Clinton Veto Threat Feeds Medicare Panic

It's very interesting that President Clinton plans to veto the Medicare reform bill, considering there is no Medicare reform bill.

Sure, the House passed its version of Medicare reform on Thursday. But there are significant differences between the House and Senate bills that must be resolved in conference committee. Until then, no one knows just how good or bad the legislation is—which makes Clinton's threat to veto premature, to say the least.

But the president's jumping the gun to oppose Republican-pushed reforms is only the latest in a long line of political rhetoric that confuses and frightens the public—those who pay the bills and those who rely on Medicare for health care coverage.

As reform proposals finish their trek through the legislative process, it is important to keep a few things in mind:

- Medicare does need reforming. The trust fund (Medicare Part A) that pays hospital bills is running out of money. For each enrollee, it spends \$2,900 but collects only \$2,600 in annual payroll taxes.
- The reforms do not cut Medicare. They limit spending increases over the next seven years. Rather than rising by \$623 billion, the amount spent on Medicare will jump by \$353 billion. Annual spending per enrollee will increase from \$4,800 to \$6,700, although the cost of health care per enrollee is expected to rise to \$7,700.

These are serious issues facing America. They call for serious discussion by political leaders, medical experts, insurance authorities and the media. Hyperbole, inflamed rhetoric and other exaggerations do nothing to solve the crisis. They merely feed the fears of seniors and the ambitions of politicians. That is no way to head off a national disaster.

Publisher arrested for printing nude photo of Greek chief's wife

ATHENS, Greece — A publisher was arrested and three more were in hiding after their newspapers printed a picture Friday alleged to show Greek Prime Minister Andreas Papandreou's wife in an intimate nude beach scene with another woman.



Papandreou

All were charged with an "unprovoked insult" against Dimitra Liani-Papandreou, 40, after the Onoma and the Avriani dailies published the alleged photograph of her.

Avriani said it published the picture to force her to withdraw from public life, while Onoma said it printed it to show it was a fake.

Liani-Papandreou issued a statement denouncing the picture as a fabrication and she had nothing but contempt for those involved in a campaign against her.

"To today's outrageous fabrication, the peak of a filthy campaign of political blackmail that a woman is going through, I can only answer with my deepest contempt," she said.

Police arrested Makis Psomiadis, Onoma's publisher, and were searching for three more publishers or chief editors involved in publish-

ing the picture.

Psomiadis was expected to go on trial today. If convicted, he could face up to six months in jail for the misdemeanor but under Greek law he can buy off the sentence.

Liani-Papandreou has enraged some members of Papandreou's Panhellenic Socialist Movement (PASOK) by appearing to be preparing the ground to enter politics and stand for Parliament.

A group of prominent socialists has complained that her "inner court" has become too powerful and has effectively taken over the running of the socialist party and the government.

Papandreou, 76, frail since heart surgery in 1988, has even been forced to insist that he, not she, is in charge. He has also said he would support her if she chose to run for office.

Liani-Papandreou became director of his private office after the socialists won a big election victory in 1993, organizing his daily agenda and controlling access to him.

Avriani said it wanted her to resign from her powerful post as chief of staff to Papandreou and vowed to publish more nude pictures if she did not.

Liani-Papandreou shocked many Greeks when she appeared at Papandreou's side during the 1989 election campaign. They were married to other people at the time.

Avriani, once a champion of Papandreou, fell out with him and trained its fire on his wife with a series of previously published nude pictures from her summer escapades in the Aegean before her marriage to the prime minister.

It said Friday's picture, which has not been issued before, was part of a series of new photographs which it would publish in coming weeks.

Avriani's nude picture campaign sent its circulation soaring to more than 80,000 from 10,000 and it was expected to surpass 100,000 Friday.

Papandreou and Liani-Papandreou, a former flight attendant, met in mid-air as she was serving the prime minister drinks. They divorced their spouses and married shortly after he lost elections in June 1989.

His defeat after eight years in power was partly attributed to their public extra-marital affair.

