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COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERVICES COPS AHEAD NOTIFICATIONS FACT SHEET

COPS AHEAD NOTIFICATIONS

Total Awards. COPS AHEAD distributed 631 notifications, totaling \$327.1 million, to help hire or rehire 4688 additional law enforcement officers. This \$327.1 million represents approximately 25 percent of the total \$1.3 billion dollars available under the COPS program for fiscal year 1995.

Program Overview. Jurisdictions announced under COPS AHEAD in December 1994 have already submitted a Letter of Intent to participate to the COPS office by November 10, 1994. On December 19, 1994, these applicants will be notified of their eligibility and given an authorized officer hiring number. Jurisdictions must then hire these officers and enroll them in the first available training classes in 1995. Jurisdictions will complete an application kit and forward it to the COPS office by March 3, 1995. Technical assistance will be offered to jurisdictions to help in the preparation of their formal application. Grant funding will begin once an application is approved or new officers are sworn, whichever occurs later.

Geographic Distribution. Jurisdictions in 50 states, Guam, and Puerto Rico received notifications under COPS AHEAD.

Large Jurisdictions. 167 jurisdictions with populations at or above 150,000 received notifications totaling approximately \$ 231.7 million.

Small Jurisdictions. 464 jurisdictions with populations under 150,000 received notifications totaling approximately \$95.4 million.

Police Departments. 407 municipal and county police departments received COPS AHEAD notifications. They serve populations ranging from 50,008 to 2,768,483.

Sheriffs' Offices. 201 county sheriffs' offices received COPS AHEAD notifications.

Indian Tribal Groups. 2 Indian tribal groups received notifications in Arizona and Oklahoma.

State Police Departments. 21 state police departments received notifications, including Alaska, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Maine, Missouri, Mississippi, Montana, North Dakota, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Puerto Rico, and West Virginia.

POLICE HIRING BACKGROUND

Police Hiring Supplement Program (PHSP)

The US Department of Justice created the Police Hiring Supplement Program (PHSP) in response to Congressional passage of the Supplemental Appropriation Act of 1993, which provided \$150 million to help pay for the salaries and fringe benefits of sworn law enforcement officers.

Under PHSP, the Justice Department received 2,760 applications from all 50 states and several territories for grants to hire or rehire new officers. This grant program concluded in May 1994.

The Justice Department made a total of 249 awards under PHSP totaling approximately \$150 million, to help hire or rehire 2,020 additional law enforcement officers.

Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Community Policing Grants

In conjunction with the PHSP, the Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance awarded four Community Policing Grants.

COPS: Phase I

The response to the limited PHSP demonstrated the magnitude of unmet needs for more officers on America's streets. Under PHSP, money was available to fund fewer than one in ten of all applications received.

The President and Congress responded to public demands for safer streets by enacting the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 in September 1994.

To expedite the hiring of more law enforcement officers, Congress directed the Department to spend up to \$200 million of the \$1.3 billion appropriated for FY 1995 to fund additional proposals from the 2,506 applicants to the PHSP that were not funded.

The Justice Department made a total of 392 awards in October 1994 to jurisdictions for the hiring or rehiring of additional officers under COPS: Phase I.

COPS AHEAD

COPS AHEAD is the second program designed by the Justice Department in response to Title I of the Crime Act and one of two expedited hiring programs. Law enforcement agencies serving populations at or above 50,000 were eligible to submit Letters of Intent by November 10, 1994. 631 jurisdictions received authorized hiring numbers in December 1994. Jurisdictions must submit completed applications by March 3, 1995.

The COPS office received over 800 Letters of Intent to participate from all 50 states and several territories for the expedited hiring or rehiring of new officers.

ACCELERATED HIRING, EDUCATION AND DEPLOYMENT (COPS AHEAD)
PROGRAM SUMMARY**

Overview

The Accelerated Hiring, Education and Deployment (COPS AHEAD) Program is one of several programs designed to implement the "Cops-on-the-Beat" provisions of the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994. It is part of President Clinton's pledge to put 100,000 more law enforcement officers on the streets and rural routes of America. COPS AHEAD targets law enforcement agencies serving populations of 50,000 or more and is designed to encourage accelerated hiring of new law enforcement officers for community policing.

