PLANNED PARENTHOOD CONFERENCE  
ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI  
DECEMBER 4, 1998

Thank you Gloria for that introduction. And thank you, in particular, for your many years of service on this issue. You have always been at the forefront of this battle and your leadership is an important reason why we are where we are today.

I would also like to acknowledge Sharon Allison, Chairman of the Board of Directors for Planned Parenthood and Jane Mitchell, Chairman of the Board of Directors for the St. Louis Region, as well as Alderman Phyllis Young who joins us today.

Almost 26 years ago, the Supreme Court,s ruling on Roe V. Wade upheld a woman,s right to choose. Today, we can celebrate the fact that that ruling and that right are still intact. And we can thank Planned Parenthood, Gloria Feldt and all of the individuals who have worked so tirelessly for so many years to protect that right.

But as each of you know all too well, this is no time to rest on our efforts. A quarter of a century after the Roe V. Wade decision, we are still having to vigorously defend a woman,s right to choose.

Those who oppose abortion have fought for many years to take it away -- they have fought with words and with legal challenges. They have tried to chip away at the foundations that uphold this right -- by withholding information on abortion procedures, by blocking access to clinics, by targeting individual procedures, by intimidating those who provide safe abortions, even, sometimes, resorting to violence and murder.

Let me say a word about the recent acts of violence that have swept our nation. There is no logic that justifies these killings. The American people cannot and will not tolerate these acts of cowardice. In the words of my husband: "We Americans resolve our differences with civilized discussion and spirited debate and elections and constitutional processes not with pipe bombs, hand grenades and instruments of hate."

And all of us know that, embedded in our Constitution and affirmed by the highest court in our land, there is one basic truth which cannot be denied -- and that is every woman,s right to decide what is the most difficult and intimate decision she can make -- and that is the choice of whether she will or will not be a mother.

It is not a choice made lightly. Nor should it be. But it is today and

should forever be a personal, medical decision that is made by the individual -- not the courts, not the Congress, but the individual.

After more than 25 years of debate, I think most Americans have reached a new level of understanding on this issue -- an understanding that we must support and defend a woman's right to choose while at the same time agreeing that this is a choice we hope women will never have to make. And the best way to make abortion less necessary is through the support and promotion of family planning services. Through family planning we can help fewer women face this decision and raise the quality of life for those babies who are brought into this world.

This Administration understands this and has proven that the best way to reduce the number of abortions performed is to reduce the number of unwanted pregnancies. For the last six years, the Clinton-Gore Administration has steadily increased funding for a wide range of family planning programs.

In the Fiscal Year 1999 Omnibus Appropriations Act, the President won an increase of \$12 million over 1998 for family planning services and Title Ten Family planning grants. And as many of you know, that increase in the context of the first balanced budget in a generation is a significant victory.

The budget also contained an important policy break-through on reproductive choice. The final bill requires the federal employees health benefits plans to cover contraceptive drugs, covering approximately 1.2 million women of childbearing age. Until now, only 19% of federal health plans covered prescriptive contraceptives and 10% of the plans offered no coverage at all. The Republican Leadership of the Congress tried to remove this measure, but with the help of our pro-choice friends in Congress, we were able to remain firm on this provision.

On international family planning, the Administration fought against the so-called "Mexico City" policy, a provision that would have denied U.S. funds to international family planning organizations that use their own resources to perform abortions or lobby on abortion policy. The Mexico City restrictions were also included in the Foreign Affairs Reform and Restructuring Act. President Clinton vetoed this legislation because it contained these unacceptable restrictions.

These policies run counter to years of Republican cutbacks on family planning investments -- in 1981 alone, family planning funds were cut by 25%. How can we not invest in education and family planning that teaches the value of abstinence and the risk of unprotected sex? How can we not provide women with counseling and contraception that will prevent unwanted pregnancies?

The facts are clear. Nearly half of all pregnancies in America are unplanned and more than half of unplanned pregnancies end in abortion. Between 1987 and 1994, our nation showed a 16% decrease in unintended pregnancies due to increased use of contraceptives. The birth rate for teenagers aged 15-19 has now dropped for six years in a row. Why?

