Groups prod Porter to back anti-crime bill

■ TASC: Funding for social service programs at stake

A coalition of local social agencies is lobbying one of Lake County's Congressmen to support passage of President Clinton's anti-crime bill.

The \$30 billion legislation was stymied last week when the House of Representatives defeated a motion to bring the bill to a vote.

Another form of the bill, which includes funding for law enforcement and social programs, may be revived today or Saturday, according to a spokesman for U.S. Rep. John Porter, R-Wilmette.

Representatives of TASC (Treatment Alternatives for Special Clients) updated

a coalition of substance abuse treatment providers this week on possible local funding coming from the bill.

The coalition, which includes representatives from the county Health Department, Interfaith Chaplaincy, Northeastern Illinois Council on Alcoholism and Substance Abuse (NICASA), Gateway Foundation and TASC, agreed to lobby Porter to change his vote in support of the bill.

TASC is a statewide agency which is trying to funnel federal funding for substance abuse treatment to the local level. Passage of the anti-crime bill would provide 150 Lake County Jail inmates per year with intensive substance abuse therapy and 300 inmates with drug education.

If passed, the crime bill could provide at least \$500,000 for inmate substance

abuse counseling at Lake County Jail, said Edward Ravine, assistant director of the Health Department's Mental Health Division.

Following therapy, other funding sources included in the legislation will pay for community services, vocational training and family therapy to prevent relapse and continued criminal activity.

Passage of the bill will allow funding for incarcerated inmates to receive 10 weeks of therapy and six months of post-treatment counseling, said Ravine. Studies have shown that substance abusers who receive six months of substance abuse therapy have a much greater chance of long-term recovery, he said.

Federal funding of programs which reduce repeating criminal behavior is a way to reduce state and federal prison

populations, said John Merwin, associate director for NICASA.

Inmate treatment will be incorporated in the establishment of a local drug court, which under the proposed legislation will be set aside to prosecute non-violent substance abuse offenders.

On Thursday, news reports said some House members had changed their position to support the legislation.

Porter said he opposed the rule for vote on the bill's own merits because it contained inappropriate spending, and as of Thursday, his position was the same, said David Kohn, Porter's press secretary.

"If the bill comes back and some of the excessive spending is removed, he would support it," Kohn said.

Kohn said Porter "wants to support it" and was "hopeful the bill would be turned back to a sensible size."

Dear Congressman Porter:

As leaders of community service arenas in Lake County, we have come together because we are concerned about the fact that drug abuse is driving much of the crime in our community, and we are asking for your support on the crime bill and the crime bill rule.

Alcohol and other drug abuse is involved in a majority of crimes committed in our area. A recent study of arrestees in Lake County showed that 43 percent had used illicit drugs within the 48 hours prior to arrest, and that 62 percent had reported alcohol use within the 72 hours prior to arrest.

We have been working on a plan to expand interventions for substance-abusing offenders in Lake County because we cannot hope to address drug-related crime and associated recidivism without treating addicted offenders. Our plan is to provide approximately 150 Lake County Jail inmates per year with intensive therapeutic treatment services and another 300 inmates per year with drug education. This project would connect offenders to community services upon release from jail, including vocational training and family therapy, to help prevent relapse and further criminal activity. If we only achieve a conservative decrease in recidivism through this program, it would save Lake County significant court and incarceration costs. With adequate treatment services, along with appropriate sanctions for those who fail to meet program requirements, we can begin to make an impact on the drug/crime problem in our community.

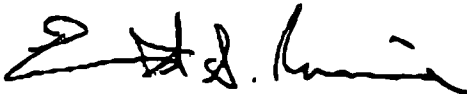

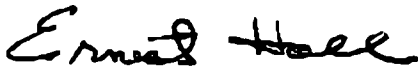