Liani-Papandreou stood by him and nursed him after heart surgery. Through it all, she kept a low profile and convinced the public her goal was to make Papandreou happy.

But even senior members of his socialist party began to see her as a political upstart after Papandreou returned to power in 1993 and made her head of his private office.

"She began to test the waters for running for office but the public response was very negative," a foreign diplomat said.

Opinion polls showed Greeks strongly objected to her direct involvement in politics and newspapers that had long supported Papandreou turned their guns on her.

Dissenters from within his party openly called for him to choose a successor to ensure the party's survival but he brushed them aside, saying he and he alone ruled.

"I listen to her opinions, like every husband, but how could she co-govern?" he asked. "I'm the one who governs."

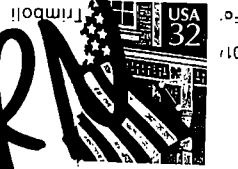

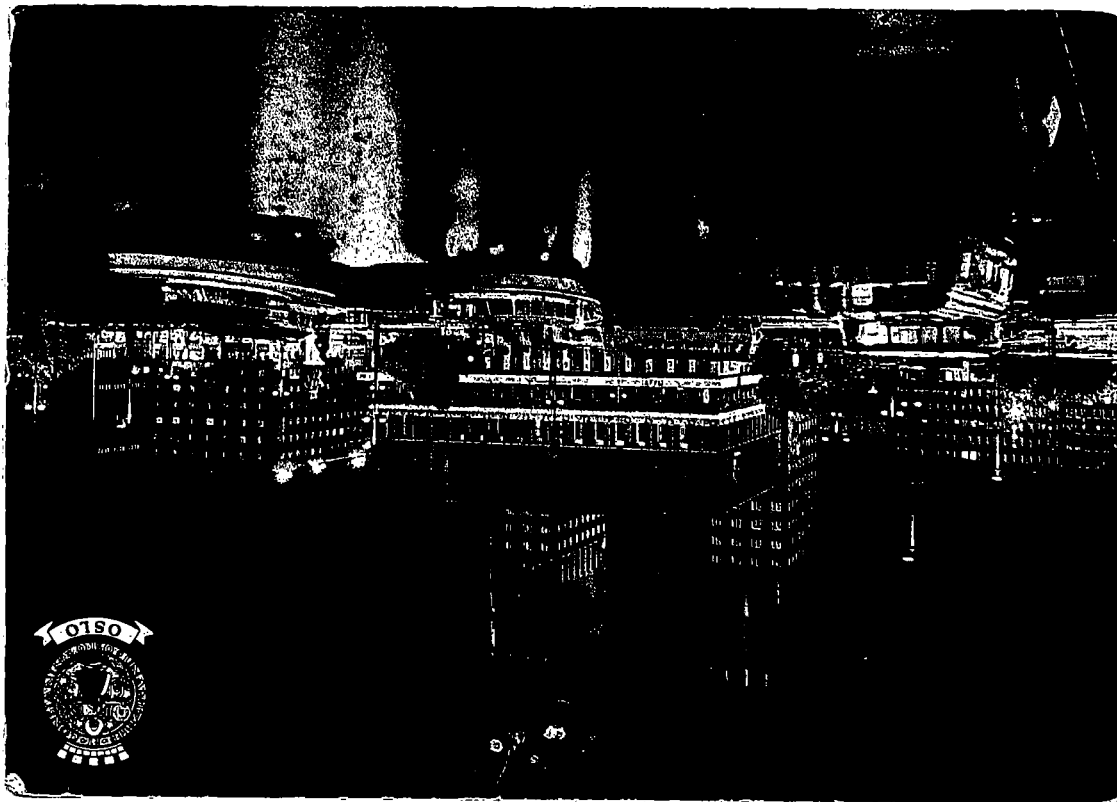

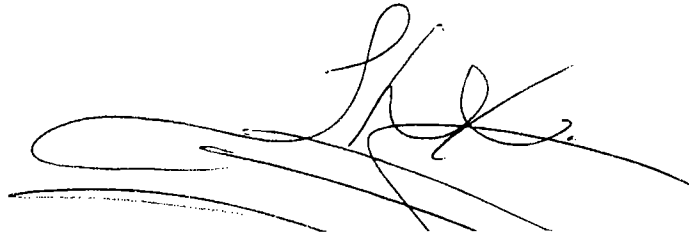

TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES:

