In our meeting today we discussed and propose the following schedule:

1. Roundtables with key opinion leaders -- We propose three roundtable meetings next week with Maria taking the discussion lead. Purpose of meeting would be for Maria to do a thematic briefing on the State of the Union message and to hear from them on what they would like to see in the SOTU. We would include a total of 60 opinion leaders during the three meetings.

Note to Miriam: We will need three one hour time slots on Maria's calendar for Wed. (1/21), Thurs. (1/22), and Friday (1/23) of next week.

Note to Danny: When we have sign-off from Maria and times from Miriam will you please reserve Room 180 OEOB for us? Thanks.

2. Regional conference calls -- We propose 2 or 3 regional conference calls (upon request by OPL staff) to key "outside the beltway" opinion leaders. These calls would be "heads up" calls to group leaders regarding the SOTU themes. These calls could be scheduled on 1/26 and 1/27.

Note to Miriam: We will need 2 or 3 conference call time slots on Maria's calendar. I will advise OPL staff to contact you directly if they would like to do a conference call.

Note to OPL staff: If you would like to request a conference call please contact Miriam directly to set up a time and work with Marge on materials Maria will need to do the conference call. It will also be your responsibility to set up the conference call line with Signal or the WH operator. Please keep me in the loop as you make your request for these calls.

3. Room 450 Budget Briefing -- We propose 1 large briefing regarding the budget on Monday, 2/2, 2:00 to 3:00 pm. We would need Maria to host the briefing and would ask Ann Lewis or Paul Begala to do an overall budget message review. Other proposed speakers would be Frank Raines or Jack Lew.

4. Post budget submission conference calls -- We propose 2-3 post submission conference calls regarding the budget. These calls would be organized by topic. We would propose one (possibly two-depending on how we deal with international family planning discussion) calls regarding foreign affairs with Tony Blinken of the NSC staff. We would like to do the first call on 2/3. Other calls to be scheduled will be recommended and requested by OPL staff.

I wanted to clarify what provisions AID is accepting this year on abortion and family planning assistance:

AID is proposing that we accept appropriations language that

- 1) prohibits us from providing funds to any organization that supports programs of coercive abortion or involuntary sterilization;
- 2) prohibits us from providing funds that will be used to pay for abortion as a method of family planning
- 3) prohibits us from providing funds that will be used to "motivate or coerce" anyone to have an abortion;
- 4) prohibits discrimination against any organization that does not perform abortions on "religious or conscientious" grounds; and
- 5) specifies that organizations that provide information on a broad range of family planning options are not considered to be "motivating" anyone to have an abortion.

We included this language in the FY 1996 and FY 1997 President's budgets. There was internal confusion within AID over whether to include the language in FY 1998; we ended up bracketing the language because of this confusion,

although AID now argues that they meant for the brackets around this language to come off at the last minute and did not succeed in communicating this to us in time.

AID argues that this language codifies practices that the Administration already follows, and was on record in the FYs 1996 and 97 budgets as supporting, and that bracketing it could incorrectly signal that we intend to fund abortions or otherwise change current Administration policy. It's important not to confuse this language with the Mexico City restrictions that Congressman Smith has been pushing, or with the funding restrictions and metering provisions that we have been forced to live with since FY 1996 and which we are requesting deletion of in the FY 1999 budget.

Sorry if there's been any confusion about this.

ON THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CREATION
OF THE STATE OF ISRAEL

THE PRESIDENT: Hillary joins me in sending our warmest wishes to all those celebrating the 50th anniversary of the creation of the modern state of Israel. On May 14, 1948, the world witnessed something unimaginable for almost 2,000 years -- the rebirth of the Jewish state. The exile came to an end. The people denied a homeland for countless generations saw their oldest dream fulfilled. With the establishment of Israel, a haven was created for those who had wandered the Earth, suffering every form of persecution, including the horror of the Holocaust.

Israel was born 50 years ago, but no prophet could then have foreseen the miracles that it would perform. Its people gathered from the four corners of the world, building a diverse society and a vibrant democracy. The desert bloomed and cities rose. In a land with few natural resources, Israel created a thriving, prosperous economy. Its artists and scholars and writers and entertainers and scientists and entrepreneurs have contributed to our time far, far beyond their numbers.

Israel achieved all this despite the relentless hostility and the decades of bloody struggle and isolation. Through four wars and continuous threats to its very existence, Israel persevered against all the odds. Its achievements in the face of adversity have inspired free men and women the world over. We all draw strength from Israel's example. It teaches us anew the power of the human spirit to build reality out of dreams.

So, on behalf of all Americans, I wish the Israeli people and the friends of Israel everywhere a joyous anniversary. Fifty years ago, my predecessor, Harry Truman, made the bold decision that the United States would recognize the new state of Israel, and America became the first nation to do so. President Truman was deeply proud of that decision. Today we know it was one of his wisest ones. It laid the cornerstone for a relationship between the United States and Israel that has grown stronger with every passing year.

I'm proud that our friendship is broader, deeper, and more firmly rooted than at any time in Israel's history, and I'm determined that it will remain so. Our commitment to Israel's security remains rock solid. The relationship is not just between governments; Israel has always been a particular source of pride to our nation's Jewish community. And today all parts of American society feel a close tie to the people of Israel. The extraordinary friendship between our nations and its strategic importance have guided my efforts to bring peace to the Middle East, which the people there so richly deserve.

My deepest wish for Israel is that it should enjoy in the next 50 years what it has been denied in its first 50 years -- an end to conflict, to wars, to terror; a real peace with all its Arab neighbors and full security for all its people.

On this remarkable occasion let me say to the people of Israel and all Israel's friends around the world, Mazel Tov. Congratulations. My heartfelt best wishes for the next 50 years.

IN MESSAGE ON THE 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF ROE V. WADE

THE PRESIDENT: On January 22, we marked the 25th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the landmark Supreme Court decision that affirmed very woman's right to choose whether and when to have a child, and in doing so, affirmed two of our nation's most deeply-held values, personal privacy and family responsibility.

Over the past 25 years, Roe v. Wade has had a major positive impact on the health and well-being of American women and their families. Safe, legal abortion has all but eliminated the dangerous, clandestine conditions that claim too many women's lives when the procedure was illegal.

I'm committed to keeping abortions safe, legal, and accessible -- and to making it more rare. Over the last five years we've led the way on policies to prevent unintended pregnancy by making comprehensive family planning and sex education programs more widely available. We've increased support for Title X family planning services every year in our budget. And I'll do so again this year.

I fought to continue funding for international family planning, bringing much needed health care to women all around the world. Here, at home, by working together with health care professionals, community groups, schools and family planning agencies, we've made real progress in reducing teen pregnancy. And I was proud to sign legislation to protect the rights Roe established by protecting women's clinics from violence. We have enforced that law to its full extent.

I will continue to do everything I can to make sure that every child in America is a wanted child, raised in a loving, strong family. Ultimately, that idea is the anniversary of Roe v. Wade celebrates.

Hillary and I join with all of you in commemorating his milestone and pledge ourselves anew to protecting the right to choose.

REMARKS BY THE FIRST LADY
AT NATIONAL ABORTION RIGHTS
ACTION LEAGUE LUNCHEON

MRS. CLINTON: I am pleased to be here with all of you. And I know that it took a little longer to get into the room than usual, but let me reassure you about the events of this morning. We do not know what the facts are, but law enforcement, as the President said this morning, is working hard to get the bottom of it, and it does not, at least so far as we know at this time, appear to be anything serious that should concern us.

I am very pleased to be here for a number of reasons. One is to join all of you in honoring Robin Chandler Duke. We will hear more about her as the program goes on. But I wanted to thank

her publicly for her tireless work on behalf of family planning here at home and particularly internationally, on her advocacy of safe motherhood and other issues critical to women, children and families. She has always understood that these are not marginal concerns. They relate to political and economic progress, human rights, and peace and prosperity here in our country and around the world.

So I wanted to raise my voice with all of yours in commending her for all of her work in raising awareness about family planning and her many other contributions that she has already made and that I know she will continue to make into the future. (Applause.)

I also wanted to come and recognize and thank my friend, Nancy Rubin, for her energy, her wisdom and all of her efforts on behalf of causes relating to women and families. She is a clear and articulate voice for women's rights around the world and has worked to strengthen education, economic opportunities, legal protections and political rights, and has helped from one corner of the world to the next to bring women's issues to the forefront of international and national concerns. (Applause.)

And I know that I speak for all of us and for many others who are not here in thanking Kate Michelman for over a decade of service leading this organization and doing so much to promote and protect a women's right to choose. It has not been an easy mission. And she has continued to speak up and speak out even in difficult times. And, Kate, we want to thank you for that. (Applause).

