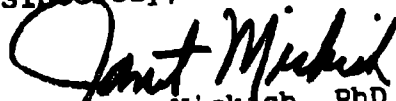

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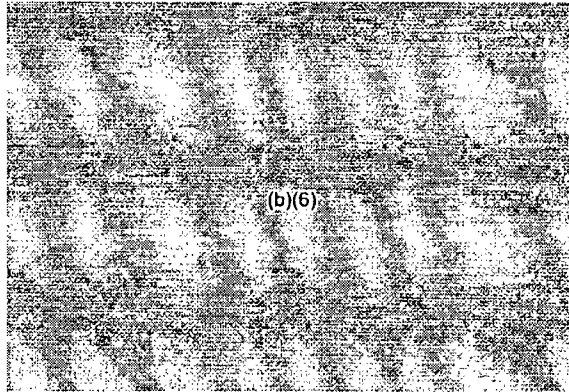

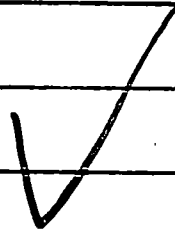

In fact, as you may know, the House on three separate occasions passed the Drug Free Truck Stop Zones as part of the crime bill, only to see it dropped in conference.

The NATSO Foundation has also been a leader in fighting alcohol and drug use among truck drivers and I know an invitation to participate in the ceremony would confer much-needed recognition of their work. I ask that you give consideration to NATSO's request.

Slain Teen's Father Wants Tougher Gun Control; Suspect to Be Tried Adult

TACOMA (AP) The father of a slain teen-ager joined other families of crime victims in a call to support federal legislation that would require the licensing of handgun owners and mandatory safety training, among other things.

John Forrest said Tuesday that restrictions like the ones proposed in the "Brady 2" bill could save lives in the future.

Less than two weeks ago, Forrest's son, Robert, 17, was killed while throwing eggs at houses and cars in Spanaway with three other friends. Michael Welden, 17, was also killed after several shots were fired through the back of the car the four were riding in.

Three teenagers ages 13, 15 and 17 have been arrested in connection with the shootings. Prosecutors said Tuesday that the 17-year-old will be tried as an adult. He is scheduled for arraignment in Pierce County Court today on two charges of first-degree murder in the Aug. 26 shootings.

Forrest, whose son was killed by a rifle blast, acknowledged that the "Brady 2" bill would not have a direct effect his son's death.

"But if this saves one child's life then it's worth it," he told a press conference at a SeaTac park that was also attended by Cheryl Terry, widow of slain Seattle police officer Antonio Terry.

Forrest, who favors legal ownership of guns and not an all out ban, said licensing would help keep guns out of the hands of children and others who shouldn't have them.

"What's a little license going to hurt?" Forrest said.

U.S. Rep Mike Kreidler's congressional staff organized the gathering but stressed that the event was not linked to Kreidler's re-election campaign. Kreidler, an Olympia Democrat, is seeking re-election in the 9th Congressional District.

Kreidler has made crime and gun control central themes in his race against state Rep. Randy Tate, a Puyallup Republican, who opposes gun control. Neither candidate has a primary opponent.

"We are here today because we believe that too many innocent lives are being lost to the deadly plague of gun violence," Kreidler told the small crowd.

In a statement issued Tuesday, Tate said gun control was the wrong approach to crime.

"Once again Mike Kreidler has missed the point," Tate said.

"Only by taking strong steps to discourage criminals can we have any success fighting crime and protecting our families, our homes and our communities."

Kreidler said Tuesday he doesn't anticipate Congress taking up "Brady 2" until next year.

200 attend candlelight vigil at the scene of the shootings

A teenage boy was arrested Thursday night in connection with the shooting death of two Spanaway teens.

The youth was one of five "persons of interest" stopped by Pierce County sheriff's deputies about 7 p.m. within blocks of a candlelight vigil in memory of Robert Forrest and Michael Welden.