In declaring my intention to disapprove House Joint Resolution 122, the further continuing resolution for fiscal year 1996, I stated my desire to approve promptly a clean extension of the continuing resolution that expired on November 13. Accordingly, I am forwarding the enclosed legislation that would provide for such an extension. This legislation also provides that all Federal employees furloughed during the Government shutdown through no fault of their own will be compensated at their ordinary rate for the period of the furlough.

I urge the Congress to act on this legislation promptly and to return it to me for signing.

We are located on the border of East Palo Alto, a city you are certainly familiar with, since you attended Ravenswood High School. OICW trains more than 2,000 people every year and we have 80% placement rates into good jobs. The average wage at placement for OICW graduates is \$8.50 - \$9 per hour.

Group offers opportunities, not handouts

GOVERNMENT and business executives who want to bring disenfranchised people — like many of the rioters in South Central Los Angeles — closer to the mainstream

should take a close look at a Menlo Park non-profit organization with a superb record and a dreadful name.

The Opportunities Industrial-

ization Center West — OICW — has trained and found jobs for more than 30,000 disadvantaged people — many of them minorities — in the Bay Area over the last 30 years. It expects to have more than 2,000 graduates this year.

Even more remarkable is the job retention rate of OICW graduates — more than 85 percent — and their starting wages — an average of \$9.22 a hour in the first seven months of the organization's current fiscal year.

THAT'S GOOD pay for a group of people that includes many high school dropouts, drug addicts and others with little earning power before they entered the program. OICW takes people who are at a potential turning point in their lives and gives them the tools to go forward in a positive way. That's far better for them — and for society — than a handout.

Several of the reasons for OICW's success could be copied elsewhere.

The program is an example of cooperation between city, state and federal government and business. Government and business each provides about half of OICW's \$2 million budget. The shared funding requires OICW to be sensitive to the needs of both constituencies.

OICW understands what its trainees — and their eventual employers — need. It provides a variety of courses that range from culinary arts to printing technology to electronics.

But OICW does more than provide a general education and a trade. It also has classes on building self-esteem and on job search and success, a child development center for pre-school children of low-income families, an on-site free store to provide clothing for interviews and the workplace, and peer counseling sessions after placement who help assure a successful workplace adjustment.

"Sometimes I feel the actual technical skills, while important, are almost secondary to learning how to be a worker and succeed in the workplace," says Sharon A. Williams, the center's executive director.

THE PROGRAM also doesn't rely only on full-time teachers and administrators. Many executives sit on its advisory boards to ensure that the courses are up-to-date and pertinent. Some executives participate in training classes.

For example, Kendall Mau, vice president of finance and administration for Silicon Valley Federal Credit Union in Palo Alto, leads seminars on employer expectations and provides job counseling, including instruction in résumé writing and opportunities for video interviews.

Although OICW receives substantial government funding and is run by full-time professionals, it's in close touch with the business community — the people who are likely to provide the jobs that enable OICW trainees to achieve their goals.

It's an excellent partnership — and one of many reasons why East Palo Alto didn't erupt after the Rodney King verdict.

Waking up to champions

Job training agency celebrates another year of community commitment

GOING to the OICW Breakfast of Champions will put a lump in your throat every time.

Something always gets to you at the annual gathering of Opportunities Industrialization Center West, a non-profit job training program based in Menlo Park.

Tuesday, maybe it was the 30 or so members of Daytop Village drug rehabilitation center in East Palo Alto who lined up across the front of the ballroom of Hyatt Rickey's in Palo Alto and sang, "Lean on Me."

Or maybe it was emcee Jan Hutchins reading Charles Rowland's first place essay about why he wanted to win the United Airlines essay contest and get the round-trip ticket home to a town called Chicago Heights.

