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Agreed Statement
Between The United States of America and
The Democratic Peoples' Republic of Korea

Geneva, August 12, 1994

The delegations of the United States of America (U.S.) and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) met in Geneva from August 5-12, 1994, to resume the third round of talks.

Both sides reaffirmed the principles of the June 11, 1993, U.S.-DPRK joint statement and reached agreement that the following elements should be part of a final resolution of the nuclear issue:

(1) The DPRK is prepared to replace its graphite-moderated reactors and related facilities with light water reactor (LWR) power plants, and the U.S. is prepared to make arrangements for the provision of LWRs of approximately 2,000 MW(e) to the DPRK as early as possible and to make arrangements for interim energy alternatives to the DPRK's graphite-moderated reactors. Upon receipt of U.S. assurances for the provision of LWRs and for arrangements for interim energy alternatives, the DPRK will freeze construction of the 50 MW(e) and 200 MW(e) reactors, forego reprocessing, and seal the Radiochemical Laboratory, to be monitored by the IAEA.

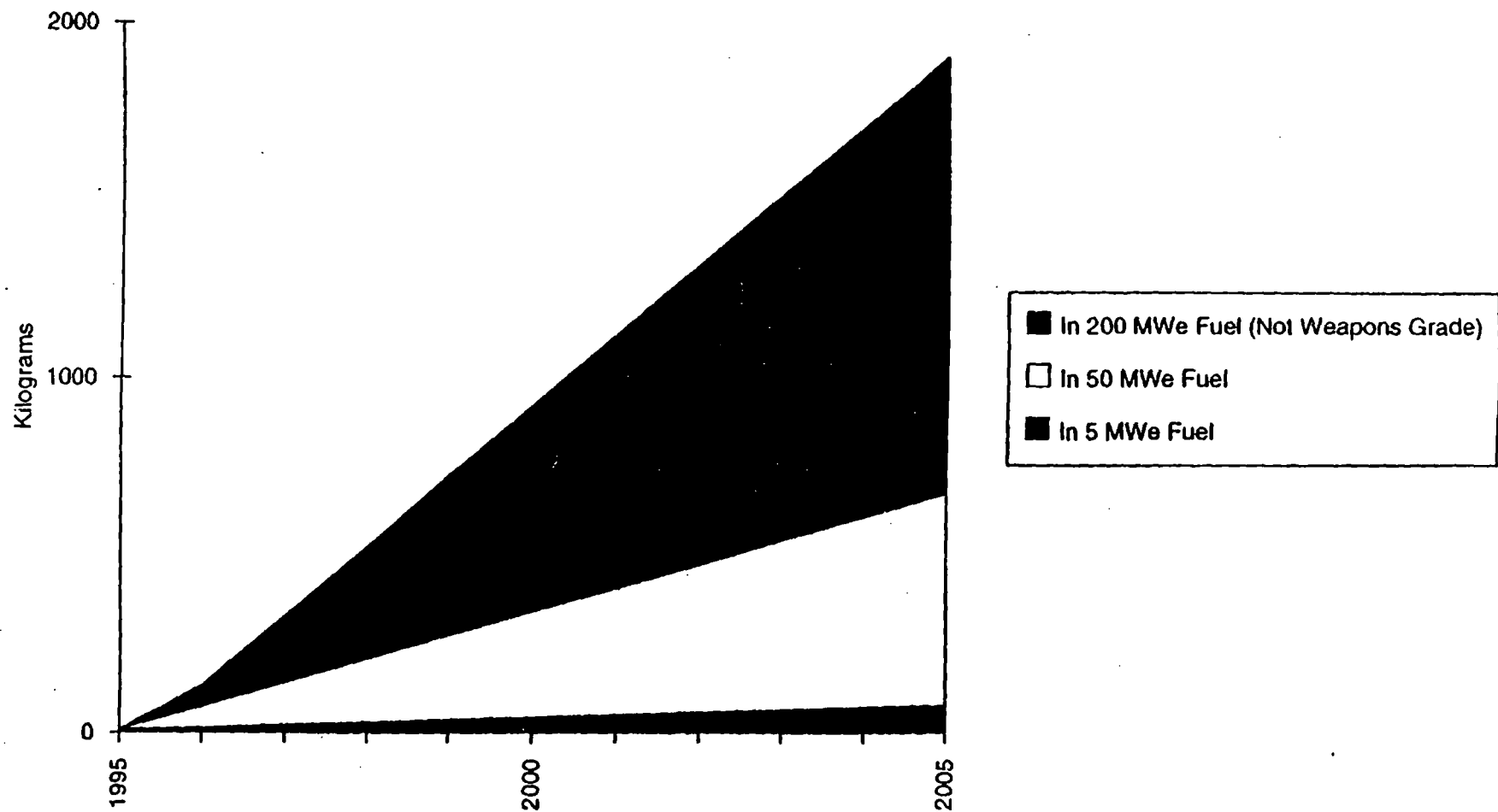
(2) The U.S. and the DPRK are prepared to establish diplomatic representation in each other's capitals and to reduce barriers to trade and investment, as a move toward full normalization of political and economic relations.

