year," Carlson outpolled Quist 40-37%. But "previous straw ballots have given the winners the perception of momentum," aiding in fund raising and

attracting party activists. Carlson's narrow win "suggests he will have difficulty" in gaining the endorsement next year. Indeed, "Carlson pulled out all the stops to make a respectable showing." "His trump card was a speech on his behalf" by ex-Rep. Vin Weber "the ideological leader of the party's conservative wing." Weber warned the delegates that if the IR gets "bogged down in a 'nine-month civil war' for the [gov.] endorsement, the Democrats win." Despite the narrow margin, Carlson campaign manager Mike Triggs "said the victory shows the moderate Carlson is making progress with the conservatives who controlled the convention." Two years ago IRCC members "booed Carson" and "walked out" to protest his support for legalized abortion and gay rights.

QUIST A TRUE BELIEVER: Quist, whose near victory "sets [him] up" to be "a serious contender" for the IR nomination, claimed his campaign would "come away from" the convention with "a lot of credibility." Quist told the convention he represents the "Reagan coalition of Republicans, conservative Democrats, pro-life and pro-family people, right-to-bear-arms people, tax protesters and anti-establishment people." A vote for Carlson, he said "would be putting politics above... conservative principles" (Salisbury, ST. PAUL PIONEER PRESS, 9/19).

*22 TENNESSEE: HEWLETT IS 2ND PSC CHAIR TO JOIN RACE

PSC Chair Steve Hewlett (D) "joined the already crowded race" 9/17, "meaning two of the state's three commissioners regulating trucking and utilities" will run in '94. PSC Chair Frank Cochran (D) is the other. Hewlett named Deborah Kolarich as Treas. and said he has "pledges and cash totaling \$100,000 at this point." Hewlett referred to the decisions by "several other candidates" not to run as the reason that "someone like himself" is able to "get into this." Hewlett: "[The] business attributes and instincts I've developed in the private sector have really been a benefit. ... I believe I can provide the same type of creative, productive leadership in the governor's office" (Branson, Memphis COMMERCIAL APPEAL, 9/17). Possible Dems: Shelby Co. Mayor Bill Morris, state Sen. Steve Cohen, Ex-Adj. Gen. Carl Wallace, Univ/TN prof. Richard Chesteen, Educ. Commis. Charles Smith, Sen. Harlan Mathews, Ex-state Rep. Walter Bussart, Atty Bruce Shine, state Rep. Bill Purcell, Lobbyist Dick Lodge and '82 Dem nominee Randy Tyree. Possible GOP candidates: Rep. Don Sundquist (07) and ex-state Rep. David Copeland.

*23 KENTUCKY: BUNNING HAS CHOICE WORDS FOR PRESIDENT

Rep. Jim Bunning (R-04) told a three-county GOP gathering: "Bill Clinton is the most corrupt, the most amoral, the most despicable person I've ever seen in the presidency." Bunning's "denunciation of Clinton was followed by attacks on the president's tax package and what Bunning called Clinton's appointment of 'some kind of radical in every major cabinet position or subcabinet position.'" Asked later to expand on what makes Clinton "corrupt," Bunning: "The total distortion and lying he has done ... to say one thing and then do another." Asked what made Clinton "amoral," Bunning "said he was referring to the early-1992 allegations of infidelity, which Clinton answered by acknowledging that he had experienced marital problems" (Cross, Louisville COURIER JOURNAL, 9/19).

President Unveils Plan Stressing Link Between Exports, Jobs

* "I don't believe that a wealthy country can grow much richer in the world we're living in without expanding exports," President Clinton said yesterday. "I don't believe you can create jobs ... unless we can increase the volume of exports in this country." The President spoke to a group of U.S. business leaders at the White House, announcing the Trade Promotion Coordinating Committee's report designed to lower barriers to exports and streamline the Government's efforts in export promotion. In his remarks, the President said "it's very important to see this announcement today in the context of our administration's support of the NAFTA agreement. It would also open up our export opportunities, not just to Mexico, but throughout all of Latin America."

* Since 1988, exports have accounted for 58% of U.S. GDP growth.

* Today, the U.S. exports \$600 billion in products, supporting 7 million American jobs.

* The export initiative announced by the President is designed to boost that to \$1 trillion in exports, supporting some 13 million American jobs by the year 2000.