To the rescue

Since he left 23 years ago as a young U. S. Army draftee, his widowed father and two brothers had died and Rowland now hoped to rescue his sister from her addiction.

Maybe it was even funnyman Michael Pritchard making you howl one minute ("Some days you are the pigeon, some days you are the statue.") — then choking you up the next minute talking about his work with children.

"I said to one little kid, 'Today, we are going to learn about responsibility. You know — responsibility to yourself and mom and dad and school...'

Baby in the closet

"And he said, 'I have a responsibility that when my dad gets drunk and starts to beat on my mom, I take the baby and hide the baby with me in the closet so he doesn't hurt us, too.'"

It's not easy to get motivated to show up at a 7:30 a.m. breakfast. Especially in this community where most of us eat more than our share of banquet peas to support worthy causes. But since its start 10 years ago, the breakfast

body can any longer expect to do the same thing throughout life," he said.

The nearly 750 people in the room and those in the OICW program, already had discovered that the world had changed drastically, he said. And even Stanford students might be astonished to find information they learned as freshmen, changed by the time they were seniors.

"It is said that 5½ years from now, all scientific knowledge will be viewed as obsolete," Casper said.

Scary stuff

The breakfast crowd was composed of OICW staff and graduates, employers and potential employers — people acquainted with a new kind of scariness in the job market.

Said Tom Peters, management author and syndicated columnist, participating in his 10th breakfast, "It is no longer dog eat dog out there, it is brain eat brain out there.

Today is the most frightening time in 200 years, but it is the time laden with the most op-

were produced by OICW printing technology trainees. The culinary arts classes and working cafeteria turn out meals from elegant to simple.

In the electronics division, men and women hunker over complicated-looking circuit boards.

And in classrooms everywhere, the basics of math, English and computers are being taught.

And here are a few more facts told about OICW on Tuesday:

Ninety percent of its enrollees graduate and more than 70 percent of the graduates are enrolled in full-time jobs within 90 days after their OICW course ended. In 29 years, OICW has helped 37,000 men and women prepare for careers.

At the breakfast, OICW gave Marriott Corp. its Employer of the Year Award. Miguel Mariscal Jr. received its Alumni Achievement Award and Daytop Village received the Community Champion Award.

More good news of the day concerned the agency's on-going effort to raise \$4½ million for a new building. Tuesday emcee Hutchins announced that David Packard has donated \$1 million, putting them over the top.

SEOUL Twelve American soldiers were detained by police and accused of beating a South Korean man in a drunken subway brawl, police said Saturday.

The members of a U.S. Army military police unit in the Yongshan area of central Seoul were accused of dragging Cho Chung-koo, 28, out of a subway car and beating him Friday evening.

Police turned the Americans over to U.S. military authorities and said they would decide after further investigation whether to file charges.

According to police, Cho said he had been attacked after protesting to the U.S. soldiers that they were sexually harassing a Korean woman.

Police said five soldiers, including one woman, were directly involved in the assault on Cho. The soldiers were drunk and were returning to their camp after a party for a friend, police said.

Clinton Optimistic About U.S. Future In Spite of Violence

WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP) — President Clinton told a White House gathering today that the United States is prone to violence and has many problems but that Americans should not be discouraged about the future.

"We're more violent than we need to be, but we always have been," Mr. Clinton said, adding, "We've got to get a hold on it."

But he urged his audience, 250 educators meeting to discuss character-building, responsibility, community and the importance of the family, to keep faith in their country and social problems in perspective.

"Look, this is not the Great Depression, this is not World War II, this is not the Civil War," he said. "I am basically very optimistic about the future of this country."

Mr. Clinton said the United States had too many out-of-wedlock births, too much drug addiction, too many children growing up in unstable environments and too much polarized political debate. But, he counseled: "We know what to do. We know the difference between right and wrong. The fundamental fact is that this is a very great country and nearly everybody is still getting up every day and doing the very best they can to do what is right. Nearly everybody desperately wants to have children who have good character and who do good, and who are good — nearly everybody."

