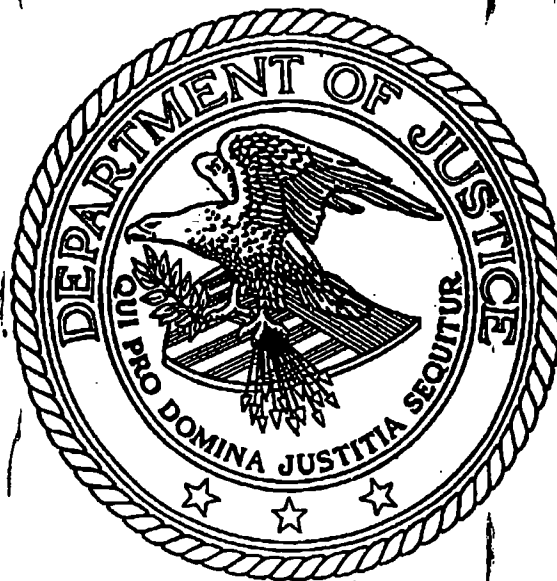

Dear Confreres:

I would like to express my concern about the new jobs program included in Subtitle J--Employment & Skills Crime Prevention of H.R. 3355 and to ask that it not be included in the final version of the crime bill.

This program would only add to the existing maze of 164 federal employment training programs already hampered by unwieldy bureaucracy, duplication, and overlap. I am also not persuaded, given the history of these types of programs, that this program could be cost-effective or succeed in meeting its intended goal of lowering local crime rates.

Like the many programs which have gone before it, this one represents a well-intentioned effort to address a legitimate problem. Nevertheless, I believe we have to look beyond good intentions and look instead for good results.

This is a time when Congress should not be creating new programs of questionable effectiveness but, rather, conducting a comprehensive review of all federal job training programs to decide which ones work and which ones don't. To do otherwise will leave another generation of job seekers with little to bring back from job training programs but false hopes and broken promises.

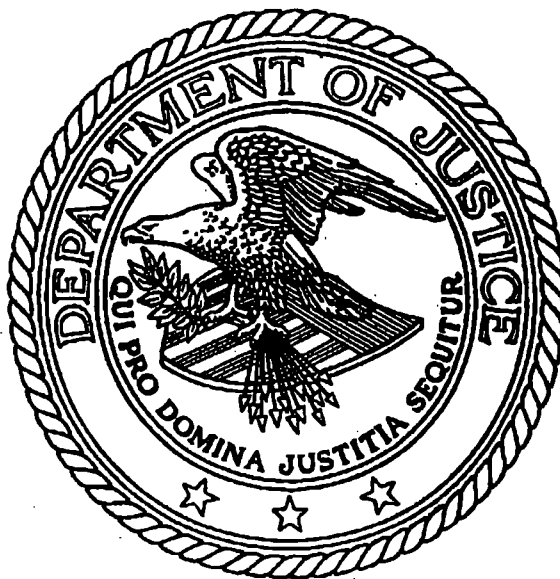