* Such export-related jobs pay on average 17 percent more than non-export-related jobs. (Source: Department of Commerce)

* The President asserted "that anyone who has seriously looked at the NAFTA dynamics, the specifics of the NAFTA agreement, will actually alleviate all the complaints that people have who are attacking it." He reminded his audience that "[t]his export strategy we announced today assumes that we have people to sell to. ... We have to keep reaching out to tear down these barriers, to integrate our economies in ways that benefit Americans."

* Commerce Secretary Ron Brown, who chaired the Interagency Committee which produced the report, stated: "A more effective export strategy can easily result in over one trillion dollars in exports and six million additional jobs by the year 2000." The report contains 65 specific recommendations for revamping and stream-lining U.S. export promotion activities. The initiative would create "one-stop shopping" for small and medium size exporters by consolidating the resources of Commerce, the Export-Import Bank and the Small Business Administration in one place; coordinate the resources of the Administration for export promotion activities; as well as easing controls on certain high-tech exports.

NAFTA Fact

* Because of current Mexican import restrictions (which NAFTA eliminates) U.S. automakers today export more vehicles to Japan than they do to Mexico.

Democratic Senators Endorse NAFTA

* In a Senate press conference this afternoon, two previously undecided Senators, Jeff Bingaman (D-NM) and Harlan Mathews (D-TN), publicly announced their endorsement of NAFTA. "The NAFTA process provides us with an excellent opportunity to identify resources for addressing the state of the Rio Grande and other pressing environmental and health issues along the border," Senator Bingaman said. Senator Mathews called NAFTA "an opportunity to become more prosperous and secure by becoming more productive and more competitive."

* The announcement was arranged by Senator Bill Bradley (D-NJ), who heads the Senate's informal NAFTA whip organization. "Trade Hawk" Clyde Prestowitz Takes Second Look, Endorses NAFTA

* In an extended op-ed article in Sunday's Washington Post, on NAFTA subtitled "How I Overcame My Doubts and Learned to Like the Pact," former Reagan Administration trade official and acknowledged "trade hawk" Clyde Prestowitz reversed his position, writing that while at one time he had great concerns, "I believe the time has now come for Congress to ratify NAFTA."

"Under the terms of NAFTA," Prestowitz writes, "we are giving away very little. The barriers being removed are mostly on the Mexican side. Ironically, their removal may actually reduce incentives for U.S. firms to move south." Without NAFTA, Prestowitz argues, it is only logical for U.S. producers of, say, minivans to export the excess production of their Mexican plants (which are required by pre-NAFTA Mexican law in order to sell in Mexico) back to the U.S. With NAFTA, the Big Three could shift their minivan production back to more efficient U.S. plants. NAFTA isn't perfect, Prestowitz concludes, but "even with its imperfections, NAFTA will leave America better off than before."

Caucus Vice Chair & DCCC Chair Fazio, Freshman Rep. Endorse NAFTA

* In a House press conference this afternoon, House Speaker Thomas Foley was joined by members Vic Fazio (D-CA), Vice Chair of the House Democratic Caucus and Chair of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee, and Freshman Rep. Jay Inslee (D-WA) to publicly endorse NAFTA. In voicing his support Fazio said, "California stands to gain 30,000 to 40,000 jobs over the next two years, and the country gains 200,000 jobs after the enactment of NAFTA." Arguing that NAFTA was a "unique" opportunity for the U.S., Fazio said, "if we don't take it, if we allow others like the Japanese and Europeans to take it, they will not only have been able to cement their own trading blocks, but destroy the chance we have to put America's trading blocks together, giving ourselves an opportunity for the long haul, for the future."

Freshman Rep. Inslee stated that he was "optimistic [NAFTA] is going to pass because it is my experience that when the truth is told about NAFTA and the truth reaches the American people, the American people will support it."

* Other members attending were Robert Matsui (D-CA), the Majority Whip at Large who is rallying NAFTA votes in the House, Chairman Sam Gibbons of the House Ways & Means Trade Subcommittee and Reps. David McCurdy (D-OK), James Moran (D-VA), and David Skaggs (D-CO), as well as Democratic National Committee Chair David Wilhelm.

* In a long-expected move, Rep. Richard Gephardt (D-MO) announced that he will oppose NAFTA. While he was critical of aspects of the agreement, Gephardt praised the administration's "important progress" in certain areas such as having minimum wages, child labor, and health and safety covered under the dispute settlement system, as well as Mexico's unilateral pledge to tie minimum wages to productivity. When asked about Gephardt's opposition, White House Spokesperson Dee Dee Myers said "we knew this fight wouldn't be easy. When we began we knew that even some in our own party would oppose us. But it's the right thing to do; it's good for jobs, and good for America." Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell said that he would make a statement in support of NAFTA, "so we have one majority leader for it and one against it today."