Because of your efforts and the commitment of this Administration to family planning. The result: fewer abortions, fewer unwanted pregnancies, fewer children born to parents unwilling or unable to provide for them. This is a great victory that we can all celebrate. And we can all resolve to spread this message. Because it is important to understand that these policies are a direct result of what we, the people mandate on election day. If we want to maintain our freedom of choice, we must vote our concern. There is perhaps no other issue more directly linked to our say in the polls than this one.

When the Supreme Court decided Roe v. Wade nearly 26 years ago, the vote was 7 to 2. Twenty years later, that majority had shrunk to 5 to 4. The election of Bill Clinton and Al Gore brought us two Supreme Court appointments. Can you imagine where that majority would stand today if our President were not pro-choice?

And let me say this in closing: President and Mrs. Clinton and my husband, Vice President Gore, join me today in thanking you for all you have done to help preserve freedom of choice for our nation,s women. It has not been an easy road -- we know. But we also want you to know that we are with you every step of the way.

Media Strategy -- Roe v. Wade Anniversary:

Here are materials we hope will help you with media outreach for the 26th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision, which is January 22. At the bottom of this e-mail, you'll find a sample press release for use with any Roe events you have planned, and an op-ed.

The violence and threats aimed at abortion providers will likely be the lead theme of this year's Roe coverage. The annual PPFA Chronicle of Clinic Violence and Harassment (which was sent to you on January 11 and should arrive today) will be useful with reporters. Dr. Slepian's murder is still very recent, and this month also brings the first anniversary of the Alabama bombing. A verdict in the Oregon "Wanted Poster" trial is also likely to happen on or close to the Roe anniversary (for more info on the case, see Roger Evans' recent e-mail -- copied for you again at the bottom of this message).

Given this environment, we will lead with the theme of anti-choice violence, addressing the issue with information and analysis, and then work to move the media's focus to other themes. Specifically:  
The central place choice should have in the spectrum of rights  
The need for abortion access for all

The important preventive strategies outlined in the Responsible Choices Action

Agenda.

Our effort will, in fact, be part of our broader Responsible Choices work to change the social climate.

To make sure our message and presence is felt, PPFA will place a number of paid ads in the national media, all using the "coat hanger" theme of the recent PEP (Pro-Choice Education Project) ads. PPFA ads will appear on the op-ed page of the New York Times, in Roll Call, and possibly in USA Today and the on-line magazine Salon. PPFA is also working to finalize and place two different op-eds (we will circulate copies shortly) in national newspapers and/or magazines, and working with national columnists and reporters on Roe coverage.

Our messages for Roe activities are:

Everyone must stand united against the terrorist campaign aimed at abortion providers.

Safe, legal abortion saves women's lives. The ability to determine whether and

when to become a mother is central to women's health. The right to choose birth

control and abortion are central human rights. We must protect access to health

services or the right to choose becomes meaningless.

More Americans are making responsible choices when it comes to sexual health -

we need politicians to make responsible choices, too. Rates of unintended pregnancy and teen pregnancy are dropping significantly as more Americans use

birth control and use it well. It is time for Congress to stop the divisive

battles over abortion and unite to promote family planning and responsible sex

education.

Lastly, we will blend in information from the Alan Guttmacher Institute's report

on unintended pregnancy and abortion (embargoed until January 21) into our writing and media work.

Finally, here is the previous e-mail from Roger Evans on the Oregon "Wanted Poster" case:

As many of you have surely heard, our lawsuit against the American Coalition of Life Activists (ACLA) started on Thursday, January 7. I write to update you on the trial and to explain the "gag order" which has prevented us from commenting on the case.

#### I. The trial.

The case is named Planned Parenthood of the Columbia/Wilamette et al v. ACLA. The names of the other plaintiffs and defendants is at the end of this message. The trial is before a jury in federal court in Portland, Oregon. The trial is expected to end on January 21 or 22 or 25.

