Purpose

To reply to Senator D'Amato, who wrote you concerning POW-MIAs from the Korean War and the Cold War.

Background

Senator D'Amato's letter notes that many families of POW-MIAs from the Korean War and the Cold War are still actively seeking information regarding their missing relatives. He does not criticize current policy; indeed, he notes that "significant steps" have been taken recently to resolve longstanding questions about the fate of these individuals. Without specifying any steps he would like the Administration to take, Senator D'Amato "strongly appeals" to you to keep the interests of the families in mind and to help them find answers concerning the fate of their loved ones.

Your letter indicates that you share his concern and that you are committed to the fullest possible accounting for POW-MIAs from all of America's conflicts.

RECOMMENDATION

That you sign the letter to Senator D'Amato at Tab A.

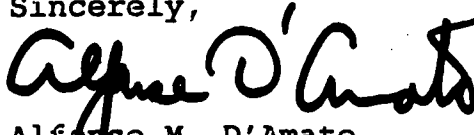
I wish to express my concern for the continued efforts of the many American families who are currently seeking information regarding unaccounted servicemen from the Korean War and Cold War.

SUPPLEMENTARY TALKING POINTS: ENERGY SUPPLY

- o We suggest that the experts' talks on interim energy supply be convened on the margins of the DPRK side's visit to Washington to discuss the LWR project and to tour several nuclear power plants, i.e., in the period September 6-9.
- o The US side in the interim energy supply experts' talks will be led by David Brown, Director of the State Department's Office of Korean Affairs. Mr. Brown was from 1990-1993 the Director of the Office of International Energy Policy at the State Department.
- o Mr. Brown will be assisted by officials of the Department of Energy and the State Department.
- o We think it important that the counterpart group on the DPRK side also include officials who are expert in non-nuclear energy technologies.
- o We suggest that among the DPRK participants there be representatives from the Institute of Thermal Energy and from the ministries responsible for coal and electric power, in particular.

DPRK Delegate Visit To U.S. Implementation Plan

PURPOSE

The DPRK delegate visit to the U.S. has 3 primary functions: 1) To provide the DPRK delegation of government and technical representatives with an understanding of the commercial nuclear power program in the United States. 2) To provide the DPRK delegation a first hand opportunity to visit US nuclear facilities and talk with industry personnel involved with the design, manufacture, and operation of US commercial nuclear power plants. 3) To establish a direct intellectual and working relationship between the appropriate DPRK and US government and technical representatives.

SCOPE

The DPRK delegate visit will consist of presentations and discussions with representatives of the appropriate government agencies, nuclear power utilities, nuclear supply vendors, and other pertinent nuclear industry organizations in Washington, DC. In addition, site visits to select nuclear power plants will be planned to provide a visual reference and understanding of the current US commercial nuclear power plant. The schedule for the delegate visit is provided in Attachment 2.

Washington Visit

The DPRK delegate Washington visit should include presentations by the following organizations. The scope of the presentation and discussions should include the role of the agency/organization in the nuclear power program and key issues facing the US nuclear plants that could be of common concern or mutual interest to the DPRK.

Department of Energy (DOE) - Provide an organizational and historical brief and statistics on the US commercial nuclear program including when the program was started, plant licensing history, current age and megawatt capacity of the civilian nuclear fleet versus total US capacity, capacity by plant type.

Present a brief on the Office of Nuclear Energy and purpose of each applicable division. SM Franks to present the Light Water Reactor Program (LWR) including activities on existing plants, the Advanced Light Water Reactor (ALWR) program, and technology currently being addressed (eg. reactor vessel annealing). Additional presentation could include lessons

learned and technology development that resulted from the TMI event.

Provide a discussion of the capability of the national laboratory complex.

Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) - Provide an overview of the NRC organization, responsibilities, and its operation with particular emphasis on the regulation for plant licensing and post license oversight functions. Additional information would be useful on key emerging issues that the NRC is addressing including severe accident, station blackout, plant life extension, etc.

Nuclear Energy Institute - Executive Committee (NEI) - Present the function and purpose of the Institute including the roles and responsibilities of the Committee, the interfaces with the utilities, NRC, DOE, and the commercial nuclear power utility industry and the current key issues being addressed.

Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) - Present the function and purpose of the organization, an historical perspective, how industry guidance is developed and achieved, current industry issues being evaluated.

Advanced Reactor Corporation (ARC) - Present the purpose, organization and functions of this non-profit corporation and it's role and interfaces in advancing the advanced light water reactor program.

Institute of Nuclear Power Operations (INPO) - Present the function and purpose of the organization, historical perspective, industry oversight activities and methods and current issues in the industry.

Key Nuclear Utility Representatives - Provide a brief on each utility's nuclear capabilities and organization, motivations behind the use of nuclear power and the current issues facing the nuclear utility.

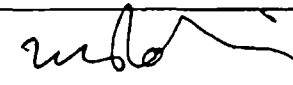