I'm delighted that the Vice President and Tipper Gore will be here shortly, representing the administration, and that both of them will address you. I literally am dropping in, wanting to be here today, but I have a previous engagement and have to be New York this evening, I think -- I lose track of where I am and where I'm going and where I'll be. (Laughter.)

But I wanted to lend my voice to the Vice President's and Tipper's and to all of yours in thanking you for your work. And particularly, I wanted to thank the members of Congress who are here and other elected officials for remaining steadfast in their support of a woman's right to choose.

This is never an easy issue, and anyone who thinks they have the ultimate truth on it is always going to be wrong. This is a

very hard issue. And in the next years, I hope that we will be able to find ways of increasing dialogue, in working together with people of good faith who do not share extremism as their rallying cry, to try to understand how we can continue the progress that has been made in the last four years in decreasing the number of abortions, decreasing teen pregnancy, in working to give women opportunities to

make the choices that are best for them and their families.

And I have no illusions about the difficulty of that.
But I also have no illusions that there is any other route to take.
This is an issue that will be with us because of the strong feelings.
And I think that my husband's formulation of it years ago is still the right one, that abortion should be legal, safe and rare. We have worked hard in the last -- (applause) -- in the last four years to maintain legality and safety and to begin to put into place attitudes and values and policies that are beginning to work to make abortion rare.

But that will mean we also must speak out on behalf of family planning here and around the world -- (applause) -- on behalf of educational opportunities for young women and young men so they know they have better choices and that they should postpone childbearing or even confronting the issue of abortion. It means that we have to have good, comprehensive health care services available to all people in our country so that they have access to the same information that those of us who are fortunate do.
(Applause.)

I was reminded on my way over here of several of the experiences that I have had in the last four years traveling on behalf of our country. I was in Brazil, a maternal hospital -- I wrote about it in my book and I talked about it. It stays in my mind because half the admissions were for the joy of giving birth, and half the admissions were for complications resulting from self-induced or back-alley abortions. And the Minister of Health in a public meeting with me said, we want to give poor women the same information and access to family planning that well-to-do women have always had in our country. (Applause.) That should be our goal not only here but also in our foreign policy.

I also had the rather unique experience within a year of traveling to China and speaking out against policies of forced abortion and sterilization where the government made the choice for women, and traveling to Romania that under the previous communist regime had a policy of enforcing birth -- five children per woman. And I spoke with women who told me of every month being taken as part of their work units to local hospitals where they were forcefully examined to determine whether or not they were pregnant so they could then be monitored by the secret police to be sure they had the child.

Two extremes -- government, on the one hand, saying you cannot have children; government, on the other hand, saying you must have children. What we have tried to do in promoting choice is to say that this most difficult of all intimate choices for women and men must be made by the individual in the privacy of her consultation with her conscience, her God, her family, her physician --
(applause.)

Thank you for continuing to try to get that message across. Please join in helping us make these difficult decisions

rarer. Help us support women in all their needs. Help us support families.

And I appreciate greatly the devotion and dedication that so many of you have given to this over the years, and look forward to working with you into the future. Thank you very much. (Applause.)

SUMMARY POINTS

Support for Family Planning in the Clinton Administration

Under the Clinton Administration, federal support for family planning has been steadily rising, both in programs specially dedicated to family planning and others (e.g., Medicaid) that provide family planning services as part of a broader program.

Title X Family Planning grants will, under the President's proposal, be increased \$15 million to \$218 million in FY 1999.

This is a 46% increase since 1992, at a time when total Federal discretionary spending has increased only 6% [however, non-defense discretionary will have risen 32%].

\$15 million would be the largest increase enacted in this administration, and well above the \$5m Congress provided last year.

Medicaid provides almost \$500 million [est: \$475 in FY98] in Federal funds to support family planning services. By FY99, this will represent an increase of almost 20% [19%] over FY 1992.

Family planning services are also provided by states and local communities from the Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, the Social Services Block Grant, and the Preventive Health Block Grant and to Native Americans by the Indian Health Service. In FY 1999, we estimate \$100 million [actually \$101m] in family planning services will be provided under the President's budget, a 21% increase over FY92 [though a 4% decrease from FY98].

Services are provided to nearly 4.4 million clients each year at more than 4,000 family planning clinics nationwide. They include the contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, STD screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

The National Institutes of Health undertake research in infertility, contraception, and related matters. CDC funds programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence. Under the President's Budget, in FY 1999 these should total about \$200 million [\$202m], a 25% increase since FY92.

Internationally, the Administration has been a strong supporter of family planning programs. Under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY99, a 32% increase over FY92.

In total, under the President's budget family planning will rise to \$1.43 billion in FY 1999, a 27% increase over FY 1992 [\$1.1 billion].

Ensuring Abortion is Safe, Legal and Less Necessary: The Alan Guttmacher Institute, a New York-based organization that conducts research on reproductive issues, reported a 16% decrease in unintended pregnancies between 1987 and 1994. The change is primarily a result of improved use of contraceptives, according to the study's author. In 1980, the peak year for abortions, there were 29.3 abortions for every 1,000 women of child-bearing age. By 1994, the last year for which data were available, that figure had dropped to 24.2.

According to a CDC report issued last month, the percentage of pregnancies ending in legal abortions has fallen to its lowest level since the mid-1970s. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that 20 of every 1,000 women (ages 15-44) had abortions in 1995 (the most recent data), the lowest rate since 1975 and a slight drop from the rate of 21 per 1,000 in 1994. The abortion rate increased steadily from 1972 to 1980, leveled off between 1981 and 1993, and gradually started to decline in 1994.

Promoting Prevention of Teenage Pregnancy: After rising steadily from 1986 to 1991, the birth rate for teens aged 15-19 declined for the sixth straight year in 1996, from a high of 62.1 per 1,000 teens aged 15-19 in 1991 to 54.7 in 1996. The rate declined 12% between 1991 and 1996 and four percent from 1995 to 1996. All 50 states had a sustained decline in their teen birth rates between 1991 and 1995, and 21 of these states had declines of more than 10% over this period.

Supporting Prevention Education. The National Institutes of Health undertake research in infertility, contraception, and related matters. Meeting with Family Planning Advocates

January 20, 1998

- I'm glad to have the opportunity to meet with you all as we approach the 25th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. I'd like to thank you for all your work to promote and protect a woman's right to choose. I know it has not been an easy mission.
- In fact, this has never been an easy issue. I hope that we will be able to find ways of to increase dialogue, to work together with people of good faith on both sides of this issue, to try to understand how we can continue the progress that has been made in the last five years in decreasing the number of abortions, decreasing teen pregnancy, in working to give women opportunities to make choices that are best for them and their families.
- I think my husband's formulation of it years ago is still the right one: abortion should be legal, safe and rare. We have worked hard in the last five years to maintain legality and safety and to begin to change attitudes, values and policies that will make abortion less necessary. And we are gratified at some of the results we are seeing -- the teen pregnancy rate is down to its lowest level in years, and the abortion rate is declining as well.
- That's why the President's increase in Title X is so important -- we can continue the progress we've made. We must work on behalf of educational opportunities for young women and young men so they know they have better choices and that they should postpone childbearing so that they can avoid the issue of abortion. That's why I think efforts like HHS' Girl Power! Campaign are so important. This pregnancy prevention education initiative is engaging all HHS teen pregnancy prevention and related youth programs in sustained efforts to prevent pregnancy among 9- to 14-year-old girls.
- We must continue to speak out on behalf of family planning here and around the world. As I have traveled around the world, I have seen examples of how our international family planning efforts reduce abortion in country after country [e.g. Brazil]. I have also been to a country where the government forces women to have abortion [e.g. China] and to a country where the government forces women to become pregnant [e.g. Romania]. Two extremes -- government, on the one hand, saying you cannot have children; government on the other hand, saying you must have children. What we have tried to do in promoting choice is to say that this most difficult of all intimate choices for women and men must be made by the individual in consultation with her conscience, her God, her physician and her family.
- I look forward to working with you to meet the challenges ahead. Thank you for all your work.

Meeting with Family Planning Groups

Background Facts

January 20, 1998

Under the Clinton Administration, federal support for family planning has steadily increased, both in programs specially dedicated to family planning and in programs providing family planning as part of a broader range of services. Most recently, the President demonstrated his commitment to family planning by refusing to accede to Republican demands that he support a measure that would deny federal money to any overseas family planning agency that performs abortions or lobbies to change abortion laws. Congressional Republicans had made the President's support of this effort the price of passage of fast-track trade legislation and legislation that would fund the U.N. and the I.M.F.