We are claiming that the Deadly Dozen poster issued by ACLA in January 1995, the Wanted Poster of Robert Crist issued by ACLA in August 1995, and the Nuremberg Files website posted by ACLA in early 1997 each constitute threats under the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act (FACE). We are also claiming that the posters and website are violations of the Racketeer Influenced Corrupt Organizations Act (RICO).

To prevail, we must persuade the jury that the posters and website were issued in a context where a reasonable person would foresee that they would be interpreted by the plaintiffs as a serious expression of an intent to inflict bodily harm or death.

You should recall that similar Wanted style posters were issued (we do not know by whom) shortly before the assassinations of Drs. Gunn and Britton in Florida in 1993 and 1994. Following these killings, ACLA was formed as the umbrella for those in the anti-choice movement who were prepared to endorse violence against abortion providers as "justified." ACLA members appeared regularly in the mainstream media and in the media of the religious political

extremists advancing this message. ACLA's first Wanted style poster, the Deadly Dozen list, was issued just weeks after the shootings of two clinic workers in Brookline, Massachusetts.

We believe that we can persuade a jury that, in context, the posters and the website should be understood and were understood as messages to the identified doctors: if you continue to provide abortions, you risk the same fate as Doctors Gunn and Britton.

## II. The gag order

In order to prevent the parties from making statements in the media that would affect the jurors, the judge issued a gag order applicable to the parties, the attorneys, and anyone acting as an agent of the parties or the attorneys. The gag order extends through the conclusion of the trial, and forbids statements to the media.

Thus, because I am one of the attorneys for the plaintiffs and PPCW is the lead-plaintiff, neither PPFA nor PPCW has made statements to the media about this case. Moreover, although I believe the gag order is probably unconstitutional, the team of attorneys representing the plaintiffs made a strategic decision not to challenge the gag order and to interpret its application broadly. Thus, we are asking affiliates also to refrain from commenting in the media until the conclusion of the trial.

We will, however, send to affiliates an update with our best guess as to when the trial will conclude and talking points to enable you to be able to comment fully on the outcome of the trial.

## HEALTH CARE

### Addressing Growing Long-Term Care Needs

Over five million Americans, most of whom are elderly, have significant limitations due to illness or disability and thus require long-term care. The aging of Americans will only increase the need for quality long-term care options: by 2030, the number of elderly Americans will have doubled, so that one in five Americans will be elderly. President Clinton has proposed an historic new \$6.2 billion initiative to support elderly and disabled Americans with long-term care needs and the millions of family members who care for them. This initiative includes over five years a \$5.5 billion investment in a \$1,000 tax credit to compensate for the cost of long-term care services; a new \$625 million National Family Caregiver Program; a \$10 million national campaign for FY 2000 to educate Medicare beneficiaries about long-term care options; and \$15 million to allow the Federal government to offer long-term care insurance to its employees at group rates.

### The Potential of New Biomedical Research

Advances in biomedical research have captured the imagination of all Americans, with scientists now poised to make advances that could revolutionize the way we treat diseases. The President's new \$320 million investment in NIH will allow us to make progress in preventing the complications of diabetes, combating diseases associated with aging, like Alzheimers and Parkinson's, and developing vaccines for tuberculosis, malaria, and AIDS.

### Protecting Patients through a Strong, Enforceable Patients Bill of Rights

Once again, the President is calling on Congress to pass a strong federally enforceable patients, bill of rights. This Health Care Bill of Rights should contain a range of protections, including guaranteed access to needed specialists, access to emergency room services when and where the need arises, access to a meaningful independent and external appeals process for consumers to resolve differences with their health plans, and the right to be compensated when a health plan's decision causes a patient to be harmed or die. The President is already doing everything he can to implement these protections, by extending them to the 85 million

Americans covered by Federal health plans.

### Protecting Privacy of Medical Records

The President is challenging the Congress to pass strong bipartisan legislation to protect the privacy of medical records. The President also pledged that if Congress does not pass this legislation this summer, he will take action to implement protections for electronic medical records under the authority given to him by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.

