Dear Senator Helms:

Thank you for your letter concerning IAEA technical assistance to North Korea. As you have noted, all such assistance has been halted by the IAEA because of North Korea's failure to comply with its international nonproliferation obligations.

IAEA Director General Blix has stood firm in insisting that North Korea allow a complete inspection of its nuclear facilities. I am confident he will not go forward with any cooperative programs so long as North Korea refuses to comply with the requirements that have been set forth by the IAEA Board of Governors and the UN Security Council, and I assure you that the United States will strongly support this position.

I look forward to working with you and your colleagues on this important matter.

Dear Mr. President:

Recognizing your stated concern about North Korea's nuclear weapons proliferation program, I suspect that you are unaware of the International Atomic Energy Agency's (IAEA) proposed project to assist the North Koreans in their search for domestic sources of uranium. That's why I am writing to you today because I myself am greatly concerned. Here's why:

While all IAEA aid projects for North Korea, including this one, have been suspended temporarily as a result of North Korea's failure to comply with the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), funds for this project have been appropriated (and may be expended at the will of the Executive Director of the IAEA, currently Dr. Hans Blix). I strongly urge that you take immediate action to ensure that this irresponsible project is canceled permanently.

The uranium exploration technical assistance project was first proposed to IAEA by the North Koreans six years ago -- ostensibly to aid in the development of a safe, commercial, domestic energy program. The IAEA description of the project contends that the most accessible type of uranium found in North Korea is low-grade and poses difficulties for ore processing. As a result, the IAEA proposes to assist the North Koreans in exploring for uranium found to be more suitable for ore processing, in terms of grade and production costs.

In other words, Mr. President, the IAEA, to which the United States provides about 50% of its funding, plans to help this rogue regime to find better domestic uranium --- the same material that, when reprocessed, could very well be used in North Korea's efforts to develop an indigenously designed and produced nuclear weapon.

I reject the notion that this is merely an innocuous program as some in the State Department and the IAEA claim.

As I'm sure you know, the U.S. intelligence community has been aware of North Korea's dual-use nuclear program for several years. Incredibly, this uranium exploration project was approved in November 1993 by the IAEA's Technical Assistance Coordinating Committee at its annual meeting in Vienna -- long after North Korea had withdrawn from the NPT and long after North Korea had refused full IAEA safeguards inspections.

The United States representative was present at the November meeting. I understand that at the time of the meeting, the Italian representative raised an objection to this project, and possibly to others intended for North Korea.

In response, the North Koreans claimed that denial of this voluntary aid would be construed in Pyongyang as a punitive sanction. So, rather than support the very responsible proposal by a key NATO ally, the U.S. representative sided with our North Korean adversaries and voted in favor of all the programs for North Korea, including the one for uranium exploration.

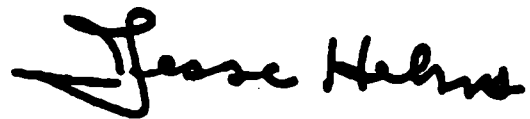
This vote profoundly concerns me on a number of levels. In light of North Korea's historical support of international terrorism, its refusal to abide by the precepts of the NPT and its destabilizing attempts to develop nuclear weapons, I am amazed that our IAEA representative did not vigorously oppose this project before it ever reached the committee. I am further dismayed that we surrendered final decision-making authority to the Executive Director of the IAEA by pre-approving this and the implementation of other projects at any time he wishes.

Additionally, at present, U.S. law dictates that no U.S. funds shall aid North Korea. If that is to be strictly enforced, does it not follow that no U.S. funds, even if distributed through international organizations like the IAEA, should reach North Korea? (IAEA technical assistance programs are funded solely through voluntary contributions from member states. In 1993 alone, the US provided over \$21.1 million of the \$40 million technical budget. Therefore, it could be construed that the American taxpayer is subsidizing Pyongyang's nuclear weapons program.)

I strongly urge that you take immediate steps to correct this unacceptable situation and remove this project from the IAEA's Technical Cooperation program agenda. We must continue to send a clear and uncompromising message to the North Koreans and the international community as a whole that we will vigorously oppose any effort--regardless of size and scope--that enhances North Korea's proliferation abilities.

Purpose

To respond to Senator Helms' letter on IAEA technical cooperation with North Korea.

Background

Senator Helms complains that the current IAEA technical assistance budget contains a project to assist North Korea on uranium ore exploration and asks you to take steps to halt this project. The IAEA has approved such a project, along with other technical cooperation with North Korea, but all of these assistance activities were halted by the IAEA following North Korea's refusal to comply with IAEA inspection requests last year.

Last November, the IAEA Board of Governors discussed IAEA technical assistance programs for North Korea. The U.S. did not then press for formal suspension of technical cooperation with North Korea because all assistance had in fact been stopped, while additional punitive action by the IAEA could have disrupted IAEA efforts to resume inspections in North Korea. Termination of all nuclear cooperation, including formal suspension of IAEA technical assistance programs, remains under consideration as a possible sanction that could be imposed on North Korea.

We propose that your response to Senator Helms make clear that the IAEA has stopped all technical assistance to North Korea and that the IAEA is highly unlikely to resume this program unless North Korea returns to compliance with its international safeguards obligations.

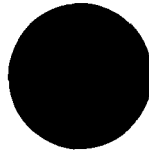
