SUBJECT: PRESIDENTIAL VIDEO REQUESTS

As part of our continuing effort to make the best use of the President's time, the Scheduling Office is instituting a new process for the submission of video requests. Effective immediately, all staff must provide the following:

- 1) Complete all the information on the attached scheduling form including whether the organization has agreed to pay for the video. (The White House does not have a budget for this service.)
- 2) Attach a proposed script that has been reviewed by White House staff for appropriate content.
- 3) Designate a staff contact to write and submit a clear and concise briefing memo to the Staff Secretary. If the video is accepted, the briefing memo should include:
 - a. The organization or person requesting the video.
 - b. The basis for deciding to do the video.
 - c. Appropriate background so that the President is well-informed about the organization and event.

The staff contact will also be required to brief the President before the video.

Video proposals must be received in the Scheduling Office at least two weeks in advance of the date requested. Staff members who wish to request a video message for an event that was regretted by the Scheduling Office must submit a new proposal with the above information attached. Any requests sent to the Media Affairs Office directly will be returned to you. **There will be no exceptions to these procedures.**

If you have any questions, please contact Margo Spiritus at 6-2823. Thank you for your cooperation.

VIDEO FOR (name of organization or person)

- This attachment should include the following information. It may be laid out in this order, but that isn't required:

- **The organization or person that the video is for.**
- **The purpose for doing the video.** Why have we decided to do it? In what way is doing it beneficial to the President's objectives?
- **Background information about the organization and event.** Tell the President what he needs to know to be properly informed, but be concise.

[This attachment will be appended to an event memo prepared by Media Affairs that will list all the videos the President is doing on a given day. This attachment should in no event exceed one page.]

Dear Mr. President:

I continue to hear reports of your concern about Lou Gehrig's disease--and even that you have asked about us. Joan and I are very grateful.

Your comment that, "Now that Lou Gehrig's record has been broken, it's time to break this disease," has been widely reported (although I don't get nearly enough credit as your "speech-writer" for that line!). Your public notice of the challenge of ALS is immensely helpful in encouraging people who have the disease and also encouraging the research community and the FDA to keep pressing for effective treatments.

On the personal front, we're doing well. I have some weakness, particularly in my right hand, but I keep up a regular schedule with work and exercise. Life is good. On the research front, the very first drug ever approved for this disease has just reached the market, and I am due to begin it next week. It hasn't been proven to do very much, but it's the first thing ever to do anything at all! And nobody has had a chance to take it for a long period of time. So we'll see.

There are some things that you can do for all of us with ALS, mainly to help continue the momentum of interest in the disease. I know how difficult your schedule and your logistics can be, but I thought I'd mention a few possibilities:

- 1. Attend a baseball game on Lou Gehrig's birthday (or some other relevant date) and call attention to the need for patient care and for research.

2. Attend Jerry Lewis's revival of "Damn Yankees," to honor the great Yankee Gehrig and also Lewis, whose telethon has raised millions for ALS research and patient care.
3. Tape a television PSA that we can promote nationwide, in conjunction with Gehrig's birthday or other anniversary.
4. Invite ALS "stars" -- researchers, fund-raisers, patients -- to the White House for some ceremony, perhaps honoring Cal Ripken.

With Erskine Bowles back in Charlotte, my brother Jim (now VP of the Carolinas Medical Center) and I are working with him to establish an ALS Clinic in Charlotte -- the first in the South! And we'd probably piggy-back a fund-raiser onto any of the ideas I've listed, with your permission.

I do understand the problems of the presidential schedule and know it's complicated by campaigning, but if there's any possibility for these or other ideas, please have someone on your staff contact me. You can be sure we'll make the most of any opportunity. I'm a great pro-motor!

Whatever the outcome of these ideas, please know that Joan and I deeply appreciate your friendship and your concern.

Thanks so much for your interest in this project. I also received a wonderful note from the President, expressing the hope that he might be able to help.

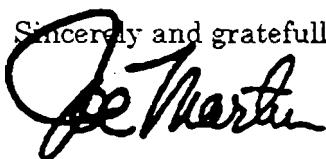
I am forwarding a draft script for the President's videotaped remarks. We are so thrilled that he might say something about ALS -- anything! -- that we are not even remotely sensitive about whether he uses this particular script. The reference to the President's "friend" (that's me!) may not be appropriate, but the writer "lifted it" almost verbatim from the President's remarks on ESPN after I talked with him at the baseball game. We love that part, if it suits you and suits him.☺.