A Record of Strong Support for Family Planning

Increasing Funding for Family Planning. In total, under the President's budget support for family planning will rise to \$1.43 billion in FY 1999, a 27% increase over FY 1992. These funds provide services to nearly 4.4 million clients each year at more than 4,000 family planning clinics nationwide. Services provided include contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, STD screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

Increasing Funding for Title X. The President's FY 1999 budget proposal will call for an increase of \$15 million in Title X Family Planning grants (to \$218 million).

- A \$15 million increase would be the largest enacted during this Administration, and well above the \$5 million Congress provided last year.
- This increase would cap an overall 46% increase since 1992, at a time when total Federal discretionary spending has increased only 6%.

Expanding Medicaid and Other Services. Under the President's proposal, Medicaid will provide almost \$500 million in federal funds to support family planning services. This sum represents an increase of 19% over FY 1992. The Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, the Social Services Block Grant, and the Preventive Health Block Grant provide funds to state and local communities for family planning services. In FY 1999, the President's budget will request \$100 million in family planning services -- a 21% increase over FY92 (though a 4% decrease from FY98).

Supporting Prevention Education and Research. The National Institutes of Health undertake research in infertility, contraception, and related matters. CDC funds programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence. Under the President's FY99 Budget, funding for these research and education programs should total about \$200 million -- a 25% increase since FY92. In addition, HHS' Girl Power! education initiative is engaging all HHS teen pregnancy prevention and related youth programs in sustained efforts to promote pregnancy prevention among 9- to 14-year-old girls.

Promoting International Family Planning. The Administration has strongly supported international family planning programs. The President has blocked several Congressional efforts to prohibit funding for international family planning groups that lobby on behalf of abortion rights or perform abortions. And under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY99, a 32% increase over FY92.

A Record of Reducing Unwanted Pregnancy

Reducing Unintended Pregnancy. The Alan Guttmacher Institute, a New York-based organization that conducts research on reproductive issues, recently reported a 16% decrease in unintended pregnancies between 1987 and 1994. The change is primarily a result of improved use of contraceptives, according to the study's author. And according to a recent CDC report, the percentage of pregnancies ending in legal abortions has fallen to its lowest level since the mid-1970s.

Preventing Teenage Pregnancy. After rising steadily from 1986 to 1991, the birth rate for teens aged 15-19 declined for the sixth straight year in 1996. The rate declined 12% between 1991 and 1996 and four percent from 1995 to 1996. All 50 states had a sustained decline in their teen birth rates between 1991 and 1995, and 21 of these states had declines of more than 10% over this period.

Support for Family Planning in the Clinton Administration

Under the Clinton Administration, federal support for family planning has been steadily rising, both in programs specially dedicated to family planning and others (e.g., Medicaid) that provide family planning services as part of a broader program.

Title X Family Planning grants will, under the President's proposal, be increased \$15 million to \$218 million in FY 1999.

This is a 46% increase since 1992, at a time when total Federal discretionary spending has increased only 6% [however, non-defense discretionary will have risen 32%].

\$15 million would be the largest increase enacted in this administration, and well above the \$5m Congress provided last year.

Medicaid provides almost \$500 million [est: \$475 in FY98] in Federal funds to support family planning services. By FY99, this will represent an increase of almost 20% [19%] over FY 1992.

Family planning services are also provided by states and local communities from the Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, the Social Services Block Grant, and the Preventive Health Block Grant and to Native Americans by the Indian Health Service. In FY 1999, we estimate \$100 million [actually \$101m] in family planning services will be provided under the President's budget, a 21% increase over FY92 [though a 4% decrease from FY98].

Services are provided to nearly 4.4 million clients each year at more than 4,000 family planning clinics nationwide. They include the contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, STD screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

The National Institutes of Health undertake research in infertility, contraception, and related matters. CDC funds programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence. Under the President's Budget, in FY 1999 these should total about \$200 million [\$202m], a 25% increase since FY92.

Internationally, the Administration has been a strong supporter of family planning programs. Under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY99, a 32% increase over FY92.

In total, under the President's budget family planning will rise to \$1.43 billion in FY 1999, a 27% increase over FY 1992 [\$1.1 billion].

If we look at the President's Budget proposals (vs what Congress enacted), then we can say the following about Title X requests:

From FY89 to its last budget submission for FY93, the Bush Administration proposed increases in Title X over 5 years (vs the previous year's enacted) totalling \$11 million.

From FY94 to through last year, also 5 years, the Clinton Administration proposed a total of \$49 million in increases.

In the FY99 budget, the President will propose an additional \$15 million increase. Once enacted, it will be the largest increase in this Administration and a 46% total increase since FY92. [N.B.: Congress, on its own, enacted a large increase for FY93, to \$173 from the previous year's \$150m.]

We should also note strong support for family planning overseas, despite Congressional opposition.

Today, marks the 25th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the landmark Supreme Court decision that affirmed every woman's right to choose whether and when to have a child. President Clinton is committed to ensuring this right, and in doing so, to protecting two of our nation's most deeply-held values, personal privacy and family responsibility.

PREVENTION AND FAMILY PLANNING. During the last five years, the Administration has worked hard to reduce the need for abortions and to prevent unintended pregnancy by making comprehensive family planning and sex education programs more widely available. The President's FY 1999 budget calls for:

- **Increased Funding for Title X.** The proposal will increase Title X Family Planning grants by \$15 million -- a 46% increase since FY1992.
- **Medicaid and Other Services.** The proposal will provide almost \$500 million in federal funds to Medicaid to support family planning services. Additionally, the Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, the Social Services Block Grant, and the Preventive Health Block Grant will provide \$100 million to state and local communities for family planning services.
- **Prevention Education and Research.** The proposal will provide about \$200 million for the National Institutes of Health's research on infertility, contraception, and related matters, and CDC's programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence. Additionally, Health and Human Service's teen pregnancy prevention and related youth programs will continue to engage the Girl Power! education initiative in sustained efforts to promote pregnancy prevention among girls 9- to 14-years-old.

A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO FAMILY PLANNING. Under the President's proposal nearly 5 million clients each year at more than 4,700 family planning clinics nationwide, would have access to a comprehensive set of family planning services including contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, sexually transmitted disease screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

SUPPORTING INTERNATIONAL FAMILY PLANNING. The Administration is strongly committed to international family planning efforts. The President has blocked several Congressional attempts to prohibit funding for international family planning groups that use their own funding to lobby on behalf of abortion rights or perform abortions. Under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY 1999, a 32% increase over FY 1992.

Support for Family Planning in the Clinton Administration

Under the Clinton Administration, federal support for family planning has been steadily rising, both in programs specially dedicated to family planning and others (e.g., Medicaid) that provide family planning services as part of a broader program.

Under the President's proposal, Title X Family Planning grants will increase by \$15 million (+7%) in FY 1999 to \$218 million.

- The proposed funding level of \$218 million constitutes a 46% increase for Title X since 1992, whereas total Federal discretionary spending has increased by only 6% over this same period [however, non-defense discretionary will have risen 32%].
- \$15 million would be the largest increase enacted in this administration, and well above the \$5m Congress provided last year.

Family planning services are provided to nearly 4.4 million clients each year at more than 4,000 family planning clinics nationwide. They include both prevention and treatment services, such as contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, STD screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

Medicaid provides almost \$500 million [est: \$475 in FY98] in Federal funds to support family planning services. By FY99, this will represent an increase of almost 20% [19%] over FY 1992.

We estimate that apart from Medicaid funding, the FY 1999 President's Budget will provide an additional \$100 million [actually \$104m] for family planning services, including services provided by states and local communities from the Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, the Social Services Block Grant, and the Preventive Health Block Grant; and services provided to Native Americans through the Indian Health Service. The Centers for Disease Control also funds programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence.

The National Institutes of Health undertakes research in infertility, contraception, and related matters. Under the President's Budget, family planning research funding in FY 1999 should total about \$200 million [\$199m], a 24% increase since FY92.

Internationally, the Administration has been a strong supporter of family planning programs. Under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY99, a 32% increase over FY92.

In total, under the President's budget family planning will rise to \$1.43 billion in FY 1999, a 27% increase over FY 1992 [\$1.1 billion].

Women's Health/Reproductive Rights - Organized meeting with 20 leaders from the pro-choice core community, international family planning advocates, teen pregnancy prevention advocates, staff of key members of Congress and mainstream women's organizations to discuss the Administration's family planning budget proposal with Vice President Gore and Ms. Clinton. The groups were extremely excited and discussed strategies for ensuring congressional support and passage. In an effort to reframe the debate away from abortion to family planning, the leaders felt this budgetary commitment would send a strong message and sets a national context to get on the offense of this issue. They are very committed to working with us and stressing the importance of family planning. The women's office will continue to meet with this broad coalition.

