DNC RELEASE OF DOCUMENTS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Democratic National Committee is today releasing more than 10,000 pages of documents which have been produced to the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Government Reform and Oversight ("HCGRO").

The DNC is making a rolling production of documents to the HCGRO, pending negotiation of the final scope of the HCGRO subpoena to the DNC. The DNC agreed to produce, at the outset, documents which would clearly be responsive to the Committee's inquiry, including documents referring or relating to John Huang.

On the stated return day of the subpoena, the DNC made available for inspection by HCGRO counsel 14 boxes of documents referring or relating to John Huang. The DNC agreed to provide copies of documents selected from these boxes by the Committee's counsel, except for documents as to which the DNC claimed confidentiality. The DNC has not agreed with the Committee on confidentiality procedures. Pending agreement on such procedures, the DNC has taken the position that it will make all documents available for inspection, but will provide copies only of non-confidential documents.

The documents being released today are copies of all of the documents selected by and delivered to HCGRO counsel, except that, in the copies being released to the press, the DNC has redacted telephone numbers, social security numbers and credit card numbers, in order to protect the privacy of individuals referred to or listed in the documents.

Attached to this backgrounder is an index to the documents. The box numbers in this index are the numbers of the boxes in which copies were delivered to HCGRO counsel. The letters A, B and C after the box numbers denote the letters of the boxes in which the documents are being released to the press.

These documents come from three sources:

Index box numbers 1 through 5 consist of documents located in the files of individual DNC employees and departments maintained on the DNC's computer network, which documents refer or relate to John Huang.

Index box numbers 6, 7 and 9 consist of documents found in John Huang's office at the DNC, including documents in addition to those produced to the House Subcommittee on Civil Service and released in December 1996.

Index box number 8 consists of e-mail sent to John Huang. (To the best of our knowledge at this time, Mr. Huang did not use a computer or e-mail, and never opened any of these e-mail messages).

Documents as to which the DNC has claimed confidentiality generally fall into the following categories:

donor lists that could be used for actual fundraising;

documents detailing DNC fundraising strategy and/or disclosing the DNC's calculations of the internal costs of fundraising; or

documents reflecting detailed political operational information, including state by state targeting, budgets and plans for specific political operations, and strategies and agreements for funding of state party operations and similar information.

Washington, D.C. -- "In light of questions raised by news accounts regarding the donation to the Democratic National Committee from the Cheyenne-Arapaho Indian Tribe of Oklahoma, we discussed the situation thoroughly with the leader of the tribe, Chairman Charles Surveyor.

"The DNC offered to return to the Tribe the \$107,000 the Tribe had contributed to the DNC. Chairman Surveyor said he needed to check with the Tribal Council and get back to us by tomorrow.

"We indicated that, if the Tribe's governing body decided that the Tribe did not want the DNC to return its donation, the DNC would then specifically dedicate the money to Native American voter registration and voter participation activities at the DNC.

"In 1996, for the first time, the Democratic Party had a Political Director for Native American Outreach and a program which actively registered Native Americans to vote and participate in American politics. We registered over 10,000 Native Americans for this last election alone.

"In the past election, Native Americans voted overwhelmingly for President Bill Clinton and Vice President Al Gore as well as for other Democrats throughout the country. We are proud of the Democratic Party's record on Native American issues," Grossman and Romer concluded.

DNC Gala

On Thursday, the President will attend a large DNC fundraiser at the D.C. Armory followed by a Saxophone Club smaller low-dollar fundraiser at the Hyatt Regency. He is scheduled to depart the White House at 7:15pm and return at 9:45pm. All money raised Thursday goes to the DNC.

Washington Gala

- The 1997 Presidential Victory Fund Gala (or Washington Gala) event is the largest national DNC fundraising event. This seated dinner includes representatives from all fifty states.
- *The event is open press.*
- The DNC expects 2,500 people in attendance at the Armory. Their goal is to raise \$4 million. They are still hoping to meet that target.
- Upon arrival, the President will attend a private reception with 45-50 people. He will then proceed to the dinner.
- Comedian Tommy Lee Jones, MC, will introduce the President, the First Lady and Tipper on stage. Each will make remarks. The President will conclude.

Saxophone Club

- All four principals will then proceed to the Saxophone Club event at the Hyatt Regency.
- *The event is either pool or open press depending on the size of the room.*
- The DNC expects 400-500 people to attend this event. The DNC was hoping to raise ~~\$60,000~~. At this point, they are short of that goal.
