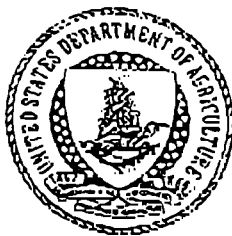

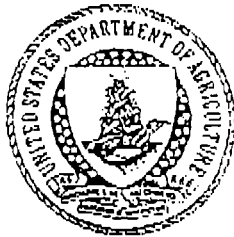

As requested, listed below is a report of the crime calls made and/or attempted by Secretary Reich.

✓ McCurdy - the Secretary attempted to contact McCurdy twice but unable to connect.

✓ Levin - the Secretary spoke to Levin on April 12th; there was a Whip Task Force meeting scheduled for 3:30 pm to discuss crime. He's unsure about overall passage (thorny issue), but thinks it will pass out of rule.

✓ Clay - the Secretary spoke to Clay on April 12th; he is opposing the overall crime bill because of the death penalty; would work with the Administration on any amendments (i.e., ban on hand guns, etc.). No discussion of rule issue.

✓ Becerra - the Secretary spoke to Becerra on April 12--he is supportive of the passage of the overall bill.

✓ Scott - the Secretary made two attempts at contacting Bobby Scott, but Scott was unavailable (meetings April 12; hearing April 13). Staff contact was made on April 13. Scott is unsure on the vote on the rule, he has two serious concerns--the McCollum and the Chapman amendments to increase prison funding to \$10 and \$12 billion respectively. He will vote against final passage. CBC is meeting at noon today and staff will call with updates.

✓ Payne - the Secretary attempted to contact but he was not available. Staff contact only--he is unsure where he is on the rule and has general concerns about the punishment provisions in the bill.

P. Williams - The secretary made two attempts to contact Pat Williams, but was unable to connect. Staff only contact--he is "okay" on the rule and on final passage. His principal concern is that the crime bill disregards Native Americans and he may do a colloquy with Chairman Brooks to emphasize Native American needs.

Schenk - The Secretary attempted to contact Schenk but unable to connect. Staff contact only -- yes on the rule and yes on the crime bill.

Following is feedback from calls placed to Members of Congress by DOT Assistant Secretary for Governmental Affairs, Steve Palmer. As discussed, the Secretary is in the middle of a heavy travel schedule and it is difficult to arrange for him to place the calls until later this week.

✓ Rep. Condit - wants changes from the first rule. Is particularly concerned re: habeas corpus. Has an amendment he wants to offer on illegal aliens.

✓ Rep. Traficant - wants an open rule. He has 4 amendments he wants to offer: 1) add 8 police counseling centers, 2) notification on release of convicts 3) alternatives for non-violent offenders 4) fraudulent labeling of buy-America products.

✓ Rep. Schroeder - will support rule

✓ Rep. Gutierrez - will support rule -- wants a vote on death penalty.

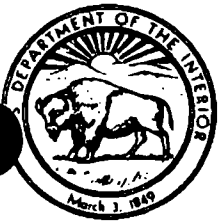
