ITINERARY:

There are three segments to this visit: The Town Hall Meeting; an independently hosted reception; and three simultaneous site visits of integrated clinics.

6:30 pm Please meet in the hotel lobby NO LATER THAN 6:30 pm to drive over to the reception together. If the meeting runs over, we will return to the hotel but depart immediately.

- Tuesday, 7:45 am Staff will walk meet in the lobby and walk over together; you are welcome arrive more leisurely—but promptly! Breakfast will be available on-site and the meeting begins promptly at 8:30 am
- 8:30 am Meeting is convened at 8:30 am and concludes by 2:00 pm
- 3:00 pm Please meet in the hotel lobby NO LATER THAN 3:00 pm to catch your ride to your site visit. If the meeting runs over, we will return to the hotel but depart immediately.
- 3:30 – 5:30 pm Site visits. Please let Michele Chang know your first and second choices for site visits by lunchtime Monday. We will try to accommodate your first choice, but will want to cover all 3 sites evenly.
- 6:45 pm For any Commissioners and staff remaining in Seattle, who may be interested in sharing dinner, meet in the lobby at 6:45 pm

TOWN HALL MEETING FORMAT:

The speakers are roughly clustered so that members of each 4-5 person panel will address similar or related issues. Each speaker has been allotted 3 minutes to make an oral statement; most also will bring a written copy for you to follow as they speak.

There will be an 8-minute Q & A session following each panel. *Please refrain from making statements of any kind; limit yourself to short, focused questions.* We are anticipating that many more people than are listed here will register to speak on-site; we would like to accommodate them if time allows. Thank you for your help to keep us on schedule!

MONDAY EVENING RECEPTION:

The reception is sponsored jointly by Basytr and the King County 2010 Council. This will be an opportunity for you to socialize informally with members of the Seattle CAM community, including many of the speakers participating in these proceedings. We hope that you will attend; please let me know if you are planning NOT to attend.

SITE VISITS: (please choose a 1st and 2nd choice by lunch on Monday)

At your request and interest, three simultaneous site visits have been arranged and scheduled from approximately 3:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, after the Town Hall Meeting has adjourned. All these sites represent examples of integrated (CAM/conventional) health care services, with differences mostly in patient demographics.

(1) King County Community Health Centers delivers integrated care primarily to the poor and uninsured. 97% of the patients seen here are below the poverty line.

(2) Country Doc delivers integrated care at the community level; the majority of its

patients are HIV-positive.

(3) Baystr Natural Health Clinic is a teaching clinic and serves a primarily student population.

The basic format that has been suggested to our hosts is:

Tour of Facilities (15-20 minutes)

Discussion with Clients/Patients to understand how the clinic has impacted their healthcare, what barriers and obstacles they have faced in trying to get care (generally speaking), and what suggestions they might have to improve the access and availability of the healthcare that they want and need. (20-30 minutes)

Discussion with Operations Staff and Practitioners to understand the challenges faced in running the clinic, both operational and practice-based, and what suggestions they might have to improve their ability to provide the care, and access greater numbers of patients/clients. (20-30 minutes)

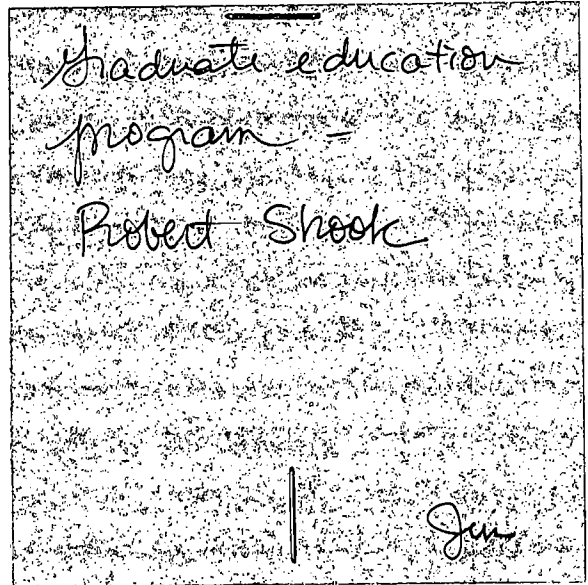