25th Anniversary of Roe v. Wade - Produced and distributed POTUS video through Planned Parenthood, NARAL and National Women's Political Caucus to nearly 400 local, state and national affiliates hosting events to commemorate Roe v. Wade's 25th anniversary. The video was also aired at Planned Parenthood's 25th anniversary event Wednesday and was attended by more than 500. On Thursday, NARAL held their national luncheon with more than 3000 in attendance. The Vice President delivered the keynote address and announced the Administration's budget proposals to increase Family Planning, Research, and Medicaid funds. This was, of course, received with an enthusiastic applause.

National Indian Women's Health Services Roundtable -- The Women's Office and Lynn Cutler hosted 13 members of the National Indian Women's Health Services (NIWHS) Steering Committee for a roundtable discussion in follow-up to our earlier meetings with women's health officials across the government. Presentations were made by several (NIWHS) representatives regarding their office's special activities and programs with special attention on the health needs in their communities that are not being

adequately addressed by the Administration. We will continue to work with this group on suggestions and alternatives to assist in their particular areas.

National "State of the Union" Watch Parties --The Women's Office is in the process of outreaching to national women's coalition organizations who are "stakeholders" with an interest in the President's themes. Confirmed Watch Parties to date are: Illinois -- Phyllis Hill-Slater, President of the National Association of Women's Business Owners (NAWBO) will be in Chicago will participate in a Watch Party hosted by the Chicago Chapter of NAWBO and be available for media; and California -- NAWBO-Los Angeles will host a Watch Party with their members. There is also interest by the NAWBO Chapter in Little Rock; the chapter in Simsbury, CT; and the NAWBO-affiliate in Wisconsin. We're also working with AAUW, BPW, NWPC on their activities pertaining to the SOTU.

We are co-hosting a State of the Union Watch Party with the President's Interagency Council on Women and Department of Interior for women political appointees throughout the Administration, NGO's, women's organizations, and women mayors from around the country (in town for their annual meeting). We will announce the Department of Interior's plans to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the Seneca Falls Convention. This event is an opportunity to mobilize women to amplify our accomplishments and new initiatives such as child care, Medicare, Civil Rights Enforcement, Pension Reform and the President's Initiative on Race. Expected attendance is 500-700.

**THE CLINTON-GORE ADMINISTRATION:
PROMOTING REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH SERVICES FOR WOMEN**

Throughout their Administration, the President and Vice President have demonstrated their strong commitment to reproductive health services for women, emphasizing the importance of prevention and family planning.

A Record of Strong Support for Family Planning

Increasing Funding for Family Planning. In total, under the President's budget support for family planning will rise to \$1.43 billion in FY 1999, a 27% increase over FY 1992. These funds provide services to nearly 4.4 million clients each year at more than 4,000 family planning clinics nationwide. Services provided include contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, STD screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

Increasing Funding for Title X. The President's FY 1999 budget proposal will call for an increase of \$15 million in Title X Family Planning grants (to \$218 million).

Supporting Prevention Education and Research. The National Institutes of Health undertake research in infertility, contraception, and related matters. CDC funds programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence. Under the President's FY99 Budget, funding for these research and education programs should total about \$200 million -- a 25% increase since FY92. In addition, HHS' Girl Power! education initiative is engaging all HHS teen pregnancy prevention and related youth programs in sustained efforts to promote pregnancy prevention among 9- to 14-year-old girls.

Promoting International Family Planning. The Administration has strongly supported international family planning programs. The President has blocked several Congressional efforts to prohibit funding for international family planning groups that lobby on behalf of abortion rights or perform abortions. And under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY99, a 32% increase over FY92.

Promoting Access to Reproductive Health Services For Women:

Repeal of the Mexico City Policy. Most recently, the President demonstrated his commitment to family planning by refusing to accede to Congressional demands that he support a measure to deny federal money to any overseas family planning agency that performs abortions or lobbies to change abortion laws. The Congressional Leadership had made the President's support of this effort the price of passage of fast-track trade legislation and legislation that would fund the U.N. and the I.M.F.

Establishing Clinic Safety. President Clinton signed the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act, establishing a safety-zone around women's health clinics. This law is meant to ensure that women and their doctors enter clinics with less fear of intimidation and violence.

Reversed the "Gag Rule." During his first week in office, President Clinton reversed the previous administration's attempts to prevent federally-funded family planning clinics from providing full information on options for resolving unintended pregnancies.

Establishing Services for Victims of Rape and Incest. Under President Clinton, the Department of Health and Human Services implemented a congressionally ordered change to Medicaid to include abortion services for women whose pregnancies result from rape or incest, in addition to saving the life of the woman.

A Record of Reducing Unwanted Pregnancy

Reducing Unintended Pregnancy. The Alan Guttmacher Institute, a New York-based organization that conducts research on reproductive issues, recently reported a 16% decrease in unintended pregnancies between 1987 and 1994. The change is primarily a result of improved use of contraceptives, according to the study's author.

Preventing Teenage Pregnancy. After rising steadily from 1986 to 1991, the birth rate for teens aged 15-19 declined for the sixth straight year in 1996. The rate declined 12% between 1991 and 1996 and four percent from 1995 to 1996. All 50 states had a sustained decline in their teen birth rates between 1991 and 1995, and 21 of these states had declines of more than 10% over this period.

The increase in Family Planning of \$15 million (from \$203m to \$218m) is not in any way related to the decrease in Adolescent Family Life of \$12 million (from \$17m to \$5m).

HRSA runs an Abstinence Education program, which receives \$50 million in each of fiscal years 1998-2002. This program teaches abstinence education only, and focuses on teens and pre-teens.

Given that HRSA's Abstinence Education program should be fully geared up by FY99 (its second year), a \$12 million reduction is being taken in Adolescent Family Life funding because AFL primarily focuses on promoting abstinence among teens, much like the Abstinence Education program. (AFL is operated by the Office of Population Affairs in HHS' Office of the Secretary.)

AFL is a demonstration authorized in 1981, and the things to be demonstrated have been accomplished by 1998.

2. * What exactly does the administration mean by &key8 developing nations8 and &meaningful participation8? When are we likely to obtain this?
- 3* When does the President intend to submit an agreement for advice and consent by the US Senate?
- 4* Will the administration produce and economic analysis of the impact of the Kyoto protocol on the US economy, and its sectors and regions? If so, when, and by what method? Will it predict job losses and energy price impacts? Will it look at the shift of US production to developing nations?
- 5* What is the administration,s critique of EIA,s energy use projections (34% increase by 2010, 40% by 2015, and 45% by 2020)? Do we believe oil prices will remain flat?
- 6* Is it true that the US endorses family planning (i.e. abortion) as a means for developing nations to reduce greenhouse gas emissions?
- 7* Is it true that the US didn,t really get &joint implementation8 and &trading8 in Kyoto, and that they are entirely contingent on future negotiations? What do we have to get in Argentina to make these fully operational?

14* What affect will the Kyoto agreement have on energy prices in the US, including gasoline, heating oil, and electricity independent of electricity restructuring? What effect will electricity restructuring have? What is the administration doing to advance restructuring, and when can we expect a proposal?

15* Isn't it true that the Kyoto agreement will inevitably require the US to impose a gasoline tax because it is the only way to reduce overall emissions by the level required?

16* What is the administration's critique of worst-case economic models that suggest compliance costs well over \$100 per ton of carbon, 50 percent increases in gasoline and diesel fuel, doubling of electricity prices, major losses in GDP, and millions of job losses? How do these analyses differ from ones the administration endorses?

17* What does the administration's SGM model (Battelle/Pacific Northwest Labs) show in terms of US economic impacts? Effects of sinks on US baselines? Effects of trading programs on US costs?

18* Isn't it true that the defense exemptions the administration claims to have obtained in Kyoto are dependent on future outside negotiations, and therefore don't really exist? What: Equity in Prescription Insurance and Contraceptive Coverage Act of 1997 (EPICC) and AB 160.

At Issue: If your insurance plan covers antibiotics, hypertension medications and remedies to treat toenail fungus, should it also cover contraceptives?

Many health experts and government representatives say yes. And, after years of discussion and grass-roots campaigning, these two major pieces of legislation are now before federal (EPICC) and state (AB 160) lawmakers that would mandate insurance coverage of contraceptives.

When: Action expected this spring.

What's at Stake: The arguments for these bills are strong. About half of all large-group insurance plans do not routinely cover any contraceptive method, according to the New York-based Center for Reproductive Law and Policy. About one-third of these plans cover oral contraceptives. Only 18% pay for intrauterine devices and 24% cover Norplant. Even some of the companies providing insurance coverage to federal employees and military families withhold contraceptive coverage.