* With the implementation of NAFTA, the Commerce Department estimates that the Big Three automakers could see \$1 Billion in new sales to Mexico in the first year of the agreement. This translates into 15,000 jobs in the auto and supplier industries in the first year alone.

Kantor, Espy, Reich Testify on Capitol Hill

* Yesterday, U.S. Trade Representative Mickey Kantor and Secretary of Agriculture Mike Espy appeared before the Senate Agriculture Committee at a hearing on the NAFTA. In his remarks, Ambassador Kantor discussed Mexico's many agricultural non-tariff barriers stating: "In our bilateral relationship, the maintenance of these non-tariff barriers helps Mexico much more than it helps us. Conversely, the elimination of these barriers will be more beneficial to the United States than to Mexico." Kantor testified that the passage of NAFTA will sweep away these and other barriers, greatly increasing U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico.

* Secretary Espy picked up on Kantor's theme of increased exports, and testified that since 1986 when Mexican President Salinas first came into office and began reforms, "we had export sales there of about \$1 billion, and just by [Salinas'] unilateral actions, we've seen almost a quadrupling in the U.S. presence in their agricultural market [to \$4 billion annually]." With NAFTA and the removal of the remaining Mexican barriers to U.S. agricultural products, Espy testified "for the first time, we will be dealing on a level and on a fair playing field" with a market of 90 million Mexican consumers.

* Labor Secretary Robert Reich also testified before the Senate Finance Committee yesterday regarding NAFTA labor issues. Addressing the concern that low Mexican wages would draw U.S. manufacturing jobs south, Reich argued that many factors other than wages impact a company's investment decisions, concluding "[i]f low wages were the key to where manufacturers located, manufacturers would be locating in Bangladesh and Haiti. Those would become the manufacturing capitals of the world."

Mitchell, Bradley, Baucus Reaffirm Support of NAFTA

* In a Senate press conference yesterday afternoon, Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell joined Senators Bill Bradley (D-NJ) and Max Baucus (D-MT) in reaffirming their support for NAFTA and responded to Rep. Richard Gephardt's (D-MO) announced opposition. Mitchell expressed his "belief that the NAFTA will be good for Maine, good for the country and will be approved by the Congress." Sen. Max Baucus, Chair of the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works and the Senate Finance Trade Subcommittee, said "I have the utmost respect and admiration for Dick. ...But he is simply wrong on this issue." Baucus continued, "I have the utmost confidence that, after the smoke clears, after the dust settles, and the American people and the Congress know more about the facts and less about the rhetoric, that NAFTA will pass. It will pass this, and it will pass both bodies."

U.S. Capital Goods Exports -- The Real Story

* One of the strongest arguments for NAFTA is that it will continue the growth of U.S. exports to the dynamic Mexican market. In the past five years, the U.S. has gone from a \$5.7 billion trade deficit with Mexico to a \$5.6 billion surplus. NAFTA critics, however, point out that much of that surplus is made up of capital goods -- and claim that this is nothing more than taking apart American factories and sending them south to Mexico. But this claim misses the real story behind U.S. capital goods exports.

* In percentage terms, capital goods have been the slowest growing major export category to Mexico in the last five years. While capital goods are still the largest component of U.S. exports to Mexico, they have decreased from 40 percent of total exports to Mexico in 1987 to 33 percent in 1992. In comparison, capital goods make up 40 percent of our exports to developing countries, and 39 percent of our exports to the world.

* The flawed logic that assumes that capital goods are merely a one-time export which will produce a flood of cheap imported goods flowing back into the U.S. misses the point. Capital plant equipment exported to factories in Mexico should not be seen in negative terms for the American economy. Production of cutting-edge technology such as robotics, generators, and production machinery supports the highest-paying U.S. manufacturing jobs; just as importantly, a healthy, expanding Mexican economy will continue to need such high-tech U.S. products. Even the U.S., the world's most productive economy, must replace a part of its capital equipment each year.

Additionally, capital goods are some of our most competitive exports and cover many things other than capital plant equipment: Boeing jets, IBM computers, AT&T telephone systems, John Deere tractors. The manufacture of all of these U.S. products support high-paying U.S. jobs, and cannot be construed as a drag on the U.S. economy.