COPS AHEAD is the first new grant program developed by the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS). The COPS Office was established under the Associate Attorney General to develop and implement \$8.8 billion in community policing grants over the next six years. The Office became operational on October 1, 1994, and has embarked on its challenging mission with a handful of professional staff.

COPS AHEAD was designed in response to a suggestion made by the U.S. Conference of Mayors. Members indicated that some jurisdictions would like to move forward with the recruitment and hiring of new officers before actual grants were awarded by the Justice Department. By accelerating the hiring process new officers would be on the beat months before they would have been under traditional grant award processes. COPS AHEAD was also designed to make the grant process easier and faster for municipalities.

Grants will be made for up to 75 percent of the total salary and benefits of each officer over three years, up to a maximum of \$75,000 per officer with the remainder to be paid by state or local funds. Funding will begin once a satisfactory grant application is approved and the new officers are sworn. Requests for waivers are not permitted under this program. Any hiring under this program must be in addition to, and not in lieu of, officers that otherwise would have been hired by the agency. Law enforcement agencies could only apply for funding for up to 2.5 percent of October 1, 1994 sworn force levels. Although this figure was originally 3 percent, based on the overwhelming number of letters of intent, it was decided that COPS AHEAD would fund 2.5 percent of sworn personnel as of October 1, 1994.

In hiring new officers, agencies may not reduce the scope of their customary screening and training procedures, and must include community policing principles and methods in their training curricula. To the extent practicable, and consistent with applicable law, grant funds are to be used to increase the representation of women and racial and ethnic minorities within the ranks of sworn officers. New officers are required to begin their training no later than the first available training class in 1995.

All law enforcement agencies, and city and county governments, serving a population of 50,000 or more were mailed a COPS AHEAD summary fact sheet and an invitation to apply in early November. This same information was published in the Federal Register on November 3, 1994. The invitation included a "Letter of Intent" form. Applicants were asked to return letters of intent to the COPS Office by November 10, 1994, although late submissions were accepted.

After a verification of eligibility and funding levels the COPS Office will give departments a "go ahead" letter to begin hiring and training new officers. Law enforcement agencies will be notified that funding will occur after a formal application is submitted and approved. The formal application will include information concerning the agency's strategy for community policing, including a description of how the officers will be used, budget and retention plans, and other information to enable the COPS Office to confirm compliance with grant requirements. Technical assistance will be available to agencies so they may submit a satisfactory formal application. Applications will be reviewed and awarded on a rolling basis with a submission deadline of March 3, 1995.

Any award under COPS AHEAD will not affect the eligibility of an agency to apply for a grant under any other COPS program. An agency that received funding under COPS Phase I is eligible to receive additional funding under COPS AHEAD if the combined hiring under both programs does not exceed 2.5 percent of the actual October 1, 1994 force levels.

Funding

The initial funding projection for the AHEAD Program was \$226 million.

Eighty-six percent of available FY95 funds, after subtraction of administrative, training, technical assistance and evaluation allotments, are committed to hiring of new police officers. Of this \$1,075 million, \$200 million were committed to Phase I awards announced in October and \$250 million was committed to redeployment grants ("20% monies"). This left \$625 million to be split evenly between agencies serving populations of 150,000 or more and those serving less than 150,000. Fifty percent of the hiring monies for jurisdictions over 150,000 (\$156 million) and 75 percent of the hiring monies for jurisdictions 50,000-150,000 (\$70 million) were initially allotted to COPS AHEAD, for a total of \$226 million.

Number of New Officers to be Hired

Based on \$226 million, a minimum of 3013 new officers could be hired under this program. This meant that if about 30 percent of the approximately 1500 qualifying agencies requested an average increase of 2.5 percent of sworn force levels, most or all agencies could be funded.