Something like this script will do several things for us:

1. Gives us tape that we can use at special events and fund-raisers.
2. Provides a clip that could be shown at baseball parks on Lou Gehrig anniversaries (birthday, record day, retirement day, etc.).
3. Excerpting the last 3 paragraphs, gives us a 60-second spot to promote as a PSA through television and radio stations throughout the country -- in conjunction with local fund-raisers or special events or minor-league ball games or any number of other related events.

I will be out of the country for a few weeks (with my French exchange-student brother from high school days nearly 40 years ago!), but I will be in touch with my office if you need me. Another and readily available resource: Ellyn Phillips, president of the Philadelphia ALS Association and a member of the FDA Advisory Committee (215/643-5434). She's very knowledgeable about the disease and about this project and can help with any question that might come up.

Remarks for President Clinton

Imagine not being able to do something as simple as buttoning your shirt or tying your shoelaces. Imagine not being able to talk with your children or grandchildren. Or join them in a backyard game of ball. Or even play cards with them. Even though your mind is perfectly clear.

Those are just some of the things that can happen with Lou Gehrig's disease. The medical name for it is Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis -- or ALS. But most of us know it as Lou Gehrig's disease.

It was this disease that took the great Yankee first baseman out of the line-up and, two years later, took his life. That was more than 50 years ago.

Today, thirty thousand Americans have ALS, Lou Gehrig's disease. About 300,000 other Americans who are now living and healthy will get this disease over time. It is a devastating condition which robs the body of its muscular ability -- while leaving mental functions perfectly clear and unaffected. The cause is still not known, and there is still no cure.

Not long ago, we were all reminded of Lou Gehrig -- and of the disease that still bears his name -- when Cal Ripken broke Gehrig's incredible record for consecutive baseball games played. I was at the ballpark for that emotional and thrilling moment. So was a dear friend of mine who is courageously managing Lou Gehrig's disease in his own life. My friend said to me that night, "Now that we've broken Lou Gehrig's record, it's time to break Lou Gehrig's disease."

I, too, think it's time. It's past time. I ask you to join with thousands of others who give their time, their compassion, and their financial support for essential research and for programs that help men and women with ALS to live meaningful and productive lives.

For my friend..., for Lou Gehrig..., for all those today who are waging a battle with ALS..., let's help in the effort to break Lou Gehrig's disease.

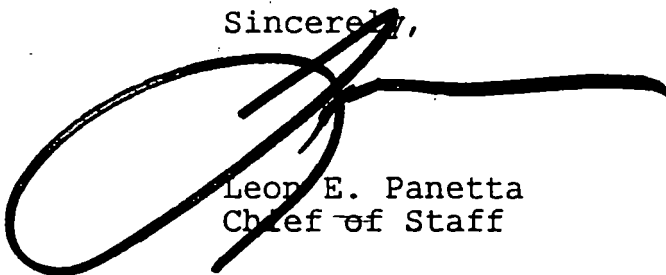

I am writing to bring the invitation request to the President Clinton and Mrs. Clinton from Mr. Scott D. Shea of Dillon, Montana to your attention.

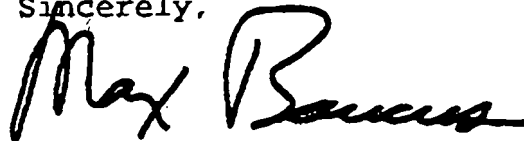

Following an accident on June 30, 1995, our 8 year old son and brother, Michael Jordan Shea, became an organ donor. This was a decision he had made 1 year earlier following the death of his Grandpa.

I write to you today to personally invite you, Mrs. Clinton and Chelsea to attend any portion of this ceremony, as time may allow. I am aware that the National Kidney Foundation has formally invited you to attend also. As the leader of this great nation, and leader of the Free World, your attendance at this ceremony would help elevate public awareness of the importance of organ and tissue donation.

As you are aware, every year thousands of men, women and children die because of a lack of available organs for transplant. On a personal note, many of those who will be in attendance, including my family, are in various stages of grief over the loss of their loved ones. Your presence at this ceremony would be of great comfort and be a tremendous source of pride for these families.

We are so proud of our son and brother, Michael. The gifts he has given are making life possible for 4 other people, including 2 children. Michael's legacy is of great comfort to this family, and Michael Jordan Shea is, in my mind, a hero.
