These organizations have since certified, and the funding has been taken out of the cap.

³These numbers are based on rough estimates provided by missions and cooperating agencies at USAID/W request.

⁴Central cooperating agencies implementing existing awards are still awaiting final funding allocations from missions and will be making decisions through September 30, 2001 on local subcontractors and subgrantees as project activities progress.

⁵Earlier estimates of the number of covered organizations, which were higher, neglected to consider that many foreign NGOs work with multiple U.S. partners, but only need to certify once. Approximately 40 NGOs submitted duplicate certifications in the first round.