* Finally, and perhaps most importantly, without NAFTA Mexico has no incentive not to fill its growing capital goods needs from Japanese and European -- rather than U.S. -- exports. NAFTA Fact

* 83 percent of the growth in U.S. exports to Mexico in the last five years was for Mexican consumption -- not re-export. Additionally, in those five years exports to maquiladoras in relation to total U.S. exports to Mexico have fallen. In 1992, U.S. exports to maquiladoras comprised 22 percent of U.S. exports to Mexico, compared to 32 percent in 1987.

Court Rules in Administration's Favor on NEPA

* In a ruling handed down this morning, the three judge panel of the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia announced its unanimous decision that the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) does not require the Clinton Administration to prepare an environmental impact statement in connection with the NAFTA. The court ruled that "[b]ecause we conclude that NAFTA is not "final agency action" under the APA, we reverse the decision of the district court and express no view on the government's other contentions."

* Returning from his trip to Florida, President Clinton said, "First, I applaud this decision. And second, I want to emphasize that if this agreement goes through, it will lead to improvements in the environment and increased investment on the Mexican side of the border in environmental cleanup." This decision reversed the June 30 decision of Judge Charles Richey, which had raised uncertainty about the Administration's ability to go forward and seek Congressional approval of NAFTA.

* In a press briefing -- by NAFTA Coordinator William Daley, USTR Mickey Kantor, EPA Administrator Carol Browner, Associate Attorney General Webb Hubbell and Under Secretary of State Tim Wirth -- Ambassador Kantor said that the Administration was "gratified" by the court's decision to overturn Judge Richey's ruling, and noted "that the Richey decision raised in the minds of many the feeling that NAFTA could have an adverse impact on the environment. Nothing could be further from the truth." EPA Administrator said, "I welcome the court's decision because the decision is good for NAFTA, and NAFTA is good for the environment," and called NAFTA "the most environmentally sensitive trade agreement in history."

* Senator Max Baucus (D-MT), Chair of the Senate Environmental and Public Works Committee and the Senate Finance Trade Subcommittee, said: "Today's decision removes a potential procedural roadblock for NAFTA. Coupled with last week's send-off at the White House, NAFTA is on a winning streak -- not a long one -- but a winning streak nonetheless." Rep. Ron Wyden (D-OR) called the environmental side agreement "an unprecedented linking of environmental protection to trade", and said the decision cleared the way for Congress to decide the real question on NAFTA: "Isn't it better to pass this NAFTA that permits monetary penalties and trade sanctions for environmental violations, than to sit by while pollution increases under the status quo?"

* The six national environmental groups that have endorsed NAFTA represent 7.5 million members, some 80 percent of those belonging to environmental groups.

President Continues NAFTA Push In California

* President Clinton continued to take his argument that NAFTA will create high-wage American jobs to the people of California following his speech to the AFL-CIO convention on Monday. In remarks to California citizens, political leaders and business leaders the President stressed his belief that NAFTA will help to reverse the course that the American economy took over the last twelve years. "The objections to NAFTA," the President stated, "are basically objections to the system that has existed for the last 12 years, of being able to go down just across the border, set up a plant, have lower wages, lower environmental costs, and export back into America with no tariffs."

"The question the American people should be asking," the President concluded, "is if we adopt this trade agreement, will it make it better or worse? It will plainly make it better."

New England Kicks Off Series of Leadership Briefings

* The Vice President, Treasury Secretary Lloyd Bentsen, USTR Mickey Kantor, EPA Administrator Carol Browner, and NAFTA

Coordinator William Daley held the first in a series of briefings yesterday for business and community leaders from New England. Tomorrow and Thursday, similar briefings will be held for North Carolina and New Jersey leaders.

Commerce Study Sees \$2 Billion Increase In Auto Trade with NAFTA

* Following up on the President's argument that NAFTA will create more and better U.S. jobs, the Commerce Department yesterday released a study which foresees a \$2 billion increase in U.S. automobile exports to Mexico under NAFTA. "NAFTA automotive provisions," the study states, "provide the opportunity for increased U.S. exports of approximately \$2 billion in 1994, with increasing potential over the 10-year transition period."

* Announcing the study, Commerce Secretary Ron Brown said that NAFTA "is a big plus to the automotive industry -- it means exports and it means jobs." The study found that the American automobile industry is one of America's biggest winners under the NAFTA. By removing Mexican laws requiring that U.S. automakers build in Mexico most of what they sell in Mexico, U.S. automakers will be able to export American-made cars for sale to Mexican consumers.

NAFTA Fact

* The Big Three automakers expect that 15,000 American jobs will be supported by increased U.S. automotive exports to Mexico in the first year of NAFTA alone.