A Reporter Forgotten In D.C. Jail

SUMMARY:

I'm aware that the U.S. Constitution provides the President with enormous powers on matters related to national security and international relations. I'm also aware that Congress has never enacted any law preventing the public and especially reporters (the media) from accepting and circulating newsworthy classified govt. information "leaked" to them by a govt. employee or anyone else. Also no reporter or third party has ever been prosecuted under the Federal Espionage Act, 18 USC 793(c) and 18 USC 641 for accepting and making such information available to the public without any criminal intent. I'm the first culprit forgotten in D.C. jail, in what I regard as a politically selective motivated indictment fabricated/concocted and executed by govt. agents to make an innocent reporter with 15-years record in D.C. the fall guy or scapegoat for "leaked" govt. information he did not initiate, encourage or control. A criminal scenario concocted has led to my being incarcerated in "a prison within a prison" unit of D.C. jail for 18 months without trial and costing U.S. taxpayers over half a million dollars and counting. Despite the faked foundation of the alleged criminal activities which enabled govt. agents to establish probable cause, subsequent investigation and my indictment, I have waited patiently to plead my case before a Jury of my peers. After 18 months, I have not been able to do so because my basic rights to a fair trial have continued to be violated while I watch in dismay the manipulation of the legal process by

my Court appointed attorneys working in concert with the Prosecution/FBI. I have watched helplessly how they have manipulated, exempli gratia, the Speedy trial mandate and how they have embarked on a consistent pattern of either hiding or destroying material evidence that I could use for my defense or manufacture, concoct and then transplant incriminating evidence against me to secure a conviction against me.

Mr. President, it is with humility, great respect and admiration that I write to you today not to circumvent the law but to draw your attention to this bizarre case ^{of} espionage which testifies miscarriage of justice and waste of taxpayers money. That a journalist will be prosecuted for accepting newsworthy classified information from a govt employee or anyone else is very unsettling. Equally unsettling is the concoction of a criminal scenario to entrap or frame me, one of the reporters who allegedly received the information circulated by a govt employee. And that I should be incarcerated for 18 months on a criminal scenario concocted in violation of my rights to free speech and search for knowledge is a terrible mistake and abuse of power over those of us in the minority, poor and at the periphery of our profession in the media.

I write to you, Mr. President, because I'm out of place in this prison as Joseph was in Pharaoh's prison and that given the facts of this case as I know them, you will not tolerate my spending one extra day in jail. Despite my isolation from everyone and intimidation of those who could provide me information or assistance to demonstrate this fabrication and entrapment, I now have factual proofs to show that I was framed and that govt agents manufactured and concocted a criminal scenario in Herbei, Liberia to secure an indictment against me. It is difficult for me to present these facts either in Court or before ~~some~~ ^{a neutral authority} ~~else~~ because my Court appointed attorneys and govt agents have made sure not only that I remain isolated but embarked on consistent cover ups, that's, hiding or destroying material evidence, manufacturing, concocting and planting others right before my very eyes. I seek your intervention to bring an end to this nightmare because I'm an innocent and law abiding reporter and perhaps the most visible community activist of all contemporary African immigrants residing in the Washington Metropolitan Area. This case is a terrible mistake.

1. EXTREME PREJUDICE NIGHTMARE:

I believe I have become a hostage in D.C. jail because I do no longer comprehend why I have been held here for 18 months without trial. Furthermore, the pitiful conditions of my incarceration defeat any sense of human decency. My civil and constitutional rights have been violated with impunity and I write with humility, great respect and admiration to draw your attention and that of the public to the lone voice of innocence crying in the wilderness against gross injustices. I solicit your assistance to get me out of this hole before I'm overwhelmed by the mighty hands of govt agents who have fabricated/concocted a criminal scenario against me and which is costing taxpayers over half a million dollars.

The suspense and pressure to reveal the criminal hoax of espionage concocted against me to an authority is killing me. I write to you therefore not to circumvent the law but to enable me have equal opportunity to defend myself on fabricated criminal charges brought against me. Without your intervention the probability is that, I may be left here to rust indefinitely, especially as my Court Appointed Attorneys have consistently been in league with the Prosecution/FBI. They have deliberately manipulated the legal process to my disadvantage subjecting me to extreme prejudice that defeats any sense of human decency.