### Encouraging Small Businesses to Purchase Health Insurance

Many small businesses cannot offer health insurance because of their higher administrative costs and premiums relative to large businesses. As a result, workers in small firms are less likely to have access to affordable, job-based health insurance. Nearly half of uninsured workers are in firms with fewer than 25 employees (relative to 30 percent of all workers). The President is proposing a new \$44 million initiative to encourage small businesses to offer health insurance to their workers by developing and/or joining coalitions for purchasing health insurance. This three-part initiative would provide a tax credit to small businesses that decide to offer coverage by joining coalitions; encourage private foundations to support coalitions by allowing their contributions towards these organizations to be tax exempt; and offering technical assistance to new small business coalitions.

### Providing New Options for Americans Ages 55 to 65 to Obtain Health Insurance

Americans ages 55 to 65 are one of the fastest growing groups of uninsured Americans. They are also extremely difficult to insure: they have less access to and a greater risk of losing employer-based health insurance; and they are twice as likely to have health problems as the population generally. The President's \$1.4 billion proposal gives this vulnerable population three new ways to gain access to health insurance by: (1) allowing Americans ages 62 to 65 to buy into Medicare, through a mechanism that preserves the Medicare trust fund; (2) assisting vulnerable displaced workers 55 and over by offering those who have involuntarily lost their jobs and health care coverage a similar Medicare buy-in option; and (3) giving Americans 55 and over who have lost their retiree benefits access to their former employers, health insurance.

### Improving Economic Opportunities for Americans With Disabilities

Since President Clinton and Vice President Gore took office, the American economy has added 17.7 million new jobs. However, the unemployment rate among working-age adults with disabilities is still nearly 75 percent. People with disabilities can bring tremendous energy and talent to the American workforce, yet institutional barriers often limit their ability to work. The President's budget proposes a historic new \$2 billion initiative that removes significant barriers to work for people with disabilities. It includes the Work Incentives Improvement Act, which invests \$1.2 billion in providing options for workers with disabilities to buy into Medicaid and Medicare; a new \$700 million investment in a \$1,000 tax credit for workers with disabilities; and more than double the government's current investment, an increase of \$35 million, in assistive technologies that make it possible for individuals with disabilities to

work.

#### Improving Health Care Access for Uninsured Workers

This new initiative invests \$1 billion over 5 years in local communities to integrate providers that traditionally provide services to the uninsured, such as public hospitals and clinics, into networks that provide a comprehensive range of services to uninsured people. Providers will receive funds to develop the financial, information, and telecommunication systems necessary to monitor and manage patient needs, as well as funds to expand the range of services they deliver.

#### Providing Critical Mental Health Prevention and Treatment Services

Approximately 44 million adults and 14 million children suffer from a mental disorder each year. The Clinton/Gore Administration's new FY 2000 budget includes a \$70 million increase -- the largest ever -- in the mental health block grant. This 24 percent increase, totaling \$358 million, will enable states to enhance and expand their efforts to assist people with mental illnesses, by targeting particularly-hard-to-reach adults and children with severe mental illnesses, improving school violence abatement programs, helping states provide new effective medications for people with mental illnesses, and providing services to older Americans who are reluctant to reach mental health services in traditional mental health settings. This spring, the Administration will also hold the first ever White House Conference on Mental Health.

#### Protecting Our Children From Tobacco

Every day, 3000 children become regular smokers and 1000 have their lives shortened because of it. Almost 90 percent of adult smokers began smoking by age 18 and today 4.5 million children -- 37 percent of all high school students -- smoke cigarettes. The state tobacco settlement is an important step in the right direction, but the President believes additional measures must be taken to reduce youth smoking and hold the tobacco industry accountable: 1) raise the price of cigarettes, so fewer young people start to smoke; 2) reaffirm the Food and Drug Administration's full authority to keep cigarettes out of the hands of children; 3) fund critical public health efforts to prevent youth smoking and hold the tobacco industry accountable for reducing youth smoking; and 4) protect farmers and farming communities. The President's budget will use all the funds resulting from this plan to help reimburse the federal government for its annual tobacco-related health costs.

#### Largest Increase in Family Planning Grants in 15 Years

The President's FY 2000 budget proposal will call for a substantial increase in Title X Family Planning grants, which helps provide women with vital services, including contraception, pregnancy testing, STD screening and treatment. Further details of this increase will be announced later this week.

