- I. Thank You Attorney General Reno
[acknowledge Vice President]
- II. I am particularly pleased to be here to kick off this anti-violent crime initiative. This program is based on COOPERATION, one of the basic themes of Treasury law enforcement, and on taking POSITIVE, PROACTIVE STEPS against violent crime.

III. COOPERATION

At Treasury, we are learning to turn our membership in the larger law enforcement community into a powerful asset. Organized crime, the drug cartels, and even street gangs have demonstrated how cooperation can make the criminals stronger. But we've also learned that law enforcement too, can cooperate to become stronger and more effective.

The cooperation now taking place among federal law enforcement agencies under this Administration is unprecedented. But under the plan we are beginning today, federal law enforcement cooperation with local law enforcement will be even greater and more effective.

Different law enforcement agencies have different

strengths and abilities. When we put these strengths together, we will realize a sort of synergy - a whole that is greater and more effective than the sum of the parts.

An incident last December, when our country experienced a series of bombings in upstate New York, shows the potential for this type of cooperation. Because terrorism was a possibility in the bombing case, because the U.S. mail was involved, and because 5 murders occurred, the case presented a potential jurisdictional collision for: ATF, FBI, U.S. Postal Inspectors, the N.Y. State Police, and various county and city law enforcement agencies.

But rather than fighting over jurisdiction, all agencies agreed that ATF should take the lead, with all the other agencies contributing their expertise. Through this cooperation, a team emerged and the case was solved in a matter of hours.

IV. PROACTIVE STEPS

It's clear to anyone who reads a newspaper or watches the evening news that violent crime is a tremendous problem. Across the country, law enforcement finds itself in a reactive posture, forced to deal with violent crime, after the fact.

More can be done. This Administration is committed to the concept of community policing, to help cut

down on violent crime before it happens. The violent crime program we are announcing today takes that same concept even further. Federal law enforcement will offer its particular expertise in various areas and join with state and local law enforcement's own expertise, to shut down violent criminals before they commit additional crimes.

One good example of this type of coordinated, proactive crime prevention is ATF's [example from ATF]

V. CONCLUSION

I'm delighted and proud that Treasury law enforcement will be working along with the Department of Justice, and with state and local law enforcement across the country, to make the Administration's new anti-violent crime program a success.

Subject: Press Calls on Crime Bill

There are three (3) key points that you should stress in your conversations with press regarding the Crime Bill.

- **BALANCE:** The Crime Bill is a comprehensive bill that takes a balanced approach to fighting crime. This legislation strikes a balance between policing, prevention, and punishment that is critical to stopping the cycle of crime and violence in this country.
- **BIPARTISANSHIP:** This Crime Bill has had bipartisan support from the outset. In both the House and Senate, in committee and on the floor, Democrats and Republicans alike have supported important crime-fighting measures that are included in the Crime Bill.

For example, Democrats voted for the 3-strikes provision and for increased funding to build more prisons; Republicans supported the President's call for 100,000 police officers, and sponsored prevention legislation.

Members of Congress know that crime is not a partisan issue. Their constituents have told them loud and clear that crime and violence is an American crisis. The old argument of prevention vs. punishment is no longer valid. One or the other does not fight crime; we need both. That is why we must continue to work together to pass this Crime Bill.

- **RESOURCES:** Unlike in 1991 and 1992, this Crime Bill commits real resources dedicated to fighting crime.
