STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT
40th Anniversary of the AFL-CIO
December 5, 1995

Today we celebrate the 40th anniversary of the merger between two organizations who have worked long and hard to improve the lives of working Americans -- the American Federation of Labor and the Congress of Industrial Organizations.

This successful 40-year partnership that began on December 5, 1955, required great courage on the part of the AFL's leader, George Meany, and the CIO's leader, Walter Reuther. Not only did it require them to accept each other as partners, but for the first time to compromise on behalf of their shared self-interests. They had the wisdom to see that unity would make them stronger and better equipped to face the challenges of the time.

The challenges facing labor today are no less daunting: global competition, the shift to a post-industrial economy, a changing workplace, and a dramatically changing work force. But through its ability to adapt to change as it did in 1955, it is clear that the American labor movement and the AFL-CIO will continue to be an essential and effective part of our democracy.

I just received your request to get feedback on the events that labor leaders have attended at the White House. Due to the creation of the White House Database (WHODB), your office has the capability of getting immediate feedback on lists such as this.

I am returning your list with the following instructions of how to look-up what events someone has been to in the WHODB. Please let me know if you have any questions or problems with the system.

- Log into WHODB
- At the MAIN MENU screen, click on INDIVIDUALS
- At the INDIVIDUALS screen, click on SEARCH
- Type in the name of the person you are trying to find and hit RETURN (FYI-some people have multiple appearances in the database, so I recommend entering the last name only and checking through all possible entries.)
- A screen will appear with all possible individuals with that name. With the mouse, POINT to the record you want to select and DOUBLE-CLICK
- The BASIC INFORMATION screen will appear for that individual. To view what the person has been to, CLICK on the CONTACT MANAGER tab at the bottom of the screen.
- This screen shows what that person has been invited to and whether they came.

I am adding you to the distribution list for the 'List Creation' updates, so you can suggest individuals to be invited to events. Thank you.

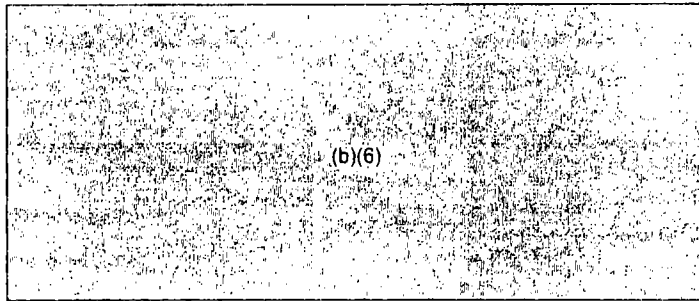

Beginning next week, the AFL-CIO will undertake a major research project to determine how union and non-union American workers view their current and future economic prospects. The project will consist of polls, focus groups, and other opinion measurement activities.