For 18 months I have been confined in a 13ft by 8ft cage under solitary confinement also known as total separation in a "prison within a prison" unit of D.C. jail. This unit is mainly for inmates who commit serious infraction e.g. stabbing or drug trafficking, etc. within the institution. Because of the extreme harsh conditions prevalent in this unit, such inmates spend on average only 14 days to 2 months, here. I have been made to spend 18 months. I'm therefore the longest held inmate here and who has not even been tried and yet who has been subjected to such extreme prison conditions for such a long period. Even serial killers or political prisoners don't experience the type of restrictions imposed on me for 18 months. The following are highlights of my predicament:

- (a) I'm allowed a shower only 3 times every 7-days. The water maybe too hot or too cold, it doesn't matter. This has been going on for the past 18 months.
- (b) I have only three hours recreation time every 7 days. That's 1hr every Monday; 1hr every Wednesday; and 1hr every Friday. I'm allowed to leave my cage only during ^{the} three hours to stretch my bones and to take my prescribed shower.
- (c) Otherwise, I'm locked-up in my cage - 13ft by 8ft cage, 24 hours a day; 7 days a week; 4 weeks a month; 12 months a year and so on without a glimpse of the blue sky. The only exception is when I'm being taken to court or to the infirmary.

- (d) I have no access to the Law Library where I could spend time to research or to read about legal issues that may help my defense.
- (e) My liberty to communicate with relatives, friends and colleagues is restricted, and
- (f) I don't have access to a telephone to make legal calls.
- (g) I'm not permitted to fellowship with other inmates or Sunday church services. I also don't have access to the ~~chaplain~~ chaplain's office like other inmates and my written requests don't reach or they are ignored.

This extreme isolation, deprivation and mental torture has affected my emotional well-being and my health. For example,

- (a) I have not been able to talk or to read from any member of my family or relative for the past 18 months. I have apparently lost 3 family members. But because letters from my family, close friends etc. from Africa, Europe, and within the USA are confiscated by govt agents, I don't have the slightest details about who is dead and what happened. And this is killing me emotionally and mentally.
- (b) I have not seen my God Son and don't know his whereabouts since govt agents informed his mother not to contact me.
- (c) Because of lack of access and communication with my family and relatives, etc. I have had to spend two cold winters without any winter clothings and underweares.
- (d) I lost my car, property and important files and office documents accumulated for the past 6 years of business transactions. Everything I owned over a period of 15 years is destroyed or lost.
- (e) I lost a World Bank contract of \$27,000 annually and a potential investment package of \$1.5 million.
- (f) Being confined in a 13ft by 8ft cage for 18 months also means inactivity and lack of mobility. My health has seriously been affected. I'm suffering from hypertension and nursing an ulcer. The poor diet hasn't helped matters.

The handling of this case is baffling to me and to anyone who understands the genesis of my indictment. I believe I have been subjected to this inhumane treatment because my Court Appointed Attorneys and government Agents through a process of intimidation and isolation have stifled virtually every efforts I have made to raise the \$50,000 Surety bond the Court granted me.

They know that once I'm out of this hole/cage, their leverage over me is dead and so is the case. Because I'm going to reveal a Fabrication/concocted criminal scenario against me that will make headlines.

The question one may ask is, why I have been subjected to such inhumane treatment, harassment and intimidation? What crime have I committed to deserve this type of treatment?

CONCLUSION:

The Lord Jesus Christ taught us that we should learn to ask if we need something, and it will be given to us. That if we seek, we'll find and that if one knocks, the door will be opened to you, "For everyone who ask receives, he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks, the door will be opened, (Matt: 7:12)." I'm facing the most difficult time of my life facing charges on a horrendous crime of espionage for ^{allegedly} accepting old govt information from a govt employee which she made available to the media and to her friends without anyone influencing her decisions. She did this voluntarily. I have spent 18 months in a "jail within a jail" unit of D.C. jail where I'm confined in a 13ft by 8ft cage and allowed only 3 hours recreation time from the cage every 7 days and allowed to take a shower only 3 times every 7 days. As if this isn't enough, govt agents working with my Court Appointed Attorneys, have succeeded in isolating me from everyone who maybe able to provide assistance. For 18 months I have received no correspondence from my family in Cameroon. This isn't because they haven't written. Simply put, my letters are not only read, they are confiscated.

