### DRAFT ROK ASSURANCE

I am pleased to confirm that the Republic of Korea will cooperate fully in efforts to arrange for the financing and construction in North Korea of light-water nuclear power reactors of similar design to reactors currently operating or under construction in South Korea. In particular, the Republic of Korea guarantees that it will provide not less than (\_\_\_\_%) of all funding necessary to construct such light-water reactors in North Korea with a total design capacity of approximately 2,000 MW(e) and will authorize full participation by South Korean firms in the project. Such funds will be made available to the organization overseeing the project (or its designee).

Letter from U.S. to ROK

In order to promote a broad and thorough resolution to the North Korean nuclear issue, the United States has informed North Korea in Geneva that we are prepared to provide a letter of assurance with respect to the financing and construction of a light-water reactor project in North Korea. This assurance would be contingent on a complete resolution of the nuclear issue, including satisfaction of the IAEA's requirements to address questions arising from North Korea's past nuclear activities (such as special inspections as required by the IAEA). Such a resolution would also require full implementation of the Joint Declaration on the Denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula.

Based on consultations between our two governments, the United States has proposed to North Korea that the Republic of Korea play a central role in financing and constructing the proposed light-water reactor project. We have explained that this proposal is the only technically, politically, and financially viable option. We also believe that the role played by the Republic of Korea in such a project would provide an opportunity for improving inter-Korean relations.

The provision of a light-water reactor project to North Korea will be central to the resolution of the North Korean nuclear issue when the U.S.-DPRK talks resume on September 23. That project will only come into being if the United States offers the assurances that we discussed with North Korea in the August session in Geneva. The United States will do its utmost to insure the success of the project. In view of the central role of the Republic of Korea in the proposed light-water reactor project, however, your written commitment on the Republic of Korea's participation in the financing and construction of the project is essential to our efforts to remove the North Korean nuclear threat. As you well know, no light-water reactor technology or equipment can be transferred to North Korea without full implementation of its full-scope safeguards obligations so as to address its past, present, and future nuclear activities.

It will be important that there be progress in North-South talks as we make progress in our talks with North Korea. We must continue our close consultations and draw on the strength of our forty-year alliance as we seek to resolve this issue of vital importance to our alliance, the region, and the world.

DRAFT CONVENTIONAL ENERGY ASSURANCE

As part of the overall settlement of the nuclear issue, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) has agreed to terminate construction on its 50MW(e) and 200MW(e) graphite-moderated reactors while a light-water nuclear power reactor project is constructed in the DPRK. In this connection, the United States Government will take all appropriate action to facilitate multilateral arrangements for the funding and supply of interim energy alternatives for the DPRK pending completion of the light-water reactor project. The U.S. objective will be to arrange for the provision of alternative energy equivalent to (1) the predicted output of the 50MW(e) reactor from July 1995 until the light-water reactor project begins operation, and (2) the predicted output of the 200MW(e) reactor from July 1996 until the light-water reactor project begins operation.

The United States Government follow this course of action so long as the DPRK continues to implement the policies described in the Framework Document dated \_\_\_\_\_, 1994.

The U.S. and DPRK held expert level discussion in Pyongyang from 10-13 September, 1994, in accordance with the agreed statement of the third round of U.S. DPRK high-level talks. Both sides discussed detailed technical matters that would be related to the exchange and establishment of liason offices. the discussion proceeded in a serious and cooperative atmosphere (on the basis of the principle of mutual respect).
