Thank you very much for your letter. I appreciate and understand your concerns, and I want you to know that I in no way intended to diminish the artistic value of the film itself. Instead, I hoped to identify some significant concerns raised by the White House Counsel's Office which highlight the difference between the use of real footage in "Forrest Gump" and that used in "Contact."

In the case of, "Forrest Gump," the film producers secured the approval of all the former presidents or their relatives prior to using their image. In "Contact," the film-makers did not receive the President's approval. There is a difference when someone uses the President's image, which is his alone to control, to lead a viewer to imagine that he said something that he really did not say, and using the President's image in merely a satirical manner. The use of the President's image and words to make a fictional point in a plot unrelated to the context in which the President made real remarks is disturbing and has some elements of real concern to the Legal Counsel.

I hope this helps you understand the White House's objection to President Clinton's portrayal in the movie, and that you continue to stay involved.
