Treasury
Office of Thrift Supervision Director Seidman will testify before the House Banking Committee on Year 2000. Chairman Leach,s proposed legislation, which would give thrift and credit union regulators the authority to examine software vendors for year-2000 glitches. OTS and the National Credit Union Association (NCUA) have requested this authority to put them on par with bank regulators.

Justice
The Department Operations, Nutrition and Foreign Agriculture Subcommittee (Goodlatte, Chair) of the House Agriculture Committee will hold a hearing on efforts to stop food stamp fraud.

The House Judiciary Committee will hold a hearing on the civil liability portions of the proposed tobacco settlement.

Attorney General Reno will attend the State Dinner for Prime Minister Blair.

Interior

Secretary Babbitt will testify before the Fisheries, Conservation, Wildlife, and Oceans Subcommittee of the House Resources Committee on the reauthorization of the Rhino and Tiger Conservation Act, and an amendment by Subcommittee Chairman Saxton making it illegal to import or sell traditional medicines labeled as containing rhino or tiger parts.

BOR and FWS will dedicate the new Winter-Run Chinook Salmon Supplemental Spawning and Rearing Facility, near Shasta Dam, CA. The urgency for new genetic material by the next breeding cycle in early 1998 rendered development of the facility a priority, and it was designed and constructed in only 5 months.

USDA

USDA's Under Secretary for Farm and Foreign Agricultural Services will testify before the House Agriculture Committee Subcommittee on General Farm Commodities on the currency crisis in Asia and its effects on U.S. agricultural exports.

The House Agriculture Subcommittee on Department Operations, Nutrition, and Foreign Agriculture has tentatively scheduled a hearing on food stamp fraud.

The Secretary will address the National Cattlemen's Beef Association annual conference in Denver, CO.

Commerce

Economics and Statistics Administration will release Manufacturer' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (December).

A U.S. delegation, with representatives from Commerce, Defense, and the NSC will meet in The Hague with other member delegations to address encryption controls in the Wassenaar Arrangement. Discussions will focus on encryption issues presented in a non-paper at the December Wassenaar plenary session.

Secretary Daley will attend the State dinner for British Prime Minister Blair.

Health and Human Services

The House Judiciary Committee will hold a hearing on the civil liability portions of pending tobacco-control legislation. No Department witness has been invited to testify.

The Senate Veterans Affairs Committee will hold a hearing on the Defense Department's vaccination procedures during the Persian Gulf War. Randy Wykoff, Associate Commissioner for Operations, FDA, will testify.

FDA will announce in the Federal Register the availability of a guidance on how FDA will review and approve antibiotic drugs. The FDA Modernization Act of 1997 (FDAMA) repealed the certification provisions for antibiotics under which FDA had published regulations for each marketed antibiotic drug. The guidance is intended to clarify the administrative processes that FDA will follow in implementing this provision of FDAMA.

The House Commerce Subcommittee on Health and Environment will hold a hearing on the transmission of HIV. The Department has not been invited to testify.

The February 5 issue of The New England Journal of Medicine reports the longest known malaria infection on record. Dr. Joseph M. Vinetz, research physician affiliated with National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, successfully diagnosed and treated a 74-year-old woman who had a mild case of malaria undetected for more than 46 years.

HUD

Secretary Cuomo will:

- attend the National Prayer Breakfast.
- meet with Congressman Lazio to discuss HUD's FY 99 Budget.
- attend the State Dinner for British Prime Minister Tony Blair.

Energy

The Department of Energy has executed agreements preparing for the sale of the U.S. interest in the Naval Petroleum Reserve No. 1 (Elk Hills) to Occidental Petroleum Corp. The sales price will be \$3.65 billion in cash, making it the largest privatization in the history of the U.S. Government. The signing ceremony will occur in the DOE Main Auditorium at 1:30p.m. with media from 2:30 to 3:00. Guests include officials and staff who assisted in the sale process from DOE, OMB, Treasury, Occidental, and the State of California.

In compliance with §3415 of the National Defense Authorization Act for FY96 and in order to remove any cloud over title to Elk Hills which could diminish its value, DOE entered into a Settlement Agreement with California to settle a long-standing dispute over an 1853 land grant to school lands within the Elk Hills Reserve. Under the Agreement, the United States agreed, subject to appropriations from Congress, to pay the State, for the benefit of the State Retired Teachers, Pension Fund, 9% of the net proceeds of sale over a 7-year period, or roughly \$324 million. In exchange, the State agreed to a waiver of suit and the release of claims upon payment. Due to the payment schedule, the net present value of the expected payments equates to approximately 7% of the estimated net proceeds of sale.

1/29 Lawsuit filing: Please note that while closing is presently scheduled for February 5, we have been notified that an environmental group and Native American group are filing suit today to enjoin the sale. As a result, while we believe that we can successfully defend the action, it is possible that there could be some delay to this February 5 closing ceremony.

