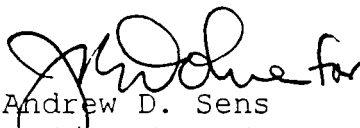

Summary of Conclusions

1. Deputies met to discuss next steps in dealing with the Contact Group on what degree of sanctions relief to offer Milosevic in return for genuine recognition of Bosnia. Following Ambassador Frasure's report on his two meetings with Milosevic, Deputies discussed a State proposal for a new, two-pronged approach that incorporates sanctions relief and new OSCE involvement. Deputies directed that a paper outlining the new proposal be circulated to the Deputies by May 10 for subsequent Principals consideration. **(Action: State)** Deputies reemphasized the need to work in close coordination with the Bosnian Government on any proposal regarding its goal of gaining

genuine recognition by Milosevic of Bosnia-Herzegovina within its internationally recognized borders in return for limited sanctions relief and a closure of the border with Bosnian Serb territory. ~~(S)~~

2. Deputies reviewed the situation in Croatia and progress on preventing escalation following the Vice President's meeting with President Tudjman in London over the weekend. Deputies agreed that the situation remained very volatile and that the U.S. should continue to press President Tudjman to exercise restraint. They agreed that Ambassador Holbrooke should follow-up with Tudjman on his agreement with the Vice President to accept some UNCRO presence in Sector West and to refrain from military action in other areas of conflict. Deputies further directed that Ambassador Albright and Ambassador Galbraith continue efforts with appropriate Croatian authorities to develop positions that will further defuse the situation. (Action: State/USUN) ~~(S)~~

4. Deputies discussed options for dealing with the situation in Sarajevo where increased violations of the exclusion zone and the Bosnian Serb closure of the Sarajevo airport continue to erode UN authority and NATO credibility. Deputies agreed that the untenable situation, and lack of UN will to fully execute its mandate, places the continuation of UNPROFOR in Bosnia at serious risk. Noting that with the change in Government, the French will undertake a review of their participation in UNPROFOR, Deputies directed that a strategy be developed for gaining French support for tougher UN action in Sarajevo. (Action: State) Deputies further directed that the JCS Sarajevo military options paper be circulated to Principals. (Action: JCS) ~~(S)~~

5. Deputies briefly discussed the IWG efforts in developing a post-UNPROFOR withdrawal strategy and in drafting answers to the unanswered policy questions regarding OPLAN 40104. Noting that more time was needed to review the work, Deputies asked that Agency comments be promptly provided (NLT COB May 11) directly to State (EUR). State will incorporate comments and circulate another version for Deputies final review on Friday, May 12. (Action: State) A subsequent version which incorporates any additional Deputies' comments will be circulated to Principals. ~~(S)~~

6. Deputies discussed the SACEUR's request for authority to issue an ACTREQ for the enabling and main forces in OPLAN 40104 that may be forwarded to the North Atlantic Council (NAC) next week. Deputies agreed that this request goes beyond existing Principals' authorization and directed that the following actions be taken to frame the issue for Principals' decision:

- o Present Principals with proposed answers to OPLAN 40104 unanswered policy questions NLT Monday, May 15. (Action: State) ~~(S)~~

- o Clarify the significance of the ACTREQ as it relates to the overall OPLAN 40104 approval process. (Action: OSD/JCS) (S)
- o Gauge likely NATO response to the request and develop appropriate guidance to U.S. representatives at NATO. (Action: State/DoD) (S)
- o Prepare ACTREQ options/decision paper for Principals' consideration NLT Monday, May 15. (Action: DoD with State input) (S)
- o Defer Congressional briefings until questions concerning new authorities requested by the SACEUR are clarified. (Action: NSC/IWG) (S)

Deputies agreed that we should continue to pursue a strategy, in close coordination with the Bosnian Government, that supports the Bosnian Government's goal of gaining genuine recognition by Milosevic of Bosnia-Herzegovina within its internationally recognized borders in return for limited sanctions relief and a closure of the border with Bosnian Serb territory. ~~(S)~~

2. Deputies agreed that Ambassador Frasure should continue to stand on the existing USG position in upcoming Contact Group discussions. In the follow-on meeting with Milosevic, Ambassador Frasure should emphasize that the U.S. will not support any efforts to lift sanctions until the Contact Group plan is accepted by the Pale Serbs, and that while we might consider a longer sanctions suspension period (e.g., 180 days), any extension of suspended sanctions would require a positive UNSC vote. He should also inform Milosevic that the U.S. is not prepared to support release of frozen financial assets. Deputies agreed that, if it becomes clear in the meeting with Milosevic that an element of lift is necessary to complete an otherwise acceptable deal, the U.S. should consider (but not offer at that meeting) lifting sanctions against certain media and information-related activities. Deputies asked that Leon Fuerth and Ambassador Frasure confer on the appropriate financial sanctions language for presentation to the Contact Group. (Action: OVP/State) (S)

3. Deputies discussed the renewed fighting in Croatia and a strategy to prevent escalation. They agreed that the U.S. should press President Tudjman and the Krajina Serbs to halt military operations and exercise restraint. They agreed to press the Croatians at all levels to adopt an accommodating position that could include the demilitarization of the recaptured areas, the return of Serb civilians to their homes and the reestablishment of UNCRO authority in Sector West and other areas of conflict. If Croatia is willing to take these steps, the U.S. would support the presence of Croatian civilian police in Sector West and the removal of all RSK military forces. (Action: State) (S)

4. Deputies discussed the steps to be taken to ensure the Croatians are aware of the U.S. view of their military actions. They agreed to support a UNSC resolution condemning incursions by all sides in Sectors South and East and calling for the restoration of UNCRO authority in all areas. Deputies directed that the Croatians be immediately informed of our deep concerns and endorsed a Vice Presidential meeting with President Tudjman in London as a useful forum for registering U.S. concerns about Tudjman's military actions. (Action: State/OVP) (S)

5. Deputies also discussed the importance of warning the Krajina Serbs of the consequences of attacks on U.S. personnel in Zagreb. They agreed that we should be prepared to bypass the dual-key system if a NATO response were not approved by the UN. They directed military options be developed for retaliatory action, both unilateral and through NATO. (Action: JCS) (S)

6. Deputies discussed briefing the Congress on OPLAN 40104 and directed that the talking points be cleared before the briefings are scheduled. (Action: JCS draft talking points; NSC/State schedule briefings) (S)
