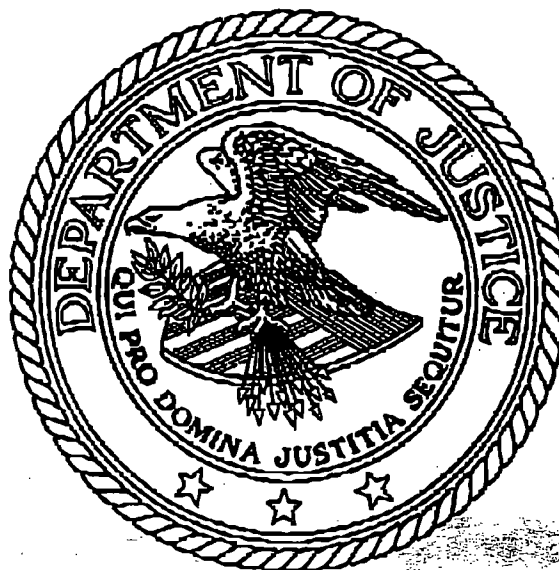

Administrator Browner spoke with Rep. John Conyers (D-MI) yesterday evening (3/21) regarding the crime bill. Conyers will support the rule for the bill.

Rep. Conyers did not state his unconditional support for the bill. However, he said he would "listen to the President" before making up his mind on the vote for final passage of the bill. He emphasized that he and other members of the Congressional Black Caucus, if they vote for the bill, are going to need a way to explain their support for a bill that contains capital punishment.

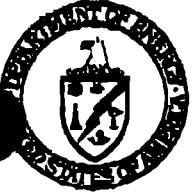

Rep. Pat Danner-225-7041-D-MO- She is leaning yes and is getting more info on the Rural Crime Grants provisions which are her primary interest. She has talked to Attny. Gen. Reno and apparently has no real problems with the bill.

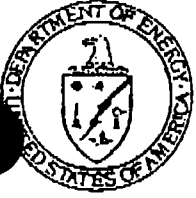

Cong. Pat Schroeder - the Secretary spoke with her Chief of Staff Dan Buck, she will support the legislation and assist in fending off problematic amendments.

Cong. Steve Horn - is supportive of Cong. Bill McCollum's amendment, but will vote for final passage of any "strong crime bill".

Cong. Lincoln Diaz-Balart - has not carefully studied the issues, he will apprise the Secretary of any problems with the legislation.