Unintended pregnancy, meanwhile, is a huge and embarrassing problem in the United States. About 1.6 million abortions and 1.5 million births from unintended pregnancies occur annually in the nation--one of the highest rates among Western countries. Research shows that access to contraception reduces the probability of having an abortion by 85%.

The contraceptive -coverage measures are considered cost-effective as well.

A 1996 study concluded that every tax dollar spent for contraceptive services saves an average of \$ 3 in Medicaid funds that would have been spent on prenatal and newborn care.

A similar bill passed the California Legislature in 1995 but was vetoed by Gov. Pete Wilson based on his concerns over the fiscal impact of the measure. Since then, research has been done showing that adding contraceptive coverage would cost businesses about \$ 16 per employee each year. The bill would require insurance companies to add contraception to their prescription packages.

Prospects: In California, AB 160 was not supported recently in a government blue-ribbon commission on HMOs, which could ultimately hurt its chances for enactment. The bill, sponsored by Rep. Robert Hertzberg (D-Van Nuys), is awaiting a vote in the Assembly, where it is thought to have a good chance of passing.

On the federal front, EPICC has been introduced in both houses by sponsors Sen. Olympia Snowe (R-Maine) and Rep. James Greenwood (R-Pa.). The measure is thought to have broad support in the Senate and mixed appeal in the House. A hearing on the measure is expected to be held this spring.

Summary of Bill (Senate version)

S.1050, the World Summit for Children Implementation Act of 1997

There has been much progress made globally over the last decade in reducing child mortality rates. The goal of immunizing 80% of the world's children has been achieved, saving three million children annually. Despite this, millions of children are still dying every year for want of a vaccine costing just a few dollars or a vitamin A capsule costing a few cents. Indeed, 12 million children still die each year from mostly preventable diseases and malnutrition.

At the 1990 World Summit for Children the United States and 158 other nations made a promise to the world's children. In signing the Summit Declaration and Plan of Action, they pledged, by the year 2000, to reduce child death rates by at least one-third, to reduce maternal deaths and child malnutrition by one-half, to provide all children access to basic education, and all families access to clean water, safe sanitation and family planning information and services. In the

declaration they stated, "We are prepared to make available the resources to meet these commitments."

S. 1050, the World Summit for Children Implementation Act (WSCIA) of 1997 provides a vision for our ongoing U.S. response to the Summit goals. The World Summit bill calls for shifting funds within the existing foreign assistance budget to meet the needs of children, without increasing overall foreign assistance. It specifically calls for increased allocations of funds for Child Survival, Basic Education, Vitamin A and other micronutrients, UNICEF, AIDS prevention and care, refugee assistance, Family Planning and has a new section on tuberculosis prevention and treatment programs.

Domestically, the World Summit for Children bill calls for increasing funding of the Special Supplemental Food Program For Women, Infants and Children (WIC), a program which provides supplemental food packages and access to health care to pregnant and nursing mothers and young children, a methodology which has proven its effectiveness in reducing infant mortality, premature births, low birthweight babies and consequently reducing medical costs. This legislation also calls for increased funding for Head Start, a program that provides young children from low-income families comprehensive pre-school, as well as services to address nutrition and health needs. Head Start involves families and helps children start school ready to learn.

To follow are the proposed funding levels for international and domestic programs in the World Summit for Children Implementation Act (Senate) and the amount actually appropriated for FY98.

"Warm greetings to all those commemorating the 25th anniversary of Roe v. Wade. This landmark Supreme Court decision affirmed every woman's right to choose whether and when to have a child and, in doing so, affirmed two of our nation's most deeply held values: personal privacy and family responsibility.

Over the past 25 years, Roe v. Wade has had a major positive impact on the health and well-being of American women and their families. Safe, legal abortion has all but eliminated the dangerous conditions that claimed too many lives when the procedure was illegal. I am committed to keeping abortion safe, legal, and accessible -- and to making it more rare. Over the last five years, we have led the way on policies to prevent unintended pregnancy by making comprehensive family planning programs more widely available. We have dramatically increased support for Title X family planning services, and these efforts have brought real results: both the teen pregnancy rate and the abortion rate are down.

I fought to continue funding for international family planning, bringing much-needed health care to women all around the world. Here at home, by working together with health care professionals, community groups, schools, and family planning agencies, we've made real progress in reducing teen pregnancy. And I was proud to sign

legislation to safeguard the rights Roe established by protecting women's clinics from violence. We have enforced that law to its full extent. I will continue to do everything I can to make sure that every child in America is a wanted child, raised in a loving, strong family. Ultimately, that idea is what the anniversary of Roe v. Wade celebrates.

Hillary and I join all of you in commemorating this milestone and in pledging ourselves anew to protecting the right to choose. Best wishes for a memorable observance."

Anne- Couple of things. In brackets I've denoted which passages need to be changed because the passage of time since we last used this language. Everything else is fine, it just needs to be put in past tense. Also, since there is no longer 1122 pending in Congress, we're not still committed to working with Congress on it. I've changed the language in the past to say "I was disappointed that Congress did not craft a bill that would satisfy these requirements..." or similar such language. Sarah works on "regular" abortion so she can give you the language for that.

Thank you for your letter.

As you know, [last year] I vetoed H.R. 1833, the proposed late-term abortion ban, because Congress would not include a limited exception in the bill for those few but tragic cases in which the procedure is necessary to save the life of a woman or to prevent serious harm to her health; I vetoed H.R. 1122 for the same reason.

I have never contended that this procedure, today, is always used in circumstances falling within this exception. To the contrary, the procedure may well be used in situations where a woman's serious health interests are not at risk. But I do not support such uses, I do not defend them, and, as I have stated

repeatedly, I would sign appropriate legislation banning them.

I know that many believe that any health exception will be so broad that it would negate the ban. That is not the kind of exception I support; instead I am asking for an exception that takes effect only when a woman faces real, serious adverse health consequences. [I remain confident that Congress and this Administration, working together, could craft such an exception, and I regret the failure of recent good-faith efforts to reach a workable compromise.]

I appreciate knowing your concerns on this complex and important issue.

Re: International Family Planning

As we discussed at our meeting 3/6/98, I have gone over statements on International Family Planning by the President and other principals to see & how far we are already on record and what impact these existing statements might have on our ability to negotiate future policy.

The statements were produced by a Lexis/Nexis of WH documents and a request to Mrs Clinton,s office . The selection of quotes used to develop these statement were drawn are attached; the full text of the documents we found is available on request.

The bottom line is two strong positive statements and one that may be problematic: :

-- We are committed to making high quality voluntary family planning and reproductive health care available to every citizen in the world. We know that family planning protects women,s health, strengthens families and children, fights the spread of disease , and prevents abortion and maternal deaths.

-- Because we know that family planning is so important, we have an obligation to work to avoid any delay (or, by extension, diminution) of funds to continue these programs. Any such delay will result in a rise in unintended pregnancies and maternal deaths, and an increase in unsafe abortions.

-- Doctors and medical workers in family planning programs should be able to provide a full range of family planning information

Points 1 and 2 offer the framework both for continued support of family planning and for a possible explanation of why it is so important that we find ways to ensure that these vitally needed programs are continued.

Point 3 is the international corollary to the domestic gag rule. The original Bush administration Gag Rule referred not to lobbying or advocacy, but discussion with patients ; family planning groups argued that their responsibilities to their clients required that they be able to discuss all medical options. Obviously , this is a very different issue in countries in which abortion is illegal.

The increase in Family Planning of \$15 million (from \$203m to \$218m) is not in any way related to the decrease in Adolescent Family Life of \$12 million (from \$17m to \$5m).

HRSA runs an Abstinence Education program, which receives \$50 million in each of fiscal years 1998-2002. This program teaches abstinence education only, and focuses on teens and pre-teens.

Given that HRSA's Abstinence Education program should be fully geared up by FY99 (its second year), a \$12 million reduction is being taken in Adolescent Family Life funding because AFL primarily focuses on promoting abstinence among teens, much like the Abstinence Education program. (AFL is operated by the Office of Population Affairs in HHS' Office of the Secretary.)

AFL is a demonstration authorized in 1981, and the things to be demonstrated have been accomplished by 1998.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

The South Lawn

11:30 A.M. EST

THE PRESIDENT: Good morning. Ladies and gentlemen, as you know, we have postponed the vote in the House of Representatives on renewing fast track authority to strengthen our ability to expand exports through new agreements. I'm disappointed, of course, that this step was necessary because we worked very hard and we're very close to having the requisite number of votes. But early this morning it became clear to me that if the matter were taken to a vote there was a substantial chance that we would not get the votes necessary to pass the bill.