(3) To help achieve peace and security on a nuclear-free Korean Peninsula, the U.S. is prepared to provide the DPRK with assurances against the threat or use of nuclear weapons by the U.S., and the DPRK remains prepared to implement the North-South Joint Declaration on the Denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula.

(4) The DPRK is prepared to remain a party to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and to allow implementation of its safeguards agreement under the Treaty.

Important issues raised during the talks remain to be resolved. Both sides agree that expert-level discussions are necessary to advance the replacement of the DPRK's graphite-moderated program with LWR technology, the safe storage and disposition of the spent fuel, provision of alternative energy, and the establishment of liaison offices. Accordingly, expert-level talks will be held in the U.S. and

Overview of Korean Energy Development Organization

1. Establishment

KEDO would be established by multilateral agreement.

This agreement would serve as a charter for the organization, providing a framework for energy assistance projects.

2. Participating Countries

We encourage participation by a core group of countries with vital interests in the NE Asia region and/or global non-proliferation. These would include the U.S., Japan, the ROK, China, Russia, the U.K., France, Germany, the Netherlands, Canada, and Australia.

The participation of other Asian and European countries could be useful and welcome.

3. Objectives

- a. Provision of light-water reactor (LWR) project.
- b. Provision of interim alternative energy to replace energy from the DPRK's graphite-moderated reactors.
- c. Disposal of spent fuel from the 5 MW reactor.
- d. Other related projects (e.g., dismantlement or decommissioning of existing DPRK nuclear facilities).

4. Funds

Funding would be provided primarily by KEDO member states, but KEDO would be authorized to seek contributions from any source. In-kind contributions (e.g., coal or technical assistance) would also be encouraged.

The DPRK has offered to pay for the LWR project through barter. The terms of such an arrangement would likely be highly favorable to the DPRK, so the project would have a significant grant element.

The alternative energy assistance, spent fuel disposal, and dismantlement/decommissioning would be provided primarily on a grant basis.

5. Budget

The budget for the LWR project would include: a feasibility study, extensive technical assistance and training; construction of the LWR; and work on the DPRK power grid so it can accommodate the LWRs.

The budget for interim energy assistance would include: an energy survey (by IEA or others); fuel (coal, but not oil); (possibly) technical assistance to upgrade existing capability; and (possibly) additional generating capacity.

Administrative costs would be kept to a minimum by using a small secretariat and contracting for most of the necessary technical and financial expertise.

Precise cost estimates of the components of the energy package offered to North Korea will be available only after completion of an energy survey and an LWR site survey. Our best preliminary estimates of specific elements include:

Construction of twin "Korean standard" 1,000 MW LWR's: \$4 billion;

Energy survey: \$300 thousand.

Estimated interim conventional energy assistance to compensate for freezing the DPRK's graphite-moderated nuclear reactor program: \$400 million. (This figure includes an estimated annual supply of coal at about \$35 million, plus an estimated transportation cost of \$15 million, provided over an eight year period.)

6. Structure

The KEDO agreement would establish a Board of Governors with each member country represented. The Board would oversee KEDO activities.

Day-to-day management would be the responsibility of a General Manager or Secretary General.

A small secretariat would be established with some financial and technical expertise.

DRAFT LETTER

I wish to confirm to you that I will use the full powers of my office to facilitate arrangements for the financing and construction of a light-water nuclear power reactor project within the DPRK. In addition, in the event that this reactor project is not completed for reasons beyond the control of the DPRK, I will use the full powers of my office to provide, to the extent necessary, such a project from the United States, subject to the approval of the U.S. Congress.

I will follow this course of action so long as the DPRK continues to implement the policies described in the «the framework agreement/our letter from _____ to _____ of _____ confirmed in your letter from _____ to _____ of _____.»