Despite my isolation from relatives and friends etc. who could render me most needed assistance and despite the horrors and mental torture of my incarceration, I have remained an ideal prisoner obeying all the rules and regulations of the Institution.

Mr. President, the pressure to reveal the criminal fabrication, is killing me. I know I have been framed. I know documents involved in this case have been fabricated. The proofs are with me and around me but I'm not able to present them. I know my Court Appointed Attorneys' professional and ethical conduct as pertains to this indictment has been frightfully disappointing. I have watched helplessly how material evidence are concocted and planted while others are hidden or destroyed. I have unsuccessfully tried to make my voice of innocence heard. I have no other choice but to turn my plea to the father of the Nation, President Bill Clinton, himself.

In the 1830s, the French Political Historian, Alexis de Toqueville visited America to see how democracy was faring on in the New Republic. He was fascinated with what he saw and proclaimed that, "the bench and the bar were America's nobility." Although de Toqueville did not explore the Theories of Justice in America's Jurisprudence, his powerful statement, I believe remains as true today as it was some 160 years ago. My dilemma with govt agents and my Court Appointed Attorneys notwithstanding, I still believe in the rule of the law and justice for all. It's because I'm being refused these basic rights that I seek your intervention. I do this with great humility, great respect and admiration. I'm a victim of circumstances. I thank you again for listening to the plight of a reporter in jail for 18 months without trial for allegedly receiving State Department cables made available to the public by a government employee.

I look forward to hearing from you very soon.

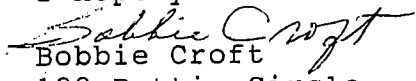

There is still a ceremony planned for Honolulu, and Clinton is expected to attend. But leaders of other nations aren't being invited.

For the record, the administration says plans can't have been scaled back because they hadn't been announced in the first place. And officials say there already were an abundance of high-level gatherings scheduled this year.

The administration also rejects veterans' complaints that it is trying to eliminate usage of the phrase "V-J Day."

"I'm not aware of any policy" that expressly rules out using the phrase "V-J Day," White House spokesman Mike McCurry said Tuesday.

Still, he added, "There are sensitivities here. . . . There is a way in which you can address these things that match the spirit of reconciliation that now exists between the United States and Japan. We are not into cleaning

ter last summer, he vowed that the Japanese parliament would pass a formal resolution of apology to Asian nations it attacked during the war. That resolution has not passed, nor does one look likely.

A gathering of Pacific heads of state in Honolulu would have put Murayama in a delicate and embarrassing position — having to come and face his former adversaries.

The overall subject, including the controversy over the "V-J Day" phrase, is a sensitive one for the White House since several conservative commentators and lawmakers have cited it as a sign of Clinton's clumsiness on military issues — and insensitivity to U.S. veterans of the Pacific.

"He has spent so much time doing crossword puzzles and reading mystery novels that he shows no knowledge of the torture and abuse of our prisoners of war at the hands of Japan," said Rep. Bob Dornan, R-Calif. "The only aggressor in the Pacific was Japan. 'V-J Day' is honorable shorthand."

Department official. But he also insisted he not be quoted by name.

And the phrase does not appear in material being put out on end-of-war observances.

"The Defense Department's World War II Commemorative Committee is planning an end-of-the Pacific War commemoration in Honolulu for Sept 1-3, 1995. These ceremonies will also mark the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II," said one official announcement.

Nor have spokesmen used the "V-J Day" phrase from the lectures of the State Department, White House or Pentagon.

By contrast, the term "V-E Day" has been uttered freely.

It should be noted that "V-J" stands for "Victory over Japan," while the European counterpart has never been "V-G Day" — or "Victory over Germany" — but "V-E", or "Victory In Europe."

