We are writing on behalf of the Law Enforcement Steering Committee (LESC), a coalition of national law enforcement associations representing over 500,000 law enforcement practitioners, to urge you to exempt Federal law enforcement positions from Executive Order 12839 and other Executive memoranda mandating reductions in the Federal work force.

The LESC is a nonpartisan coalition consisting of the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association, the Fraternal Order of Police, the International Brotherhood of Police Officers, the Major City Chiefs, the National Association of Police Organizations, the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives, the National Sheriff's Association, the National Troopers Coalition, the Police Executive Research Forum, and the Police Foundation. The LESC is a model of an unprecedented cooperative effort between law enforcement research organizations, police management and labor. We are dedicated to the advancement of legislation and policy that will ensure the safety and security of our country's people.

The LESC applauds the Administration's continued commitment to put 100,000 more "cops on the beat" and the Senate's recent passage of a Comprehensive Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act authorizing over \$22 billion in funding and grants. The Senate's quick action in passing anti-crime legislation is a clear indication that the public is sick and tired of the violence that is afflicting our nation.

The Senate's Crime Control Act established the Violent Crime Reduction Trust Fund, a copy of which is attached, to help finance the cost of the Act. Further, the Crime Control Act authorizes the revenues to fund the Trust Fund to be derived

from savings resulting from the reduction of the Federal work force by 252,000 positions over a five year period. The proposed reduction in personnel includes full time Federal law enforcement positions. Many of these reductions, particularly within the FBI, will also critically impact programs and systems such as training, the National Criminal Information Center (NCIC), and the Uniform Crime Report (UCR), which directly interface with local law enforcement.

As a result of the budget cuts and proposed reductions in law enforcement personnel, it is estimated that by 1995 the Federal Bureau of Investigation will have eliminated 1,500 full time positions, the United States Marshals 216 positions, the Naval Criminal Investigative Service 177 positions, and the Drug Enforcement Administration 531 positions, with further cuts to follow through to 1998. Many agencies have not had any new hires since 1992 and are now facing the possibility of RIFs of law enforcement personnel.

In the Senate's Crime Control Act, a sense of the Senate resolution, a copy of which is attached, recognizes that any meaningful anti-crime legislation must not include a reduction of Federal law enforcement personnel. This is because Congress has long acknowledged the integrated role that Federal law enforcement has in working with State and local law enforcement in combatting violent crime. Further, the Senate bill includes a number of new Federal criminal violations which, if they become law, will add substantially to the cost of operating Federal law enforcement agencies.

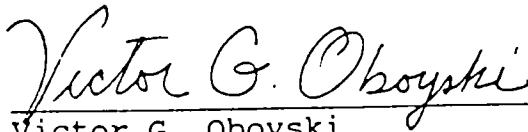
At a recent forum entitled, "Reinventing Federal Law Enforcement", Deputy Attorney General Phillip Heymann addressed the future of Federal law enforcement. Mr. Heymann stated, "You're going to see a lot of cooperation with State and local (law enforcement) because when you're in the violence or local drug business you have to be working with the State and local. I know the task forces have been doing this. We'll keep using task forces." Regarding the proposed cuts in personnel, he noted, "I know that in the Justice Department we've been planning on very sizable law enforcement cuts. I mean, the FBI is planning them, the DEA is planning them, and I'm sure ATF is too. And it is a little bit strange at a time when we're about to put 100,000 new cops of the street."

Addressing the same forum, FBI Director Louis Freeh stated, "Our agency, like many of your agencies, are facing reductions and cut backs which are really unprecedented in our history, at a time when our challenges and responsibilities are growing by leaps and bounds."

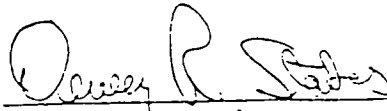

● **Funding for more prisons, jails and boot camps** – The current state and local prison systems are overflowing and in serious need of repair. Arrests mean nothing unless we can back them up with the threat of doing jail time, but criminals cannot be kept behind bars if there is no available prison space. Criminals must know that if they commit a crime, they will serve the full sentence. Boot camps are a pragmatic approach to dealing with juvenile, non-violent offenders for whom training and guidance can serve to turn their lives around. Youths can receive education, discipline, and drug treatment through these innovative programs. If law enforcement can deter young people from a life of crime, then American society will be the winner.

● **Protecting our youth** – Children, our most precious resource, have become both the victims and the perpetrators of the violence sweeping this country. One in 25 high school students carry a gun to school and over 30% of students responding to a survey said they have been physically threatened. We need to make every effort to ensure that our schools are crime and gun-free. We must support programs that help all of our children stay crime and drug-free, and that offer opportunities for productive employment and meaningful lives.