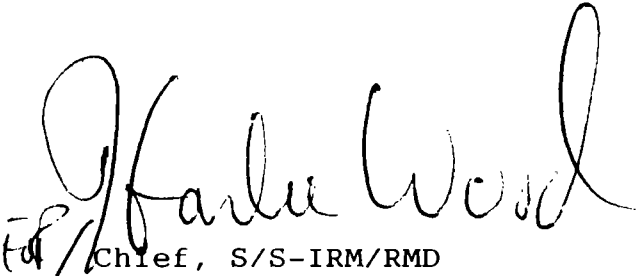

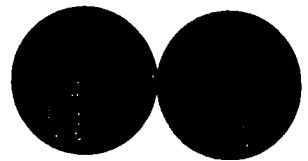

The United States and North Korea held talks in two locations on subjects related to the North Korean nuclear program. In Pyongyang, a working-level U.S. delegation discussed a variety of technical matters related to the possible exchange and establishment of liaison offices, in conjunction with satisfactory progress on the nuclear issue. In Berlin, U.S. officials are discussing technical issues related to Light Water Reactors and alternative power supplies with a North Korean delegation.

Q: When is the United States planning to establish diplomatic relations with North Korea?

A: We are holding out the possibility that liaison offices – not embassies – might be established in each others' capitals in the context of significant progress in resolving the nuclear issue. ~~We have no firm timetable.~~ The working level delegation to Pyongyang was there only to discuss – not negotiate – technical issues that might arise should the necessary progress be achieved.

The timetable depends upon progress on the nuclear issue.

Q: Why hold the talks in Pyongyang?

A: We decided it would be helpful to talk to experts in Pyongyang on the operative conditions and limitations with respect to foreign representative offices.

Q: Was progress made?

A: ~~Since~~ ^{*this*} it was not a negotiation, it is not appropriate to discuss progress. The two sides will report back to their respective governments.

which sought progress; it was a technical discussion in which we sought information.

Q: What about the talks in Berlin?

A: Those talks are ongoing. It would not be appropriate to characterize them at this time.

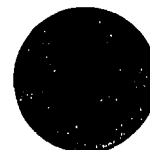

THIS PROPOSAL WAS TABLED BY THE KOREANS LATE IN THE LAST FULL PLENIPOTENTIARY MEETING OF THE TEL WHICH DID NOT PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR A FULL DISCUSSION OF THE MERITS OF THIS PROPOSAL OR EXACTLY WHAT KOREA WAS PROPOSING. AS A RESULT, WHILE SOME DELEGATIONS EXPRESSED INTEREST IN THE KOREAN PROPOSAL, NONE WERE IN A POSITION TO SUPPORT IT FULLY.

3. THE MEETING REPORT CALLS UPON KOREA TO PROVIDE MORE INFORMATION REGARDING THE PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF THE APII AT THE NEXT TEL MEETING IN VANCOUVER IN FEBRUARY BUT LEAVES OPEN THE RIGHT OF ANY MEMBER ECONOMY TO PURSUE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN APII DURING PREPARATIONS FOR THE ECONOMIC LEADERS MEETING. ON THE MINISTERIAL-LEVEL MEETING, THE REPORT STATED THAT THE CONCEPT IS WORTH PURSUING AND THAT IT WOULD BE TRANSMITTED TO THE SENIOR OFFICIALS MEETING {SOM} IN YOGYAKARTA, INDONESIA SEPTEMBER 12-14.

4. IN PRINCIPLE, THE UNITED STATES COULD SUPPORT THE KOREAN PROPOSAL FOR A MINISTERIAL-LEVEL MEETING PROVIDED THAT ADEQUATE GROUND WORK CAN BE LAID FOR THE MEETING. WE CAN NOT SUPPORT THE KOREAN PROPOSAL TO HAVE THE ECONOMIC LEADERS TAKE THIS SUBJECT UP AT THIS TIME. WE WOULD PROCEED BY HAVING THE SOM ASK THAT THE MINISTERS INSTRUCT THE TEL TO DEVELOP A FRAMEWORK UNDER WHICH THE COMMERCIAL {PRIVATE} SECTOR IN APEC ECONOMIES COULD COOPERATE IN THE BUILDING AND OPERATION OF A REGIONAL INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE.

5. WE WOULD PROPOSE THAT THE FRAMEWORK TO BE DEVELOPED BE CONSISTENT WITH THE FIVE PRINCIPLES ENUMERATED BY VICE PRESIDENT GORE IN HIS SPEECH AT THE WORLD TELECOMMUNICATIONS DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE IN BUENOS AIRES IN MARCH, AND ADDRESS SUCH TECHNICAL AND LEGAL ISSUES AS INTERCONNECTION STANDARDS, PRIVACY, INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS, ACCESS, ETC. IN THE UNITED STATES, THE GOVERNMENT HAS FUNDED A FEW SMALL DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS BUT THE BUILDING, OPERATION AND PROGRAMMING ON THE NATIONAL INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE {NII} IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THEREFORE, THE UNITED STATES COULD NOT SUPPORT A PROPOSAL THAT WOULD IMPLY THAT GOVERNMENTS WERE COMMITTED TO FUNDING OR BUILDING THE APII.