Several White House aides also noted the term, "V-J Day" itself is misleading, since there are actually two such days that in the

Your letter voicing concern about issuing a stamp depicting the atomic bombing at the end of World War II has been forwarded to this office for response.

The Postal Service has announced it will change the proposed design depicting the 1945 dropping of an atomic bomb on Japan. The original design, a picture of a mushroom-shaped cloud, will be replaced with artwork featuring President Harry S. Truman preparing to announce the end of the war.

American History is a dynamic subject. We, as a nation, are constantly examining and re-examining the role of many public figures and historical events. Almost any historical stamp subject will hold some degree of controversy. Stamps depicting such events and figures are not offered as an endorsement of individual deeds or policies the events represent, but are intended to recognize their historical significance.

The Postal Service is mindful of the feelings of U.S. veterans and their families about the sacrifices they made in World War II and other military conflicts. We also realize that times and some feelings have changed in the 50 years since the war's end. The bombing has been an extremely emotional issue in Japan, while in this country sensitivity to the issue has increased. The remarkable partnership between the United States and Japan has become a cornerstone of foreign policy in recent years, and the Postal Service does not want to do anything that would affect the friendship between the two countries. We believe the long-term interests of the United States are best served by eliminating sore spots when possible.

Another battle over WWII

At issue is how the victory in the Pacific will be marked

WASHINGTON — The Clinton administration, after ducking the flap over the Enola Gay and ruffling only a few feathers with its V-E Day plans, could be headed for heavy flak over how it intends to mark the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II in the Pacific.

Perhaps the most inflammatory prospect, vigorously denied by senior White House officials, is that the

administration has acceded to Japanese government urgings not to refer to the event as V-J Day — "Victory over Japan."

Veterans groups, which have kept a wary eye on a White House headed by a president who avoided serving in the Vietnam War, said Tuesday they had heard of such a plan for more than a week. Their fear was fed by an Associated Press report that the White House, for the purpose of observances in late summer, had transformed V-J Day into the "End of the Pacific War."

"We've been hearing ripples," said Steve Van Buskirk, a spokesman for the Veterans of Foreign Wars, since a Washington Post report earlier this month suggested the Clinton administration had assured Tokyo that instead of "V-J Day" official U.S. material would refer to "the end of the war."

The response of VFW members is singular, Van Buskirk said: "It's preposterous."

"It's just a desire to be politically

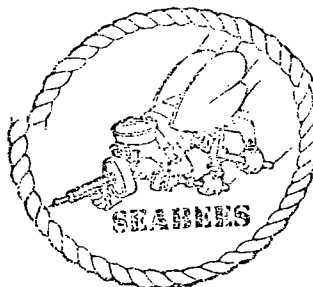

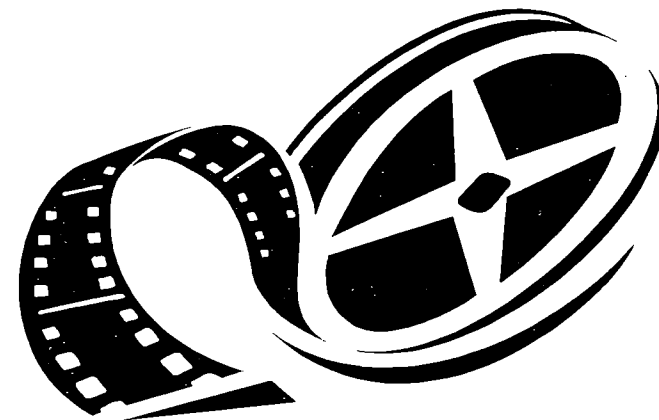

PROGRAM SUPPORT

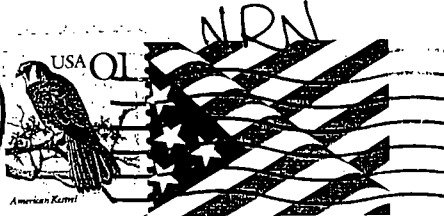