Let me begin by saying a profound word of thanks to Speaker Gingrich and to the leadership team in the House who worked with us on this, and on the Democratic side, to Representatives Fazio and Matsui and the others who were helping them. This was a partnership for the national interests and I am very grateful for what they are doing.

I think most of you know what happened. We have been having a big debate in our party for several years on the question of

trade and its role in our economic future. Even though we clearly have a majority of the Democratic mayors and governors and we had a majority in the Senate, we don't have a majority in the House who agree with the position that I have taken. We worked hard to overcome their objections and we didn't succeed. And because we didn't have more Democratic votes, we then had to get a bigger share of the Republican vote. That brought into play the controversy over international family planning and the so-called Mexico City language.

Had we been able to resolve that, I think we could have gotten enough votes on the Republican side to go with the Democrats' votes we had to pass the bill. Clearly, I think we could have. But we simply were not able to do that. And I say that without undue criticism of anyone. The people who took the position that they could not give their votes to the fast track legislation believe very deeply in principle that we should change our family planning funding. I, on the other hand, believe that it would have been wrong for me to mix the two issues and to compromise what I believe in principle. And in the end this matter could not go forward because of that disagreement.

But what we're going to do now is to regroup a little bit and find a way to succeed, and I think we'll be able to do that. I also know, from my extensive work now in the House that there are a large number of House members who are interested in trying to find some constructive resolution of this matter, and I think we may well be able to do that. I expect that we will successfully press forward with this issue in this Congress and at the appropriate time. So I'm not particularly concerned about the long run; I think we'll be able to prevail.

Today, let me say again, I think it's important that all of us do more to make the case. This country is in good shape. We

have 13.5 million more jobs, we have a 4.7 percent unemployment rate, we know that a third of that growth has come from trade. We know that the countries that are willing to enter into agreements with us in the kinds of areas of agreement that we need to push on a regional and a worldwide basis will lower barriers more in other countries than they will in our country.

But we also know that the benefits of trade are often not seen as directly tied to trade. When a plan expands or a new contract is signed, and whenever a plant closes down, generally it's easy to tie it to trade whether trade had anything to do with it, or not. So we have some more work to do.

But on balance, based on where we are now, I'm quite optimistic that we will ultimately prevail in this Congress. And I'm very pleased again with the good partnership that we had with Speaker Gingrich and the House leadership team and with the Democrats who helped us. And so we're just going to go forward. I think it's clear to everybody that America's leadership in the world depends

upon America's continuing economic leadership, and this, therefore, has to be only a temporary obstacle because, in the end, we always find out a way to do what's right for America, to maintain our leadership and maintain our economic growth.

Q What did you think -- to make a move on Iraq? And how do you assess the situation now?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, first of all, as you know, the United Nations U-2 plane was not fired upon in its flight. But -- and that's a good thing, but it does not change the larger issue which is that the U.N. inspections have been stopped by Saddam Hussein. So the next step is to get a very strong resolution from the United Nations manifesting the determination of the international community to resume those inspections. And that should happen shortly, as the report is made from the people who went to Iraq. And then we will have to go about manifesting that, demonstrating our determination to start those inspections again.

Q Do you have any fear for the safety of those Americans who are in Baghdad? And what kind of unambiguous action did you signal yesterday that you expected out of the Security Council?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, of course, I'm concerned about the Americans. I'm concerned about the other United Nations personnel who are there. I'm concerned about all of them. But, again, I am trying to work with Mr. Butler and with the United Nations on a daily basis to do what seems right and best. And it was the judgment of the United Nations people and Mr. Butler that they ought to stay as long as they had a chance to resume their work, and that they wanted to do that. But I assure you, I'm quite concerned with the safety of all the people that are there on behalf of Americans and on behalf of the world community trying to keep this weapons of mass destruction program from being restarted.

I believe we are considering every aspect of this issue. We spent all weekend working exhaustively on it, and we're going to watch it very carefully in the days ahead.

Q Mr. President, on fast track, you said that the people who decided to vote no on this because they believed in principle about family planning are sincere. Do you think the Democrats who decided to vote no on fast track are sincere, or as you suggested in the past, that, in fact, they're knuckling under to political pressure from labor?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I think some of them are generally opposed to it. I think some of them really do believe that we would

have gotten all the jobs we've gotten and we would be raising incomes and lowering unemployment and growing the economy if we had a more protectionist trade policy, and that we wouldn't have lost any jobs

that have gone away in the economy. I think some of them really believe that. I don't believe that. And I think the evidence is on my side on that argument.

And then I think some of them were, in effect, voting their district, voting their concerns. They're afraid, or concerned, at least, that the trade issue is much misunderstood and easily subject to misunderstanding. Was there some politics in it? Of course, there is. But there's politics in every tough vote that has been held in the Congress and any legislative body in my lifetime. I did not question their integrity; I questioned the judgment, and I do believe that there were some who felt that it was a politically impossible vote, but that the right thing to do was for me to have the authority and go forward, based on my conversations.

What I think we have to do is try to let the temperature go down here and unpack this and go back to what is actually at stake. The Democratic Party, insofar as it is saying that we ought to inject labor issues and environmental issues into our international negotiations as part of our strategy to expand trade and economic partnerships, that is a positive thing. We can disagree about how we should do that, but I think that's a positive contribution of our party.

Insofar as we're saying that we should do more and do it more quickly to help people who do lose their jobs, whether it's from trade or technological changes, or whatever, to start new lives and to resume successful careers, I think that is a positive thing. And what we need to do is sort of unpack the politics and the emotions and the substance and try to go back and put this together in a way that allows us to have a big bipartisan majority in the House for a constructive fast track authority that enables us to move forward on all these fronts. And I think we'll be able to do it.

Q A lot of people are going to say this is the second most serious defeat you've suffered, after health care. Do you feel --

THE PRESIDENT: No, there's a big difference.

Q Do you feel you could have handled it better? Do you think you could have started earlier, or is this just a nut you couldn't crack unless you caved in on Mexico City?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I think in the end -- let me say again, I think in the end we could have passed the bill if the Mexico City thing had been resolved. But I simply couldn't do that. I mean, I just couldn't do it. To me, first of all, I think it's wrong to mix these things. And secondly, I feel as strongly in principle on one side of the issue as the people in the House who otherwise might have voted for fast track do on the other. The prior problem was that we have, as I said, we had -- look at the Senate vote -- we have a majority of Senate Democrats for fast track, a huge majority

of the mayors and governors who are Democrats. We don't have a majority in the House. And I don't know whether -- what we could have done differently.

Let me just say this. I think the bill that's there before them now, had we been able to persuade everybody involved that that bill should have been there months ago, maybe that would have made a difference. But it's easy to second-guess these things. The main thing is -- the difference between this and health care was that health care was all caught up in politics and partisanship in even a more profound way, and there were big vested interests that had a stake in basically performing reverse plastic surgery on the proposal we made, and when it was dead it was dead.

,

,

This is not dead. I will be very surprised if we are not successful in developing a bipartisan, constructive, successful approach to fast track before this Congress is over. This is a big difference here. I feel that this is entirely different. And keep in mind, it's also occurring in a different context. It's occurring in the context of the country doing well, the economy being strong, and the Congress continuing to do productive things.

So I'm going to sign a bill, an appropriations bill that has the biggest increase in education in decades, that funds the America Reads program, our program to put computers in schools, increased scholarships for people going to college, and that makes a huge step toward establishing national academic standards and national testing, something that everything thought was dead just about 10 days ago, and we worked out.

So I'm basically very upbeat as we move toward the break for Thanksgiving and Christmas about the capacity of the Congress to work together and to work with me and to get this done. I wish we'd been able to pass it right now, but I expect it to pass.

Q What about this week? You said this session, but do you mean this year?

Q When? In the spring?

THE PRESIDENT: I'm sorry, what did you say?

Q You said you expect it to pass this session, but what about this year? Any hope this week?

THE PRESIDENT: First of all, we've been up for a couple of days working on fast track and dealing with Iraq, and you will, I hope, understand why we can't make a judgment about that. We will bring it back up at the appropriate time and when we think we can pass it. But we're very close now, under the most burdensome of

circumstances. So all we need is a few breaks to have more than enough votes to pass it. And what I would like to do is to bring it back up at a time when we can pass it with a big vote and a much stronger vote from both parties. And I think there's every chance that we will be able to do that. And I look forward to it and I expect it to happen.

Sorry I was so disorganized over the phone, but I'd been in 2 back to back meetings on equal pay and child care.....I was just moving my head back into Family Planning and couldn't recall the information off the top of my head.....anyway, here it is.....the conf report that passed does the following:

1. bans the performance on abortions but gives POTUS ability to wave this each year but if he does, it will cap the \$\$ to \$356million each year which would be a \$44 million cut
2. Regarding lobbying - it has the standard Chris Smith bill language but broadens it with a Statement of managers that says they can't sponsor a conf. or issue public statements at a conference.