● **Assault weapons prohibition** – The easy availability of assault weapons wreaks havoc daily on the streets of America. These dangerous weapons, with their rapid rate of fire, ease of handling in close quarters, and military features, are simply not sporting weapons. As long as assault weapons are sold legally, the public and law enforcement will continue to be at great risk.

● **National Commission to Support Law Enforcement** – Comprised of members from all aspects of law enforcement, including management, labor, federal law enforcement agencies, academia, together with Members of Congress, the members of the LESC believe a commission to support law enforcement will be an excellent forum for sharing law enforcement resources and intelligence. A partnership such as this will help ensure that law enforcement at every level has the tools it needs to conduct a coordinated, national approach to fighting crime.

● **Research on issues affecting the cop on the street** – To help effectively address the problems of crime and disorder in the community, the LESC feels that there needs to be a sufficient level of research funding that directly benefits the cop on the street.

The LESC supports a crime bill that encompasses these and other issues contained in the crime bill. The LESC is committed to standing with President Clinton and his Administration in pressing for prompt enactment of such a bill by the Congress.

Founded in 1985, the Law Enforcement Steering Committee (LESC) is a nonpartisan coalition consisting of the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association, the Fraternal Order of Police, the International Brotherhood of Police Officers, the Major City Chiefs, the National Association of Police Organizations, the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives, the National Sheriffs' Association, the National Troopers Coalition, the Police Executive Research Forum, and the Police Foundation. These groups represent over 500,000 law enforcement officers nationwide. The LESC is a model of unprecedented cooperative effort between law enforcement research organizations, police management, and labor, dedicated to the advancement of legislation and policies that will ensure the safety and security of our country's people.

Over the past eight year's LESC members have worked diligently on law enforcement issues of mutual concern and have been able to articulate to the White House, the Congress, and the American people our ideas for achieving a safer society. We have expressed our concerns over the increase in violence and crime, the easy access criminals have to weapons, and the need for more support for professional law enforcement.

For too many years, crime control--and legislative means of achieving it--has been undermined by partisan politics and pressure from special interest groups. In the meantime, violence has exploded in our communities, making peace officers' jobs increasingly dangerous and frustrating.

While we fully recognize that anti-crime initiatives in the legislation pending before Congress do not present a panacea for crime, they are a solid beginning toward a comprehensive approach to making our nation's streets safe and secure. The members of the LESC stand firmly behind many major provisions of the legislation, including those that would enhance police presence in the community and that would confine violent criminals until they are no longer a danger to our communities.

Members of the LESC met with congressional and Administration leaders in 1992 in an effort to forge a compromise and enact a comprehensive crime bill. We were very disappointed when that effort failed, and are committed to working with policy makers to ensure this crime bill does not suffer the same fate. This year, the case for strong, effective crime legislation is so compelling that no such effort should be needed. The nation's police and the citizens they are sworn to protect have no doubt that crime is threatening the quality of life in our communities. Nonetheless, the LESC offers its assistance in securing sensible, effective legislation to address what has become the public's number one concern. The LESC feels that the following items are key elements to any package of crime legislation:

- **Funding for 100,000 additional police officers** -- There is a broad consensus among the law enforcement community that additional personnel dedicated to community policing will assist some agencies in reducing crime, and is essential in our efforts towards working with the community to take back our streets.
- **Community Policing** -- New policing strategies in which police are in close contact with residents of the community and in which the police and residents become partners in solving community problems offer the best hope for improving the quality of life for all citizens we serve. While change will be difficult, it seems that traditional responses alone have not been enough.

Here is the information you requested on a possible person to join the President in presenting the Heroes Awards on Thursday.

Marc Lawson is a twenty year veteran of the Atlanta Police Department. He joined the Atlanta Police as a Patrolman in 1975 as a part of the Team Policing Project, developed by Atlanta officers and Lee P. Brown. The Team Policing Project was a forerunner to the Community Policing Concept. In his first year as an officer Marc received Atlanta's Distinguished Service Award.

Marc was promoted to Detective in 1976, working in each division, ranging from Homicide to Theft. He spent 8 years as an undercover narcotics officer. Marc was promoted to Sergeant in 1991 and is currently a Field Supervisor and Director of the Crime Analysis Unit. Marc teaches Ethics and Professionalism at the Atlanta Police Academy.

Marc was instrumental in the organization of the police union in Atlanta, Local 623 of the International Brotherhood of Police Officers. He has served as President of the IBPO since 1984.

During his career Marc has pursued an acute interest not only in reducing crime through arrests but in reducing crime by preventing violence. He has dedicated thousands of hours working to reduce youth violence and violence against women. He is a social activist in his community.

Marc's expertise in devising solutions has led him to be a two-time guest on the Oprah Winfrey Show, in 1994 and in 1986. He is a frequent guest on local TV to address community strategies in reducing violence.

On the education front, Marc holds a bachelor's degree from Clark University in Atlanta and has taken graduate courses at Georgia State.
