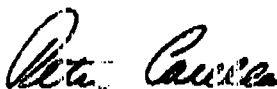

Dear Dr. Gibbons:

I assumed Chairmanship of the National Security Industrial Association (NSIA) Space Committee effective this past January first and wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself and to offer to you and your staff the substantial industry resources available to our committee — pro bono, of course!

Our Space Committee has conducted numerous Space related studies sponsored by DoD components and other government agencies. However, my review of the committee's past history indicates we have had little interface with the Executive or Legislative Branches.

With 295 industry members that we can tap for expertise and support, I consider that the NSIA Space Committee can broaden its efforts and provide valuable industry insights and perspectives as inputs to the policy making sectors of our government. Accordingly, I would like to propose that NSIA arrange and host a conference in Washington, D.C. as a forum for OSTP to introduce, project and discuss space policy related issues as they apply to US industries domestically and internationally. It could be a "gangbusters" effort to project the Administration's vision to the industry and to stimulate exchanges vital to the policy making process. OSTP would

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set the time frame, identify speakers, establish the agenda, and the NSIA Space Committee would manage the minutiae related to organizing such a conference and ensure broad industry participation.

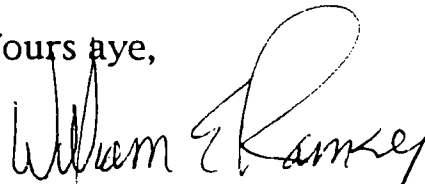
There is great interest among industry leaders with whom I have discussed this subject. With so many critical space policy areas being addressed — i.e. foreign launch, transfer of technology, commercial remote sensing, archived national imagery, LANDSAT, GPS internationalization — there is broad consensus in favor of an exchange such as we propose.

In addition, I would like to offer the Space Committee's service in support of studies you and your staff may be considering. With the diverse views of our industry members, we generally provide reports that contain credible alternatives and/or options for consideration. At times when the aim is for a more rigorous assessment, we do focus on preferred solutions as deliverables with minority views displayed.

I hope the foregoing NSIA Space Committee proposals are intriguing and interesting. I will be pleased to put our planning subcommittee Chairman in touch with your POC to pursue further.