No official letter is going to the Hill today. But Barry T. is taking the Press calls and has been instructed to tell the Press to "Send the bill to us right away so the POTUS can veto and we can get it back up to you".....

But there are other international debates going on today on IMF and NATO.....so WH doesn't want to piss folks off by issuing statement officially today.

Q: Are you concerned that the IMF package won,t get through Congress?

A: I am very concerned that the emergency legislation moving through Congress now does not include funding for the IMF and UN. Our economy is the strongest in the world, but the crisis in Asia poses a threat to American jobs and exports and worldwide economic stability. We have already seen evidence that weaknesses in economies there are having an impact here -- cutting into our ability to export goods to the region and increasing our trade deficit.

To make sure that our economy continues on a path of steady growth, Congress must make sure that the IMF is strong enough to respond to any broadening of the current crisis. And because the IMF functions like an international credit union, paying our share won,t cost American taxpayers a dime.

At the same time, we are deeply concerned that the conference report may not address the matter of United Nations arrears. This failure to pay our dues continues to undercut U.S. leadership in the world. I urge Congress to act now to include both IMF and UN arrears in the emergency bill that is now in conference.

Q: Will you sign the bill if it does not include IMF funding?

A: I have a number of very serious concerns about the supplemental, especially its failure to give the IMF the resources it needs to keep the crisis in Asia from deepening. Right now, I,m focused on doing everything we can to improve the bill.

Q: Why do you need to include IMF funding in the supplemental?

A: We think the supplemental should include funds to pay our share of support to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) as it works to restore

financial confidence and stability to the troubled economies of Asia.

East Asia is a major customer for U.S. goods and services; and if they can't buy, we can't sell. If economies there do not recover, a chain reaction is possible that could undermine economies around the world, including our own. East Asia includes some of our closest allies and friends, including Korea where almost 40,000 U.S. troops are deployed. IMF programs require that recipient countries undertake reforms that reduce the chance of similar financial crisis in the future. Finally, because the IMF acts as a sort of international credit union, its programs have not cost our taxpayers a nickel.

Q: Why are you opposed to having family planning language attached to the supplemental?

A: There are deep convictions on both sides of the family planning debate, which should be settled on its own merits. However, it would do grave harm to U.S. interests to allow such an extraneous debate to sidetrack emergency legislation on matters vital to our nation's well-being.

Dear Mr. Speaker: (Dear Mr. Leader:)

I am writing with respect to the treatment of International Monetary Fund (IMF) and United Nations (UN) funding in the pending supplemental appropriations conference.

I am pleased that both Houses have approved needed funding for domestic disaster relief and defense. I urge Congress to approve this funding as I requested it, without violating the "firewalls" agreed to in last year's balanced budget deal or including objectionable extraneous measures.

However, I am deeply concerned that the conference report may not include the funding I have requested for the IMF. Delay or failure to approve the full IMF requests could undermine our capacity to deal with threats to world economic stability and could leave us unable to protect American workers, farmers, and businesses in the event of an escalation or spread of the Asian financial crisis or a new crisis.

I am also deeply concerned by the possibility that the conference will not include payment of our UN arrears. The failure to provide the full request in this bill could jeopardize our chance to affect negotiations starting in May on lowering U.S. dues and would undermine U.S. leadership in the international community.

Some would link passage of IMF funding and UN arrears to legislation related to international family planning. There are deep convictions on both sides of this debate, which should be settled on its own merits -- and not used to sidetrack other legislation on matters vital to our nation's well-being.

I urge you in the strongest possible terms to include the full requests for the IMF and UN arrears in the bill now in conference.

Tobacco -- The Women's Office hosted a third in a series of meetings with outside women's membership groups to discuss the importance and urgency of their support to affect the likelihood of comprehensive tobacco control legislation being seriously considered. Representatives from the Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids have been present at all of these meetings and have presented a "call to action" to the groups for their support in their efforts to demonstrate to Congress that the health community expects Congress to get the job done.

Child Care - As of Thursday afternoon, the child care advocacy groups were calling and faxing several members of the White House staff urging us to set aside a specific amount of money for child care in the tobacco settlement. They asked that child care not be an "option" on a list for states to choose. As we understand, they have alerted their grassroots throughout the country to call or fax the White House.

Child Custody Protection Act (S.1645) - Republicans held a press conference on Wednesday to kick off their push of this bill which will prohibit taking minors across state lines to avoid laws requiring the involvement of parents in abortion decisions. Internally we met on Thursday with DPC, Counsel, Legislative Affairs and Vice President's Office to determine our response. Justice is reviewing the bill. Hearings are scheduled before the Senate Judiciary Committee on Wednesday and before the House Constitution Subcommittee of Judiciary on Thursday. Senator Kennedy is hopeful that Dept of Justice will serve as one of his witness on Wednesday. We are holding a meeting with the pro-choice groups on Monday afternoon in the Women's Office to hear their strategy.

"Mexico City" - We met with the International Population/Human Rights groups that have been working on the "Mexico City" issue. They requested the meeting to discuss "message." Ann Lewis and Martha Foley also attended. The groups asked that we stress the restrictions on freedom of

speech as being unacceptable as a matter of principle. We pushed back asking them to share their communications strategy for the coming weeks with editorial writers and other media. They asked us to thank you once again for your continued commitment to international family planning programs.

Executive Women in Government -- The Women's Office hosted 80 members of Executive Women in Government (EWG) at a White House briefing in an effort to connect with women who are executives in the Executive, Legislative, and Judicial branches of the Federal Government. They were primarily interested in discussing the issue of the advancement of women in the Federal government and hearing about our achievements in this area, and they were extremely interested in the Administration's commitment to diversity and equal opportunity. These and other issues were addressed by Audrey Tayse Haynes, Bob Nash, Ida Castro, and Lynn Cutler, and detailed packets of information were provided by the Women's Office and the Women's Bureau.

As you know, last week three Florida abortion clinics were the targets of butyric acid attacks. No one was hurt and the clinics were not occupied during the attacks. The attacks occurred late Friday, May 15, and early Saturday, May 16, at the Family Planning Center in Daytona Beach, the Women's Health Center in Daytona Beach and the Central Florida Women's Health Organization in Orlando. In the Daytona Beach attacks, holes were drilled in window frames and the acid was deposited with a syringe. In Orlando, a window was broken and the acid was deposited in a surgery room. All of the clinics were open the following Monday, May 18.

We have received numerous calls from our choice constituency requesting that POTUS issue a statement. In light of increased levels of violence and disruption against providers since 1997, we think a statement would be appropriate. Please advise.

PRESIDENT CLINTON: INCREASING SUPPORT FOR FAMILY PLANNING

January 22, 1998

" I will continue to do everything I can to make sure that every child in America is a wanted child, raised in a loving, strong family. Ultimately, that is the idea the anniversary of Roe v. Wade celebrates."

President Bill Clinton
January 22, 1998

Today, marks the 25th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the landmark Supreme Court decision that affirmed every woman's right to choose whether and when to have a child. President Clinton is committed to ensuring this right, and in doing so, to protecting two of our nation's most deeply-held values, personal privacy and family responsibility.

PREVENTION AND FAMILY PLANNING. During the last five years, the Administration has worked hard to reduce the need for abortions and to prevent unintended pregnancy by making comprehensive family planning and sex education programs more widely available. The President's FY 1999 budget calls for:

- **Increased Funding for Title X.** The proposal will increase Title X Family Planning grants by \$15 million -- a 46% increase since FY1992.
- **Medicaid and Other Services.** The proposal will provide almost \$500 million in federal funds to Medicaid to support family planning services. Additionally, the Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, the Social Services Block Grant, and the Preventive Health Block Grant will provide \$100 million to state and local communities for family planning services.
- **Prevention Education and Research.** The proposal will provide about \$200 million for the National Institutes of Health's research on infertility, contraception, and related matters, and CDC's programs to educate teenagers about sexual development and abstinence. Additionally, Health and Human Service's teen pregnancy prevention and related youth programs will continue to engage the Girl Power! education initiative in sustained efforts to promote pregnancy prevention among girls 9- to 14-years-old.

A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO FAMILY PLANNING. Under the President's proposal nearly 5 million clients each year at more than 4,700 family planning clinics nationwide, would have access to a comprehensive set of family planning services including contraceptive services, pregnancy testing, sexually transmitted disease screening and treatment, and education and outreach.

SUPPORTING INTERNATIONAL FAMILY PLANNING. The Administration is strongly committed to international family planning efforts. The President has blocked several Congressional attempts to prohibit funding for international family planning groups that use their own funding to lobby on behalf of abortion rights or perform abortions. Under the President's Budget, bilateral assistance provided through AID and assistance to the United Nations Population Fund will grow to \$425 million in FY 1999, a 32% increase over FY 1992.