These stories and quotes are from the A Tradition of Choices which is Planned Parenthood's 75th anniversary book. I know we can't use too much from Planned Parenthood, but I thought some of this might be helpful.

"The doctor told me I was too weak to have children. He doesn't want me to have any for a while but what shall I do? He won't tell me how not to have any. So I thought I would ask you if you know of any way....Please try to help me if you can. I would be ever so thankful and I am asking only for the sake of these little ones so that I can bring them up halfway decent." -- Letter received by the American Birth Control League in the 1920s.

In the 1920s birth control advocates across the country started clinics in their own communities. Denver activists, for instance began a shoestring operation in 1926 (forerunner to today's Planned Parenthood of the Rocky Mountains) which by 1990 was serving nearly 60,000 individuals annually. Operating just once a week in a borrowed room in a church, the original Denver clinic had almost no money and was run by the efforts of volunteers. They arose at 6am to escort poor women to the clinic and care for their families, which typically included 12 or more children. According to a 1979 account, "Only loyalty, courage and imagination kept the idea and work afloat because these women encountered continual opposition and ridicule"

In 1930, the South's first birth control clinic was founded in Birmingham, Alabama by pediatrician Dr. Clifford Lamar and obstetrician Dr. Lee Turlington. After just three days, religious opponents had the clinic removed from its original site in a hospital. It reopened almost immediately in the waiting room of a public health tuberculosis clinic, where family planning patients were seen in the afternoon.

"I am writing to inquire the locations of birth control clinics located near here. Mrs. and I were married December 22nd during a furlough of mine....As an enlisted man I do not receive enough money to sustain a household by myself, let alone to have children. The only reason Mrs. and myself will be able to live together is her having a position as teacher in a nearby high school. During my service in the army I have had occasion several times to witness the utter despair of men who trusted the hearsay methods of contraception on learning that their wives were to have children." -- Letter reprinted in the PPFA newsletter, June 19, 1944

## Combating Clinic Violence

In the wake of escalating violence against women's health clinics that provide abortions, the President's FY 2000 budget will include \$4.5 million to support additional security for these clinics and their doctors and nurses. Under this proposal, the Department of Justice would make security assessments and enhancements available to clinics deemed to be at high risk of violence.

Security enhancements to improve safety and better protect health care providers and their patients may include closed circuit camera systems, improved lighting, motion detectors, alarm systems or bullet-resistant windows.

In recent years, violence against women's health care clinics has intensified. Most recently, Dr. Bernard Slepian was fatally shot through the window of his home. His death followed four non-fatal shootings in western New York and Canada over the last four years. In addition to shootings, between May and July of this year, about 20 health care clinics in three states were splattered with isobutyric acid, and two clinics in North Carolina were the victims of arson and attempted bombings. Clinics in Indiana, Tennessee, Kansas and Kentucky received letters that falsely claimed to contain anthrax.

This FY 2000 budget proposal builds on the Justice Department's National Task Force on Violence Against Health Care Providers announced on November 9 to coordinate the investigation of violence against women's health care clinics nationwide. The Task Force has begun working closely with local authorities and U.S. Attorneys investigating acts of violence against clinics by: coordinating national investigative efforts; creating an investigative clearinghouse for information related to clinic violence; and providing training to federal, state and local law enforcement personnel. A key missing piece in preventing clinic violence is funding for greater security. The Task Force, given its expertise on clinic violence, will serve as an advisor in the administration of these funds.

Unintended pregnancies among women who do not use contraception are almost as likely to end in abortion as they are in a birth.