Education

Secretary Riley is scheduled to address the American Institute of Architects Leadership Conference in DC; his remarks will highlight the Administration's school construction initiative.

The House Committee on Education and the Workforce on January 28 approved a bill that would limit work on national test development to that described in DOE's FY98 appropriations act. Floor action is scheduled for February 5.

VA

The House Veterans, Affairs Committee will hold a hearing to review the recently published special report of the Presidential Advisory Committee on Gulf War Veterans, Illnesses and to provide the Committee a status report on VA-sponsored research and investigations regarding these illnesses, benefits adjudication, and VA efforts to improve both pertinent programs and public confidence in program administration.⁸ Witnesses are to be announced.

The Senate Veterans, Affairs Committee (Special Investigative Unit) may hold a hearing on issues relating to Gulf War veterans, the anthrax vaccine, and the use of other biologicals. Invited witnesses include representatives from DoD and FDA. VA officials may be asked to testify.

Deputy Secretary Guber will attend the Defense Prisoner of War/Missing Personnel Office Annual Prayer Breakfast at the Marriott Crystal Gateway.

USTR

The WTO panel that reviewed USTR's complaint involving Japanese market access barriers to photo film will issue its final report to Japan and the U.S. The report will be released to the public several weeks thereafter. The panel has already issued its preliminary report finding in Japan's favor, and the U.S. does not expect the final report to be significantly different from the preliminary report. USTR has been working closely with Kodak in developing a strategy for continuing to pursue market access in Japan.

Ambassador Lang will meet with U.S. insurance industry representatives of the American Council of Life Insurance to discuss Japan insurance issues.

The WTO will release the report of the WTO panel that considered our complaints against the EU, Ireland, and the UK involving reclassification of local area network (LAN) computer-related equipment and multimedia personal computers to different tariff categories with higher tariff rates. The results were mixed. The panel upheld our claim on LAN equipment (the more significant part of the case from a commercial standpoint), but it rejected our claim on multimedia PC's.

Ambassador Barshefsky will attend the State Arrival Ceremony and participate in other activities for UK Prime Minister Tony Blair.

Ambassador Scher will travel to Universal City, CA to speak at the annual meeting of

Sunkist Growers regarding agricultural trade issues.

Senior USTR staff will hold consultations with the House Ways and Means, House International Relations Committee, and the Senate Finance Committee regarding FTAA negotiations.

Senior USTR staff will hold consultations with the Senate Finance Committee regarding the dispute settlement process and updated staff on the status of current dispute cases.

Senior USTR staff will brief the House Commerce Committee regarding WTO discussions on the ITA II to expand the product scope and address non-tariff measures.

USTR staff, working with an interagency team, will hold consultations with the Senate Finance Committee regarding the status of the NAFTA temporary entry provisions.

SBA

Administrator Alvarez will address the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency's conference on small business lending. The speech, entitled "Preparing Small Business for the 21st Century," will talk about SBA's efforts to become a leading-edge financial institution and its efforts to position itself and the small business community for a future that is increasingly diverse, technology-driven, and global in scope.

The Administrator will deliver the keynote address at an OCC conference on small business lending.

The Administrator will receive an award from the Business and Professional Women in the evening.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Earlier today, with regret, I accepted Secretary of Energy Federico Pena's resignation.

Secretary Pena has admirably served my Administration, first as Secretary of Transportation and then as Secretary of Energy. It is a measure of my confidence in his abilities that I entrusted him to run not one, but two cabinet agencies.

In his last year he diligently managed the Energy Department, focusing on energy, environmental quality, national security and science and technology issues. Just last week, Secretary Pena unveiled our Comprehensive Electricity Competition Plan, saving consumers \$20 billion per year, by introducing competition into the electricity industry. Under his leadership, the Department of Energy provided much of the analysis that gave me the confidence that we can reduce greenhouse gas emissions without harming the economy.

In the last year, he helped shape our policy in the Caspian region, building a coalition among the key nations in that region; he provided a comprehensive national energy strategy for the nation that will help ensure that Americans have affordable, clean and secure energy supplies in the 21st century; and he privatized Elk Hills Naval Petroleum Reserve, generating \$3.65 billion for U.S. taxpayers.

During his four years at the Transportation Department, Secretary Pena increased the level of competitiveness of America's transportation industry with more investments in mass transit than at any time since Woodrow Wilson was President. Secretary Pena helped to improve travel safety, signed aviation agreements with 40 nations, opened lucrative markets for American airlines and oversaw a 25 percent increase in infrastructure investments.

I wish Secretary Pena, his wife Ellen and their three children the best for the future. I thank him for his invaluable service as a member of my cabinet.