PRESIDENT CLINTON: GROWING THE NEW ECONOMY INTO THE 21st CENTURY

March 6, 1998

"The American economy has added more than 15 million new jobs since I took office, while inflation has remained low and stable. We continue to have the strongest economy in a generation, and we are on track to have the longest peacetime expansion in the history of this country."

Today, President Clinton announces that the American economy continues to grow: another 310,000 new jobs were created last month, real wages continued to rise, and unemployment fell to 4.6% -- the lowest level in a quarter century. To increase opportunity in this new economy, President Clinton is calling on Congress to create a G.I. Bill for workers that would create a network of One-Stop career centers and empower people to gain skills that are in greatest market demand.

THE STRONGEST ECONOMY IN A GENERATION. President Clinton's three-part economic strategy -- cutting the deficit, investing in our people, opening new markets to American goods and services -- is working for America's families. Since 1993 it has helped bring about:

- **The lowest unemployment level in 25 years.** In 1992, the unemployment rate was 7.5 percent. Today, the unemployment rate is 4.6 percent -- its lowest level since 1973;
- **More than 15 million new jobs.** Since President Clinton took office, the economy has added more than 15 million new jobs -- with two million new jobs in manufacturing and construction combined;
- **An increase in family income of nearly \$2,200.** Real wages are rising at their fastest pace in 20 years and a typical family's income is up nearly \$2,200 since 1993, when adjusted for inflation;
- **Opportunity for more Americans to share in the benefits of the new economy.** Under President Clinton, the African-American unemployment rate has fallen from 14.1 percent to 9.7 percent, and the Hispanic unemployment rate has dropped from 11.3 percent to 6.8 percent -- as low as it's ever been. But much work remains, since these unemployment rates are above the national average.

EXPANDING OPPORTUNITY IN THE NEW ECONOMY. Two keys to expanding opportunity in the new economy are education and job training. Through HOPE Scholarships, Lifetime Learning Tax Credits, Education IRAs, expanded Pell Grant scholarships and cheaper student loans, the President has helped open the doors of college to all Americans who want to pursue learning and upgrade their skills. Now, President Clinton is working to improve elementary and secondary schools by raising standards, reducing class sizes, improving teaching, enhancing discipline and increasing accountability. President Clinton is also working to reform the job training and adult and vocational education systems, calling for a G.I. Bill for workers that will:

- Empower individuals, providing Americans seeking training with Skills Grants, report cards to inform consumers' choices, and universal access to core services like job-search assistance;
- Streamline services, creating a nationwide system of One-Stop Career Centers (centers that consolidate multiple training and employment programs at the "street level");
- Enhance accountability, requiring training providers to be certified. Performance measures will include rates of job retention, earnings, and job placement;

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Increase flexibility, allowing states and local areas to implement innovative job-training programs.

**PRESIDENT CLINTON:
IMPROVING THE HEALTH OF AMERICAN FAMILIES**

March 9, 1998

"Although medical technology is ever-changing, the values of your profession -- the Hippocratic Oath -- are everlasting. We face a choice, as we walk together into the future, whether to widen the circle of access and extend the opportunity of new treatments to all American families. If we keep in mind the values you were taught and continue to uphold, then we will have a healthier America, and a stronger America, in the 21st century."

Today, President Clinton is the first President to address the American Medical Association (AMA) in 15 years. In his remarks he calls on Congress to pass a Patients' Bill of Rights, comprehensive tobacco legislation to reduce teen tobacco use, and a proposal to allow hundreds of thousands of Americans ages 55 to 65 to buy into Medicare.

URGING CONGRESS TO PASS LEGISLATION GUARANTEEING A PATIENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS. The nation's health care system is undergoing significant change. Many Americans worry that these changes may reduce their health care options and lower the standards of care. A Patients' Bill of Rights would provide Americans much needed protections, including:

- Guaranteed access to needed health care providers to ensure that patients are provided appropriate high quality care;
- Access to emergency services when and where the need arises;
- Confidentiality of medical records to ensure that individually identifiable medical information is not disseminated and to provide consumers the right to access and amend their own medical records; and,
- Grievance and appeals processes for consumers to resolve their differences with their health plans and health care providers.

RELEASING A NEW REPORT UNDERSCORING THE BIPARTISAN SUPPORT FOR THE PATIENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS. In today's event the President releases a report showing that 44 states -- including 28 states with Republican governors -- have enacted at least one of the provisions in the Patients' Bill of Rights. To ensure that all health plans serving Americans provide the protections envisioned by the Quality Commission, we must pass and enact bipartisan Federal legislation.

CALLING ON CONGRESS TO PASS COMPREHENSIVE TOBACCO LEGISLATION. A recent study concluded that the Administration's proposal to increase the price of cigarettes by \$1.50 per pack, coupled with proposed sales and advertising restrictions, would keep up to 1.9 million Americans from smoking 2003, sparing as many as 1 million of today's young people from premature deaths resulting from smoking-related diseases. The President is proposing tobacco legislation that includes five key principles:

- A comprehensive plan to reduce youth smoking;
- Full authority of the Food and Drug Administration to regulate tobacco products;
- Changes in how the tobacco industry does business, including an end to marketing and promotion to children;
- Progress towards other public goals, including a reduction of secondhand smoke; promotion of cessation programs; public health research; and the strengthening of international efforts to control tobacco;
- Protection for tobacco farmers and their communities.

URGING CONGRESS TO PASS HIS TARGETED PROPOSAL TO EXPAND ADEQUATE, AFFORDABLE HEALTH COVERAGE. The President has a carefully-targeted, fiscally-responsible proposal that would allow hundreds of

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thousands of vulnerable Americans to gain access to more affordable health care coverage by: allowing Americans ages 62 to 65 to buy into the Medicare program; allowing displaced workers age 55 and over a similar buy-in option; and allowing Americans 55 and over who have lost their retiree health benefits to buy into their former employers' health plan.

**PRESIDENT CLINTON:
QUALITY CHILD CARE FOR OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE**

"With more families relying on two incomes or working longer hours to make ends meet, millions of children must spend time in care away from their parents. For them, child care is not just an option, it's a necessity. No parent should have to choose between the job they need and the child they love."

Today, President Clinton calls for action making child care better, safer, and more affordable for America's working families. In a speech in Connecticut, the President issues an executive directive to improve federally-sponsored child care, and announces the release of a new report by HHS which reveals a pressing need for greater child care investment.

THE CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT: REPORT OF STATE PLANS released today outlines strategies that the states have developed to administer the Child Care and Development Block Grant and meet the pressing child care needs of working families. The report reveals that because of resource constraints, most states have insufficient funds to subsidize all the families meeting their eligibility requirements. The President's Child Care Initiative addresses the need for more resources and builds on innovation in the states and makes an historic investment -- more than \$20 billion over five years -- to help working families pay for child care, build the supply of after-school programs, improve child care safety and quality, and promote early learning.

ENSURING AFFORDABLE, ACCESSIBLE, SAFE CHILD CARE. The President's child care initiative responds to the struggles our nation's working parents face in finding child care they can afford, trust and rely on. The initiative:

- **Makes child care more affordable for working families.** The initiative invests \$7.5 billion over five years to double the number of children receiving child care subsidies to more than two million by the year 2003. The initiative also invests \$4.8 billion over five years to increase tax credits for child care for three million families and provides a new tax credit for businesses that offer child care services to their employees at a cost of \$500 million over five years.
- **Improves the safety and quality of child care.** The initiative: steps up enforcement of state health and safety standards in child care settings, facilitates background checks on child care providers, increases scholarships and training for child care providers, and invests in child care research and evaluation.
- **Increases access to and promotes early learning and healthy child development.** The initiative includes \$3 billion over five years to establish an Early Learning Fund that helps local communities improve the quality and safety of child care for children ages zero to five. The initiative also increases investment in Head Start and doubles the number of children served by Early Head Start to 80,000.
- **Expands access to safe after-school care.** The initiative increases the 21st Century Learning Center Program by \$800 million over five years to provide after-school care for up to half a million children a year.

ENSURING THE QUALITY OF THE FEDERAL CHILD CARE SYSTEM. The President believes that the federal government should lead the way in improving the child care it sponsors for its employees. The executive directive President Clinton issues today instructs all executive agencies to:

- Reach 100% national accreditation of federally-sponsored child care by the year 2000;
- Ensure proper background checks on child care workers in federally-sponsored child care;
- Explore public-private partnerships to improve child care quality and affordability; and
- Ensure that all federal workers have full information on child care benefits and options available to them.

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