**NEW INITIATIVE TO PROVIDE SAFE, EFFECTIVE FAMILY PLANNING SERVICES FOR AMERICAN WOMEN.** This new initiative reaffirms the Clinton-Gore Administration's commitment to expanding and enhancing the quality of reproductive health services for all American women. Today, the First Lady and Vice President announced the Administration:

- **Unveiled the Largest Increase in Family Planning Services in 15 Years.** The **Clinton/Gore Administration's** FY 2000 budget includes \$240 million for family planning, a \$25 million increase, and the largest increase in 15 years. These grants fund family planning clinics providing reproductive health services and clinical care to over 5 million low income women. These new funds will be used to improve the delivery of comprehensive reproductive health services, including STD and cancer screening and prevention, and HIV prevention, education and counseling; provide educational programs that encourage adolescents to postpone of sexual activity; increase the accessibility of contraceptive counseling and services; increase efforts to provide effective contraceptives to those in need; and develop partnerships with other community based providers to conduct outreach to adolescents at risk.
- **Ensuring that Federal employees have access to comprehensive family planning services.** The FY 2000 budget also continues to ensure that the Federal government leads the way as a model health plan by assuring that Federal employees and their families participating in the 300 Federal Employees Health Benefit Program (FEHBP) have access to contraceptive coverage. This policy provides coverage to approximately 1.2 million women of childbearing age and reduces unwanted pregnancies and the need for abortions by requiring most FEHB plans to offer the full range of contraceptive services. Before this requirement, only 19% of federal health plans covered prescription contraceptives and 10% of the plans offered no contraceptive coverage at all.

- **Preventing violence at women’s health clinics.** While emphasizing the importance of family planning services to prevent unintended pregnancies, the Vice President and First Lady also emphasized that those women who choose to have an abortion do not have to fear violence. In the wake of escalating violence against women’s health clinics that provide abortions, the Administration’s budget includes \$4.5 million to support additional security enhancements, including closed circuit camera systems, improved lighting, motion detectors, alarm systems or bullet-resistant windows for these clinics in order to protect their doctors and nurses. Under this proposal, the Department of Justice would make security assessments and enhancements available to clinics deemed to be at high risk of violence.

**BUILDING ON LONGSTANDING COMMITMENT TO PROVIDING SAFE, HIGH QUALITY FAMILY PLANNING SERVICES.** The new steps the First Lady and the Vice President took today build on the Administration’s longstanding commitment to provide American women with safe, high quality family planning services and assure access to choice.

- **Providing family planning services to low income women.** The Administration has granted Medicaid waivers to expand access to family planning services in 11 states in order to reduce the number of women with mistimed or unwanted pregnancies. These waivers extend family planning services to low-income women of childbearing age who would not otherwise be eligible for Medicaid family planning services, including low-income women who are eligible for Medicaid while pregnant but who lose their eligibility at the end of pregnancy, and low-income women who would become eligible for Medicaid if pregnant, even if they’ve never been pregnant or Medicaid eligible.
- **Creating of the National Task Force on Violence Against Health Care Providers.** Last November, the Justice Department’s launched a National Task Force on Violence Against Health Care Providers to coordinate the investigation of violence against women’s health care clinics nationwide. The Task Force works closely with local authorities and U.S. Attorneys investigating acts of violence against clinics by: coordinating national investigative efforts; creating an investigative clearinghouse for information related to clinic violence; and providing training to federal, state and local law enforcement personnel.
- **Defeated Parental Consent Restrictions on Contraceptives for Minors.** The House voted to require minors to obtain parental consent prior to receiving any Title X family planning services (this has also been referred to as the Istook amendment). The President’s veto threat helped to keep it out of the final bill.
- **Stopped the Coburn Amendment Which Would Have Prohibited the FDA from Approving RU-486.** On January

22, 1993, President Clinton reversed the ban on the importation of RU-486, which is currently under review by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). President Clinton threatened to veto a provision that would have prevented the FDA from using government funds to test, develop or approve drugs that may induce medical abortion, including RU-486. Because of the President's veto threat, Republicans backed down and did not attach this provision to any funding bill.

Here is the paragraph on family planning from FPA speech 10/19/98. The whole speech is available on the H drive under transcripts for the month of October.

We also won more funding for the Peace Corps, another important symbol of American engagement. Yet our nation's foreign policy agenda also suffered losses. Once again, Congress refused to pay our debts to the United Nations, whose work is essential to peace and stability in our world. That issue of paying our UN arrears remains entangled in the issue of family planning overseas. I respect those who in good faith are against family planning. But that is not an issue to be entangled with whether or not we fulfill our obligations to the United Nations. We should not and we cannot continue to fail to pay our dues because of this unrelated issue. It should be unacceptable to all Americans, of any political persuasion, that the richest and most powerful country in the world is the number one debtor to the United Nations.