6. WE HAVE HEARD THAT OTHER ECONOMIES ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THE EXTENT TO WHICH KOREA INTENDS TO PURSUE ITS PROPOSAL AT THE SOM.

7. ACTION REQUESTED: USING THE FOLLOWING TALKING POINTS, THE EMBASSY IS REQUESTED TO CONTACT THE APPROPRIATE ROKG OFFICIALS, PREFERABLY TELECOMMUNICATIONS OFFICIALS THAT WILL BE ATTENDING THE SOM, TO ASCERTAIN HOW KOREA INTENDS TO PROCEED WITH ITS PROPOSAL.

--THE UNITED STATES WAS QUITE INTERESTED IN THE PROPOSAL WHICH KOREA MADE DURING THE TENTH MEETING OF THE WORKING GROUP ON TELECOMMUNICATIONS CALLING FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ASIA PACIFIC INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE {APII} AND A MINISTERIAL LEVEL MEETING TO DISCUSS AND REVIEW NECESSARY MATTERS TO ESTABLISH AN APII.

--IN HIS SPEECH BEFORE THE WORLD TELECOMMUNICATIONS DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE IN BUENOS AIRES IN MARCH, IN WHICH HE OFFERED TO COOPERATE WITH LIKE MINDED ECONOMIES IN BUILDING SUCH A GLOBAL INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE {GII}, VICE PRESIDENT GORE STATED THAT, "THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE GII MUST BE A COOPERATIVE EFFORT AMONG GOVERNMENTS AND PEOPLES."

--THE VICE PRESIDENT THEN LISTED THE FIVE PRINCIPLES WHICH THE UNITED STATES CONSIDERS TO BE ESSENTIAL IN DEVELOPING A INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE. THESE PRINCIPLES ARE:

- ENCOURAGE PRIVATE INVESTMENT;
- PROMOTE COMPETITION;
- CREATE A FLEXIBLE REGULATORY FRAMEWORK THAT CAN KEEP PACE WITH RAPID TECHNOLOGICAL AND MARKET CHANGES;
- PROVIDE OPEN ACCESS TO THE NETWORK FOR ALL INFORMATION PROVIDERS; AND
- ENSURE UNIVERSAL SERVICE.

--WE BELIEVE THAT THE ASIA PACIFIC REGION WOULD BENEFIT GREATLY FROM INTERCONNECTING ITS NATIONAL INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURES. THIS REGIONAL NETWORK COULD, IN TURN, BE PART OF A GLOBAL SYSTEM.

--THE UNITED STATES IS PREPARED TO SUPPORT THE KOREAN INITIATIVE IF APEC USES A BOTTOM-UP APPROACH TO GETTING ALL OF THE APEC ECONOMIES TO AGREE ON AN ASIA PACIFIC INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE {APII}. BASED ON OUR EXPERIENCE, THIS APPROACH IS MORE LIKELY TO PRODUCE POSITIVE RESULTS.

--THEREFORE, AT THIS TIME, WE FEEL THAT IT IS PREMATURE FOR THE LEADERS TO ADDRESS EITHER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN APII OR A TELECOMMUNICATIONS MINISTERS MEETING.

--WE RECOMMEND THAT THE SENIOR OFFICIALS MEETING IN YOGYAKARTA BE ASKED TO ENDORSE A PROPOSAL TO THE MINISTERS, NOT THE LEADERS, CALLING FOR THE WORKING GROUP ON TELECOMMUNICATIONS (TEL) TO DEVELOP A FRAMEWORK WHICH WOULD ENCOURAGE THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO BUILD AND OPERATE AN APII.

--WHEN THE TEL HAS HAD AN ADEQUATE OPPORTUNITY TO DEVELOP THE FRAMEWORK FOR ESTABLISHING AN APII, WHICH WE WOULD EXPECT WOULD BE CONSISTENT WITH VICE PRESIDENT GORE'S FIVE PRINCIPLES AND ADDRESS SUCH ISSUES AS TECHNICAL STANDARDS, INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AND PRIVACY, THE UNITED STATES COULD THEN SUPPORT A LEADER'S INITIATIVE TO CONVENE A TELECOMMUNICATIONS MINISTERIAL LEVEL MEETING TO FINALIZE THE AGREED FRAMEWORK.

--WE ARE VERY INTERESTED IN YOUR REACTION TO THESE IDEAS.

8. IF THE KOREAN REACTION IS FAVORABLE, YOU CAN INFORM THEM THAT GARY DE VIGHT, INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION POLICY, DEPARTMENT OF STATE, WILL BE AT THE SENIOR OFFICIALS MEETING AND WOULD LIKE TO TALK TO THEM ABOUT THEIR PROPOSAL.