Letters of Intent to the COPS Office

Almost 900 letters of intent were faxed or mailed to the COPS Office. The total number of officers requested was 8997, which when capped at \$75,000 per officer, totaled over \$626 million.

Review of Letter of Intent Information

All letters of intent to participate in AHEAD were reviewed for information accuracy. Of particular concern were the following items: Population served; number of sworn officers; number of new officers requested; and, entry level salary and benefits. Telephone calls were made and facsimiles sent to departments interested in participating in COPS AHEAD to verify these items. Eligibility and proposed funding levels were then revised.

Department Eligibility for COPS AHEAD

The COPS Office staff examined revised numbers regarding population as a major criterion for eligibility to participate in COPS AHEAD. For population served, some departments, particularly sheriffs and county police departments, provided jurisdiction-wide population figures that included areas served by other municipal departments. All of the sheriff's departments and county police departments that applied were contacted by telephone or fax to obtain the actual population served figures. The population figures were adjusted accordingly and in some cases resulted in the agency falling below the 50,000 population served mark, making them ineligible for COPS AHEAD.

In several other cases, most notably New York City, proposed new hires were not in addition to scheduled hiring plans and federal funds might be considered supplanting non-federal local funds devoted to law enforcement. They were deemed ineligible on that basis.

In addition, there were letters of intent from 59 departments categorized as "special police." This included the following kinds of departments:

- * Airport Police
- * Natural Resources Police
- * Park Police
- * Prosecutor Investigators
- * Campus Police

While it may be feasible for these special departments to engage in community policing, it was felt that a thorough review of their community policing activities and plans was necessary before giving them go ahead authorization. They will be eligible under the standard hiring programs where review of their plans and activities can take place before commitment of any resources.

Lists of applicants also were screened by the Civil Rights Division, U.S. Attorney Offices and the Office of Justice Programs Civil Rights Office. Based upon input from these offices, three agencies were deemed ineligible.

A followup letter also was sent to all applicants reemphasizing the program conditions of COPS AHEAD grant awards. Several departments, after reviewing these conditions, voluntarily

withdrew their applications.

Officers/Funds Requested Adjustments

Some of departments reported total number of sworn officers as all officers employed by the agency. Based on an analysis of the 1990 Law Enforcement Management and Administrative Statistics Survey data the COPS Office identified agencies where large proportions of personnel actually worked in jails, process serving or other non-law enforcement duties. All of the sheriff's departments that applied were contacted by telephone or fax to obtain the number of actual sworn personnel working in law enforcement functions. Telephone calls were also made to the few municipal departments that reported large percentages of officers devoted to other duties. Non-law enforcement personnel were subtracted from these totals and the 2.5 percent cap was adjusted accordingly.

In addition, some departments included in salary and/or benefit levels such items as equipment, weapons, training and other non-financial benefit items. After agency contacts, these items were subtracted from provided figures which reduced the total levels of funds requested for some departments.

Application Procedures

As a result of these eligibility adjustments a total of 631 departments will be given go aheads for hiring new officers. Funding for these officers will total \$ 327 million. Because of this increased budgetary demand additional funds will be devoted to COPS AHEAD. "Go ahead" notifications are tentatively scheduled to be announced on December 19, 1994.

After announcement of authorized go-aheads, eligible departments will be forwarded an application kit. Efforts were made to insure that this application kit was simplified and less bureaucratic than traditional grant application materials. Eight specific tasks necessary to complete the application are outlined at the beginning of the kit and discussed in detail within the kit. The narrative information requested from the department is designed in a short answer format. Technical assistance will be provided by the COPS Office to agencies needing help in completing the application. Assurance and certification forms have been simplified and require only reading and a signature. Examples of completed forms are included as a reference. A COPS Office telephone card is on the inside of the back cover for use on a rolodex. Applications are due no later than March 3, 1995 and will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

Funding Decisions

Applications will be reviewed based upon the adequacy of the agency's community policing plan and other requested information. All applicants that comply with program requirements will be funded. Those that are found to be deficient will be provided technical assistance to improve their applications.