We also suffered another defeat. Not one dime went to the United Nations International Family Planning Program. I don't know how we could best make this argument persuasively with those who, for both political and personal reasons, oppose family planning and use it to undermine our capacity to pay our arrears to the United Nations. But I have personally been in clinics all over the world, from the Ukraine to Uzbekistan? and Kazakhstan and Russia, where family planning is not only helping women gain authority and dignity in their own lives, but is actually decreasing the abortion rate. So this is an argument that has no inherent logic to it. By refusing to fund decent family planning services, we force women to fall back on abortion as the family planning choice. So I would hope that the Congress, when they reconvene, will once again visit that issue.

2. World Health Assembly, 5/14/98

In Bolivia, I visited with expectant mothers at a primary health center run by an NGO with support from the government. They had created a safe place for very poor women to come and get health care. The women -- with their ruddy faces and bowler hats -- were receiving prenatal checkups and having their infant immunized on the day that I visited. They were also learning about family planning and how to space births so they could more likely have their children survive, and themselves.

At a small clinic in Nepal, I saw a safe home-delivery kit that is given to expectant mothers. Inside is a bar of soap, twine, wax, a plastic sheet, and a razor blade. Its purpose is to reduce the two major causes of maternal and neonatal death -- tetanus and sepsis -- by promoting the &three cleans8 principle -- clean hands, clean surfaces, clean umbilical care. These kits are made locally by a micro enterprise owned by women. And these kits, as well as the entire Safe Motherhood Initiative, teach us about the importance of investing in prevention.

#### 4. Remarks to Women of the Phillippines, 11/24/96

I have seen for myself the pioneering work being done to improve conditions for women in the Phillippines. I had the chance when I was here before to tour the Fabella hospital, where innovative, low-cost techniques are used to help new mothers bond with and breast-feed their infants. When it comes to giving women and children the right start in life, the hospital is a model for the world.

**TALKING POINTS BY VICE PRESIDENT AL GORE**  
**MEETING WITH WOMEN'S AND FAMILY PLANNING GROUPS**  
**Friday, January 22, 1999**

- Let me begin by saying how grateful I am to our First Lady -- for standing up for the rights and fundamental freedoms not just of women, but of all people around the world.
- It was twenty-six years ago today that the Roe v. Wade decision was reached. Most women of child-bearing age do not even remember the days of back-alley abortions. That fading memory plays into the hands of those who would chip away at these freedoms.
- And it is why we must be vigilant -- not merely in protecting and defending a woman's right to choose, but in moving toward the day when there are far fewer unintended pregnancies in America -- when abortion is far less necessary, and far more rare.
- That's what our commitment to family planning is all about. Nearly half of all pregnancies in America are unplanned, and more than half of all unplanned pregnancies end in abortion. We must teach the value of abstinence and the risks of unprotected sex -- and we must make sure women have access to counseling and contraception.
  - Last year, we insisted on an increase in funding for family planning -- while fighting back restrictions that would have required parental consent.
  - As the nation's largest employer, we are setting an example by requiring the 300 federal health plans to cover contraceptives.
  - We made clear that we won't tolerate violent and illegal means -- such as blocking clinics or assaulting providers. We responded with legislation to protect women's access to clinics, and to protect providers and patients from violence.
- And every time Congress has tried to play politics with a woman's right to choose, we have fought to stop them. If they try it again, we'll stop them again.
- Today, I'm proud to share with you the brand new steps we will take in this year's budget. We will propose a \$25 million in crucially-needed family planning funds. And we will propose \$4.5 million specifically to fight clinic violence. The First Lady and I wanted to share these important new proposals with you before announcing them publicly, because you have been the heart and soul of America's efforts to safeguard reproductive choice.
- Again, I thank you for your leadership and partnership in this crucial area. Now I'd like to turn things over to the First Lady, who will talk about our commitment to family planning around the world. Mrs. Clinton...
