Recently we visited the White House Office of the Science and Technology Program (OSTP) to explore opportunities for assisting the Executive Branch in the dissemination and development of new technology in the United States.

At that time, I was given a copy of the just published book issued by President Clinton and Vice President Gore entitled "Technology for America's Growth, a New Direction to Build Economic Strength" and was assured that the White House was interested in receiving inputs from scientific and engineering societies on the programs described in the publication.

To give substance to such an effort, I would like to invite you and one or two other very senior members of your society to an "Engineering and Scientific Societies Manufacturing Summit for Economic Growth" in Washington, DC on April 20-21 at the Almas Temple, 1315 "K" Street, N.W., Washington, DC.

In addition to discussing the Presidential Paper, we are also planning to discuss Senate Bill S4 and House Bill H820, the National Competitiveness Act of 1993.

We have contacted OSTP about the proposed meeting and have been advised that any results from such a meeting would be of great interest. The meeting provides us a real opportunity to impact the direction that the new administration is taking with regards to technology and engineering education.

Enclosed you will find a preliminary agenda addressing the subjects contained in the above publications that we believe to be of particular interest to the invitees. The morning is planned to consist of briefings by government officials who were involved in crafting the three documents referred to above. The afternoon will consist of break-out groups who will be asked to discuss the subjects contained in the agenda and develop recommendations. On the next morning, we will meet in plenary session in which the individuals will brief the recommendations developed by them during the previous afternoon. These recommendations will then be consolidated and submitted as a single document to the White House.

With regards to costs, I would propose that we split them by charging a nominal attendance fee which would range from \$30 to \$35 per person for each of the two days. It would include the cost of a luncheon and refreshments.