Forrest and Welden, both 17, were shot and killed just after midnight Aug. 26 while going home and mailboxes along 168th Street East in Spanaway.

The suspect, who is either 13 or 15, was

booked late Thursday. The other four were released, sheriff's Maj. Larry Meek said. He didn't identify the youth in custody.

The five males — ages 15, 16, 23 and two who are 19 — were questioned at the sheriff's offices in downtown Tacoma, Meek said.

They are affiliated with an East Side Tacoma gang, Meek said. Detectives were continuing Thursday night to look for other persons of interest, he said.

About 10 undercover detectives converged on two cars carrying the group near 22nd Avenue East and Old Military Road East. Officials had received tips they might drive through the area for the vigil. Meek

said. No weapons were found in the cars, Meek said.

Earlier Thursday, detectives listened to a tape-recorded message that had been given Wednesday to a deputy. On the tape, two people talk about the shootings and suggest the killers were gang members, sheriff's Lt. Pat Carder said.

However, the tape played no role in the later action, Meek said.

Tom Brinkley was in his truck, heading to his son's soccer game at Spanaway Lake High School and traveling behind an unmarked deputy's car, when he saw everything turn to chaos.

"All of these police cars converged on the car," the 44-year-old Spanaway man said. "There were 15-20 units and people with guns drawn. They pulled them over and handcuffed them."

Officers detained the occupants without any problems, he said.

"They were overwinded and didn't know

what to do," Brinkley said of them.

Two hours later, Mark Jungbluth, Welden's uncle, opened the 9 p.m. vigil at 22nd Avenue East near 168th Street East, where Welden and Forrest were killed.

He told at least 200 people someone had been taken into custody for the slayings. A long, loud cheer erupted from the crowd.

Later there were lots of prayers, couples holding hands and students leaning against one another for support. Several speakers came forward to talk about the two slain teens.

Dennis Cummings, associate pastor at the South Hill Christian Center, declared that violence should stop. He asked the crowd if they agreed and got solemn nods in return.

Cummings asked for silence as tears glistered in the candlelight, and participants bowed their heads, holding their candles aloft.

Ed Mason, pastor of the Fellowship Christian Center of Tacoma, read a class paper by Forrest. The topic: Death.

"It's a very serious topic that people don't like to talk about," Mason read, "because they're scared of it happening to them."

"Accepting the death of a loved one takes courage and a lot of self-motivation."

In his paper, Forrest went on to say people should not let the death of

a loved one affect them in a negative way.

Weldon and Forrest, both tennis players at Spanaway Lake, were in a car with two other 17-year-old classmates when someone drove behind them and fired a shot, deputies reported. Forrest quickly turned north onto 32nd Avenue East to escape.

The shooter blasted several rounds at their car. Forrest was shot in the head, and Weldon was shot in the back. Both died that morning.

They would have been seniors at Spanaway Lake High School this school year. Many students from the school, which began class Wednesday, came to funeral services Thursday morning for Weldon.

day morning for Weldon.

At Weldon's memorial, more than 300 family members, friends and classmates overwhelmed the tiny chapel at Fir Lane Funeral Home and Memorial Park in Spanaway.

About 150 mourners stood outside the filled chapel, listening to the services through outdoor speakers.

Jungbluth led the services.

"Michael was a lover of life," said Jungbluth, Weldon's uncle. "He liked to hunt with a bow and arrow. He detested guns. ... He loved to play tennis and basketball."

David Dickson, who coached Weldon and Forrest in tennis, said the athletic 6-foot-4 Weldon was a

horrific player when he first picked up the game in August 1993.

"He dropped a ball, hit it and it went straight into the net," Dickson remembered. "Then he dropped a ball, hit it and it went straight into the net. Then he dropped a ball, hit it and it went all the way to the fence."

A month later, a much-improved Weldon made "a pretty good tennis team" and played No. 1 doubles last year for the Sentinels, Dickson said.

"Robert and Michael are two winners," he said.
